Public Meeting on Issues Badly Affecting Aycliffe

Discussion on County Plan & Wind Farm Proposals

Great Aycliffe Residents Association have called a Public Meeting to discuss two topics which could seriously affect Newton Aycliffe in the future.

- 1 COUNTY PLAN
- 2 WIND FARM

There has been some concern shown over the Unitary Authority's County Plan which appears to be favouring expansion in central Durham when it is clearly evident growth is about to take place in the South West of the County.

Scarce attention has been given to the Hitachi

development and the necessity for improved infrastructure to cope with the demands this major industrialist will make on our area.

It is hoped someone from the County Council will be available to give more detail on the plan as the information and its implication on Aycliffe have not been fully understood.

Aycliffe is located ideally as the gateway to County Durham and boasts the second largest industrial area in the region. As such it should be vibrant, progressive and be allowed to grow.

The other current topic is the proposed Wind Farm - the largest in the country and there is confusion and alarm over this massive installation.

There will be opportunities to hear all sides of the argument to help residents come to a conclusion on the effectiveness or otherwise of wind power.

The meeting is designed to inform and help Newtonians understand what effect these future projects will have on them and their families in the future. Those present will have an opportunity to ask relevant questions.

The meeting will be held at St. Mary's Church on Thursday 7th July at 7pm.

Project Blossoms for Charity

Young offenders have helped a charity by donating £394 from the sale of garden planters made as part of a restorative justice scheme. In recent weeks the Restorative Justice Team has assembled planters, hanging baskets and garden ornaments to be sold with all profits going to The Rainbow Trust. The Restorative Justice Scheme is an award winning programme devised by County Durham Youth Offending Service for youngsters who find themselves with various court orders who benefit from a programme to 'pay

back' the community. The 'pay back' can take the form of painting and decorating community properties, gardening, litter picking and site clearing. In bad weather, industrial units equipped with tools are available to make items such as planters, which are then sold, with profits to charity. After paying the council back for the cost of the materials the young people will soon donate £394.15 to charity. The Rainbow Trust is a national charity which provides finance and support to terminally ill children and their families.

The Directors and Trustees of County Durham Furniture Help Scheme founded in Newton Aycliffe several years ago by Chris Palmer announced the latest round of improvements at their premises on Chilton Industrial Estate. The two main showrooms have been tidied; new lighting and steel shelving has been installed to improve the layout and display of the vast range of low cost household goods. The offices had a makeover with new furniture acquired through kind donors.

CDFHS has been steadily expanding and improving its service since being registered with the Charity Commission in 2004. This has accelerated recently to meet the additional demands placed on it due to the recession. Nearly 1200 people a month visit the showrooms with the widest range of reusable furniture and household goods in the County. They operate not only to help the disadvantaged and low income families, but any member of the public who may wish to find and negotiate a bargain.

Chris Palmer said "Anyone can visit us get help in the form of the essentials to start a home or to buy a reasonably priced item and we will often deliver on a next day basis to your door".

"We rely on the generosity of people who have surplus or unwanted items particularly beds, cookers washing machines or sofas to donate and our call centre will arrange an appointment to arrange FREE COLLECTION"

The crew of the fleet of modern vehicles carry photo identification and will remove any item as long as it is clean, reusable and in the case of "soft items" carries the relevant fire safety label. Chris Palmer told Newton News how grateful he was to the CDFHS volunteers. "Volunteering can help to improve your health and wellbeing and makes life more interesting and you can do as few or as many hours to suit the individual."

Ray Brown a Director said: "We all work hard as a team to ensure that our service is of a high standard. It benefits residents of County Durham working as we do, with the

County Council to reduce waste going to landfill". Nearly 150 tonnes of items were saved from landfill over the last year.

Diane Brown, Treasurer stated that every penny of generous donations goes to running the Charity covering overheads, rent, vehicles and general running costs. "The costs to our charity are rising particularly fuel for our vehicles. Even the overhead of our busy kitchen that often feeds in excess of 20 volunteers every day has to be carefully budgeted for. We need dedicated support volunteers, particularly people who have a catering background or an eye for tidiness in our Kitchen and Bric a brac departments".

Anyone wishing to support CDFHS by volunteering is welcome to a taster session by making an appointment with Training and Employment Coordinator - Steve Mitton. "Come and have a look behind the scenes" says Steve. "See if we can offer you what you want from your volunteering and in return get our help and support. Volunteering leads to employment and is now being recognised as informal, non accredited adult learning. We can help people get into or back to work "as CDFHS offers not just a wide range of volunteering or work experience, but full employability support".

Steve is employed full time, funded entirely by external grant awards and can guide people through the volunteering and employability improvement process.

"People are trapped in unemployment, lacking experience, qualifications, or sometimes from low self esteem, depression or lack of structure. CDFHS can help through work experience and a job campaign programme by giving your CV a makeover. "We have seen over 50% of people coming to us for employability support find work." said Steve.

Tony Davies found that volunteering at CDFHS was sometimes hard work, fun and rewarding, but at the same time by getting everyone's support made him feel more alive by helping other people.

Working in partnership with Claire Todd, Learning Coordinator across South and West Durham. County Durham Furniture Help Scheme (CDFHS) was successful in securing Working Neighbourhood Funding (WNF) from the Personal Skills Training (Employability) Fund. The funding proved very successful in enabling CDFHS to provide specific training including CV preparation, interview techniques etc for eligible clients allowing them to apply for jobs in sectors where there were employment opportunities. "We are proud that we have seen a wide spread of positive job outcomes including driving, warehousing and customer service roles, self employment and one client joined the Army. Claire Todd said CDFHS had provided an excellent service and recognised the importance of being able to deliver effective training quickly, enabling clients to access employment opportunities" said Chris Palmer.

Decision on Woodham Golf Club Development Next Month

People of Newton Aycliffe can look forward to luxury leisure facilities on their doorstep if plans to re-develop Woodham Golf Club are approved next month. Working on behalf of developers, Washington Developments, Newcastle-based planning consultants Nathaniel Lichfield and Partners have applied for planning permission for a £32.1m housing and leisure development at Woodham Golf and Country Club. The redevelopment and improvement of the Club follows a lengthy public consultation which began last October and proposes a mixed-use development which would include improvements to the golf course, the construction of 50 executive family homes, a 75 bed, four star hotel with conference and spa facilities and extensive landscaping

amongst which would be the re-establishment of Woodham Bridleway and new community footpaths. Members of the golf club will obviously enjoy the new clubhouse and improvements to the course which include new sustainable drainage measures that should prevent the frequent closures of the course which have occurred in the past. Members of the local community can enjoy spa facilities at the hotel without having to travel a great distance and the developers predict that the facilities will attract new custom from the local and neighbouring communities as well as from those further a field. Jamie Murphy, Group Director at Washington Developments, commented, "Woodham is an excellent golf course in a superb location but would

benefit from investment both to the clubhouse and the grounds. Our proposal seeks to create a top class leisure facility which will be a part of the local community. There is no reason why an improved course here shouldn't attract high profile tournaments in the future without losing its community base." "The improved leisure facilities are an important catalyst towards the regeneration of the wider area and the feedback we have received so far from our consultation with both the local community and businesses has been very positive." The scheme which was laid before the South and West Durham Planning Committee in April will be decided upon on 27th July, with initial construction work commencing towards the end of the year should the application be successful.

REPORT ON COUNCIL MEETING WEDNESDAY 8th JUNE

The Town Council discussed three matters, which did not involve the Council taking action itself, but which will affect life in Aycliffe for the next 20 years.

First, Councillors considered a review which is being undertaken into the Area Action Partnerships. The AAPs were initially set up to link the local Parish Councils to the County Unitary Authority. Whilst individual AAP delegates cannot be thanked enough for their involvement, there is a strong argument that the AAPs as an institution are not fit for purpose.

They are unelected and administrative costs account for 40% of their budget, and they have failed in their primary purpose to be a link between Parish and County Councils.

Councillors also discussed the latest report of the Electoral Boundaries Commission, which has recently completely changed its recommendations for Aycliffe to incorporate suggestions made by the Great Aycliffe Residents Association. The new plan gives the electors of Greenfields/Byerley Park ward their own County Councillor (so that they no longer have to share their Councillor with Shildon), and it restores 'the Dales' to West Ward. Members welcomed these new suggestions.

Finally, Councillors considered in detail the new County Plan proposals for Aycliffe. It was recognised that the Plan will determine the growth and prosperity of the town for the next 20 years, and Council Leader Bob Fleming introduced the debate by saying that this was an

issue that went beyond party politics, and that everybody had a duty to get involved. Members considered the Plan under four heads - the economy, housing, environment and the town centre. They were disappointed by the lack of provision for Aycliffe in all these four areas.

On each of these matters - the AAPs, the Boundaries Commission Report and the County Plan - the Council resolved that each member would make their comments individually. However, on two matters concerning the County Plan, Councillors felt so strongly that they agreed to submit a unanimous corporate comment, namely:

1. Economy: the County Plan has not made sufficient provision for growth on the Industrial Estate.

2. Housing: the Town Council does not think 1500 houses sufficient. Also - although it welcomed allocation of the Copelaw site for private housing - it urged the County Council to make provision for bungalows, affordable housing and social housing within the existing town boundaries (ideally on the former Avenue and Elmfield

School playing fields).

Wind Farms Running Out of Puff?

Despite the freak gales that battered parts of the country recently, climate experts are warning that many of Britain's wind farms may soon run out of puff. According to government figures, 13 of the past 16 months have been calmer than normal - while 2010 was the "stillest" year of the past decade.

Meteorologists believe that changes to the Atlantic jet stream could alter the pattern of winds over the next 40 years and leave much of the nation's growing army of power-generating turbines becalmed. The Coalition has drawn up plans to open more wind farms in an effort to meet Britain's European Union target of providing 15 per cent of its energy from renewable sources by 2020. More than 3,600 turbines are expected to be installed in offshore wind farms over the next nine years. But statistics suggest that the winds that sweep across the British Isles may be weakening. Last year, wind speeds over the UK averaged 7.8 knots (8.9mph), a fall of 20 per cent on 2008, and well below the mean for this century, which stands at 9.1 knots (10.5mph). Usually Britain has warm, wet and windy winters, thanks to

Caribbean air carried here by the Atlantic jet stream, a fast-flowing current of air.

But the last two winters have featured exceptionally low temperatures and were remarkably still when they should have been the windiest seasons of all, as high pressure diverted the jet stream from its normal position.

Meteorologists have found that the position of the jet stream has been influenced by the lower levels of activity on the Sun. This decline in sun-spot activity is expected to continue for the next 40 years, with potentially serious consequences for the viability of wind farms.

Professor Mike Lockwood, from Reading University, said: "Changes in the jet stream will change the pattern of winds that we get in the UK. That, of course, is a problem for wind power. "You have to site your wind farms in the right place and if you site your wind farm in the wrong place then that will be a problem."

Dr David Brayshaw, also from Reading's Department of Meteorology, added: "If wind speed lowers, we can expect to generate less electricity from turbines - that's a no-brainer."
