POLICE RAID CANNABIS FARM IN SILVERDALE

Officers Last week Newton from Aycliffe's Policing Neighbourhood Team executed a magistrate's search warrant at an address in SILVERDALE PLACE after information had been received regarding a strong smell of cannabis coming from a property in that area. After gaining entry into the property the team conducted a thorough search and discovered that one of the upstairs bedrooms had been converted into a substantial cannabis farm - three large tents had been erected, each one containing mature cannabis plants ready for cropping. A local man was arrested and is helping the police with their enquiries.

The Aycliffe Policing Team are committed to acting on information received any from members of the public regarding any suspicious behaviour in their area. They ask that residents report any suspicious smells, such as a strong sweet smell, or if an adjoining property

"This is a massive scheme covering 16 square kilometres. The biomass kilometres. The biomass facility at Chilton, just to the north of the site, will generate 17MW of electricity.

According to government figures, wind turbines are on average only 21.5% efficient, it would take 40 turbines to deliver the same amount of electricity. I also believe because of other schemes in the area, the landscape will be full to capacity and cannot take any more turbines; each 4 times the size of the Angel of the North.

Ed: I believe taking photos in a public place are allowed, but if someone is specifically taking photos of children it should be viewed with suspicion. The Police may question the photographer and ask to view the photos.

This may have been an innocent incident and the couple may want to contact us to confirm they had no ulterior motive.







REPORT ON COUNCIL MEETING WEDNESDAY 13th JULY

Last week's Town Council and Resources Policy Committee (13 July 2011) was to the casual observer short, even unimportant affair, but it is one which I am delighted to report.

Members granted £100 to the County Durham School Benevolent Fund. They heard that both the Town Council's Early Leaning Centres are full, and that Woodham Burn Pre-school (wonderfully) had received a 'good with outstanding features' in its ofsted inspection.

But it is two other apparently minor - matters that I want to draw to your attention.

The first was a decision to defer the purchase of IT equipment. The equipment is on a rolling programme to be replaced, and (at three years old) is indeed in need of replacement. However, the bi-annual system review is due shortly and – before they pay out to buy new equipment - members decided to pause

to make doubly sure that the equipment the Council will be buying is exactly what it needs.

The second seems tinier. Each month the Town Councillors receive a list of every financial transaction

the Council has made, and public one of the Independent Councillors questioned a payment of £421 for the disconnection of electricity to Horndale Pavilion. Officers immediately explained the expenditure. which was essential and unavoidable. A minor moment perhaps – but that is a Councillor doing the job properly.

Many people have an incorrect image of Councillors ... whom they believe to enjoy wasting

bickering about 'politics'. In fact, this caricature is nowhere near the truth. At Town Council level, much of being a Councillor involves poring over lists of figures, making sure that the Council gets best value on some new computers, or trying to find a saving of £421 in a budget of nearly £3 million.
