that government cutbacks was behind everything and that they had forced the police to rationalise and improve efficiency levels. The plan now is to seek an extension to the current lease and experiment with a new model of community policing, county wide. avoiding wasteful

wide, avoiding wasteful beaurocracy and duplication of work. It all made a lot of sense and the idea to have cells in central locations rather than at every police station was an obvious saving on

manpower. The millions saved on building a new police station in Newton Aycliffe could be better spent on maintaining a better police presence on the streets.

Our old station will be demolished and in time the land would be sold for another development. It is a valuable town centre site and the cash from the sale would help the finances of the Constabulary.

We are assured our local Beat Police and all the good work they do will not be affected in the re-organisation which in future will utilise police personnel in Darlington and County Durham more effectively with all boundaries removed.

In an effort to make our police more accessible contact points will be provided at the Leisure Centre, Tesco's and the Fire Station where residents can phone or leave

The Constabulary's plan is plausible as it seeks to provide a super efficent police service, abandoning the "patch" system where instead, officers nearest to the incident will respond. There is no doubt a lot of police time is wasted and this scheme will reduce that considerably and the high costs involved.


In light of this townsfolk will have to consider if the new plan is acceptable, whether we need a Police Station in the town centre or are satisfied with it being located on the Business Park.


The three-day event was organised by County Durham Development Company, on behalf of Durham County Local school enjoyed visits Council. Local children before it was open to the general public.
