£3.6m Advanced Manufacturing Facility Opens in Aycliffe

A new manufacturing and product design training centre offering state-of-the-art facilities for students and employers opened this week. Newton News was surprised on how quiet this new development has been kept, having received no notice of its existence until the day before it opened. More than 100 guests, including manufacturers and education providers from across the region attended the Open Day and taken on a tour of the impressive new vocational centre.



at SW Durham Training on the Business Park and has been funded by the Department for Education in partnership with Durham County Council. Other partners include Bishop Auckland College, schools, universities and employers. Using the shell of an existing SWDT building enabled the company to maximise expenditure on the latest high tech equipment, including 3D laser scanners, laser cutters, rapid prototyping machines,

routers, highly automated and flexible manufacturing systems, CNC lathes and millers, floor standing pillar drills and an industrial process control station. This means that the centre can reproduce and simulate the real-life business of manufacturing across a range of sub-sectors for younger students aged under 19, while offering bespoke, accredited vocational training for manufacturing and engineering firms. Learners in the 14-19 age range can undertake courses such as MPD Diploma, Applied GCSE, A level, NVQ Levels 1-4, BTEC and Apprenticeships. Specialist qualifications include areas like process control and automation, mechatronics, continued Page 5

"For me probably the band I was looking forward to seeing the most at Stormin'. Simply because I knew that the punk covers that they play would be such a great alternative musical taste, and that the typical assembled Stormin' audience would absolutely lap this lot up. Sure enough 1977 did the job splendidly! Lots of classic late 70's punk anthems from the Sex Pistols, Clash, Jam, SLF, D'mead, plus many more. Again it was just a brief one-hour slot in which to deliver a show, but with some of their songs clocking in at 3 minutes or less than they managed to bang in a multitude of tunes with plenty of variety. £32m WOODHAM DEVELOPMENT WILL CREATE JOBS

The proposed re-development of Woodham Golf and Country Club in Newton Aycliffe will create almost 300 jobs in an area that has experienced significant economic decline over the past ten years.

The re-development and improvement of the Club proposes a mixed-use development which would include improvements to the golf course, the construction of 50 executive family homes, a 75 bed, four star hotel with conference and spa facilities and extensive landscaping amongst which would be the re-establishment of Woodham Bridleway and new community footpaths.

The proposals, which have been developed in conjunction with Ryder Architects and Nathaniel Lichfield and Partners planning consultants, would

create almost 100 new permanent jobs as well as safe-guarding approximately 30 existing positions, if plans are approved later this month. In addition a further 145 positions will be created during the construction phase of the development.

Jonathan Walker, Head of Member Relations at North East Chamber of Commerce (NECC), commented, "It's well documented that the construction sector in particular is suffering as a result of the economic downturn so any opportunity for sustainable development in the South Durham area or anywhere in the North East would be welcomed."

Research into typical job density in the area has identified that the local economy is currently underperforming and that there are approximately 57 jobs in the for every 100

residents of working age, a total which is significantly lower than the national average of, 79, and the North East average, 69, indicating that out of work residents are likely to find it comparatively difficult to find employment in the local area.

Ross Lillico, Senior Economics Consultant at Nathaniel Litchfield and Partners explained, "The proposed development represents a significant economic opportunity for Woodham and the wider South Durham area, a location which has suffered from major job losses over the past decade. The scheme is forecast to create almost 100 new jobs and safeguard many more and will provide the business infrastructure to support major employment locations nearby. It will also help to create a more

sustainable, year round tourism offer in the area, raising the profile of South Durham as a destination and bringing an additional £1.6m of visitor expenditure into the local economy annually." Robin Beveridge, Head of Policy and research at One North East said of the proposed development, "The Agency welcomes the private investment and potential employment opportunities offered by the new development and investment proposals relating to the golf and leisure facilities at Woodham."

The planning application was submitted to Durham County Council Planning Committee earlier this year and will be decided upon on in the coming months, with initial construction work commencing towards the end of next year should the application be successful.

A 19-year-old recruit from Newton Aycliffe is one step closer to a career at sea after completing his initial naval training at HMS Raleigh in Cornwall.

Technology College previously worked as a machine operator and was inspired to join the Royal Navy by his four uncles, an aunt and three cousins who are all either former or current sailors. Mitchell said: "My family have told me a lot of things about the Service and I wanted the benefits of a great career and the opportunities to gain a trade.

Training was hard graft, but I felt great each time I completed a task. Shooting on the live range was a real adrenaline buzz. I gained the best grouping for shots on target and now hold the Raleigh record. The general fitness training has been good and I've met a great group of lads. My ambition is to work my way up the ranks and do the full 21 years service."

With the first phase of his training complete, Mitchell's next port of call is HMS Sultan in Hampshire. There he will learn the skills in mechanical engineering required to keep the ships of the Royal Navy running at the peak of operational effectiveness.

An enhanced Initial Naval Training course was introduced by the Royal Navy in May 2011. It is

underpinned by nine Core Maritime Skills that are the foundations of naval life and underpin operational effectiveness. Recruits are taught the basics of Naval discipline and customs. They learn about navigation and are given the chance to take the helm of their own medium sized inflatable boat during a waterborne orienteering exercise.

With Royal Navy personnel playing a vital role in Afghanistan and other land-based operations, recruits undergo training in basic combat skills which includes survival in the field.

Fitness is a key component of the training and is delivered using a disciplined method of military fitness which focuses on developing co-ordination and individual physical strength and endurance. As the course progresses the recruits take part in three extended exercises to test their skills and understanding of the principles they have been taught.

Tallents Fined £100,000 + Costs

Employee's Tragic Death Was Avoidable

An Aycliffe engineering firm has been fined £100,000 plus £44,000 costs after a worker was crushed to death while clearing a jam on a production line.

Father-of-two Paul Clark, 52, of Newton Aycliffe, was a multi-skilled fitter at Tallent Automotive Ltd-Gestamp Automocion (formerly ThyssenKrupp Tallent Ltd), where he died on 8 July 2009 after becoming trapped between a moving carriage and its tracks.

An investigation by the Health and Safety Executive found that a pneumatically-powered carriage, part of a large press which produced chassis components, had jammed. The carriage, known as a destacker, was used to remove empty magazines which had previously contained metal blanks, away from the press.

Mr Clark was attempting to clear the jam after the carriage had stopped halfway along its tracks. He had opened the interlocked safety gates to gain access within the fenced enclosure of the machine. This isolated the equipment from the electricity supply, but did not isolate and make safe the pneumatic power element of the machine. The equipment for controlling movement of the carriage was located within the tracks the carriage ran on, which meant he had to work in a dangerous area in order to try and establish the cause of the jam.

While working on the equipment between the tracks, the carriage moved suddenly and trapped Mr Clark between the carriage and the support structure at the end of the tracks. He died as a result of traumatic asphyxia due to crush injuries.

The HSE investigation found that there was no safe system for carrying out work within the destacker area, as the pneumatic power for the machinery was not isolated before entering the interlocked

enclosure. Although the electrical hazards were recognised by the company, the risks from the pneumatically operated equipment were not. It was also found that the controls for adjusting the destacker carriage were located in a position of danger. There was also insufficient information available to Mr Clark to show how the pneumatic supply worked and how he could safely make the necessary adjustments.

HSE Inspector Martin Baillie said:

"This tragic death could have been avoided had the company put in place a safe system of work in place which ensured that risks from all energy sources had been identified and made safe before employees could gain access to the enclosure where the equipment was located.

"It is vitally important that safe isolation procedures are developed and used before attempting to make repairs to equipment.

"In this instance, Tallent Automotive Limited-Gestamp Automocion has instead relied on the training and experience of individuals without providing a safe system of work or adequate information for them. This was a significant cause of the incident which led to Mr Clark's death."

Speaking after the case Mr Clark's wife Carole said:

"Paul was a tremendous husband, father, family man and friend to so many. What happened that fateful day has not only devastated the lives of those nearest to Paul but affected the lives of many others.

"We as a family believe Paul's death was completely avoidable. He was working in an isolated, hazardous area alone. When the accident happened his vital organs were not damaged, in fact he had only broken a few ribs and the Coroner felt his death could possibly have been

avoided had he been extricated earlier. What he must have gone through in those minutes doesn't bear thinking about.

"We would hope that since this accident Tallents and other companies nationwide will introduce measures to have another worker close by to raise the alarm immediately when workers are in hazardous conditions. This could prevent further fatalities.

"We are pleased to now be able to draw a line under this process and try to re-build our lives. The final word has to be for Paul, who we miss so much. He leaves such a big void in our lives. He led such a full life but had so much more to live for, he has already missed his son's graduation, birth of family members and won't be present at his son's wedding next year. Nobody expects their husband to go out to work on an ordinary day and not come home."

Beware Installing Solar Energy Panels

Dear Sir,
Following our investigations into solar panel electricity generation at Woodham Community Centre, I consider the public would benefit from some points of caution.

Whilst the financial benefits seem too good to be true proper investigation should always be undertaken, before any decisions are made. My late father in-law told me a wonderful story which highlights this point. When he was a young man, an elderly lady in his street suffered from an embarrassing red veined nose. A national newspaper advertised "A cure for red noses, send seven shillings and six pence". To the ladies horror, the cure sent was a paint brush, and a small tin of blue paint with the instructions "paint the red nose BLUE!"

Under the Government's clean energy cash back scheme, householders who install solar panels are paid a feed-in tariff for the electricity they make, whether you use it or not. This is set at 43.3 pence/kW if your system is under the 4kilowatt peak. This tariff, which is due to be reduced after April 2012, is guaranteed for 25 years tax-free, and is index linked. As most people are paying about 14pence per kilowatt from their electricity supplier this is the obvious major benefit. However, you also have the use of any energy that is being produced, and then any surplus is exported to the National Grid at 3.1p/kW.

Solar panels, in my opinion are the modern equivalent of the double glazing boom, and of course this can attract non reputable Companies into the market.

Make sure that your potential installer has a MCS certificate.

Don't fall for a hard sell or offers of discounts for a quick decision.

Make sure a proper site survey and inspection takes place on your property.

There are schemes where

suppliers will install their panels on your roof, if you do not have the capital to install them yourself. However, I would advise to take independent legal advice on any possible contract. You have to consider who would own these systems, what if you would want to end the contract? Are you liable for damage, and who has to pay for insurance and repairs? Under most of these "Rent a roof schemes" the main benefit, which in my opinion, is the feed-in tariff would be going to the installer not the householder.

AYCLIFFE SPARTANS SHOW PROMISE



On Sunday 2 October the Newton Aycliffe Spartans took their courage in both hands and actually travelled to Birmingham to play their first organised games of baseball, friendlies against the Birmingham Maple Leafs and the West Midlands Razorbacks.

I expressed the opinion beforehand that arranging to play outdoor ball in England in October was taking something of a risk with the weather, however it turned out to be one of the warmest October days ever, and a wonderful day for baseball.

Once the travelling Northern contingents had navigated their way to Marston Green, start of play had to be delayed until noon to allow a children's football match to finish - it was then decided that Spartans would play two hour timed games against both Midlands teams in succession, after which Birmingham and West Midlands could play each other in whatever time was left.

The Spartans gained a lot from competing against a decent opposition for the first time, and were given plenty of tips on the complex arts of base running and positioning of fielders by Maple Leafs manager James Moran.

CONSULTATION ON PLANNING

Is this the end of our 'green and pleasant land'?

The Planning Framework is a Licence to Build:

The Framework is the outcome of a basic Tory feeling that planning rules are restricting much-needed economic growth and development. So the Framework proposes to replace the existing 1,300 pages of rules with 52 pages of general principles.

Running through the Framework (its 'golden thread') is 'a presumption in favour of sustainable development' – which means, basically, that where planning permission is sought for infrastructure, industry, housing, or local services, 'the default answer to development proposals is yes', as long as the development is 'sustainable'. Some developments – such as wind farms – will be 'sustainable' by definition, since they provide low-carbon renewable energy.

This principle – this 'presumption in favour of sustainable development' – is, by the way, not up for discussion. The consultation is not asking us whether we agree with the principle – only whether the Framework document explains it properly.

The Framework explicitly requires authorities making Local and Neighbourhood Plans to keep them flexible and minimal ... and yet contains the terrifying provision that 'where the plan is absent, silent, indeterminate or out of date', the Planning Authority must grant permission – in other words, if you can find a loophole in all this, go ahead. Worrying.

There are some Positives:

There is much in the framework which makes sense.

1. People in Aycliffe will presumably want to support Paragraph 19, which overturns the current requirement that developers use brown field sites first, before they are allowed to develop green field sites. Here in Newton Aycliffe there are a number of brown field sites, long unused, which we now see as valuable green space within our communities, and we would prefer to see 'islands' of development beyond the current boundaries of the town, rather than 'infilling' on brown field sites which will 'fill up' and overcrowd our community.

2. I found myself nodding in agreement with most of Paragraphs 76-80, which set out principles for the development of town centres.

3. Also, as in Paragraph 109, I would welcome the right to 'set housing density to reflect local circumstances'. This is what we have been trying to get for ages; why should we in the north-east (where land is plentiful) be forced to build cramped, overcrowded housing estates at the high densities required down south (where land is scarce)?

The Framework, however, includes some Alarming Negatives:

There is just so much in this Framework which simply hands us over to the developers to whom, it appears to me, we will simply

be powerless to say no as long as their building has a wind turbine on the top to make it 'sustainable'.

4. Paragraph 119 restricts our right to reject ugly buildings as long as they are 'high-quality'.

5. Paragraph 151, similarly, prevents planning authorities refusing permission on the grounds that a new building does not fit within an existing townscape, as long as it has a social, economic or environmental benefit.

6. Paragraph 146 will make it virtually impossible to stop renewable energy development on green belt land, since it defines renewable energy as 'sustainable' by definition.

7. Similarly Paragraph 153 essentially allows energy companies to build wind farms ANYWHERE they can show they would be possible.

8. Finally, where pollution is an issue, Paragraph 172 instructs planning authorities to assume that pollution control regimes will operate effectively, and to judge the application only on whether the development is an acceptable use for the land, and not on what would happen if things went wrong.

Please Respond:

Generally, my fear is that this Framework will render us powerless to prevent predator development on our most beautiful and precious sites because the Framework has taken away all our powers and rights to say no.

And specifically, I remain convinced that – if the Framework becomes law – the Town Council MUST develop a Neighbourhood Plan, taking advantage of its proposed power to define WHERE development will take place, and also the 'Local Green Space' where our community might wish to rule out development.

NOT TOO LATE TO SECURE £2,000 COLLEGE SUPPORT

Summer school leavers who have not yet decided on their next move are being urged to take advantage of a £2,000 support package being offering by Bishop Auckland College. Students aged 16-19 enrolling before the October half term at the college could qualify for a £500 allowance along with a host of other benefits, including free travel, free meals, and free childcare.

Additional financial support includes help with course study costs, such as equipment and uniforms, and vouchers for stationery, with other incentives including free gym membership and free hair and beauty treatments.

The college has topped up the allocation made available from the Government's new £180m Bursary Fund to pay for the new support package. The national Bursary Fund provides £1,200 a year for young students from disadvantaged backgrounds or who have certain disabilities. The move was designed to ensure school leavers from less affluent backgrounds were not put off further education as a result of the scrapping of the £540m Education Maintenance Allowance, which paid eligible students with a family income below £30,000 up to £30 per week.

While many courses are already full, there remain limited places in a number of subject areas including: sport; construction; engineering; IT; business and administration; public services; music and performing arts; art and design; and travel and tourism.

Principal Anne Isherwood said: "Across the country there is evidence that the withdrawal of the EMA grant may have put some school leavers off going to college to pursue further education, because they are worried they will not be able to afford to study."

"Our message to those young people is come and talk to us - we may be able to offer up to £2,000 a year in financial support to cover everything from bus fares to meals. While many subject areas now have a full allocation of students, we do have limited space in others. So it's not too late to enrol."

In an announcement to coincide with national Colleges Week, Bishop Auckland College has also today pledged to maintain the same student support package next year, so students enrolling on two year courses who are eligible for financial help know it is in place for the full duration of their course.

Mrs Isherwood added: "Over half of our students were last year awarded EMA grants, which shows just how important this financial support is. We don't want young people being deterred from giving themselves a great chance in life because they are worried they can't afford to come to college."

"With a bursary of up to £500, free travel, free meals, free childcare and additional support for other study costs we believe we have a comprehensive support package in place which should ensure everyone, whatever their background, can take advantage of our superb facilities and teaching."

The college's £32m Woodhouse Lane campus, which opened in 2007, includes impressive sound recording, music & performing arts facilities, construction and motor vehicle training workshops, salons, and a sports hall.

The first class facilities are to be further boosted this October with the addition of a new Sixth Form Centre to the second floor on the main campus for Level 3 Students.

The centre, which will include an advanced study area, a research area with new computers and a socialising hub, is centrally located adjacent to the £500,000 Gateway for Higher Education centre opened last year by the University of Sunderland.

Other new developments include: New visitor and reception area ■ New Student Support and Careers Information, Advice and Guidance suite ■ New hair & beauty coffee shop ■ Extended student recreation area ■ Extension to the College's main eatery area 'The Meeting Place' ■ Expansion of the College's own Mitre restaurant increasing to 60 covers.

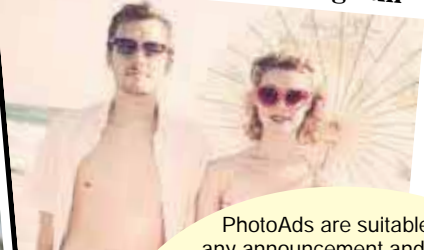

GAMP £4k DONATION BOOSTS FOOTBALL CLUB

Aycliffe were able to pick from a squad of 23 for the match, which was played on a hard ground in scorching conditions.

Despite having arrived well before kick-off, Aycliffe had their usual slow start, within 90 seconds the big Jarrovians forwards had made ground and poor tackling had seen them score a try. Again, the Aycliffe backs looked dangerous, but, with the home team on top in the rucks, and slow scrummage ball, good quality possession was at a premium.

Finally getting some possession, Aycliffe inched their way towards the Jarrovians line and were awarded a penalty near the line. With the opposition expecting a forward drive, the ball was flung wide, slick handling saw the ball quickly along the back line, where Darrell McLaren was able to set up Ben Fowler for his first try for Aycliffe. Stephen Middlemas added the kick from wide out to take the lead. Soon after, Jarrovians missed a penalty kick in front of the posts. At the break the score was 7 – 5.

The one area which Aycliffe dominated was the lineout, and Craig Holmes was making a number of line breaks. James Thacker increased the lead with a try before Jarrovians fought back and again took advantage of week tackling to score a try. Needing the conversion to tie the scores, they again missed an easy kick.

With Aycliffe's next attack producing a penalty 30 metres out, Middlemas's kick ensured that Jarrovians would need a try to get back in the game. This was to prove beyond them and Aycliffe held out for the narrow win although Jarrovians did get the losing bonus point.

Again this season, Aycliffe showed they have the spirit to win tight games, a failing in the past. They are now third in the league, having beaten some of the stronger teams and can now be optimistic of a high finish, but it will take more work on the training ground and sharper finishing.
