ROCKERMOUTH REVIEW FROM "STORMIN THE CASTLE"

'For me probably the band I was looking forward to seeing the most at Stormin'. Simply because I knew that the punk covers that they play would be such a great alternative musical taste, and that the typical assembled Stormin' audience would absolutely jap this lot up. Sure enough 1977 did the job opiendidly! Lots of classic late 70's punk anthoms from the Sex Pistols, Clash, Jam. SLF, D'mned, plus many more. Again it was just a brief one-hour slot in which to deliver a show, but with some of their songs clocking in at 3 minutes or less then they managed to bang in a multitude of tunes with plenty of variety. This crowd just grow and grow as the group continued to belt out arthem after arthem, and obviously the audience were becoming a lot more animated & lairy too, ha-ha. I was just as happy watching the crowd having a great time as I was watching the band play. There was a farfastic atmosphere building up in the main tent, and 1977 were miking it to the max. The sound mix for them was even better than the previous band, and now I could say that the quality of the rig was easily as good as any prior years of this traily. Blifs bass guitar sound was huge, Cass' drum kit had never sounded bigger nor batter, and Jakka's guitartone out through the mix like a broadsword. This was big step forward from their typical pub gigs using their own small vocal P.A. system. Stadium rock had finally arrived for 1977 after 15 years of slogging their backsides off around the north east, and boy didn't they suit it so well! This 3-piece band came alive on this bigger stage, and the crowd absolutely loved them."



Why You Should Oppose Wind Farm

This issue of the Newton News includes a leaflet published and funded by The Isles Communities Turbine Action Committee (TICTAC). E.ON's proposal to build up to 45 wind turbines to the east Woodham, Newton Aycliffe, Great Aycliffe and Ayclffe will have a significant impact on people living in those places as well as over 20 other villages and towns in the area

This wind farm will not only be the biggest in England – it will also contain some of the tallest turbines in the Country. E.ON has designated most of the population affected by this development as being in 'the outer zone' and so has not been communicating directly with them.

Those who have managed to attend an exhibition or have seen the consultation document will have some idea of what E.ON is proposing. The small group of local people who make up TICTAC hope the leaflet will give those in the outer zone more information about the scheme.







CREDIT CARD SCAM TARGETS AYCLIFFE

Durham County Council's Fair Trading Team are warning County Durham residents of a telephone scam targeting our area again.

The scam involves a phone call from a person, generally from an overseas call centre, stating they are from Microsoft or an Internet Service Provider and are calling because there is a problem with your computer, such as it is running slow or may have been attacked by a virus that needs fixing.
The caller then asks you to

access a website that allows them to gain control of your computer and all of your information, sometimes showing a list of fake faults with your computer. They will then ask for a substantial fee, requiring your financial details such as credit card or bank details.

Craig Hudson. Fair Trading Manager, within Environment, Health and Consumer Protection Service of Durham County Council said, "This type of scam is quite common, and seems to re-appear in waves targeting consumers in various parts of the country.

everyone's computer runs slow and unfortunately some people are taken in by an unsolicited phone call offering to fix the problem. Fraudsters based abroad, are thought to have obtained consumers details or may just make random calls hoping that you have a computer and claiming that a problem exists which they can solve.

should think Residents very carefully about giving control of their computer over to someone they don't know and certainly not give out credit card or other personal details to someone who has phoned them out of the blue."

Giving out personal information such as

computer address details financial information such as credit card or bank account numbers can leave consumers open to fraud and identity theft, leaving people open to having debts run up in their name, being added to a credit rating blacklist, and it taking time to resolve the problem.

Dear Alan C Scott Please receive my comments on the Draft National Planning Policy Framework (DNPPF).

1. The existing 1300 pages of planning rules were developed to protect us against predator development. Replacing these rules with a few general principles is mistaken; both applicants and Planning Authorities need to be able to measure applications against clear

2. I object to the unrealistic burden placed upon Local and Neighbourhood Plans to define the explicit limits

3. This is particularly so because the DNPPF grants permission where the Plan is 'silent or indeterminate' (¶14) – this automatic consent must be deleted.

4. I object to the blanket presumption in favour of sustainable development, and feel that the DNPPF goes much too far in helping development of Green Belt land (¶133-147) and heritage assets (¶176-191) on the grounds of 'benefit to the community'. 5. This is particularly so because 'sustainable development

inadequately defined in the DNPPF (¶10) – the definition should be much more precise.

6. I object that renewable energy projects seem to be regarded as sustainable by definition – the DNPPF is a carte blanche for energy companies to cover the country with wind farms (e.g. ¶146 and ¶153).

7. I object to the lack of need for developments to be aesthetic (¶119),

existing townscape (¶151); ALL development should be required to be attractive, sympathetic to the locality, and in the vernacular materials and style.

8. Provision regarding polluting developments (¶172) is utterly inadequate. HOWEVER:

1. I agree that a community should be able to set its own housing density (¶109) – in Newton Aycliffe we have plenty of building land available, and would welcome the opportunity to be able to build attractive, low-density housing

estates.

2. I also approve of the proposal to remove the requirement to use brown field sites first (¶19) – in Newton Aycliffe we are opposed to 'infilling' which will make our town more crowded.

3. Living in a town with an appalling town centre, I also welcome the provisions (¶76-80) for town centre development.

AGENCY WORKERS BENEFIT FROM NEW RIGHTS

Thousands of workers in the North East will benefit from improved working conditions when the new equal treatment rights for temps come into effect on Saturday (1 October).

Unlike fixed-term employees and part-time workers, until now agency workers have not had a right to the same pay and holiday rights as directly employed staff in the same workplace. This lack of rights has left them open to abuse, says Stephen Hughes

Nearly half (46 per cent) of the agency workers who responded to a YouGov survey commissioned by the TUC said they received less holiday entitlement than permanent staff. One in three (33 per cent) reported getting less pay for doing the same work as directly employed staff and nearly one in three (28 per cent) said they lost out on overtime and unsocial hours payments. According to

the Labour Force Survey, the average agency worker gets five days less holiday a year than permanent employees.

The Labour Force Servey also found that temps earned on average 68 per cent of the pay of permanent workers - a 32 per cent pay gap.

However, following years of campaigning by Mr. Hughes and Labour colleagues within the European Parliament. with support from trade unions, from 1 October agency workers will benefit from new, improved rights at work.
