INEFFECTIVE COUNCILLORS SHOULD RESIGN

LABOUR TOWN COUNCILLORS CONDEMN POOR REPRESENTATION BY SOME INDEPENDENTS

The Labour Group on Great Aycliffe Town Council acknowledge that the Independent Councillors who fought in the 2007 election did so because they wanted to make a difference in our town.

However, once elected, they found that the Council was well-run ethically, organisationally and

financially, and that the controlling Labour group was already committed to continual improvement. In terms of policy, the budget and future plans, the Independents have not made any meaningful difference to the Town Council.

Consequently, some Independent Councillors, in the fifth year of this Council, are now just 'going through the motions' and taking the money. Recent letters have named three individuals in particular.

Since these Councillors attend fewer than 10 times in a year (for which they are receiving an effective rate of pay

in excess of £100 an hour), and don't speak when they do attend, how can they claim to be representing the people who elected them?

It is a scandal which we feel we need to bring to the attention of the public. We ask those Councillors to consider whether it is time to resign. There are people, active in our community, who deserve the opportunity to join the Council and make a contribution to our town ... and these silent/inactive Councillors are getting in their way.

Town Centre Update

The Management team of Aycliffe Town Centre are delighted to announce that the "Stopping Up Order" for the footpath off Greenwell Road was confirmed this week. Now that the footpath has been closed, it is possible to proceed with the enabling works for the new Aldi store and diverting the gas and electricity supplies that run through the site.

Northern Electric Distribution Ltd (NEDL) have supplied the following information regarding the diversion of existing electricity cable - LV Diversion in Dalton Way. This section is the part across Dalton Road; all excavation will take place in the highway, outside the site on Sunday 23rd October through to 21st November. After then all cables will be in the locations as per the agreed plan. Northern Gas Networks (NGN) will commence their diversions on Monday 24th October and the works are expected to take two weeks to complete.

A building contractor has been selected for the new Aldi store and works are expected to commence at the start of 2012.

Editorial

WHAT ABOUT OUR TOWN CENTRE?

In this issue is information on a report by a Government agency aiming to improve town centres. How this or any report affects Newton Aycliffe is open to speculation. We are unusual, perhaps unique, in having a town centre which is privately owned and no one yet has been able to over-rule what the owners say or want in relation to marketing, rent levels or improvements to the environment.

Some pressure has been applied to influence what is now taking place and one has to accept the landlords are making a respectable effort in the current poor economic climate.

But, the long awaited re-development is slow in coming and we just have to wait and hope it will eventually lead to a centre in which we can take some pride. Maybe then Newtonians will return to support our shopkeepers.

Newton News made the suggestion often that the town centre pedestrian areas should be returned to public ownership so that we could take advantage of funding from other sources and make environmental improvements to make it more attractive.

Other Town Centres nearby have received help in this respect from the local authority and other funding sources and Aycliffe has missed out because the centre is privately owned.

Shildon for example had a major improvement scheme and other local towns have been tidied up and given a face lift.

Perhaps if we had possession of our own town centre (when the landlords have completed the redevelopment) we could instill some civic pride to ensure it remained an attraction to visitors. We could also then take advantage of schemes to help town centres, currently being discussed.

PREPARATION FOR JUBILEE WOODLAND

Great Aycliffe Town Council have agreed to plant a new woodland to mark the Queens Diamond Jubilee in 2012. The area which covers approximately 2 hectares is in Woodham Burn and runs along the bank side between Kendrew Close and the back of Woodham Technical College and will include a series of woodland copses separated by areas of wildflower meadows.

Preparation works have already begun with the areas to be planted up with trees being sprayed off with herbicide in late September to ensure the trees have a maximum chance of survival in the future. The grass is beginning to die

back now and so the area which will be planted with trees is now clearly visible to anyone walking the area. "Check it Out" is an interactive installation that is made by young people for young people. It uses film, graphics, light and sound to explore teenage issues. "Check it Out" has been funded by GAMP Area Action Partnership to tour to Greenfield and Woodham Schools so every young person 11-16 can experience it. REPORT ILLEGAL SALE OF FIREWORKS

A new hotline is available for County Durham residents to report illegal sales of fireworks. In conjunction with the Safe Durham Partnership, Durham County Council's trading standards team has launched the number in a bid to tackle an increase in unregistered sellers, the supply of banned fireworks and illegal sales to children. As bonfire night approaches flyers promoting the hotline will be delivered to homes in problem hotspots, asking for help to identify anyone selling fireworks from houses, pubs, mobile shops and car boot sales. Last year the council seized a large quantity of illegal bangers, that when tested on a dummy, were shown capable of blowing someone's hand off. Joanne Waller, head of environment, health and consumer protection, said: "With the recession the offer of cheap fireworks may be tempting but people must be very careful as they might not comply with strict safety standards and can be very dangerous." Cllr Bob Young, Cabinet member for strategic environment, added: "The community can play a big part in tackling the issues associated with the supply of illegal goods and sales to youngsters. "Aside from the nuisance caused by misuse, none of us want unsafe fireworks to fall into the hands of our children and put them at risk." All illegal fireworks seized by

I was sorry to hear that J.D.Clare had retired as he now has too much time on his hands to act as an apologist for New Labour, and the mess the last government left behind.

PLANNING CONSENT SOUGHT FOR NEW POLICE HQ AT DURHAM

Durham Police Authority are seeking the go ahead to build a new headquarters fit for 21st century policing.

Full planning consent is being sought for a three-storey building at Aykley Heads, Durham.

Durham County Council is also being asked to give outline planning consent for housing on the site where the present police HQ is located.

If the go-ahead is given, it is hoped that building work will start in October next year on what is envisaged to be an 18-month contract. If it all goes to plan the new premises could be open as soon as April 2014.

In support and in advance of the planning consent, the proposed plans will go 'on the road' around the force area, for the benefit of interested members of the public as well as Durham Constabulary officers and staff.

One of the roadshows will be held on **Tuesday 25th October** at Newton Aycliffe Police Station on the Business Park from 5:30pm - 7:30pm

The new development is being designed with the highest 'green' credentials as well as creating a modern office environment for up to 480 officers and staff.

The present headquarters dates back to 1969 when the first phase was opened by former Prime Minister Jim Callaghan, who was then Secretary of State. It is no longer considered fit for purpose, with extremely high running and maintenance costs, coupled with the fact it does not lend itself to modern working conditions.

The new building will represent a considerable saving to the Police Authority, at a time when every penny spent is being scrutinised.

New 21st Century Town Centres Report explains practical steps to help town centres to survive and to thrive

The New report offers a new vision for town centres and explains 5 key practical steps to turn vision to reality

It outlines NEW approaches to revitalising town centres. Town centres and high streets are under enormous strain. Household spending is falling, shops are closing and public spending is being squeezed. If our town centres are to survive and thrive again, we need to think more radically and more intelligently about their future.

The government has commissioned Mary Portas to conduct a review of the UK's high streets. Action for Market Towns (AMT) launched a new 21st Century Town Centres

light of the recent recession and the continuing strain on consumer spending.

"Action for Market Towns has long championed the important multi-faceted role that the town centre plays and has been working with communities on a wide range of initiatives such as benchmarking, tourism development, retail competitiveness and accessibility.

"We encourage Mary Portas, in her review into the UK's high street, not only to improve the opportunities available to the independent retailer but also to explore the wider role of the town centre as a focal point for neighbourhoods and social activity.

"Our new report suggests tried and tested practical ways of encouraging people back into the town centre with innovative solutions and promoting a sustainable future for the centres that make our many small towns so distinctive."



Aycliffe Firm Helps Football Academy

YOUNG soccer stars will be hoping to demolish the opposition this season thanks to brand new kit sponsored by a North-East firm. The lucky 40 boys and girls selected for a unique football academy will be given extra power with shirts sporting the moniker Tyne Tees Demolition, as well as shorts, jumpers, rain jackets and socks, worth £150 per student.

Based at nearby Aycliffe Business Park, the firm specialises in deconstruction but will be helping Greenfield Community College-based Martin Gray's Football Academy, build on its success.

Tyne Tees Demolition is awaiting news after being nominated for the World Demolition Awards, due to be announced in Holland next month. They were selected for their work removing seven redundant bridges over the A1, where it is currently being widened in North Yorkshire.

"We may have knocked them down in North Yorkshire but this sponsorship deal is about building bridges with the community," said managing director David Gauja. My co-director Andrew Verity knows Martin and we were only too pleased to help provide the youngsters with their kit."

The Martin Gray Football Academy is a pioneering initiative to engage young people in their studies using the power of the game.

Greenfield College took 200 students through the rigors of five trials, selecting 29 boys and 11 girls. On top of their normal 25 hours of school work, they get an additional two hours of education and are then coached by Martin, a former Sunderland AFC footballer, his colleague Brian Atkinson, who played centre mid-field for Sunderland in the 1992 FA Cup final and their coaching staff. Students get the chance to

train professionally and increase the opportunities of being scouted by clubs. They also receive expert tuition on nutrition and have access to a professional sports physiotherapist to help with any injuries. Martin said: "We are really grateful to Tyne Tees Demolition for their support, which is absolutely fabulous. The academy works really well and is a great opportunity for all concerned."

Assistant head teacher at Greenfield Community College Stuart Dixon said: "We wanted something students could strive to achieve, to raise attainment and grades, not just in the academy but across the whole school. The effect has been unbelievable."

"We also work with ten feeder primary schools and have had meetings with another five schools interested in the project. It's powerful, it's innovative and it balances nicely with the school's other specialisms of science and the arts." Martin and his team currently offer enrichment programmes to 17 local schools. Greenfield Community College is the only school in the country

currently running its own academy with Martin at the professional football helm.
