£150k Training Boost for Aycliffe

£150,000 is being used to fund a programme of training to help people in Newton Aycliffe and the surrounding area into work. It's the biggest project to date for Great Aycliffe and Middridge Partnership (GAMP) and will see cash spent on both an Employability Skills Fund, which can respond to specific training needs, and a Discretionary Fund which will remove the barriers that prevent people from accessing training. Examples of specialist training include: Fork Lift Truck training, Gas training, Tiling, Plumbing and Plastering, Hazardous Off-Shore training, HGV Training. £30,000 has come from the GAMP area budget with additional funding from Councillors Joan Gray, Paul Gittins, Dorothy Bowman, Mike Dixon, Enid Paylor, John Moran and Sarah Iveson's Neighbourhood

Budget totalling £60,000. Further funding has come from Bishop Auckland College, Sedgfield Borough Homes, South Durham Enterprise Agency and MEARS bringing the total to £147,910. The project will be launched on November 1st at Newton Aycliffe Learning Centre. Representatives from GAMP, Bishop Auckland College, Sedgfield Borough Homes, South Durham Enterprise Agency and MEARS will attend with some of the Councillors. Brian Riley, GAMP coordinator, said: "One of GAMP's key priorities is Employment, Job Prospects and Enterprise. "This project is unique to the GAMP area and brings together a wide range of partners to address barriers to employment and it is hoped that the project will be of immense benefit to the town's job seekers."

Personnel Sub Committee: 2 Independents, 7 Labour.
Appeals Sub Committee: 3 Independents, 7 Labour.
Audit Sub Committee: 1 Independent, 7 Labour.

Asset Management Working Group: 3 Independents, 6 Labour.
Charges Working Group: 0 Independents, 3 Labour.
Golf Course Working Group: 0 Independents 3 Labour.
(I am the only Councillor that plays golf and was on this committee for years, but the Labour Group would not vote me on).
Show Working Group: 2 Independents, 7 Labour.
Planning Sub Committee: 2 Independents, 7 Labour.
Independents do speak at these committees and put things forward, but are always out-voted.
Independents put their names forward to stand for Mayor and Deputy Mayor but never make it, because they are not Labour.
The allowance for

Councillors was decided by an independent panel which stated that all should be reimbursed to cover the cost of travel to meetings, home and mobile phone calls and the time they spend representing residents of their Ward. They also may attend other meetings like Sure Start, PACT, School Governing bodies etc. As an Alderman I attend Durham County Council meetings and also represent and deal with residents complaints. The Labour Party have created their complaint against some Independents by keeping them off committees. Meetings go on for more than 1 hour, sometimes 2 or 3. A Councillors work is not just attending meetings and never ends.

Asking for Independents to stand down is ridiculous! Only 3 weeks ago, in this same paper, there was a complaint of a Labour Councillor not returning phone calls.

How many Labour Councillors really work for the people in their Ward? Some residents do not even know who their Labour representatives are, and has never been seen in the Ward.

It is time that the Labour controlled Council stopped trying to put the Independents -down and give them fair representation.

It was the people who put them there, not the Labour group.

REPORT ON COUNCIL MEETING WEDNESDAY 19th OCTOBER

Council meetings run in 6-week cycles, with three weeks 'on' and then a gap, and I always find the start of the new cycle exciting - it reminds me a little of the start of a new term at school!

The first meeting of the cycle is the Environment Committee, and Wednesday's meeting heard pleasing updates on the Environment volunteers, community and school groups, and the new Jubilee woodland. The Council is in discussion with Durham County Council to improve winter maintenance (snow clearing), but we wait upon DCC to fit the necessary snow ploughs and gritting equipment.

We were also told, similarly, that the Council is ready to adopt the train station as agreed last September, but that we are waiting for Network Rail to do the preliminary work it pledged to do. (Thus we wait on both matters.)

Finally, members received the Draft Environment Budget for next year. They heard inflation had added £9,700 to costs over and above last year (£2,600 net after efficiency savings), and that an additional investment of £1,000 had also been made to provide for the purchase of the free dog bags which the Council issues to the public. A further £15,000 has been put aside to enable the Council to take over flower beds which may be removed by DCC (the Council is firmly of the opinion that in these times of

economic recession it is more important than ever to keep our township looking colourful and attractive). The Council agreed the Draft Environment Budget unanimously.

The Recreation Committee follows immediately after the Environment Committee.

After a number of reports, including an encouraging Golf Complex report, but an Oak Leaf Sports Complex report which revealed a dip in usage and takings, the Council took two important decisions.

The first authorised officers to seek tenders for laying a tarmac surface on the Oak Leaf running track. Every year, after the Great Aycliffe Show, the Council receives complaints about the running track - either it was dry and people had been sand-blasted in the wind, or it was wet and like a quagmire. Surfacing the running track with tarmac would solve this,

and provide a hard surface for the Aycliffe Running Club. At £45,000, such a track will not be cheap, but when Labour Councillors Brian Hall and Enid Paylor brought a motion that a permanent tarmac surface be put in place, members unanimously agreed that it should be done out of next year's budget.

Which brought us, of course, to the Draft Recreation Budget for next year. Members heard that inflation had added £73,250 to costs over and above last year (£28,750 net after efficiency savings) including provision in case Sports Complex income was further hit by the recession. Officers also announced the proposed capital budget spending, mainly to meet the Council's rolling maintenance programme. Again, all Councillors, of all political persuasions, agreed the Budget unanimously.

PCP Receives £50,000 Grant

The Pioneering Care Partnership (PCP) is celebrating thanks to a £50,000 grant from the Department of Health's Health and Social Care Volunteering Fund.

This vital funding will help the PCP enhance their work in the local community through the use of volunteers. The PCP have 64 volunteers, more than paid staff, and are experienced in recruiting, supporting and training volunteers working in activities across the organisation.

This funding will assist PCP to further develop its volunteering support and training programme as well as enabling PCP to work towards Mentoring and Befriending Services' to an Approved Provider Standard. The Pioneering Care Partnership is one of only 51 organisations across England to receive funding from the HSCVF Local Grant Scheme 2011. The HSCVF enables these organisations to increase their capacity in volunteering in the health, public health and social care sector.

Each successful organisation was selected for excellence in one of the following criteria: Patient-Led NHS; Delivering Better Health Outcomes; Improving Public Health; or Improving Health and Social Care.

Care Services Minister Paul Burstow said: "Volunteers are a great asset in promoting and improving health. The funding I have announced will mean the Pioneering Care Partnership (PCP) can get volunteers involved in providing real support that will help local communities and give the volunteers invaluable experience and skills."

Jane Hartley, PCP Chief Executive said, "We are delighted to have been successful in our application;



this funding will enable PCP to develop a new volunteer re-ablement buddy scheme over the next 2 and a half years.

Through this funding we will recruit and train 30 buddies to support people who leave hospital to access a range of services to enhance their health and quality of life."

The Pioneering Care Partnership is a local charity and company limited by guarantee. Set up in 1998 to support people who may have become disadvantaged through caring responsibilities, age or ill health and within disadvantaged communities across County Durham, Darlington and beyond.

Their mission is to 'improve people's health, wellbeing and quality of life and reducing inequalities in health.'

The HSCVF is innovative as the grant package includes integral capacity building support. The HSCVF funding programme is designed to help voluntary, community and social enterprise organisations (VCSEs) become more sustainable in order to deliver an effective role within their local community.

VCSEs will also take forward elements of the Big Society by delivering services that will add value to statutory provision in their localities.

Clean up Your Mess or be Fined!

Action taken to tidy up the south of the county has resulted in over 1,000 litter clearing notices being issued in the last year.

Durham County Council's neighbourhood wardens handed them out between August 2010 and September 2011 to tackle problems in Wear Valley, Teesdale and Newton Aycliffe areas.

A number of litter clearing notices led to successful court prosecutions for residents who failed to clean up their properties or land.

Under the Environmental Protection Act 1990 and the Clean Neighbourhoods and Environment Act 2005 the council can now request owners or occupiers to clear any land that is defaced by litter or refuse that is detrimental to the local area.

Anyone served with a litter clearance notice must clean up their yard or garden, and failure to comply can result in the issuing of a fixed penalty fine.

Richard Brown, neighbourhood warden co-ordinator (south), said: "There are 1,000 cleaner yards, gardens and pieces of land in south Durham, which can only be a positive step."

"We are committed to providing safer and cleaner communities by ensuring that land in the area is kept free of rubbish, litter and refuse."

APPLICATION FOR THREE HOUSES NEAR PUB WOULD TAKE AWAY GREEN AREA

Dear Sir,
Enterprise Inns Ltd have applied for outline planning permission to build three houses on the plot of green open space next to the Huntsman Car Park at the bottom of Pemberton Road in Woodham.

I don't know what you think about this, but as far as I am concerned it is yet another attempt to fill up the green open spaces in our town with buildings. Most readers will know that I have no objection to an outward expansion on the outskirts of town, provided

it is surrounded by a green buffer zone, but I'm against this constant infilling, which threatens the 'green' nature of our garden town. However, this was not what worried me most about this application, but the fact that the company's agents

had submitted an 18-page document in support of the application - citing, no less, the Draft National Planning Policy Framework (DNPPF). The document cited the Framework's presumption in favour of sustainable development, and stated the benefit to the community of providing housing. It even noted that Durham County Council had not yet produced its Local Plan, and quoted the DNPPF's provision that planning authorities should look to grant permission 'where the Local Plan is absent, silent, indeterminate or out of date'!

Now - apart from the outrage that the application is citing a document which was still under consultation, never mind not yet law - does this not worry you? Did I not warn that if the DNPPF became law we would see a rush to build on every green space, citing this 'presumption in favour of sustainable development'? I fear it is impossible to underestimate the danger that the DNPPF poses to our green town environment, and we must continue to lobby the Government to see sense. I for a start will be writing to the Government to point out this misuse of the DNPPF and its implications.

In the meantime if you, as I, oppose this infill housing on the green field land next to the Huntsman car park, email planningspennymoor@durham.gov.uk, quoting case number 7/2011/0380/DM (DL5 4UE), giving your name address and telephone number, and saying simply that you object to the loss of green field amenity open space. Your objection will have more impact if you add why you value and wish to retain this open space. (You can see the full application on the Durham County website at http://www2.sedgefield.gov.uk/planning_search/alldetails.php?ID=32556.) You have until 3rd November, when the consultation period ends.

ACCIDENT & EMERGENCY SERVICE ACCESS EXPLAINED

Knowledge of how to appropriately access medical treatment, within our Trust area, is something many people find confusing, especially when they are confronted by a serious medical situation.

I hope in this article, to offer some basic guidelines as to when and how to access either Accident and Emergency, or the care and treatment offered by Urgent Care Centres.

First of all let me put your mind at rest regarding which telephone number you should ring (be it 999 or 111). Do not worry if you get it wrong, experienced operators will assess your medical situation and channel you towards the most appropriate pathway to treatment. It is 999 for Emergency and 111 for other non-life threatening medical problems.

Accident and Emergency began in the 1960s, and was known as Casualty, later Accident and Emergency and now increasingly to avoid confusion, will be known as The Emergency Department. When should you ring 999? When a person is badly injured or showing signs of critical illness, such as poisoning or a heart attack. Other conditions suitable for 999, would include severe blood loss, chest pains, shortness of breath, choking and blacking out, or other situations where speed is of the essence.

Within County Durham and Darlington NHS Foundation Trust area, there are two Accident and Emergency centres: Darlington Memorial Hospital and the University Hospital of North Durham, Durham City. A. and E. is staffed on a 24-hour basis, with a mix of different doctors, nurses, consultants and other senior staff on call throughout the night.

We are currently collating statistics to see if the closure of one A. and E. department, in Hartlepool, has meant an increase in pressure on A. and

E. services, within our area.

There are six Urgent Care Centres in our Trust area. I have visited them all and they offer outstanding medical facilities, offering provision, in no way inferior to that given by Accident and Emergency for situations that would not be considered life threatening. They were set up to take the pressure off Accident and Emergency Departments, not to replace them. The nearest Urgent Care Centres to us are at Bishop Auckland General Hospital, Dr Piper House, King Street, Darlington, as well as the University Hospital of North Durham.

You access these if it is not a medical emergency, but are still needing treatment fairly quickly. You should ring 111. Your situation will then be assessed and is known as Triage. You will be offered an appointment time that is most suitable for you and your condition, at whichever Urgent Care Centre is the most convenient for you.

Ambulances are provided for 999 cases only, but dependent on the age or infirmity of the patient, any assistance required would be assessed during '111' Triage.

If you have a chest infection, urinary infection, suspected eye infection, cuts, bruises, sprained ankle, toe, hand or wrist fracture, you probably need to phone 111 and then get yourself to an Urgent Care Centre. They are open 24/7 and are manned by a doctor (usually a GP) as well as senior nursing and paramedic staff (primary care practitioners). Several have X-ray provision, though this usually closes during the late evening/night time hours. If you turn up at an Urgent Care Centre without an appointment, you will not be turned away. They try to triage you within twenty minutes and either treat you then and there, or ideally offer you an agreed appointment time. Urgent Care Centres are there

for the whole week, however, they often come into their own from Friday evening onwards.

Especially so on a weekend and at other times when your surgery is closed or when the provision offered by the Urgent Care Centre is more appropriate.

There are grey areas and potential overlaps between the services offered by A. and E. and the Urgent Care Centres. However, be assured, whether

you phone 111 or 999, you will receive the appropriate advice and help.

I hope that this information will be of some benefit to you and I will try to keep you informed about other developments within our Trust area.

AUTUMN LEAVES - DANGER TO DRIVERS

Road safety charity the IAM is offering motoring tips from Britain's top advanced driver, Peter Rodger.

Clear out plenum chambers – the tray-like area under the bonnet, below the windscreen. This can fill up with water

when it gets blocked with leaves.

A patch of wet leaves can be as dangerous as hitting standing water – take care and reduce your speed before driving onto them.

In cold weather, clear

windcreens of condensation or ice before setting off. Always give yourself extra time, to ensure visibility is at an optimum.

Make sure your wiper blades are in good condition. If they squeak as they wipe, they probably need replacing, and always make sure they are turned off before starting the ignition to save the blades and the risk of a blown motor fuse.

Autumn can also take its toll on car batteries – keep the top of the battery clean and dry and make sure the terminals are tight and free from corrosion.

If a battery is more than three years old, check it now; you might save yourself many a frustrating start to a morning.





AYCLIFFE PREPARE FOR VISIT OF VASE LEGENDS

Newton Aycliffe are preparing for one of their biggest home games of the season, when Whitley Bay visit Moore Lane Park next weekend.

The FA Vase legends make the trip to Aycliffe next Saturday as Aycliffe look to get their Northern League second division campaign back on track following consecutive defeats in the last week.

Allan Oliver's side hope to bounce back from their 2-1 defeat at home to Penrith last Saturday, which saw them slip to eighth in the table, when they go to local rivals West Auckland Town this Friday night.

They then face Chester-le-Street at home in the Durham Challenge Cup on Wednesday night, followed by the visit of fourth-placed Bay on Saturday. The Seahorses won the FA Vase at Wembley in May for a record fourth time, their third successive Vase triumph, and boast the biggest following in the Northern League, averaging 500 home gates. They take the biggest following of fans to away games, so Aycliffe are expecting their biggest league attendance of the season. Aycliffe's biggest league crowd this season was when 291 watched West Auckland win 2-1 at Moore Lane in September, while a crowd of 379 watched Aycliffe's FA Vase draw at home to Shildon 8 days later. Chairman Gary Farley said: "It's another big date in our calendar but every game is a big game in this league. We went to Whitley Bay as a second division side last season and beat them 4-1 in the cup, and our results this season have proved we shouldn't fear anyone."

Aycliffe crashed to a third-successive home defeat with a disappointing 2-1 defeat against Penrith last Saturday. The Newtonians led through debutant Phil Robinson's first-half goal, but the visitors struck twice in two second-half minutes to snatch the three points and ensure an enjoyable

But just as it looked Aycliffe were going to earn a scrappy three points, the visitors struck on 73 minutes, to level the contest.

Aycliffe were still reeling when Penrith took the lead two minutes later. Coleman was the architect and his pass left Davidson with the simple task of slotting into an empty net.
