£150k Training **Boost for Aycliffe**

£150,000 is being used to fund a programme of training to help people in Newton Avcliffe and the surrounding area into work. It's the biggest project to date for Great Aycliffe and Middridge Partnership (GAMP) and will see cash spent on both an Employability Skills Fund, which can respond to specific training needs, and a Discretionary Fund which will remove the barriers that prevent people from accessing training. Examples of specialist training include: Fork Lift Truck training, Gas training, Tiling,

Plumbing and Plastering, Hazardous Off-Shore training, HGV Training. £30,000 has come from the GAMP area budget with additional funding from Councillors Joan Gray, Paul Gittins, Dorothy Bowman,

Budget totalling £60,000. Further funding has come from Bishop Auckland Sedgefield College, Borough Homes, South Durham Enterprise Agency and MEARS bringing the total to £147,910. The project will be launched

on November 1st at Newton Aycliffe Learning Centre. Representatives from GAMP, Bishop Auckland College, Sedgefield Borough Homes, South Enterprise Durham Agency and MEARS will attend with some of the Councillors.

Brian Riley, GAMP coordinator, said: "One of GAMP's key priorities is Employment, Job Prospects and Enterprise.

"This project is unique to the GAMP area and brings together a wide range of partners to address barriers to employment and it is hoped that the project will be of immense benefit to the town's job seekers."

The first meeting of the cycle is the Environment Committee, and Wednesday's meeting heard pleasing updates on the Environment volunteers. community and school groups, and the new Jubilee woodland. They heard inflation had added £9.700 to costs over and above last year (£2,600 net after efficiency savings), and that an additional investment of £1,000 had also been made to provide for the purchase of the free dog bags which the Council issues to the public. A further £15,000 has been put aside to enable the Council to take over flower beds which may be removed by DCC (the Council is firmly of the opinion that in these times of

Clean up Your Mess or be Fined!

Action taken to tidy up the south of the county has resulted in over 1,000 litter clearing notices being issued in the last

vear. Durham County Council's neighbourhood wardens handed them out between August 2010 and September 2011 to tackle problems in Wear Valley, Teesdale and Newton Aycliffe areas.

A number of litter clearing notices led to successful court prosecutions for residents who failed to clean up their properties or land. Under the Environmental

Protection Act 1990 and the Clean Neighbourhoods and Environment Act 2005 the council can now request owners or occupiers to clear any land that is defaced by litter or refuse that is detrimental to the local area.

Anyone served with a litter clearance notice must clean up their yard or garden, and failure to comply can result in the issuing of a fixed penalty

Failure to pay this can lead to

Failure to pay this can lead to prosecution. Richard Brown, neigh-bourhood warden co-ordinator (south), said: "There are 1,000 cleaner yards, gardens and pieces of land in south Durham, which can only be a

positive step. "We are committed to providing safer and cleaner communities by ensuring that land in the area is kept free of rubbish, litter and refuse.

The Recreation Committee follows immediately after the Environment Committee.

After a number of reports including an encouraging Golf Complex report, but an Oak Leaf Sports Complex report which revealed a dip in usage and takings, the Council took two important decisions. The first authorised officers

to seek tenders for laying a tarmac surface on the Oak Leaf running track. Every year, after the Great Aycliffe Show, the Council receives complaints about the running track - either it was dry and people had been sand-blasted in the wind, or it was wet and like a quagmire. Surfacing the running track with tarmac would solve this.

and provide a hard surface for the Aycliffe Running Club. At £45,000, such a track will not be cheap, but when Labour Councillors Brian Hall and Enid Paylor brought a motion that a permanent tarmac surface be put in place, members unanimously agreed that it should be done out of next year's budget.

Which brought us, of course, to the Draft Recreation Budget for next year. Members heard that inflation had added £73,250 to costs over and above last year (£28,750 net after efficiency savings) including provision in case Sports Complex income was further hit by the recession. Officers also announced the proposed capital budget spending, mainly to meet the Council's rolling maintenance programme. Again, all Councillors, of all political persuasions, agreed the Budget unanimously.

appropriately access medical treatment, within our Trust area, is something many people confusing, especially when they are confronted by a serious medical situation.

I hope in this article, to offer some basic guidelines as to when and how to access either Accident and Emergency, or the care and treatment offered by Urgent Care Centres. First of all let me put your

mind at rest regarding which telephone number you should ring (be it 999 or 111). Do not worry if you get it wrong, experienced operators will assess your medical situation and channel you towards the most appropriate pathway to treatment. It is 999 for Emergency and 111 for other non-life threatening medical problems.

Accident and Emergency began in the 1960 s, and was known as Casualty, later Accident and Emergency and now increasingly to avoid confusion, will be known as The Emergency Department.

When should you ring 999.? When a person is badly injured or showing signs of critical illness, such as poisoning or a heart attack. Other conditions suitable for 999, would include severe blood loss, chest pains, shortness of breath, choking and blacking out, or other situations where speed is of the essence.

Within County Durham and Darlington NHS Foundation Trust area, there are two Accident and Emergency centres: Darlington Memorial Hospital and the University Hospital of North Durham, Durham City. A. and E. is staffed on a 24-hour basis, with a mix of different doctors, nurses, consultants and other senior staff on call throughout

We are currently collating statistics to see if the closure of one A. and E. department, in Hartlepool, has meant an There are six Urgent Care Centres in our Trust area. I have visited them all and they offer outstanding medical facilities, offering provision, in no way inferior to that given by Accident and Emergency for situations that would not be

considered life threatening. They were set up to take the pressure off Accident and Emergency Departments, not to replace them. The nearest Urgent Care Centres to us are at Bishop Auckland General Hospital, Dr Piper House, King Street, Darlington, as well as the University Hospital

of North Durham. You access these if it is not a medical emergency, but are still needing treatment fairly quickly. You should ring 111. Your situation will then be assessed and is known as Triage. You will be offered an appointment time that is most suitable for you and your condition, at whichever Urgent Care Centre is the most convenient for you.

Ambulances are provided for 999 cases only, but dependent on the age or infirmity of the patient, any assistance required would be assessed during '111' Triage.

If you have a chest infection, urinary infection, suspected eye infection, cuts, bruises, sprained ankle, toe, hand or wrist fracture, you probably need to phone 111 and then get yourself to an Urgent Care Centre. They are open 24/7 and are manned by a doctor (usually a GP) as well as senior nursing and paramedic staff (primary care practitioners). Several have X-ray provision, though this usually closes during the late evening/night time hours. If you turn up at an Urgent Care Centre without an appointment, you will not be turned away. They try to triage you within twenty minutes and either treat you then and there, or ideally offer you an agreed appointment time. Urgent Care Centres are there

for the whole week, however, they often come into their own from Friday evening onwards. Especially so on a weekend and at other times when your surgery is closed or when the provision offered by the Urgent Care Centre is more appropriate.

There are grey areas and potential overlaps between the services offered by A. and E. and the Urgent Care Centres. However, be assured, whether

you phone 111 or 999, you will receive the appropriate advice and help.

I hope that this information will be of some benefit to you and I will try to keep you informed about other developments within our Trust area.



Newton Aycliffe are preparing for one of their biggest home games of the season, when Whitley Bay visit Moore Lane Park next weekend.

The FA Vase legends make the trip to Aycliffe next Saturday as Aycliffe look to get their Northern League second division campaign back on track following consecutive defeats in the last week.

Allan Oliver's side hope to bounce back from their 2-1 defeat at home to Penrith last Saturday, which saw them slip to eighth in the table, when they go to local rivals West Auckland Town this Friday night.

They then face Chester-le-Street at home in the Durham Challenge Cup on Wednesday night, followed by the visit of fourth-placed Bay on Saturday. The Seahorses won the FA Vase at Wembley in May for a record fourth time, their third successive Vase triumph, and boast the biggest following in the Northern League, averaging 500 home gates.

They take the biggest following of fans to away games, so Aycliffe are expecting their biggest league attendance of the season. Aycliffe's biggest league crowd this season was when 291 watched West Auckland win 2-1 at Moore Lane in September, while a crowd of 379 watched Avcliffe's FA Vase draw at home to Shildon 8 days later. Chairman Gary Farley said: "It's another big date in our calendar but every game is a big game in this league. We went to Whitley Bay as a second division side last season and beat them 4-1 in the cup, and our results this season have proved we shouldn't fear anyone

Avcliffe crashed to a thirdsuccessive home defeat with a disappointing 2-1 defeat against Penrith last Saturday. The Newtonians led through debutant Phil Robinson's first-half goal, but the visitors struck twice in two secondhalf minutes to snatch the three points and ensure an enjoyable
