

POLICE TACKLE METAL THEFT

Members of Durham Police Authority have expressed support of Durham Constabulary's commitment and forward-thinking initiatives tackling metal theft.

Durham Constabulary has developed a clear strategy in response to metal thefts, developed under Operation Hansell. Policing teams have been set up within each area as well as dedicated Road Policing staff targeting specific offenders and scrap metal recycling yards to reduce metal thefts across County Durham and Darlington.

Police Authority Member Counc. Richard Bell highlighted the urgent need for a change in the law, urging the public to sign up to the government's e-petition initiative (http://epetitions. direct.gov.uk/) to influence government policy.

direct.gov.uk/) to influence government policy. The Scrap Metal Dealers Act 1964 was intended to regulate the scrap metal industry; however there are limitations which means a lack of identification being required. The British Transport Police have approached Durham Constabulary to lead on delivering an enhanced identification trial with scrap yards as a pre-cursor to potential legislation changes, and to assist with identification of good practice in relation to problem solving metal theft.

On recent increase in metal thefts affecting members of the public nationally, Councillor Eddie Bell, congratulated Operation Hansell's response to the complaints of local people, from both rural and

built-up areas. Instances such as theft of drain covers, which can cause serious hazards to pedestrians and vehicles, is just one example of metal theft local police have had to deal with

Chief Superintendent Dave Orford said: "From a policing perspective, we not only see the impact metal theft has on individual victims but also the impact this has on the infrastructure (e.g. metal stolen from railways or BT phone cabling) which affects the wider community. Metal theft continues to be a force priority with performance targets managed on a weekly basis". Counc Garry Huntington said there are genuine dealers in the region and enquired how they can take steps to work co-operatively with the police in the future. Chief

Superintendent Dave Orford responded: "The outcome for legitimate dealers is they can have a very positive impact on their local community and work with the police, as this is an industry that is based on trust.

The dedicated metal theft teams set up through Operation Hansell are already starting to have an impact with 46 people arrested within the first two weeks, 10 of whom have been charged with additional crimes and nine currently on bail".

Tony Thompson, a serving magistrate and Chair of the North Durham Bench, commented on the work going on in the courts, with progress being made in regard to metal theft and expressed the view that both victim and community impact statements are valuable in the decision making process.

REPORT ON COUNCIL MEETING **WEDNESDAY 26th OCTOBER**

Aycliffe Jobless Figure Worst in County

The first item on the agenda of this important meeting was a presentation on the local economy by Mr Graham Wood from the Regeneration team at Durham County Council, who spoke of the efforts made by his team to 'move the economy on'.

Generally, it was a depressing talk. In Aycliffe, one-in-twenty people of working age are on Job Seekers Allowance, and one-in-seven is workless - both figures are worse than the County average, and significantly worse than the UK average.

There are upward-trending

areas of the economy (health, business services, tourism and wholesale and retail) and even successful areas within manufacturing (food, glass and mechanical and automotive engineering) but there is a lack of skilled workers. When he was asked about the prospects for unskilled workers, Mr Wood simply reiterated the need to skill up the workforce – work is going on through SEMTA to develop skills, with a focus on youth unemployment and apprenticeships.

Hitachi is, of course, a bright spot – at the moment the parties are going through 'contract closure' and beginning to move to 'mobilisation' – but the 7000 associated supply jobs are expected to go across Europe, and not just to the north-east. When he was asked about distribution attracting Mr talked about the need to have appropriate sites to offer this is something we MUST insist on when the next version of the County Plan is published.

There is obviously a need to revisit this issue. An Industrial Estate 'Occupiers Forum' is mooted but not organised. A Business Enterprises and Skills Strategy is 'in preparation'. disappointingly of all, Mr Wood found it difficult to tell us what role the Town Council might play in advancing the economy, beyond perhaps 'pushing the positive message'. The Councillors were worried, and supportive, and it was agreed to ask the Regeneration Team back again in a few months to investigate these issues more thoroughly, and to see what progress is being made. NORMAL BUSINESS

The Council decided not to give a grant towards restoring memorials in St Andrew's Churchyard; the Council already looks after the graveyard, and it would set precedent to start looking after the gravestones as well. The Chair allowed Cllr Blenkinsopp, who is not a member of the Committee but always attends, to speak to say how disappointed he was. Members voted unanimously not to send anyone to a conference on Europe (irrelevant), but agreed unanimously to send the Town Clerk to a conference

'Localism' initiative (vital). Councillors also unanimously - whilst recognising, of course, that the Council is not able to positively fund private businesses – confirmed for another year the reduction in the fee the Council charges to the Market Traders, in order to encourage the continuance of the Tuesday market.

CCTV: The creation of the Unitary Authority created a problem about who should pay for the CCTV cameras in the town, which has been rumbling on ever since. If the County Council paid, there was no doubt that Aycliffe is getting a substantially better service than anywhere else in the County ... but if the Town Council pays, it is a clear 'double taxation' issue. The County Council 'recently published a consultation exercise recommending that DCC pay for all the cameras in the town save two – those at the Oak Leaf Sports Complex and at the Council Works Depot (which were judged to be the responsibility of

the Town Council). This was felt by Councillors to be a very fair result, which they accepted; the Town Council will now fund the monitoring and maintenance of those two cameras.

Councillors agreed to accept next year's Overall Revenue and Capital Budget. They heard that officers expected to make a small net reduction (£3,750) in the Council's administration/ corporate services budget. Overall, however into account the inflationary increases in the Environment and Recreation budgets (explained in last week's Council Report) – in order to set what the Finance Manager called 'a prudent budget in the current economic climate', it was unanimously agreed to increase the precept for 2012/13 by 2.5% (about £3 a year for a Band A house).



The Town Council has agreed to assist DCC: - fill salt bins with salt provided by DCC and will assist with snow clearance from certain strategic footpaths with salt supplied by DCC. This will take place Mon-Fri. Weekends are not certain as there is no staff at work and the Town Council cannot pay for standby staff
