Aycliffe Remembers

Each vear the turnout for Armistice Day and Remembrance Sunday in Newton Aycliffe increases as the sacrifice of our soldiers, particularly touches conflicts, more people.

The heartbreaking scene of young people on parade wearing the badges of their father, killed in action, is more poignant than any words we express.

The Church Service in St. Clare's was less cramped this year due to a new arrangement where children had their own informal Remembrance Sunday in another hall and soldiers and cadets heard the Service relayed into an adjacent hall. Perhaps live video coverage on a large screen might be considered for next year to help them feel more involved?

The large Parade made one proud of a town which respectfully mourned the death of our service men and women. The Church Service completed that homage

with rousing hymns led by our Town Brass Band and solemn prayer.

It was heartwarming to see our young uniformed organisations on parade and they are to be commended for their smart appearance and excellent behaviour.

Revd Linda Potter in her address asked the congregation if we had earnt the freedoms won for us and whether or not we are making the best of the life we have been given from sacrifices made by others. She recalled the well worn phrase: "Greater love has no

man than this, that a man lay down his life for his friends' She called on everyone to pursue justice and peace and never question the valour of those who give their lives in conflict. More photos page 7



We would still be joined with Yarm, but the proposal is more acceptable and we could hopefully end up with the new constituency being called Aycliffe & Billingham?

Permission Granted for Houses Near Pub

Lam able to inform readers that despite my recent campaign in the Newton News outline planning permission has been granted for the plot of amenity land next to the Huntsman Pub

I regard this as a small setback for the community; it is yet another bit of green open space we have lost forever. We live in a spacious 'garden' town and (along with many people) I am concerned to try to prevent 'infilling' as far as possible.

However, it is general government policy that development housing should not take place in 'the countryside' but on land within town boundaries - so although this is utterly inappropriate for our community, we can only achieve as much as planning rules allow.

I regard this as a class issue. Rich people live in the country, and know the benefits of looking out on green and healthy vistas. The government would be quite happy to let us 'ordinary people' live in overcrowded warrens of concrete and

was specially built as part of a post-war vision which said that ordinary people too have the right to space and greenery so whilst not wishing to hinder proper development I will continue to campaign to keep Aycliffe 'green and pleasant'. Now that the Town Council has a Planning Sub-committee, Aycliffe people can know that Town Councillors are monitoring every planning application. ever, it is Durham County Council, not the Town Council, which is the Planning Authority and makes the final decisions. The Town Council
