are urging homeowners to be vigilant in the protection of their homes throughout the winter months.

Officers across the Newton Aycliffe and Spennymoor policing districts are policing encouraging people to tighten home security during the hours of darkness.

Dubbed 'Winter Nights'

the initiative aims to cut the number of house break-ins and remind people to lock property securely.

Community Inspector
Graham Milne, of
Spennymoor police said:
"This is a very safe area to live in and we don't want to alarm people. Crime figures are at an all-time low and we want to keep it that way'

"But because it gets dark before people get home from work, we want them to take some simple precautions to make their homes more secure and to deter burglars.' Crime prevention officer PC Mark Pheasant said an occupied property is generally a secure property, and residents must take steps to ensure that their home appears occupied. He said: "The message

He said: "The message is simple. Don't give the criminal the excuse to give your home a second look. Residents must take responsibility, and keep their homes locked and illuminated."

The Safe Durham Partnership advises residents to use timing switches to turn on lights or a radio around the house while they are out and ensure doors are locked at all

And after Christmas, gift packaging, such as computer boxes, which could alert potential thieves to items inside the house, should be carefully disposed of.

Burglars are also being targeted in the seasonal offensive as teams of uniformed and plain-clothed officers will patrol crime hot spots, targeting known offenders. Police beat teams and Neighbourhood wardens will also play a part. As they patrol their beats this year, they will be leaving calling cards at homes found to be vulnerable.

The Newton Aycliffe area has seen the most significant reduction in dwelling burglary across County Durham and Darlington this year, with offences down 42% on the same period last year and members of the Safe Durham Partnership are continuing their efforts to ensure this continues.

Dangerous Boundary Proposals

Aycliffe is in danger and needs your help. We know that the government is changing the constituency boundaries and that is unstoppable.

However, you may not have realised that there is a real danger in this that Aycliffe will lose the Greenfield-Middridge electoral district (i.e. most of the town west of Burnhill Way/Westmorland Way) to the Bishop Auckland constituency.

The problem affects the 'Shildon East' ward, which sits on the boundary between Bishop Auckland and Sedgefield. It includes both Thickley (in Shildon) and Greenfield-Middridge (in Avcliffe).

If 'Shildon East' is placed in Bishop Auckland, 4232 Aycliffe voters are stripped out of whatever constituency

the rest of Aycliffe is in.
At the recent Boundary Commission hearings in Darlington, I made an impassioned plea for the commissioners to split 'Shildon East' down the middle (as, in fact, it was split in the 2010 General Election). This would allow Thickley to go into Bishop Auckland, and Greenfield-Middridge to go with the rest of Aycliffe.

But readers need to know that splitting a ward like this is not allowed under Commission's rules (unless I have managed to convince them that there are 'exceptional and compelling reasons' to do so).

Sadly, what readers also need to know is that many of the other speakers at the hearings argued that it would be better to move Shildon East into Bishop Auckland. If that happens, we will 'lose' 4232 Aycliffe voters to a different constituency.

This would, of course, only affect General Elections Town and County Council elections will remain unaffected – but being split between two MPs will divide and disadvantage Aycliffe.



WATCH FOR COUNTY **CONSULTATIONS ON-LINE**

County Council publishes consultation documents consultation on which residents are invited to comment. Since these consultations usually announce changes which affect our lives, I would advise everybody to 'have their say'.

Until recently, there was a scheme whereby the County Council emailed you about new consultations as they happened; this seems to have ended. Instead, you now have to keep track of County Council consultations yourself at: http://www.durham.gov.uk/Pages/Service. aspx?ServiceId=867 (alternatively go to the DCC home page, and do a site search for 'Consultations'). If you bookmark this page, you will be able to check it from time to time for new consultations.

There are currently THREE consultations which affect Great Aycliffe. Actually, we fare relatively well in all three, but you might wish to reply to these consultations saying that you agree (to prevent objections from other areas causing the County Council to change its mind)

Household Waste Recycling Centres County Council is

closing down six HWRCs through the County. Our Heighington Lane HWRC is set to stay open, but it might be worthwhile might be replying to say you agree. (If it closes, we will it closes, we will have to drive to Roman Way.) You can reply, slightly inconveniently, by completing an online 14-question survey.

2. CCTV – Great Aycliffe will come out quite well if the consultation goes through. Of 141 cameras are proposed decommissioning for throughout the county, only 3 are in Aycliffe – one at the police station (which is closing anyway), and two on Town Council premises (which the Town Council can take over). The Town Council has formally welcomed the consultation recommendations. but you can email CCTVconsultation@ durham.gov.uk to give them

your views.
3. Community Buildings - faced with huge cuts to its budget, the County Council is having to rationalise the 120 community buildings which it owns. The plan is to target just 36 of them for million investment £2.15 (provided they formulate a business plan and find matched funding),

though future work will not be funded by the council The remaining 84 buildings are not initially targeted for funding and will either be sold, or offered to the community under 'asset transfer'.
It is an 'everybody loses

plan, but given that the buildings need £7.5 million capital investment and £2.5 million a year to maintain, it is difficult to see what else the County Council could do in the current circumstances.
The ONLY Great Aycliffe

building involved in this is Aycliffe Village Hall, and it is one of the 36 buildings prioritised for investment, but if you live in Ayeliffe Village way will in Aycliffe Village you will be very interested in this consultation.

It is intended that the consultation team will be present at the GAMP AAP forum on 22 November (at 6pm in the Newton Aycliffe Youth Centre), and DCC will be meeting with the Village Hall Committee.



same constituency.

Then we hear once the boundaries are decided another shift will follow a year later. Who decides on this nonsense and is it just keeping the 'boys' in jobs? 





EX-PLAYERS LAUNCH NEW BTEC SPORT DIPLOMA

Young people in Newton Aycliffe will get the chance to study sports development for the first time as part of an exciting new two-year course in the town.

The Martin Gray Football Academy will work alongside Greenfield Community College in partnership with Darlington College to deliver the full-time BTEC course at Greenfield and at the Excel Centre on Aycliffe Business Park.

The two-year Level 3 Diploma, equivalent to 3 'A' Level qualifications, will cover a variety of areas including physiology, sports coaching, nutrition and sports performance, and will provide scholars with a route to university as well as enhance their footballing ability.

The qualification will enable them to go on to study a degree in Health and Fitness or Sports Coaching, providing career pathways within the sports industry, health and fitness, sports development and coaching sectors

Martin Gray and his team, including former Sunderland and Darlington midfielder Brian Atkinson, will work with Greenfield College's teaching staff

to deliver the course, beginning September 2012. Atkinson will coach the scholars every morning at Greenfield's state-of-the-art 3G football facility before they head to the Excel Centre's education suites for afternoon tutorials with the Greenfield PE team.

Gray, who also works as Greenfield's director of football, said: "This is a unique course in that it's the first of its kind being made available in Newton Aycliffe and surrounding areas.

"It will give school-leavers in the town who love sport the opportunity to study their passion full-time, while improving their education and career prospects in the long-term.

"The course is focused on elite young footballers giving them the opportunity to progress within the game whilst having a clear focus of academic attainment to help them to the next tier of higher education or employment.

"We're really excited by this and we're looking forward to starting the trials next April before narrowing the applicants down to 30 for the inaugural year, starting next September."

Atkinson, who played more

than 300 career games for the Black Cats and Quakers and also won six England Under-21 caps, currently coaches his hometown club Newton Aycliffe, helping them win three promotions from the Durham Alliance League to the Northern League first division in the

last four years.
He said: "Thave a passion for football and for coaching, and both Martin and I share the same philosophies on playing football the right way.

"It will be my job to work with the scholars on a fulltime basis, to improve them as players but also as people, and it's something I'm really looking forward to"

Greenfield College's assistant head teacher Stuart Dixon added: "We're delighted to be working with Martin again on another exciting programme which will give school-leavers in Newton Aycliffe the chance to study within this model, on their door step for the very first time.

"Previously, pupils have had to travel outside the area to study this field, so we're excited at the prospect of delivering a new course for young people in Aycliffe and surrounding areas.

"Another fantastic byproduct of this course is that it will bring together 30 young footballers of exceptional quality who will then play together in the National Colleges League, bringing a higher standard of performance to the game in our town."

Darlington College Principal Tim Grant added: "I welcome this opportunity and I know it will have a really positive impact on young people who are passionate about their sport."





"Keep Aycliffe Green and Pleasant"

I fail to be convinced the Town Council Planning
Sub Committee will bring about any observations that will keep Aycliffe "green and pleasant". My assumption is based on the fact that the majority of Town Councillors, including the leaders, voted for the proposed houses, hotel, etc. Woodham Golf Course which will be a scar on the landscape for ever and maybe just the thin end of the wedge. Some of those Councillors were on the Council many years ago when the then owners of the course wanted to build the original bungalows, to which they vehemently objected, and should be fully aware that there was then a covenant on that land preventing house building. This seems to have disappeared or been forgotten!

The golf course itself would seem to be rather under-used, from observations when travelling past, and this is not just in wet conditions which seemingly cause drainage problems. Should planning permission be granted and, if as the owners of the course maintain, the increased usage of the course does not come about we could see further houses being built there in years to come as a precedent will have been set. I do not want to be able to say I told you so. I sincerely hope the County Council Planning Committee is not swayed by a free new roundabout as a County Council engineer told the Town Council several years ago that this was not the problem with the C35, the problem is the undulating nature of the road.

If as Bill Owen stated there has been over 400 letters of objection to the course that is a very significant percentage of the town's adult population. I am given to believe that there were only 5 residents who individually objected to the A&E Department being moved from Bishop Auckland to Darlington and that was, at the time, a very contentious issue. Four hundred letters

should show the level of

feeling towards the proposal

and should not be ignored.

Our MP and other objectors to the wind farm on the Council would seem be very inconsistent when it comes to green areas surrounding the town. Whatever your views on the proposed wind farm it will only be there for 25 years we are told. However, the lovely green wedge of land at one of the entrances to our town will be lost forever if planning permission is granted for the proposed building on the golf course.

I await with interest the written report for the Newton News on the Planning Sub Committee meeting taking place on 30th November 2011 and of course future

AYCLIFFE BATTLE TO VITAL BONUS POINT WIN


Houghton 17 Newton Avcliffe 28

Newton Aycliffe Rugby Club visited fourth placed Houghton in the Durham and Northumberland Division 3 and came away with a bonus point win.
