Durham County Councillors are to receive an update on the authority's work to achieve substantial budget savings. They have already identified the need to make savings of £123.5m over the four year period between 2011 and 2015 following reductions in Government funding. This further report updates the savings required to £145.8m over the five years between 2011 and 2016. At Cabinet next week, members will also receive an update on the budget for 2012/13 as well as information on how the council's Medium Term Financial Plan is being developed. This includes new steps being taken to help achieve the necessary savings, such as the decision made by Full Council this week, following a recommendation from Cabinet last month, to end council tax discounts on empty properties. This is expected to generate an additional £2.1m income. The report states that the expansion of the council tax base, to take into account the greater number of properties in the county, is expected to result in an additional £0.8m in council tax revenue. The report also refers to the consultation carried out last year by the council as part of the budget decision-making process, which involved more than 8,000 residents and partner organisations. The results of which have again been used to help identify how the savings should be made. This year an inaugural county-wide Area Action Partnership forum meeting was held which gave residents the opportunity to put questions about the budget to the council's Leader, Cllr Simon Henig. Presentations were made at each of the 14 AAPs throughout November on how spending priorities still matched the original consultation outcomes. The five main priority services identified last year - including winter maintenance; repairs to roads and pavements; adult care services; community safety and tackling anti-social behaviour; and child protection, adoption and fostering - are still influencing spending decisions. Cabinet members will also be given an update on work being carried out to try to ensure any changes to services do not have a disproportionate impact on vulnerable or minority groups. The final report and decision on the 2012/13 budget will be made at a meeting of the Full Council in February 2012.

MOTOR TORQUE

By Ramsays of Aycliffe



For many of us Christmas is a time for visiting family and friends so it's important we take care and prepare for the road. Winter driving usually means breakdowns, and the AA estimate it doubles over this period especially when it's really cold.

Our sales manager Ian Ramsey has put together a few helpful tips to make winter motoring less of a headache. 'It's not much fun driving anywhere during cold winter days and nights, yet we rely on our cars and often take for granted the strains snow and ice can play on our vehicles

Check the life of your battery, the extra workload from heaters, lights and wipers means the life expectancy of the battery will diminish. Try not to run heaters and fans longer than necessary, avoid starting the engine with lights and wipers already switched on. Small simple things that can make a big difference.

Many new cars use a long life Anti-freeze, check with your manual or ask for advice. A 50-50 mix of antifreeze and water in the cooling systems gives the best protection, plus a bottle of anti-freeze is much cheaper than it is to replace an engine.

Remember to clear any snow from your roof, lights and glass before setting off as this could be a hazard to you and other motorists. One of the most common yet less well documented factors for winter accidents can be the sun, especially low winter sun. Check your wiper blades have been returned to the correct position before turning the engine off. If the blades freeze to the screen you could damage them when switching on the engine.

Give headlights and number plates a clean between journeys, it's surprising how dirty they become. The AA recommend 3mm of tread for winter driving and avoid reducing tyre pressure for more grip as it impairs stability.



Winter tyres can be a good idea if you do a lot of driving as the high silica in the tread gives a much better grip in wintry conditions. Stopping distances are longer in bad conditions, especially ice. Clear your windows before setting off! How many drive off peering through a tiny gap? Be prepared, buy a scraper and de-icer. Plan your journey to include roads that have been gritted. Always put the safety of you and your occupants first, and it is better to be late than sorry. Keep a shovel, lamp and some old rugs in the boot of your car, plus extra warm clothing.

This depends upon the quality of life the countryside gives us all - through its beauty, tranquillity, local distinctiveness and open space - which should be valued as much as material goods and economic growth.

On behalf of CPRE, I would like to urge readers to join us in standing up for the countryside by writing to their MPs to let them know that they want the planning system to protect their local countryside, not just specially designated areas. Dear Sir,
I write to thank Newton News for publishing the photograph of Pudsey Bear and our Heartbeat Bus whilst at Beamish for Children in Need, which brings to an end our very busy running programme for 2011.

This year we did 70 vehicle days the highlights being Beamish twice, Heritage Week up in Newcastle upon Tyne, bookings with 5 primary schools using our re-enactors group to recreate the days of WWII, one school being St Francis CE primary school with whom we continue to work and build up our educational outreach programme. This year we again maintained our 100% record of no failures to complete a booking.

The Society is now 31 years old and has an active membership who maintain the vehicles to the high standards required of us as an accredited museum with a working collection.

A recent audit by the conservator for Bowes Museum congratulated us on our standard of conservation which scored 79% on the national standards set by the

formers Museums, Libraries and Archives Council, now subsumed into the Arts Council.

Only one other independent museum in the northern region scored higher than us. This high score has triggered an entitlement to funding for archive standard storage drawers which will protect our stock of old drawings, photographs, decals which have previously been kept in cardboard boxes.

Part of the score is as a result of the construction of an archive store together with a small IT suite funded by GAMP last year. This year GAMP funded a new lightweight scaffold tower and access steps to be able to work on the roof of our buses in greater ease and safety. This funding is very much appreciated and I write to publicly acknowledge the help of GAMP over the last 2 years.

FOSTER CARERS WANTED URGENTLY

OVER 400 extra foster carers need to be found across the north east of England in the next 12 months, a leading charity has warned today. The new figures, published by the Fostering Network, show the scale of the challenge for fostering services in the region as they struggle to provide the right foster homes for all the children who need them. Since 2008 the number of children living with foster families in England has risen by 16 per cent, and is continuing to rise. There is also an ageing foster carer population and around 14 per cent of the workforce retire or leave every year. Without these extra families, too many children will have to settle for second best. This might mean living with a foster carer who is a long way from the child's home, school and family, or who does not have space for their brothers and sisters, or even living in residential care when fostering has been identified as the right option. Helen Clarke, recruitment

and retention expert at the Fostering Network, said: "All children in care need a family they can grow up with who can love them, be ambitious for them and help them achieve their potential. For a growing number, foster care is the best option. "By becoming a foster carer people can help the children they welcome into their homes to have the best possible opportunity of a positive future, to do well at school and be successful in later life. "Foster carers come from all walks of life, from teachers to factory workers and builders to nurses. If you want to work with children and have the right skills to foster, then finding out how you can make a real difference to children across the north east could be a great start to the new year." PUBLIC INVITED TO 'HAVE YOUR SAY' ON POLICING AND COMMUNITY SAFETY PRIORITIES

Durham Police Authority, Durham Constabulary and Community Safety Partners are inviting local residents and businesses in County Durham and Darlington to have their say on their top policing and community safety priorities for 2012/2013.

Mr Peter Thompson, Chair of Durham Police Authority said: "Representing the priorities of local communities is a core business activity for Durham Police Authority. We are undertaking this consultation in partnership with Durham Constabulary, The Darlington Community Safety Partnership and The Safe Durham Partnership, with the aim of capturing the information once to avoid the cost of duplication and using it to inform decision making processes".

"We want to reach as wide an audience as possible and understand that not everyone can attend the meetings we hold so are exploring other options to enable the public to provide us with their views". The Chief Constable, Jon Stoddart said:

"It's crucial that we inspire confidence in our communities by providing a policing service which reflects their needs and concerns. I would encourage as many people as possible to get involved in this survey so they can shape their policing service."

Local people are asked to vote for their top three priorities out of the following list of seven priorities

1. REDUCING THE HARM caused by Organised Crime Groups: Organised crime can be described as two or more people involved in a network of criminal activity. Organised crime causes serious harm and fear to others by intimidation and violence

and groups may be involved in drug related crime, money laundering, metal theft, fraud, and importation of counterfeit goods.

2. PROTECTING COMMUNITIES from Terrorism and Extremism: Terrorism can be described as the use or threat of action where it involves serious violence against a person, serious damage to property or endangers a person's life to advance ideological causes. Examples: bomb threats/attacks, extremists and radical groups.

3. REDUCING THE IMPACT of Alcohol abuse on people and communities: Alcohol abuse has a range of harmful effects on communities. Examples are street drinking, public disorder, nuisance behaviour, rowdy behaviour, domestic abuse and can affect communities at all times of the day and night.

4. REDUCING THE IMPACT of Drug abuse on people and communities: Drug abuse has a range of harmful effects on communities. It can result in burglary and theft, public disorder, nuisance behaviour, rowdy behaviour, and can affect communities at all times of the day and night.

5. PROTECTING VULNERABLE people from harm: This involves tackling issues such as violent crime, domestic abuse, hate crime, sexual offences, young people who go missing, child protection, adult protection and anti-social behaviour.

6. SOLVING LOCAL PROBLEMS with Partners: This would involve early intervention to deliver positive long term solutions on problems in specific localities that can have a negative impact on the lives

of residents.

7. TACKLING ANTI-SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR with Partners: Anti-Social Behaviour can be defined as any nuisance, intimidating or destructive activity that damages or destroys another person's quality of life. Examples: nuisance neighbours, vandalism, graffiti, rowdy behaviour, anti-social street drinking, littering.

Targeting Olympic Scams

Residents in County Durham are being advised on how to avoid getting stung by scams targeting next year's Olympic Games.

Durham County Council's fair trading team is aiming to raise awareness about bogus tickets and merchandise associated with the London 2012 Olympics.

It is hoped that the campaign will help residents to steer clear of counterfeit sportswear and avoid online ticket scams which could prove costly.

Joanne Waller, head of environment, health and consumer protection said: "With the Olympics encouraging more people to take up sports, counterfeit sportswear may be on sale in shops, markets and on the internet.

These are generally poor quality items which do not represent value for money.

"Our staff will be carrying out checks on goods being offered for sale to protect consumers and legitimate traders around County Durham."

Cllr Bob Young, Cabinet Member for strategic environment added: "The

Olympics are a wonderful opportunity for County Durham residents to get involved in sport and get behind Team GB. We want people to enjoy the Olympics and avoid getting caught out by scams and fake ticketing websites."

There are a number of ways people can be vigilant against possible scams:

- Be wary of websites offering tickets to Olympic events. All ticket sales are provided through the London 2012 website or as part of a package through their authorised suppliers.

- Tips on spotting fake ticketing websites can be found by visiting www.directgov.uk and searching for 'Just Tick It'.

- To avoid bogus internet accommodation offers, check out the accommodation carefully before giving your credit or debit card details. Look for customer reviews and other write-ups on the internet and ensure the site provides a landline telephone number to ensure the business exists.

- Be wary of online bargain

sportswear, it may not be genuine and if so could be poor quality.

- For peace of mind and help finding websites selling genuine products, check out the Brand-I website - www.brand-i.org

- Advice and information on getting tickets for events, accommodation and official merchandise to help people plan for the games can be found on the official website www.london2012.com

KEEP YOUR NUMBER PLATE SECURE!

A spate of number plate thefts linked to fuel 'bilkings' has prompted police in East Durham to put vehicle owners and garages on alert. The number plates have been stolen from private vehicles in the Peterlee and Seaham areas. They have then been used on vehicles which have been filled up with large amounts of fuel by thieves who have driven off without paying. It's not only are the vehicles which are being filled up with fuel - in one instance a

motorist filled a number of containers with petrol then drove off without paying.

"We've had ten of these incidents in East Durham in the last four weeks, five in the Peterlee and Seaham area and five in the Durham area," said Inspector Dave Coxon, from the Peterlee neighbourhood team.

"Some of the plates were stolen from cars parked outside people's homes, but we had one this week stolen from a car parked in a supermarket car park.

"It's a double edged theft, stealing the number plate in the first place then using it to steal fuel."

People are being reminded that they can fit number plates with tamper-proof screws which can be bought quite cheaply from automotive or hardware stores. Members of the public are also being asked to contact police if they see anyone tampering with a car number plate.

Local officers are also maintaining a list of the stolen plates, so that local garages can be circulated with the details.

"Everyone can have a part to play in curbing this crime," added Insp Coxon.

Loss of Fitness Instructor Counterproductive

Dear Sir,

It has come to my attention that from the 23rd December 2011 due to the withdrawal of Mrs Rachael Hall, there will be no dedicated fitness instructor to look after the G.P. referrals who attend the gyms both at Aycliffe and Shildon. This situation is unsatisfactory, and could result in both a loss of income for the gyms and perhaps danger for the attendees.

At the moment Rachael Hall greets every new potential attendee with a smile which settles them down straight away, she gathers information about illnesses and injuries and medication. She then sets a programme for them and takes them around each machine assessing what the attendee is capable of and writing a program making sure that they do not do too much. She works with them throughout the 12 weeks and is very attentive to all of their needs.

No matter what level you are at she improves it and if you are off for a session she rings you at home to find what the problem is, and sees if she can help. She is well aware of every attendee's level and problems, and goes round conversing with everyone. When she has gone in the New Year there will be no one who will take the same interest and care of the attendees. As for financial matters, Fit for Life will lose a lot of potential memberships, because Rachael encourages people to join the gym on completion of their 12 week initial period.

I am aware of, at least 12 people (G.P. Referrals, this is at Aycliffe only) joining since April this year, and at around

£200 per year per person that is a lot of money. I know money is tight and cuts are to be expected, but one member of staff in this area has already been cut and therefore it is wrong to cut the only other one, especially when Rachael only works a total of 9 hours per week split between the two gyms.

I believe that the G.P. referrals are getting a rough deal if this cut goes ahead, and numbers will dwindle, but perhaps this is what is wanted.

I ask Fit for Life to look at this situation again, and give the G.P. referrals the service they need.

FOOTBALLER LEADS ANTI-RACISM WORKSHOPS

SUNDERLAND FC legend Gary Bennett has helped to deliver a number of anti-racism workshops in the County thanks to local council funding.

Michelle Postma, Shildon and Newton Aycliffe Extended Schools Co-ordinator, raised in excess of £6,000 to finance more than 20 workshops involving hundreds of children in the area.

Bennett, along with other ex-professional football players and education workers from Show Racism the Red Card, delivered the sessions along with fun, football fitness sessions to young people aged from nine to 16.

The former Sunderland star, who played more than 400 games for the Black Cats between 1984 and 1995, endured horrific racism in football in the 80s. Now he educates young people through SRTRC, an anti-racist charity which harnesses the role model status of professional footballers.

"Unfortunately our work is never done," said Bennett, who also played and managed Darlington and who now works as a pundit for BBC Newcastle. Although racism isn't as bad as it was when I first started playing football, it continues to exist, in life generally as well as in sport, and we can't afford to be complacent about it.

"We try to educate children from a young age and openly discuss stereotypical views surrounding racism." As part of the workshops, young people took part in question and answer sessions as well as coaching sessions with SRTRC's professional football coaches.

"We always get tremendous feedback from youngsters," added Bennett. Some are shocked to hear what we have to say and, in turn, we continue to be surprised by some of the stereotypical views of some young people."

Michelle Postma added: "Show Racism's work is commendable and we've found young people gain a lot from what they have to offer, both in terms of getting the



anti-racism message across as well as their fun coaching sessions. We're delighted with the workshops and look forward to working with SRTRC again in the future."
