CHECK HOLIDAY IS ABTA BONDED

Dear Sir,

At this time of year our thoughts often turn to holiday planning, and for many of us it can be an exciting prospect, whether we hope to go on a long haul trip or pass our time more locally. Whatever the decisions we make we have to be prepared to spend a fair amount of our hard-earned cash and generally the time and effort is worth it.

There are, however, those of us who encounter problems such as myself and friends who booked an African Safari with a small, private enterprise, which at the time of booking had a UK business address here in Newton Aycliffe.

Because of the ensuing difficulties we have had I would like to remind readers that it is always wise to ensure your money is protected by the fact that the company, whatever the size, is ABTA bonded. Needless to say this business was not.

6 of us paid almost £12,000 during the course of 2007, to go to Kenya in January 2008 and although problems in Kenya prevented the trip, we were assured a holiday would be forthcoming.

Repeated excuses as to the timing and nature of the trip set alarm bells ringing and myself and two others decided we had lost confidence in this business so asked for a refund of costs. I do not want to bore you with the details but at this point, despite intervention by the European equivalent of Durham trading standards no money at all has been refunded and the owner of the company seems to have disappeared among the Norwegian Fjiords, where I believe the establishing of another business is being attempted.

I live in hope that this company will eventually refund all or at least some of our money. I do not agree that any business should profit from the consumer because of the so-called "force majeure" nor, as was quoted by the business owner, "circumstances beyond our control."


To myself and many others it is a way of profiteering and ripping off the hapless traveller and for those of you for whom this article rings a bell and who will have had business cards from me, and I gave out many, I say think twice, tear

up the cards and go to a bigger more trustworthy travel agent who, as I said before is ABTA bonded.

There is no way I would recommend this firm which no doubt will have by now spent the money paid to it. The promises made by this company are empty and I would not wish anyone else to endure the same disappointment and upset it has caused. Hopefully the adage "What goes around comes around" will work in this case.



In addition the cost of care in a Council home is considerably more expensive, (almost double in some cases). This money will not be provided by government.

The answer to the question in 2006 was "why should we give you money to build new homes when there are 700 empty beds in the private sector"?

92% of residents then, were in private homes, with only 8% in Council homes and this trend has continued since. People are voting with their feet and the end is inevitable whatever you want.

No one will accept the cost involved on their household rates and as I said in the County Council at the time, the problem will not go away, and so it has proved.






DEATH OF FORMER

Marjorie Spark 19-1-1922 - 15-1-2010

Sadly we announce the peaceful passing of Marjorie Spark on 15th January

Marjorie, and her late husband John, lived in Newton Aycliffe since 1952 and moved to Woodham in 1986. Originally from Ashford in Kent she married John, from Darlington, during the war and moved to Co. Durham in 1945.

She was a well known in the the community in its early days. An active member of the Dramatic Society she frequently played the leading lady as well as the wicked witch in Christmas Pantomimes. She served on several committees and, with John, won many gardening

Marjorie played a part in the early years of the 'Newtonian' working on its

committee and providing news items. She contributed letters on controversial aspects in the town and kept a watchful eye on its development right to the end of her life.

In the 60's she wrote a column on life in Newton Aycliffe called 'Newton View' for the Northern Despatch and also reported on local associations activities for the Auckland Chronicle and Northern Echo. In her capacity as a reporter she attended local council meetings and her favourite comment was: 'If I had wanted I could have blown this town apart!" No amount of asking would get her to reveal what she

From 1971 Marjorie and John often went to Southern Africa to visit her children, who emigrated in the 70's.

After she retired she took up painting, decoupage and continued writing. She became a member of the Weardale Writers Group and leaves behind volumes of poetry and short stories, some of which have been published. She also joined the Woodham Art Group and her art work has been shown at several local exhibitions.

Marjorie revelled in modern technology and bought a word processor to assist her writing. She naturally progressed to a computer and was insisting her far flung family also get one so she could communicate by email.

Marjorie is survived by her children Carol and Andy, daughter-in-law Debbie, 7 grand-children and 2 greatgrandchildren.

Her funeral service will be at Darlington Crematorium on 26th January at 2.15 pm. At her request, please do not send flowers, instead please make a donation to an animal rescue charity.

C.A.B. CELEBRATE 50 YEARS SERVICE

The day book of the Newton Aycliffe & District Citizens Advice Bureau opened for the first time on 21st April 1959 providing advice to a lady on accommodation.

Back in those days the bureau was lucky if it handled 2 enquiries a week, but of course, every project takes a while to get off the ground and getting the public to trust such a new organisation takes time. It took 10 years to fill the first day book, which we still have. Even back then, there were diverse queries, yet still very similar in content to what we see now.

By the late 1970s, 3 CABs had joined together: Spennymoor, Sedgefield and Newton Aycliffe to become the

Sedgefield & District Citizens Advice Bureau.

From this time, the bureau went from strength to strength. The National Association of Citizens Advice Bureau was also growing and developing strict guidelines for membership, ensuring that advice given was of a high quality and that the aims of the service, being impartial, nonjudgement and confidential were always adhered to.

These days we see on average 10,000 clients a year. We are now the largest CAB in County Durham.

Over 50% of our workload is around debt with many clients needing ongoing case work, and not just one-off advice. We still provide advice on any

subject and can help whether it is an enquiry about education, consumer, finances.... We deal with it

In the main bureau sessions in Newton Aycliffe and Spennymoor, clients will be given a quick diagnostic interview, which determines whether they just need some self-help information or if they need an appointment or a referral to one of our specialist teams. We hope that by operating this way, waiting times are vastly reduced and clients feel the service works better for them, meaning they get access to the type of help they need right from the start. Although we are celebrating this fantastic achievement

of reaching 50 years service, we are also struggling with the fact that funding is being reduced.

Every bureau is an independent charity and has to raise its own funds to provide the service. Whilst the recession has resulted in unprecedented demand for the service, it has also meant that we will face difficulties in securing an income so that the service will continue to exist.

We are trying to secure funding from a number of new sources but unfortunately every funder wants something new, different, when what we need is for a funder to recognise that the CAB model works, reaches those in need, and helps prevent crisis situations. Unfortunately we could be about to face a crisis of our

This service is needed more now that it has ever been and although things are looking bleak, we still hope to be an important part of our community in another 50



Internally, each tent has privacy partitions that allow recipients to divide the space as they see fit.

A smile

Every box contains a children's pack containing drawing books, crayons and pens. For children who have lost most, if not all, their possessions, these small gifts are treasured. **Warmth and protection**

In addition to the tent, the boxes contain a range of other survival equipment including thermal blankets and insulated ground sheets, essential in areas where temperatures plummet at nightfall. Where malaria is prevalent mosquito nets are supplied, as well a life saving means of water purification. Water supplies often become contaminated after a major disaster, as infrastructure and sanitation systems are destroyed, this presents a secondary but no less dangerous threat to survivors than the initial disaster itself.

Self sufficiency

A basic tool kit containing a hammer, axe, saw, trenching shovel, hoe head, pliers and wire cutters can be found in every box. These items enable people to improve their immediate environment, by chopping firewood or digging a latrine, for example. Then, when it is possible, to start repairing or rebuilding the home they were forced to leave.

Fit for purpose

Every item is durable, practical and brand new. The box itself is lightweight and waterproof and has been used for a variety of purposes in the past - from water and food storage containers to a cot for a newly born baby.

A heart to the home

A key piece in every box is either a wood burning or multi-fuel stove - that can burn anything from diesel to old paint. This provides the heart of the new home where water is boiled, food is cooked and families congregate. In addition, there are pans, utensils, bowls, mugs and water storage containers.

Adaptability

A broad range of equipment is kept in stock so Shelterbox can adapt the contents of a box to a specific disaster. For example, following the Javanese earthquake in 2006, when some resources were available locally or could be salvaged from one storey buildings, the overwhelming need was for shelter – so we just sent tents, packing two in each box.

GRIT THEFT WARNING

Durham County Council officials are issuing a following warning a number of reports from residents that their community salt or grit supplies are being taken by people pulling up in cars and helping themselves.

This week the authority has been carrying out a concentrated programme to replenish grit and salt bins and roadside piles across the county, with 40 staff designated to the task.

Strategic Highways Manager Dave Wilcox says transporting these urgent supplies away in cars is not on, "These stocks are sited in very specific places so that communities are more able to help themselves during this extended cold snap. They are placed on sharp corners and inclines,

near busy community buildings and collision points, and they are put there for a reason".

"Many people will be aware we are working with restricted salt supplies, overseen by the Government, and what I am saying is please don't put other people at risk so that you can salt your own property."

The Cabinet Member for Strategic Environment is Cllr Bob Young, "It is especially important at the moment, with further snow falls, black ice and concerns over salt supply, that we work together to see this difficult time through.

"These community salt bins and roadside piles are often a vital lifeline in rural communities, helping people keeps their links with community services and shops and making sure they can move safely around important buildings.

"Please don't remove these supplies. If you need urgent assistance please contact the Highways Action Line on 0191 370 6000. There are many, many occasions where we have been able to help with urgent requests." Anyone spotting someone removing salt and grit from bins or roadside piles is askd to contact the Highways Action Line on

Grit/salt boxes are located at sites of difficulty and have to satisfy criteria laid down in the Winter Service Plan eg. steep banks, bends, whether it is on a bus route or treated route, accident history and whether there are any special considerations such as Aged Persons homes in

It follows that the salt put out in boxes at these locations should be only used by the community for the community in the immediate vicinity.

LETTER to the EDITOR

YOUNG FAMILY LOCKED IN PARK

Dear Sir.

On Sunday 17th January as the snow was finally clearing my husband and I took our 2 children in their double buggy to St Oswalds Park at around 3.15pm.

We were in the toddler area of the park located to the front of the park near the gates. As we went to leave we were horrified to discover the gates had been locked with us still inside the park.

I then read the notice which explained the park closed at 3.30pm and it was around 3.40pm, I had not read this notice on entering the park. Fortunately I had my mobile telephone with me and tried to ring the number on the sign but as it was Sunday the offices were closed.

I started to get very panicky and anxious about the situation as my young son was due a feed and I was worried at how long we would be locked in the park surrounded by a 6 foot fence!

Luckily a lady who lived in the houses close by noticed our predicament and came out to help and said we could use her ladders to get out of the park. I had to climb a ladder and pass my 4 month old son over to the lady's daughter and then my hysterical 18 month old daughter, who was terrified at being passed to a stranger over a metal

My husband and I then had to lift a large double buggy up the ladders and pass that over the fence. I was left shaken by the incident and thankful that I was lucky enough to have my husband with me and a mobile telephone to hand. I will be personally thanking the lady who came to my rescue as if it was not for her I don't know how long we would have been locked in the park. I find it quite alarming that when the park gates are closed they do not do a simple check that no one is still inside. I find it even more puzzling that we were at the front of the park in the toddler play area and not out of view.

I contacted the Council offices on Monday to inform them of this situation and was advised that there is a notice stating the gates will be locked at 3.30pm, but that she would speak to the individual concerned.

The lady who came to my reacue advised me this was a different individual to the one who normally locks the park.

I thought I would send this to inform readers so that this never occurs again.....I'm only lucky that the lady was looking out of her window at the right time or it could have been a lot worse. Worried

From pushy salespeople trying to flog double-glazing or mobile phones to 'silent' calls and pre-recorded messages telling you that you have won a trip of a lifetime – providing you pay a 'small' deposit to claim your prize, of course - these unsolicited sales calls are frightening for the elderly and annoying for everyone else.

Across Britain 70% of people claim they have been victim of a phone scam while the total number of nuisance and silent telephone calls made to UK households every year has topped the 3 billion

intimidating, obscene, silent or downright abusive. But with some UK households receiving as many as 20 or even 30 nuisance calls each month, what can you do to put a stop to these unwanted calls once and for all?

1. Keep calm

Always keep your cool and resist the temptation to let the caller know how infuriated they make you feel - this is precisely the reaction they want to hear. And no matter how annoying these calls can be don't blow a whistle down the phone - it rarely works and gives the caller the satisfaction that they have wound you up

Walk away from the

Once you realise that this is not a normal call, simply place the handset down next to the phone and walk away. Then after ten minutes or so return to the phone and replace the handset without listening. This will infuriate the caller who probably won't bother calling you again

Avoid entering into conversation with the

The sales people employed disreputable companies are highly skilled at keeping you engaged in a conversation. And regardless of how many times you say No, I'm not interested thank you, they keep coming back for more. So avoid getting into a conversation in the first place

Don't give out any personal information

If it's a wrong number and the caller asks you to clarify your name and telephone number, this could be a trick. Simply ask them what number they want and confirm if they have got it right or wrong

Change your answer phone message

Be careful not to leave your name or contact telephone number on your answer phone message. This can then be used by some companies to verify your personal details and give them an excuse to keep calling you...as if they needed an excuse!

6. Ask the caller to identify themselves

If the caller is genuine they will have no objection to providing you with their name and company details. Then it is up to you to decide whether the caller is reputable

Keep a record of all numbers

Note down the numbers of reoffending callers, including date, time and details of what was said. This information could prove very useful if further action is taken

8. Report nuisance calls to your phone provider

If you have obtained the number from your caller display or by dialling 1471 report it to your telephone service provider initially. And if the call was abusive and you believe there is a genuine risk to your safety, call the Police

9. Block silent calls

If the number was withheld and you are continuing to receive a high volume of calls your telephone service provider will be able to put a trace on your phone line which will enable the Police to take action against the offending companies who are calling you

10. Let someone else take action for you

If you are still receiving lot of nuisance and telemarketing calls and don't want to involve the Police, you should consider registering with the Call Prevention Registry (CPR). CPR is an organisation that maintains a list of people who do not wish to receive any telemarketing calls and has the highest success rate in blocking nuisance calls than any other anti-nuisance calls service provider in the UK.
