

SBH EXPLAIN CHOICE BASED LETTINGS SCHEME Durham County Council

Since 1 October 2009, SBH has allocated its properties through the Durham Key Options (DKO) Choice Based Lettings (CBL) Scheme, Of the 410 properties advertised so far, the overwhelming majority have been let to applicants who already resided within the former Sedgefield Borough Area.

In the Newton Aycliffe area 128 properties have been advertised, generating a total of 3,600 bids. The average number of bids per property is consistently higher in the Aycliffe area than the number of bids for similar properties in other areas covered by SBH. What is Durham Key Options?

LABOUR EURO MP's **HELP SMALL FIRMS**

The European Parliament has voted to exempt very small firms, known as micro-entities. from EU law on accounting standards, reducing the burden of red tape and helping them

beat the recession. Local Labour Euro MP Stephen Hughes said: "as our small firms in the North East struggle to overcome the crisis I am determined to help them y cutting red tape. It is vitally important that

EU law does not over-burden very small businesses. This exemption means that very small firms will save around £1,000 in accountancy and audit fees." Stephen added: "We have

made a commitment in the EU to reduce burdens on business by 25% by 2012, and this law

is an important step towards meeting that goal. Micro-entities are often the first step on the ladder to successful employers of the future, we need to nurture and support these businesses, not place extra burdens on them."

WASTE OF MONEY says Lib Dem EMP HIGH COST OF TWO PARLIAMENT H.Q.'s Lib Dem MEP Fiona Hall, Leader of the UK Liberal Democrats in Europe, has signed a petition calling for the European Parliament in Strasbourg to be scrapped in favour of one Brussels-based

parliament. Currently, MEPs, along with all their staff and necessary documents, are required by treaty to up-root to Strasbourg for the full sessions of the Parliament once every month. This 500 mile round-trip is done at huge cost - estimated at €200million (£180 million) a year - and is environmentally damaging as the travel uses huge amounts of energy and

adds to CO2 emissions. The petition, delivered to European Council President, Herman Van Rompuy, this week, highlights the monetary and environmental burden of running two parliaments and states that the cost is 'completely unacceptable' to most MEPs

Fiona, who has been campaigning for a single seat for the European Parliament in Brussels since first becoming an MEP in 2004, said:

"As the new European Council President under the Treaty of Lisbon, Herman Van Rompuy is in a position to give a strong lead on this issue. "It is simply ridiculous that at a

time when public finances need to be tightened, the European Parliament spends about 15% of its annual budget on pointlessly travelling between two cities. And it is outrageous that at a time when the European Parliament should lead by example in reducing its carbon footprint, the carbon emissions of the monthly trips add up to the carbon costs of about 4,000 houses in London. Unfortunately, it is not up to MEPs to decide where the European Parliament is based. It is the European Council, made up of Member States, which has the power to take action to stop the completely unacceptable between commute between Brussels and Strasbourg. I will continue to

lobby the British Government to take action in the European Council to scrap the seat in Strasbourg and put an end to the monthly travelling circus.

BULLYING IN SCHOOL In Memoriam WORRIES PARENT PAUL ABBOTT 27th March

Dear Sir,

I would ask through you if any reader has experienced problems of their child being bullied at school and felt they were not given a fair hearing All my children have attended the same school in the town over the past 12 years. When you have a problem you go through the correct channels, but when you decide to take a bullying matter to the Governors you can only do so in writing, whilst the Head Teacher can make a verbal report. I don't think this fair! I removed my child who suffered mental abuse whcih I think is worse than physical harm.

RESPONSE FROM HEAD TEACHERS

We passed this complaint to a spokesperson for schools in the town and received the following statement: Without wishing to enter into the specifics of this particular

case all primary schools work very hard to address issues of bullying. A great deal of work goes into preventing bullying by encouraging all pupils to be aware of when they are either perpetrators or victims and how to deal with a wide variety of eitherties. Becauted invited of bullying and bullying situations. Reported incidents of bullying are also dealt with. When complaints are made about any issue it is always hoped to resolve the situation through conversations with the head teacher but set procedures for all complaints do provide parents the opportunity to meet with governors and make verbal representations when all else fails. These procedures exist to protect everyone involved and ensure complaints are dealt with in a fair and appropriate manner
