OPENINGS TIMES: Monday to Thursday 7.30-6.00pm, Friday 7.30-5.30pm (* subject to conditions) Newton Aycliffe Police are asking parents to question their children's whereabouts, particularly during the school holidays, as a number of them are using the town centre rooves as a playground and are putting their lives in danger.

Some have been seen biking on the roof and jumping between gaps onto surfaces which are angled, slippy and highly dangerous. They see it as an adventure and are giving the police concern that someone will have a serious accident and they will be the ones that have to inform parents their child is in hospital.

The gaps being jumped are between 6 and eight feet with perilous drops to the ground. Kids as young as eight are climbing onto rooves and when the Police appear they run away, putting themselves in more danger as they scatter over dangerous surfaces.

They have been seen dry sledging down angled rooves, playing football and are also causing £1000's of damage. Arrests have been made and the police are determined to stamp out this trespassing nuisance and prosecute the offenders. Demolition work is being

carried out in the Town Centre at this moment and more security staff have been employed who will be alerting the Police when they see youngsters fooling about in the area.

Meanwhile parents are requested to ensure their children are not engaged in this foolhardy and highly hazardous practice. Residents using the Town Centre at night are also asked to report sightings of children playing on the rooves. 0345 6060 365.



WHY CAN'T COUNCIL RUN MEN ON THE JOB CARE HOMES EFFICIENTLY?

Dear Sir, Reading Councillor Mike Dixon's letter in last week's Newton News I was struck by the fact that he did not justify the closure of Care Homes. Instead, he ranted on about the pending cuts in public spending being discussed by the present coalition Government as though it was all their fault.

Be aware that Durham Labour County Council was minded to close the Care Homes before the General Election but put off announcing their decision until after a bogus 'consultation period' which conveniently allowed the announcement of the bad news after the election result; an old (or should I say, New) Labour trick, practised by the last, discredited, Government. Was it that amoral MP, Peter Mandelson, who invented it along with 'spin'? During the press debate on this issue, the Council pointed out that it cost almost twice as

much to keep a resident in a Council Care Home compared with the cost in a Private Care Home. This fact should not have led to the decision to close the Council Care Homes, but rather, to the mass resignation of Councillors and the sacking of all involved in the inefficient management of the Council funds, and especially, Care Homes! Remember their actions at the next County Council elections!

If Durham County Council If Durham County Council cannot run Care Homes cheaper than the so called greedy profit making Private Sector, then we, the taxpayers, cannot afford Durham County Council. It is this profligacy that the Coalition Government has found it will have to curb. New Labour borrowed billions

of pounds to fund its flagship 'Building Schools For The Future' project. Schools do not teach children to read and write. It is the teachers who teach, not the buildings. Good teachers teach regardless of the

This, without again wasting taxpayers money on demolishing a perfectly good building. The money saved (if not borrowed) could be transferred to the Care Budget. Our Labour Council and ex. Labour Government have shown themselves to be unable

and unworthy to be in control of our public finances. The former borrowed heavily to give tax credits to people, who most of the residents of our town would regard as being high earners! This was no more than the blatant buying of votes. Indeed, I turned 60 recently and was gifted £240 winter fuel allowance.

As the Government expenditure at the time was greater than its income, this money must have been borrowed. Good for me, but not so good for the next generation of taxpayers who generation of taxpayers who will be paying off the interest, and perhaps eventually the debt, run up by the previous Government in a desperate attempt to buy votes to ensure re-election. Fortunately, the majority of those who voted were not fooled.

Let us not forget that the main ideological difference between the current Government and the last on public spending is, only on when to cut and not on the necessity of cutting. The new Government is being

cautious in trying to reduce our debt and therefore, our interest payments, early, such that our taxes can then be spent on the needs of people rather than on their wants. 

A paper councillor is usually too busy, uninterested or sometimes unsuitable to be a councillor. (S)he serves the party's purpose by keeping anyone else out of the seat. (S)he does not even have to attend committees. where most of the real decisions are made: by a process called "substitution", the Party boss can get another member of the same Party to take up the place on the committee to secure the required votes.

The Romans Are Coming!

Having read the interesting article on the unusual caterpillar found by Anna Dooney, members of the Aycliffe Nature Park Association visited Anna and her mother at their home to discuss this find. We came to the conclusion the

caterpillar is not a Tersa Sphinx which is usually found in North America. The caterpillar turned out to be an unusual green form of the Elephant Hawk Moth. The common name derives from it's caterpillars apparent resemblance to an elephants trunk. Confusion arose because the caterpillars of the two moths can look very similar.

These moths are very common across Newton Aycliffe, although they are not often seen. The caterpillars feed on a variety of plants, but their favourite is

Rosebay Willowherb, which grows in profusion in the area. The adult moth is attractively coloured, and feeds at night on the nectar of Honeysuckle. We had a friendly talk about all the different kinds of moth and

Anna's mother became very interested. We have well over 300 kinds of moth recorded from the town, and many more remain unidentified. It will surprise many to know that there are about 2500 species of moths in the UK, a great number of which are probably more colourful than some

butterflies. We are interested in sampling moths from different parts of the town whenever the chances arise. If your readers would like to try and trap/identify moths they should call us to arrange




