MIXED WEATHER FOR GREAT AYCLIFFE SHOW



Despite a doubtful weather forecast, we enjoyed another successful Great Aycliffe Show this year. High winds and some showers on Sunday did cause some disruption to the arena programme but overall the Show went on as normal.

The thousands of spectators who flocked to the show this year were not disappointed with the many forms of entertainment and activities on offer. The handcraft and horticulture exhibition had its highest level of entries ever with classes ranging from sausage rolls to scarecrow models. There were 1105 entries this year, including instantly recognisable portraits of Tony Blair and Prince Charles!

The environment marquee was literally a hive of information and innovation. Children's activities were very popular, they were able to make clay models, and work green wood the 'old way' or even see the goats who were only too pleased to be the focus of attention. There was an amazing array of craft items being demonstrated in the craft marquee, everything from making jam and lemon curd to home made jewellery, while the trade tent was bristling with customers who could buy everything from a holiday to

a cup cake. The World War II exhibition was almost big enough to be an event on its own. They had everything from machine guns to ration packs. It was an extremely lifelike display of army living during the war period with authentic costumes, tents and cooking equipment as well as the essential 'battle kit'. Crowd entertainers Lofty and Squeazy were doing walkabouts during the weekend amusing the children and adults with their agility and clowning. Professor Llewellyn attracted full audiences to see Punch and Judy at every showing and there were hundreds of children walking about with their faces painted during the weekend.

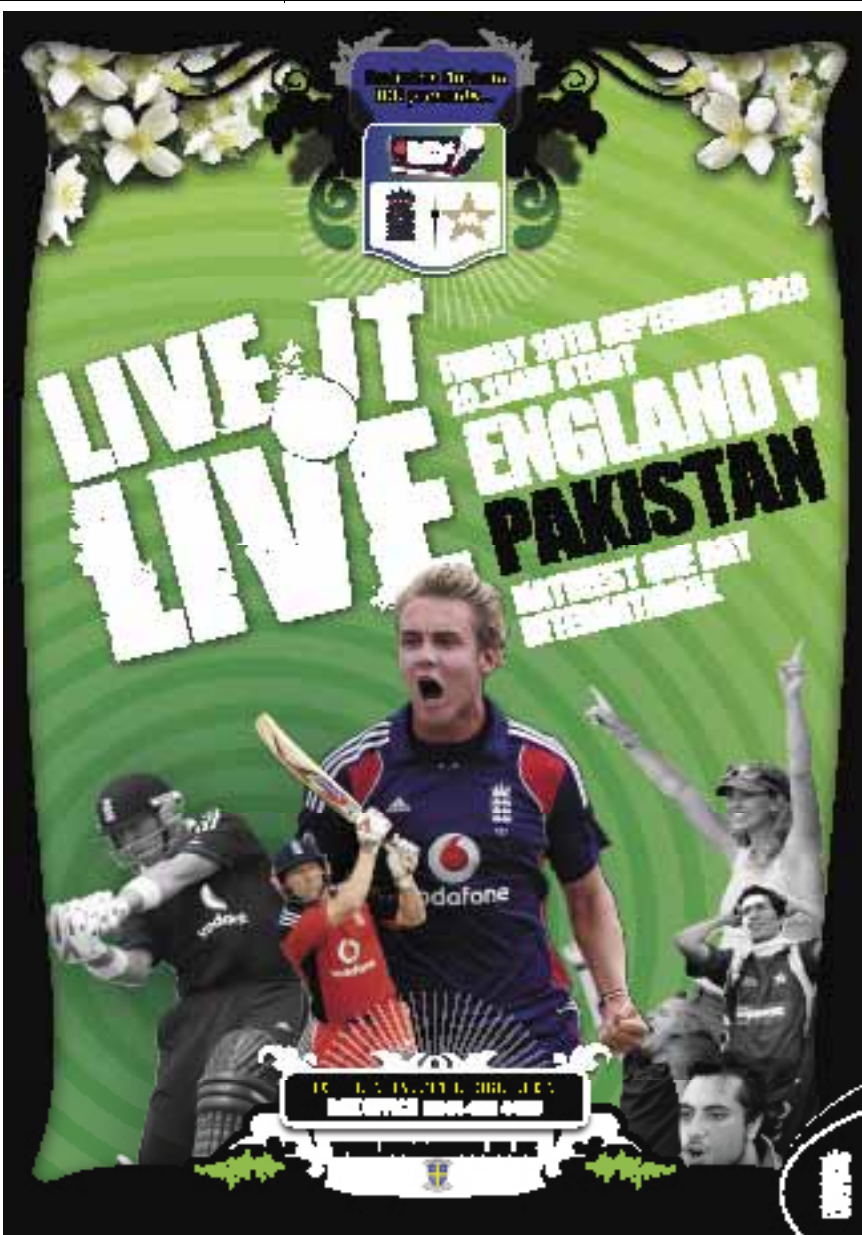

Rotary Receive £700 for Shelterboxes

The presentation was made by Liz Foulger on behalf of HASSRA Sports and Social Club of The Benefit Delivery Centre, Stockton on Tees.

NUISANCE OFF-ROAD MOTORBIKES



Once again the summer is here and the Local Police have received calls from members of the public reporting the illegal use of off-road motorbikes across the town.

Particular hotspots are GREENFIELD/WEST WARD, and WOODHAM WARD.

Police are actively targeting those individuals who are riding the motorcycles in an anti-social manner and will deal with them accordingly. The neighbourhood policing team have created Operation SONESTA 2010 and so far it has been successful with 34 warning notices issued to people using these bikes as well 8 bikes seized.

The police are keen to clarify the legal position and ask that parents in particular are aware of the

law if their children have motorbikes.

In order to lawfully ride an off-road bike you must first obtain the land-owners permission in advance. (You cannot ride an off-road bike on a public road unless it has been adapted for such use – ie indicators, number plate etc). If caught riding a motorbike illegally the rider would receive a warning initially but then if caught a second time within a twelve month period the police may seize the vehicle. The riders may also be prosecuted for driving offences.

Town Council Vacancy in West Ward

Dear Sir,
The resignation of GATC, Councillor Helen Hutchinson, probably means the local Labour Party does not now have any representation actually living within the boundary of West Ward.
I use the word 'probably', because despite all of the hoo hah about him supposedly still being a member of The Labour

Party - when he stood and was elected as an Independent for West Ward - Councillor Ray Bowman is still down on the GATC web site as being an Independent - very confusing - confusion that Ray has chosen not to clarify.
George Gray Snr, elected as a Labour Councillor, now stands as an Independent (understandable, given the

shabby, bullying treatment he received); Councillor Enid Paylor, who serves on both GATC and DCC (West Ward and Aycliffe West, respectively), moved out of West Ward about ten months ago; Councillor Mike Dixon, DCC, Aycliffe West representative, does not live in the West Ward area. There is a rule that as long as a Councillor continues to live within about three miles of those that they represent, they do not have to resign their seat. However, living outside the area that one represents, at least as a GATC Councillor, is hardly an ideal situation.

Given the mass resignations from the former West Ward branch of the Labour Party, it will be interesting to see who the Labour Party choose as their candidate for the now vacant West Ward seat. Either way they may be on to a winner.

If their candidate does not win the seat and an Independent does so - as with two Independents at the last GATC elections - they simply ask the Independent to join the Labour Party. Job done!

AYCLIFFE'S GIRL RACER WALKS AWAY FROM CRASH



Amanda Whitaker had a rollercoaster ride at the Oulton Park Gold Cup recently. The Newton Aycliffe girl racer was driving Amaron Racing's Formula Ford 1600 Elden Mk8 and the TIGA SF78 Formula Ford 2000 at the prestigious race meeting.

She made a great start to take 4th at the first corner then dived past David Wilds to take 3rd at the end of lap one. A few laps later she was passed by Ian Ashley, a former F1 and F5000 driver and overall winner of the Oulton Park Gold Cup in 1974 - the year Amanda was born! However, Amanda showed her determination at her favourite circuit - and closed back onto the gearbox of Ashley. She was thwarted by a flat spot on her engine coming out of the corners, just preventing her from getting a run to make an overtaking move and finished 4th just behind Ashley and ahead of Wilds.

In the Formula Ford 2000 race, she qualified unusually low in 21st position and 5th in class, but had engine problems stopping it from revving highly. On the formation lap of the race,

she felt the problem may have been cured after work done by her team. But it was all for nothing - although she made a good start to jump a number of drivers off the line, she was hit by a spinning car into the first corner, turning her car into the path of another and she ended the race in the tyre wall. She walked away from the crash but the car was damaged, although repairable.

"That was such a disappointing end to what was otherwise a good weekend. In the Formula Ford 1600 race I had a really good charge, and although it was a shame I couldn't quite make the podium it was nice to be competitive," she said. "But in the Formula Ford 2000 race there was nothing I could have done more to avoid the crash - I was right across to the edge of the track and had nowhere to go - the other car just caught my rear wheel."

She badly bruised her left leg aggravating the ligament injuries in her horrific crash at Mallory Park a year ago. She plans to be back in a racing car soon in time for the next meeting in November.

Care Connect offers round-the-clock support via an alarm link to a team of locally-based control room staff and mobile responders.

On-call staff can contact the emergency services in the event of accident, arrange for a warden to visit a client's home if required or simply offer reassurance if someone is feeling vulnerable or alone.

TSA accreditation is awarded following an on-site audit by an independent inspector. A service must pass an annual re-inspection in order to retain the standard each year.

DEMOLITION DAY 7th SEPTEMBER

AYCLIFFE FC PREPARE FOR HISTORIC VASE GAME

From our M.P. Phil Wilson

On September 7th at 11.00am a ceremony will be held outside the former health centre to celebrate the building's demolition. The winner of the Demolition Day Draw, Mrs Laverty, will do the honours. The charities who will share in the proceeds of the lottery will also receive their cheques at the event. The people of Newton Aycliffe have waited a long time for this day. The old library and the Dalton Way end of the town centre are to bite the dirt at the same time. The complete demolition will take several weeks to finish, with preparatory work already taking place. Once the demolition is finished, Aldi are to build a store on the site, starting next year. The ramp, which dominates the town centre, is also to come down. I believe the whole town centre will be transformed over the next couple of years. But the former health centre is symbolic. I do not think anyone will believe the town centre is to be regenerated until that building is no more. That day is fast approaching and it's a day I can't wait to see. I would like to take this opportunity to thank all those who have worked with me to see this day made a reality, including Durham County Council, the Primary Care Trust, Great Aycliffe Town Council and Freshwater. Once the demolition has taken place I will watch carefully future developments to ensure the redevelopment progresses.

DECISION ON HITACHI

As you know I've been leading a campaign with the Northern TUC, North East Chamber of Commerce, Durham County Council and many others to ensure the government goes ahead with the Intercity Express Programme which will mean the trains will be built by Hitachi in Newton Aycliffe creating hundreds of jobs. We need your support. The petition we have launched has gathered thousands of signatures. But we need more. I intend presenting the petition to Parliament in October. I'm leading a delegation to the Department of Transport to see the Secretary of State on September to explain the need for the jobs in Aycliffe. Please sign the petition. If you don't have access to one please pop into my office in the town centre and sign the petition there.

Newton Aycliffe are preparing for another historic fixture for the club this weekend. The Newtonians are due to go to first division side West Allotment Celtic in the first qualifying round of the FA Vase on Saturday. Boss Allan Oliver is no stranger to the competition, as he masterminded Crook Town's run to the last-eight during the 2005-06 season. Should Aycliffe overcome 'Celtic,' they have already been paired with another first division side, in the shape of current second-placed Bedlington Terriers. BROKEN PROMISES!

Heighington School Road Safety

Dear Sir

As the school holidays are drawing to a close, could I remind all parents who will be driving their children into Heighington school, to remember and obey the School Traffic Charter that has been developed over many years. All parents should be aware of this and act accordingly. If any parents have any questions regarding the Traffic Charter or do not know anything about it, contact the school of myself for clarification. But as a reminder, I would ask ALL parents to accept the following procedures when driving a child into school:-

Do not park outside of the school entrance or across the double yellow lines on Redworth Road (opposite the Sports Field Car Park - unless you want to pay for a Parking Fine)

Do not park on any restricted parking areas displayed on the road surface by yellow paint lines.

Do not park nor enter the small road leading into Hopelands Court which is opposite the school main entrance. Parking in this area is restricted to our senior citizens who live in the flats opposite.

Do not park over the entrance or in the Hopelands Garage area.

Parents wishing to drop their

child outside the school gates should do so by driving along Highside Road into Hopelands, stopping your vehicle opposite the tarmac strip just before the school gates and then allow your child to get out of your car to walk into school. Parent's should then drive slowly up to Millbank and then home.

For those parents who escort their younger children into school, please park your vehicle in the Redworth Road Sports Field Car Park, Highside Road, the centre of the village or the laybys in Hopelands.

I would also remind all parents that Heighington is a small and old village. Our roads are narrow and visibility splay lines

are often poor and these are made much worse in adverse weather conditions. Over the years our school population has increased dramatically and with this increase has come a dramatic rise in the number of vehicles driving into and out from our school in Hopelands. Sadly, this in turn has increased the accident risk to our school children and to our residents. Please drive with due care. Have respect for the residents who live in Heighington. Give yourselves more time to complete your journey from home into school and lower your speed on entering and driving through Heighington. Councillor Gerald Lee
