7th September. It was a great community occasion attended by our M.P. Phil Wilson, Mayor Dorothy Bowman, Rotary President Barry Hutchinson, important officials and Councillors, together with representatives from Freshwaters the Landlords. Ann Laverty revelled in the

honour of pressing the start button, part of the prize she won when buying a raffle ticket from the Rotary Club Draw also winning her a 42' HD T.V. donated by Tesco. The four charity shops in the town were presented with their part of the proceeds

from the draw, by the Rotary President. Ann Laverty was interviewed on Radio and Television and appeared on the news the same day. She said: "It was a wonderful prize and I will always remember the excitement of the day and my

moment of glory". After the old buildings have gone the site will be prepared for the building of a new Aldi Store expected to be ready in nine months time.

No one believed the work on the redevelopment of our worn out Town Centre would ever start, but at last we see a new beginning. Phil Wilson said: "All we

want now is another boost to our hopes for the future and news that the Government will support Hitachi coming to Aycliffe with a new factory to build trains, bringing over 700 new jobs!"

2nd September. The couple live in Whitely Grove and have the distinction of being among the town's earliest pioneers, settling here 53 years ago. Mike was born in Spennymoor and has a splendid record of Police service both as an officer and a civilian as an officer and a civilian worker. In fact he met his wife from

Ferryhill, while in the Force as she too was employed by the Police and served 24 years in the finance department. They were married in St. Cuthbert's R.C. Church in Durham. Mike joined the Police after a

term in the RAF during the war. He was a constable in Stockton, Thorp Thewles, Hartlepool, and Ferryhill, and was promoted to Sergeant, training Cadets near Lanchester. For a while both worked at the Police HQ when it was established on Aycliffe Trading Estate.

Disaster struck for Mike when on duty in Ferryhill and investigating a road accident. While on the scene a car came off the road into himself and two fellow officers causing severe injuries. Mike was in hospital

for 13 months and eventually lost his leg. He returned to duty at Headquarters where he had a desk job until he was medically discharged after 27 years service for the Constabulary. However he continued as a civilian worker until retirement age. Despite his disability Mike has

On the weekend of September 3rd 2010, Peter Chappell and Andy Hanlon of Newton Aycliffe, Richard Smith of

Darlington, Richard Henry of Sunderland, Raymond Booth of Billingham and Barry Mayhew of Coxhoe cycled the 140-mile stretch of mountains, moors and picturesque villages that divide northern England's two coastlines, in aid of cancer research.

The Sea to Sea (C2C) starts in West Cumbria, travels through the Lake District and through Penrith, Eden Valley, Hartside, Northern Pennines, then follows an undulating ride through Nenthead, Rookhope, and down into the Durham Dales before entering Consett. From here it's an easy ride through to the North Sea and Sunderland. Tradition dictates that you start the ride by dipping your back wheel in the Irish Sea and only ends when your front wheel gets a dip in the North Sea.

So armed with our padded pants and go faster helmets we set off on the first leg of our journey. With tightening muscles, sore backsides and knee ligament damage in one case, it was purely down to mental strength and group encouragement that got us to the 100-mile point of the C2C. It was easy riding to the finish where we were greeted by family and friends and received a warm round of applause when dipping our front

wheels in the North Sea. All in all it was a very tough but rewarding challenge but most importantly it raised a lot of money for a very worthy cause which is close to the hearts of all members of the group. 




