## **London Deputation to** Promote Hitachi Bid

Regional economic analysis reveals the true extent of the wide-ranging benefits for County Durham and beyond should Hitachi bring a stateof-the-art rail assembly plant to Newton Aycliffe. A report, which has been prepared by economic regeneration experts at Durham County Council,

sets out the business case for the area, prior to the Government's decision on the matter next month. Hitachi has indicated that Aycliffe is the company's

preferred location, should the electronics giant be granted the Intercity Express Programme (IEP) contract in the Government's Comprehensive Spending Review (CSR).

The review results are due to be announced in October, but on September 21st a delegation led by the Council and Sedgefield MP Phil Wilson, will head for Whitehall to put the case and deliver the report. The delegation will outline the social and economic benefits of bringing Hitachi to Newton Aycliffe and the urgent need for such investment in both the local and wider area. Council chief executive

George Garlick said: "This is a rare opportunity to

bring about a transformation that would have an almost immediate impact on the local economy and beyond. For every £1 invested the estimated return is £48 over a 20 year period. We could see development, with the creation of 200 construction jobs, within a year. As many as 800 jobs created, at the main manufacturing unit alone within five years and the first trains roll off the assembly line by 2014. These are real, tangible and realistic targets which County Durham has the ability to deliver, given the opportunity to do so." Durham County Council

Leader, CIIr Simon Henig said: "Private sector investment on this scale would have enormous social and economic benefits for County Durham and the wider area. The creation of hundreds of jobs, with thousands more through the supply chain, will mean a significant drop in the level

of unemployment. "County Durham has seen the highest growth in the number of people claiming iob seekers allowance in the North East, with 12,000 people now unemployed; nearly 2,000 of those live in the Sedgefield area. "Securing widespread

employment raises selfesteem and improves health, giving young people greater opportunities for the future. The benefits of Hitachi coming to Newton Aycliffe should not be underestimated."

The Council's Cabinet member for regeneration and economic development, Cllr Neil Foster, said: "The impact of securing this exciting 20 year programme would be immense and that is why we will be doing absolutely everything within our powers to bring this contract to Newton Aycliffe.

"Not only do we have a rich rail heritage, we have the infrastructure and the workforce committed to quality manufacturing. It would bring a huge number of employment options for people with a wide range of skills, boosting the local housing economy and providing the impetus for

economic growth. "This is exactly the sort of private sector investment which would see the vision for our county, as outlined in the County Durham Plan, become a reality." Phil Wilson MP Sedgefield

said: "The Intercity Express Programme is massively important for Newton Aycliffe and the North East. The jobs and investment Hitachi would bring to the region, if the contract is given the go-ahead, would be the largest in the region since Nissan: 800 jobs, up to 9,000 in the supply chain, with seven out of 10 in manufacturing, the project would go a long way towards boosting the private sector. It would also ensure that train building comes back to the North East."

### SPIRAL STAIRWAY **RE-OPENED**


The spiral staircase in the Town Centre up to Upper Beveridge Walkway has been re-opened after refurbishment.


## SCHOOL AYCLIFFE PLAY AREA REFURBISHMENT

## **FOCUS ON THE CROCUS**



In early October Great Aycliffe Town Council will be teaming up with the Rotary Club of Newton Aycliffe to offer the opportunity to every primary school in the town to plant crocus bulbs in prominent locations around the town.

The reason behind this is for the past 25 years Rotary International has been at the forefront of Polio eradication worldwide. To coincide with their 2011 campaign the Rotary club are planting millions of purple crocus bulbs throughout the United Kingdom

during October, these bulbs will then flower in February 2011. Purple is the chosen colour as it is the colour of ink put on the finger of a child to indicate that the child has been inoculated against this deadly virus.

## LOOMING

For several years Great Aycliffe Town Council have been managing areas around the town as wild flower meadows, the most notable location being near the train station. The sculpture on the grassland depicts a common blue butterfly resting on an orchid; both of which are a regular sight during the summer.

Meadows are managed by allowing the natural plants to flower and disperse their seeds before cutting and removing the vegetation in later summer, by doing this the seed bank will improve over several seasons producing a richer show of flowers year on year.

This year several new meadows have been created around the town including both the Town and Woodham parks. At the moment, these areas appear to be little more than rough grassland, but given a few years these meadows will flourish into colourful grassland like elsewhere in the town.

Other particularly species rich areas can be found through Woodham Burn and in West Park. Many people walk by these meadows and may notice the impressive display of natural colour but on closer inspection these areas are often made up of a diverse range of plant species.

Comparison of costs of train travel were remarkably competitive. The Newton Aycliffe fare to Darlingon is £2.90 and takes 17 minutes while the Bus is £6 and takes 28 minutes.

Auckland by rail is only £2, taking 11 minutes. The bus takes 43 minutes and costs £6.
