Newton Avcliffe as the preferred site for the factory to build the new rolling stock for the East Coast and Great Western railway lines known as the Intercity Express Programme. If the Programme is to go ahead it must first have the sanction of the Government. We put the economic case to the Secretary of State.

The Programme will create 800 direct jobs in Newton Aycliffe including some apprenticeships. Thousands more will be created or secured in the supply chain many of them in the North East. One North East estimates that for every £1 of public investment £48 will be generated in the economy over a twenty year period. The economic case for the programme is massive and will see the biggest investment in the

North East since Nissan. The Secretary of State told the delegation that Hitachi had submitted a revised proposal. This is an indication that the Government is continuing to talk to the company. I believe we made a strong case for the North East. Hitachi has chosen Newton Aycliffe because we have the right workers with the right skills and I will continue to

fight the case for Hitachi to come to Newton Aycliffe. The Government will make a final decision at the time of the Comprehensive Spending Review on October 20th, meanwhile the fight continues.

I know the people of Newton Aycliffe and surrounding areas understand the situation and will continue to use the Town Centre shops and businesses in ever more numbers making the Town Centre the success it deserves to be.






