St. Mary's celebrated their 50th in style by installing new carpets and redecorating the church throughout to present a beautiful setting for the Festival.



Overnight between 9pm 21st September and 7am 22nd September 2010, vehicles had been broken into in Vane Road and Wolsey Close Newton Aycliffe.

A Ford Focus saloon was broken into outside of 29 Vane Road, Newton Aycliffe. A quantity of Compact Discs a jack and wheel brace were also taken from this vehicle. It was unknown how thieves had gained entry as there was no damage to the vehicle. The locking nut for the vehicle was left on the floor close to the vehicle.

The same evening, thieves gained entry to a Ford Focus estate at Vane Road. The front passenger side window was broken to gain entry to the vehicle.

A silver Hewlett Packard 3 megapixel compact digital camera was taken from the glove compartment of the vehicle.

A small blue tool box containing an upholsterers tools was taken from the boot of the vehicle. SDEA FUNDING HELPS SIX PEOPLE INTO WORK

A growing North East business has recruited six long-term unemployed staff thanks to help from South Durham Enterprise Agency and the Working Neighbourhoods Fund. Medical Services North East, which started in May 2002, has grown rapidly in the last three years. Working with the regions main hospitals, the business offers a private ambulance service - taking patients to appointments and transferring them both in the region and further afield. Approved by the British

Ambulance Association, the team of 26 staff use a fleet of 16 ambulances to move up to 1200 patients a month, taking patients as far as Cornwall, Manchester and London. Unlike similar companies Medical Services North East operate 24 hours a day, seven days a week - a service which is very well received and recommended by their customers. After working for a private

ambulance service, business partner Wayne Hall spotted an opportunity to offer a similar service and started the ambulance service with his wife, Joanne. With lots

of hard work, family support and a passion to succeed, the business has grown considerably and boasting some prestigious awards.

"We are in daily contact with poorly and sometimes terminally ill patients, we want to make them feel comfortable and try our best to brighten their day and make them smile. These are important values that I pass onto my staff," said Mr Hall.





LABOUR RECOVER OFF FALLING LIB DEM SUPPORT

In response to Wilf Emmerson's letter who made some points on which I can only agree to differ, but it is interesting to note that most of the letters in Newton News come not from Labour but opposition members.

My letter simply pointed the good things done under Labour, however Wilf may be interested to look at the recent YouGov on voting intentions and let's see what happens after the 24th September when Labour gets a new Leader.

On the 24th August 2010 YouGov voting intentions and government approval ratings were the worst for Conservatives since the election. The net government approval rating is zero. 40% of people approve of the government's performance, but 40% disapprove. On voting intention the Conservative lead is down to 2 points, the lowest since the election campaign. Top line figures are CON 41%, LAB 39%, LIB-DFM 12%

Government approval has been on a slow downwards trajectory since its peak straight after the emergency budget in June. This has been partially down to Labour voters' hardening disapproval of the government, and falling Liberal Democrat support. Some Liberal Democrats say they approve of the government's performance, but there are far fewer of

The level of Conservative support remains strong. Daily polling has shown them consistently at or above 40% since the budget, significantly

above the 37% support they received at the general election. Their narrowing lead in the polls is down to Labour increasing their support off the back of the collapse in Liberal Democrat support. Labour are consistently polling around 37%, up 7 from their general election score, while Liberal Democrat support stands at just over half their general election vote election vote.

The drop in government approval is to be expected, and with the exception of the Blair government after 1997 (and to some extent 2001, when the government's approval dropped, but then spiked after the attack on the Twin Towers), no British government sustains a positive approval rating for long. The Conservatives rating

in the polls remains quite positive, but I'd expect that to start falling at some point once the cuts really start to bite: again, it is clearly what they expect, the Conservative strategy appears to be to take the unpopularity to start with and hope to recover once the cuts have been digested and the economy is in better shape

Right now, the interesting poll rating is that of the Liberal Democrats – the Conservatives have 5 years to get over low poll ratings... unless the coalition falls apart. To date the Lib Dems have been pretty sanguine about the collapse in support, despite stories about Charles Kennedy's non-defection or Simon Hughes's semi-regular soundings off, there is no obvious sign of panic. 

CAB Open New H.Q. in Spennymoor Sedgefield & District Citizens hours and the opportunity to Sedgefield a

Advice Bureau celebrated the opening of their new premises in Spennymoor on Friday 17th September. The bureau was officially opened by Dr Dinah Roy, a local GP and Practice based commissioning lead for Durham County PCT who works closely with the Health Advice Service; a project offered by the bureau in providing advice in health settings, funded by the PCT

Established in 1959, the service has always had rented accommodation, carrying little security in the way of tenure, with limitations in relation to the alterations one can reasonably carry out to make a building fit for offering confidential advice. Additionally, with more and more reliance upon volunteers to the bureau also

needed somewhere to house a training facility. Early last year the board of trustees made the decision to find a new home. Initially they hadn't thought about a purchase, but larger, more suitable rented accommodation. After months of searching and nothing being affordable or suitable, they stumbled across the idea of converting an old public house. The Wheatsheaf was ideally located on the High Street in

Spennymoor, and was up for sale after being empty for a number of years. The Treasurer and Business

Development Manager attended a course on Capital Projects run by PNE and agreed to put the idea to the board. Whilst understanding the risk in taking on a 25 year mortgage, this seemed to be the best, most costeffective option. By stripping out the pub, the bureau could be largely purpose built internally providing the space for training of new volunteers, a good sized waiting area and more interview rooms as well as being able to house the project staff who provide advice right across the area.

Business Development Manager, Donna Stewart said "It might appear to be rather extravagant for a charity to purchase and refurbish a building but the reality is the mortgage repayments on this are cheaper than the rental and of course we have the additional security of tenure that a rental

property cannot provide. The vision was to provide a modern facility for clients, staff and volunteers that would allow greater flexibility in opening

help far more people by having additional interview rooms. The main grumble from clients has always been in relation to the tiny waiting room where now it is spacious and light. We are also able to provide a receptionist available 9am 4pm Monday to Friday for general enguiries about opening times or to receive mail to be passed to caseworkers."

This purchase and refurbishment programme was funded via a loan and grant from Futurebuilders (a government funded project) as well as smaller grants from Christ's Hospital in Sherburn and the Clothworkers Foundation

The service also contributed from their own reserves which had been set aside for this

purpose. The message CAB want to get across is this bureau is here for you, your community service - in your community and staffed by people from your community. Use us, support us or lose us!

60% of staff are volunteers who give on average 384 hours of their time every year. In return, they receive high quality training which results in them gaining extra skills making them more attractive to new employers. Not all volunteers want paid

work, but for those that do, this is an excellent stepping stone. 80% of volunteers gain employment within a year. Additional space means CAB Additional space means CAB can provide additional services. A number of partners have approached them on providing services. From next week a local firm of solicitors will be providing free 'initial' employment and legal advice from the new offies. The meeting/training room is

also available for hire so can be utilised by community groups. From November CAB have been awarded a new (LSC) Legal Services Commission Contract which will also allow them to provide specialist Housing advice as well as Welfare Benefits and Debt. Welfare Benefits and Debt. This is a fantastic development for the community particularly in Spennymoor, however, we know our offices in Newton Aycliffe are struggling to cope with the number of clients we see so are looking for an alternative home there alternative home there

Disc, a tenant of premises next to the Fire Station has relocated to the I.E.S. Centre near the Blue Bridge. With offices throughout the north it is thought Aycliffe might become the main Headquarters of the charity which helps disadvantaged young people into employment.

The question people are asking is what now happens to the empty building in a prime town centre position? It belongs to the County Council so we asked Steve Carroll, corporate estate manager, who said: "The lease on this building will terminate towards the end of the year and we will then look at plans to demolish the building as it is in a state of disrepair." The other question that springs to mind is why wasn't this

building considered for conversion as the temporary Library saving £350,000 or offered for use as a "Cubby" to release the land this drop-in stands on to be part of the redevelopment on that side of the road?

North-East in the last fortnight, watching games across the region and speaking to contacts, as Aycliffe look to get back to winning ways after two successive home draws.


