DISCOVER YOUR FAMILY TREE AT PCP

A new course at the Pioneering Care Centre, Newton Aycliffe is giving people the chance to delve into their past and discover where their family roots lie. Tutor Chris Forster is running the Family History course on a Monday evening from 6-8pm and a Friday 10am-12pm. The 10 week course gives

a comprehensive, stepby-step guide to pulling together your family tree including how to locate Parish Records, tracking down Census material. sourcing birth, marriage and death certificates and using relevant internet sites.

Chris Forster said: "People generally are really intrigued when it comes to finding out who their ancestors are and I think a lot of them secretly hope they are related to Royalty!

The easiest way to complete a family tree is to start at the present and then work backwards. So you can start by taking the names of your parents on your birth certificate, then using the birth certificates to identify their parent's details, and so on and so on. Then there are various ways dating back to the early



1800s to trace your relatives, such as birth, marriage and death certificates which were issued from 1837, and before that locating Parish records which details baptisms, marriages and burials. Nowadays, having access to the internet, you can use various websites to help complete your family tree and pull the whole thing together piece by piece like a jigsaw puzzle. It really is a very exciting process to be

The extension will provide for 10 new consulting rooms giving Doctors, Nurses and Healthcare Workers dedicated spaces for consultations and treatments and removing the need for 'hot desking' and shared facilities. It will also provide for additional meeting and waiting rooms and more space for the administration team

NHS Services for patients will improve as a result of the new build. More importantly, perhaps, in an era when more NHS services are expected to be provided locally to patients (as opposed to in a hospital), the new build gives nearly 200sq.m. of 'development space'. Whilst this space currently remains unallocated there is no doubt about its enormous potential benefit.

Senior Partner, Dr Ron Pounder commented, "I am aware that Newton Avcliffe

residents have to travel to Hospitals in Darlington, Bishop Auckland or Sedgefield to receive certain services and treatments. We are considering the best use of our 'development space' taking into account the views of patients, the local community and the availability of NHS funding.

Amongst our considerations are extended Out of Hours Services, Diagnostic Facilities (eg X-ray). We'd also like to provide a new base for District Nurses, Specialist Nurses, and Midwives who are currently housed away from the Surgery or not even in Newton Aycliffe at all."

The 1st Floor of the new extension will give better facilities to enable Peaseway to increase its private services such as Chiropody, Physiotherapy, Acupuncture and also the existing, successful Skin and Laser Clinic.

The rooms and layout of the new £1.9m extension is designed by P+HS Architects of Stokesley. The Department of Health who give technical guidance on the design of new health centres were consulted.

The new build incorporates a passenger lift allowing for disabled and stretcher access to the first floor with full accessibility to all. The main Contractor is Mollhann Construction based in Wingate, Co. Durham.

Project completion is expected early May 2011 to be followed by an official



Protected Tree - a Danger to Life - Finally Felled

In recent weeks there has been some correspondence about removal of trees which have become dangerous.

We have just been relieved of such danger after a five year battle with the Authorities over a tree on my property in Aycliffe Village, protected by a Preservation Order.

It eventually had to felled on 1st October at my own expense of nearly £1,800. A massive branch, weighing 2 tonnes broke off in a recent storm and fortunately my children weren't playing nearby at the time, otherwise they would have been killed.

I paid for pruning of the tree over the 5 years to lessen the load on the decaying trunk and during that time had three independent reports advising the tree be felled, but this met with resistance from the Council who I assume were influenced by local protesters.

Over 5 years we spent £5,000 maintaining the tree. My advice to others who have a tree causing a nuisance to foundations or looking dangerous to life is to get it removed. Others may object,



but they don't have to live with the danger.

Speaking about the help she received Debra said: "After being out of work and struggling to find a job I was starting to lose my confidence. stage during this cycle. He told me that if you as a resident of the town, have any particular concerns about potholes, or damage to a road, within West Ward, or anywhere throughout the town you can speed up this process. There is a dedicated HIGHWAYS ACTION LINE. Call 0191 3706000 or email: hal@durham. gov.uk. This will possibly speed up the inspection

process of that particular section of road and possibly lead to a speedier repair. If not, at least, the Highways Office will know about the problem.

and Teesdale areas, has also seen eight drivers issued with fixed penalty notices for failing to produce the correct paperwork for the loads they were carrying.

A further 29 people were given warnings or received fines for other vehiclerelated offences following the spot checks.

Inspector Ed Turner of Durham Constabulary Roads Policing unit said: "These stop and search exercises have enabled us to identify a number of individuals we suspect of being involved in the theft and sale of scrap

Officers and Wardens are also using DNA technology to identify the origin of suspected stolen metal.

With the help of special torches it is possible to identify markings on the metal.

During the stop and search operations, drivers are asked to produce their waste carrier's licence and documents proving the legitimacy of the load they

are carrying. Anyone who does not have the correct paperwork can receive a £300 fixed penalty notice. Failure to pay the fine could result in court action and a maximum fine





SBH New Homes May Not Help Newtonians

Dear Sir, I was astonished that SBH is submitting planning permission to build 19 new houses in the old Sedgefield Borough area, 14 in Aycliffe and 5 in Spennymoor. In a letter sent out to local residents the final paragraph says: 'We look forward to hearing or indeed seeing you soon to chat through this exciting new venture for Sedgefield Borough Homes'

I phoned and was told that I could only have an appointment on a day and time I could not attend and there were no other times.

I thank Mrs. Jan Welsh for interceding and arranging for me to get a visit. I met with Natalia Quacquarelli, the consultants representing SBH in this venture, and Lee Barras.

They chose the old part of town to build because people want to live there. Yet there is a lot of green area in the Agnews which could accommodate more residential properties where work on foundations could start immediately so as not to cause much disruption to

residents nearby.
On the Baliol Road site they forgot to mention that 50% of the garage area will not be built on and they are looking at selling this land off to nearby owners of property. Before they even applied for planning permission they had already approached garage owners and tenants and offered this land, suggesting it could be off-







Newton Aycliffe's Angie Winstanley-Smith has been selected to represent the British Women's Water Polo Team, powered by British Gas, who will be embarking on their first encounter in the Hungarian National League as they take another step in their

Olympic journey. Angie 25, will travel to Dunaujvaros, Hungary, with the rest of the team in a move that will see them compete against some of the best professional clubs in Europe throughout the 2010/2011 season.

"A lot of the top international players have returned to the clubs there this season because there is a bit more sponsorship and money about. Now we know we're going to be playing against world class players every weekend."

With success coming at the end of last season - including wins over rivals Italy and Germany in the FINA World League - the team are looking to step up their 2012 preparations and build upon their success to propel them into the highest ranks of the sport.
