## Woodham Golf Course Show Revised Development Plans

Washington Developments Ltd. is presenting an exhibition of plans for a new development at Woodham Golf and Country Club.



The proposals comprise a new 4\* hotel with 75 bedrooms and a spa for business and tourist visitors, a new golf clubhouse with improved facilities for members and visitors, with improvements to the golf course and extensive landscape enhancements.

The plans also include 50 executive family homes which is a reduction in the number of houses from the last application.

They propose to re-establish Woodham bridleway and provide a new footpath. The scheme could create and safeguard 130 jobs and add £32m investment to the local economy.

The proposals are at an early stage and the owners are keen to meet with members of the local community to

discuss the development. This will help them take on board your views before they progress to detailed designs and the submission of a planning application. The exhibition is in the Clubhouse, on Friday 22nd October from 2pm - 8pm



## DISCOVER YOUR FAMILY TREE AT PCP

A new course at the Pioneering Care Centre, Newton Aycliffe is giving people the chance to delve into their past and discover where their family roots lie. Tutor Chris Forster is running the Family History course on a Monday evening from 6-8pm and a Friday 10am-12pm.

The 10 week course gives a comprehensive, step-by-step guide to pulling together your family tree including how to locate Parish Records, tracking down Census material, sourcing birth, marriage and death certificates and using relevant internet sites. Chris Forster said: "People generally are really intrigued when it comes to finding out who their ancestors are and I think a lot of them secretly hope they are related to Royalty!

"The easiest way to complete a family tree is to start at the present and then work backwards. So you can start by taking the names of your parents on your birth certificate, then using the birth certificates to identify their parent's details, and so on and so on. Then there are various ways dating back to the early



1800s to trace your relatives, such as birth, marriage and death certificates which were issued from 1837, and before that locating Parish records which details baptisms, marriages and burials. Nowadays, having access to the internet, you can use various websites to help complete your family tree and pull the whole thing together piece by piece like a jigsaw puzzle. It really is a very exciting process to be part of."

I am the Census Area Manager for County Durham and Darlington and we have launched the official recruitment of 35,000 jobs across England and Wales. Walking around Spennymoor I noticed how much better off they are for shops and services in their town centre, highlighting the poor design of our own which is so compact and restrictive.

As we have a relatively small shopping area which is privately owned there is little chance of attracting the interesting shops and services offered in similar older town centre locations.

Spennymoor has a major Supermarket, a Netto, Aldi, Lidl, Farm Foods and Home Bargains while we just have Tesco and an Aldi (coming soon). Spennymoor has a smaller population than Newton Aycliffe, yet attracts all these shops.

We can only assume this is down to availability of space and the cost of trading in a town centre which is privately owned. For some time we have campaigned for a Retail area on the Business Park to bring those High Street shops and recreational facilities we can't fit into our town centre. There appears to be no one marketing Newton Aycliffe, trying to bring new shops and services to a population of almost 30,000 with such great potential.

Newton News made a marketing attempt themselves contacting the latest arrival in Spennymoor, "Home Bargains", a fast expanding company throughout Britain which we felt would benefit our residents.

We sold Newton Aycliffe to them and their reply was positive, stating our town was now on their list. This proved to us that it requires little to sing the praises of Newton Aycliffe to get a result!



residents have to travel to Hospitals in Darlington, Bishop Auckland or Sedgfield to receive certain services and treatments. We are considering the best use of our 'development space' taking into account the views of patients, the local community and the availability of NHS funding.

Amongst our considerations are extended Out of Hours Services, Diagnostic Facilities (eg X-ray). We'd also like to provide a new base for District Nurses, Specialist Nurses, and Midwives who are currently housed away from the Surgery or not even in Newton Aycliffe at all."

The 1st Floor of the new extension will give better facilities to enable Peaseway to increase its private services such as Chiropody, Physiotherapy, Acupuncture and also the existing, successful Skin and Laser Clinic.

We have just been relieved of such danger after a five year battle with the Authorities over a tree on my property in Aycliffe Village, protected by a Preservation Order. It eventually had to be felled on 1st October at my own expense of nearly £1,800. A massive branch, weighing 2 tonnes broke off in a recent storm and fortunately my children weren't playing nearby at the time, otherwise

they would have been killed.

I paid for pruning of the tree over the 5 years to lessen the load on the decaying trunk and during that time had three independent reports advising the tree be felled, but this met with resistance from the Council who I assume were influenced by local protesters.

Over 5 years we spent £5,000 maintaining the tree. My advice to others who have a tree causing a nuisance to foundations or looking dangerous to life is to get it removed. Others may object,



but they don't have to live with the danger.

# NEWTONIAN'S MAGICAL NEW BUSINESS

A Newton Aycliffe woman has the online gift business all wrapped up - thanks to support from Be Enterprising. Debra Farrell, 50, has recently set up two web-based businesses, [magicalcreations.co.uk](http://magicalcreations.co.uk) and [ourmagicalday.co.uk](http://ourmagicalday.co.uk) selling unique handmade gifts, wedding stationery and favours following a period of unemployment.

After arthritis forced her to stop working as a garden designer, Debra couldn't find a job she could manage with her physical problems and decided the answer lay in self-employment. With ideas and a draft business plan she approached Be Enterprising for advice.

Debra, was supported by the Enterprise Coaching project through Be Enterprising, which is part of Solutions for Business - the Government's package of publicly funded business support designed to help companies start and grow.

She was allocated an enterprise coach who helped her work out what she wanted to achieve and how to go about it. Be Enterprising also helped Debra to access funding towards the purchase of materials and a kiln for firing art clay silver for jewellery making.

The online businesses, launched earlier this year, are going from strength-to-strength with Debra now

teaching craft workshops at her home and booking fairs and markets to trade at too. All her products, from baby shower presents to wedding stationery, are entirely hand made and hand crafted.

Speaking about the help she received Debra said: "After being out of work and struggling to find a job I was starting to lose my confidence. My business coach came to visit me at my home and I showed her my products and the business plan I'd pieced together. Straight away she told me what I needed to do to get things moving."

"What was so great was I felt she believed in what I wanted to do from day one. She moved so fast to help me - it was brilliant. I thought it would take ages to get help but that wasn't the case at all."

The Be Enterprising programme was created to inspire and bring about change in County Durham's former coal fields and rural communities and has recently been awarded an additional £4.1m from the European Union Regional Development Fund.

So far the programme has helped more than 3,200 people to start new businesses, with 1,845 of these supported in moving from benefit dependency to economic activity; a success that has



happened within just three years of the programme's existence.

Debra's Be Enterprising coach Dawn Huntrud said: "When I first met Debra she was quite obviously an enterprising person but very low on her luck. She had been a foster carer and given much to help other people. I could tell she was the kind of lady who was very determined."

"She has been very focused with her business plan and has worked hard to get going. As a result her creations are starting to sell very well. Debra just needed some help and direction to fine-tune

her business plan, organise her businesses and get things off the ground by marketing her services. We were able to support her with all of this and give her the lift she needed."

He stated that every road in the town is thoroughly inspected at some time throughout every year. This of course may be just before the road is damaged by wintry weather, but it will be inspected and if necessary repaired at some stage during this cycle.

He told me that if you as a resident of the town, have any particular concerns about potholes, or damage to a road, within West Ward, or anywhere throughout the town you can speed up this process. There is a dedicated HIGHWAYS ACTION LINE. Call 0191 3706000 or email: [hal@durham.gov.uk](mailto:hal@durham.gov.uk). This will possibly speed up the inspection

process of that particular section of road and possibly lead to a speedier repair. If not, at least, the Highways Office will know about the problem.

I have been in contact with many of you with other concerns and will carry on doing so as your responses are returned to me. I will seek more answers to these highlighted concerns within the Lib Dem Focus. I am here to help.

## Police Catch Metal Thieves

Eight people have been arrested and two vehicles seized in South Durham as part of a crackdown on metal theft. Police officers and neighbourhood wardens from Durham County Council have stopped more than 100 vehicles suspected of carrying scrap metal during the past three months as part of an ongoing operation by the Safe Durham Partnership. The clampdown, in the Sedgfield, Wear Valley

and Teesdale areas, has also seen eight drivers issued with fixed penalty notices for failing to produce the correct paperwork for the loads they were carrying. A further 29 people were given warnings or received fines for other vehicle-related offences following the spot checks. Inspector Ed Turner of Durham Constabulary Roads Policing unit said: "These stop and search exercises have enabled us to identify a number of individuals we suspect of being involved in the theft and sale of scrap metal.

Officers and Wardens are also using DNA technology to identify the origin of suspected stolen metal.

With the help of special torches it is possible to identify markings on the metal.

During the stop and search operations, drivers are asked to produce their waste carrier's licence and documents proving the legitimacy of the load they are carrying.

Anyone who does not have the correct paperwork can receive a £300 fixed penalty notice. Failure to pay the fine could result in court action and a maximum fine of £5,000.

# Council Get Ready for Winter

New salt barns, updated gritting routes and a new priority pavement plan with a fleet of compact tractors suitable for clearing estate areas, plus new arrangements with farmers in extreme weather – these are the headlines of Durham County Council’s preparations to tackle this winter – whatever the weather. The authority has also hosted a regional summit, covering subjects like improving communications between local authorities, resilience planning, coordination and sharing best practice. The meeting yesterday, in Durham, (October 5, 2010) was attended by all 12 local authorities in the North East.

Director of neighbourhoods, Terry Collins, says important changes have been brought in to ensure Durham is as prepared as possible: “Last year, we started out with enough salt stocks to last an entire normal winter and with orders in, to keep our barns stocked. Many people will be aware that the exceptional and prolonged freezing weather led to a national shortage of salt and that, as a result of this, a national body called the salt cell took control of allowances. “This year, although we are most certainly not complacent, we have increased our own under cover storage capacity by 13,000 tonnes and have been busy for some time

building up our stock. “A great deal of hard work has been going on for many months to ensure that we are even better placed this year, and not just in County Durham. The purpose of the North East salt summit has been to look at how we can work together effectively whilst also considering options for increasing our regional salt stocks.” The Cabinet member for strategic environment is Cllr Bob Young: “We have built two new barns at Chilton and Morrison Busty and can now go in to the winter with 40,000 tonnes of salt. We have done this as part of our absolute commitment to do everything within our power to keep County Durham moving whatever the weather.

“We have a unique county comprising of scattered communities and towns situated well above sea level, where road surfaces are more likely to freeze. This means winter maintenance is a very serious business indeed for us. “Although we can never offer any guarantees we can say hand on heart, we are trying extremely hard.” Durham County Council now has eight salt barns and remains committed to bringing all its salt stocks under cover

as quickly as possible. The council is currently finalising a map of the priority winter salting routes which will be available on its web site. In addition, although analysis is not yet complete, early indications are that the increased priority pavement clearance in the county has had a positive impact on reducing the number of injuries sustained by people slipping on icy footpaths. This winter the council’s new compact tractors will be out in force on estates and key town centre areas across the county. These will operate in times of severe weather and will cover certain prioritised routes like:

- Category 1 and 1a Footways (Town Centres)
  - Salt Bin Filling
  - Public Transport Interchanges
  - Hospitals
  - Doctors Surgeries
  - Health Centres
  - Category 2 Footways (small village shopping streets)
  - Sheltered Accommodation and Care Homes
- With public safety in mind the council’s web site will continue to offer daily winter weather updates, including details on which roads are closed, or passable with care, and tips for driving. Following a comprehensive scrutiny review, and to ensure the council responds to changing environmental conditions and residents’ needs the service will now be assessed annually, with a report presented to Cabinet for consideration.

Dear Sir, I was astonished that SBH is submitting planning permission to build 19 new houses in the old Sedgfield Borough area, 14 in Aycliffe and 5 in Spennymoor. In a letter sent out to local residents the final paragraph says: 'We look forward to hearing or indeed seeing you soon to chat through this exciting new venture for Sedgfield Borough Homes'.

I phoned and was told that I could only have an appointment on a day and time I could not attend and there were no other times. I thank Mrs. Jan Welsh for interceding and arranging for me to get a visit. I met with Natalia Quacquarelli, the consultants representing SBH in this venture, and Lee Barras.

They chose the old part of town to build because people want to live there. Yet there is a lot of green area in the Agnews which could accommodate more residential properties where work on foundations could start immediately so as not to cause much disruption to residents nearby.

On the Baliol Road site they forgot to mention that 50% of the garage area will not be built on and they are looking at selling this land off to nearby owners of property. Before they even applied for planning permission they had already approached garage owners and tenants and offered this land, suggesting it could be off-

the-road parking, including driveways to park cars.

I believe the number of garages to go is between 60 and 90 in Aycliffe. The new houses would be let under the bidding system including people from Sedgfield area, Co. Durham, England, the UK and they even have people as far away as Pakistan applying. I thought they were joking. As you can see, the houses are much in demand by the world population, not just local residents.

They said these houses will be in great demand and will help with the housing shortage and garages are not a priority. They were applying for permission now as housing grants were being changed or reviewed next year and funding could be affected.

Comments on anti-social behaviour around these garages is a smoke screen, as there is a far greater problem on other matters in these areas which are constantly being addressed by the police.

They also failed to quantify the numbers applying for housing: newlyweds, people who bought and sold their own houses, people from outside the area, problem families, ex-forces, single parents, to name but a few. The right to buy was also highlighted as the main cause for depleted housing stock.

The proposed housing is a short term fix on their part, as the people who are successful in their bid to acquire one, still have the right to buy and if they were in Council Housing prior to SBH they still get the discount up to a maximum of 60%. Within five years they could all be in private hands.

# NEWTONIAN SELECTED TO REPRESENT GREAT BRITAIN

Newton Aycliffe's Angie Winstanley-Smith has been selected to represent the British Women's Water Polo Team, powered by British Gas, who will be embarking on their first encounter in the Hungarian National League as they take another step in their Olympic journey.

Angie 25, will travel to Dunaujvaros, Hungary, with the rest of the team in a move that will see them compete against some of the best professional clubs in Europe throughout the 2010/2011 season.

They will kick-off their campaign with two matches over two days against UVSE on Friday and defending champions Dunaujvaros on Saturday.

With the women's international team improving so quickly since moving to the High Performance Centre in Manchester and London 2012 approaching fast, it was decided the team needed to get a taste of regular high level club competition in Europe where the game is more popular.

"We wanted to have more official games and a higher level of games because that is the biggest difference between the Great Britain players and the top European nations," said Szilveszter Fekete, Women's Head Coach and former Hungarian international goalkeeper.

"Most of the women's water polo leagues in Europe have



two good teams and the rest are about the same as in the British league but Hungary is different.

"A lot of the top international players have returned to the clubs there this season because there is a bit more sponsorship and money about. Now we know we're going to be playing against world class players every weekend."

With success coming at the end of last season - including wins over rivals Italy and Germany in the FINA World League - the team are looking to step up their 2012 preparations and build upon their success to propel them into the highest ranks of the sport.

Following the initial matches the team will be in action competing over the weekends of October 21st, October 28th, November 12th and November 26th with the second round of the League commencing in December.
