EDITORIAL

BAD NEWS ON CUTS TO SERVICES

"Localism" is the new buzz word in Government and supposedly aims to devolve powers to a more local level with better consultation and public involvement.

A more cynical reason could be the Governments' need to cut County Council budgets such as Durham by £100 million!

It is more likely we will have to decide whether or not services previously provided by the Unitary Authority can be passed onto our Town Council, with the expectation we will pay for them!

By giving us the right to decide on what services we need could be a cynical way of increasing the Council Tax by the back door.

We fell into the trap in last week's issue by suggesting the Town Council should take over the responsibility of snow clearing, because it was a local problem which only they could solve.

We did qualify this statement by stipulating the money and resources would have to come from the County Council, but if they just don't have the money it could only come from increasing local tax.

The hard truth of the matter is about to be revealed and readers are warned to be ready for bad news on those services we take for granted.

WORK STARTS ON AYCLIFFE BOWLING ALLEY & ICE RINK

ANOTHER RUFF 'n' TUMBLE INVESTMENT



An exciting new recreational facility on Aycliffe Business Park, Planet Leisure, has finally received planning permission. Work started this week on a Bowling Alley, Ice Rink, Laser Tag, and Aerial Obstacle Course at premises on Maple Way by the company who own Ruff 'n' Tumble.

Darren and Andrea Peckitt opened this business six years ago and has just celebrated their millionth visitor to this popular Play Centre on Aycliffe Business Park. The couple have twin girls Niamh and Annabel, now aged 9. As parents Darren and Andrea always found it difficult to find places



that entertained very young children. They visited a Play Centre in the region but the quality of the play and food was limited, so they decided to open a centre themselves in this area, providing quality play and food at prices to suit everyone.

"We have continued to invest in the facility and now attract children up to 12 years old usually unheard of for a Play Centre, due to the addition of the climbing wall, 10 pin bowling and bungee trampolines," said Darren. "As the girls got older, we recognised another shortfall in local leisure provisions in both choice and location. In November 2009 we approached Sedgfield Borough Council on their attitude to opening the Leisure Complex close to Ruff 'n' Tumble. After 6 months of discussions we received Planning Consent in June this year.

Raising the finances to support this venture has been very difficult, especially in this economic climate. We were fortunate to have a very supportive Bank Manager (HSBC) which was vital in securing a loan through the Government Backed Scheme, the same scheme that supported Ruff 'n' Tumble" said Darren. The 32,000 square foot complex will also provide a Bistro for nearly 100 people and a bar to accommodate 50. There will be a seated spectator area for 100 people. The Bowling Alley will have 12 lanes and the Ice Rink is 4,000 sq feet large. The new amenities are planned to open in the Spring of next year. This is a very welcome project for Aycliffe and the Peckitts deserve full support for their vision and drive in bringing something much needed to Newton Aycliffe.

Appeal for Witnesses to Car Crime

Police at Newton Aycliffe are appealing for witnesses to a crime that took place on PEASEWAY at around 3:25 pm on Friday afternoon (10th December). A green 'R' registered Nissan Micra had been parked up close to the junction with OAKFIELD following an earlier accident when two males arrived in a second car, got out and approached the Micra in broad daylight. The front passenger window was smashed and one of the offenders was seen 'hanging out of the car' through the window removing the radio from inside. Both males then fled the scene in a black coloured Renault Clio which headed towards the town centre. The only description obtained at the time was that one of the suspects wore a grey stripey top and had on

trainers. Sgt Mark Edwards told Newton News: "This crime took place in the middle of a Friday afternoon at a time when there were potentially lots of people who would have been leaving their places of work and in full view of any possible onlookers and local residents. I ask that anyone who may have been in the area at that time and who may have witnessed the crime taking place or seen a vehicle fitting the description to come forward with any information - no matter how insignificant it may seem. REPORT ON TOWN COUNCIL MEETINGS

Wednesday, 8th December (snow having forced the postponement of the previous week) was busy for Great Aycliffe Town Council (GATC), because three committees had to meet in one evening.

However, I was delighted to be told at the start that - after my letters of previous weeks - the Great Aycliffe Independent (GAI) Councillors intended to offer more debate. This is wonderful - the majority Labour Group positively welcomes the opportunity to justify its decisions. GATC is a well-run, successful Council, and being questioned in public gives us the opportunity to publicly demonstrate how great a Council it is!

1. The ENVIRONMENT Committee

included two notable issues: The first was about dog waste bags. Hitherto, the County Council has provided these free of charge but - intending to stop this service - it has written to the Town Council asking if we wish to take it over. The County Council estimates that it gives away a quarter of a million dog bags every year, so the cost would be perhaps £4000. The GAI Councillors argued strongly that dog-owners should pay for their own dog bags. The Labour Group contended that the free bag scheme encouraged people to pick up after their dogs; we therefore proposed to trial the scheme for a year - and that suggestion was agreed, with just four votes against.

The second key issue was the information that the County Council planners were recommending rejection of the Aldi planning application (on the grounds that the building included a 'bland' wall). Labour Councillors felt that the people of Aycliffe would not wish the town centre regeneration to founder on the issue of a design point; they proposed

to send the Town Clerk to present this opinion to the County Planning Committee ... and were delighted that the Independent Councillors fully supported this resolution.

2. At the RECREATION Committee, GAI Councillors asked who had made the decision to cancel the fireworks display. Councillor Fleming, for the majority Labour group, was happy to explain that the decision was taken at an emergency meeting of Chairs and Vice-Chairs, and was based, firstly, on the knowledge that it would cost an extra £7000 to restage the display and, secondly, on the fear that winter weather might ruin the show a second time - a decision vindicated by the recent snow. The GAI group accepted this explanation.

3. At the POLICY AND RESOURCES Committee, the GAI Councillors wondered whether the Council's Charges Schedule was 'inequitable'. I was delighted to address this issue, which is of interest to anybody who pays to use a Council facility. The truth is that GATC charges are set by the Council's officers, who take into account competitiveness, local comparators and projected revenue. The Councillors on the Working Group generally accept the officers' recommendations, but sometimes moderate them if there will be a high social cost, or where there is an ethical issue. Again, the GAI Councillors accepted this explanation.

All in all, a very lively and successful evening's meetings. **John D Clare**

PS: do readers know that members of the public are invited and able to attend any Council meeting? I think the most interesting are the Environment Committee (next meeting 12 January) and the Policy and Resources Committee (next meeting 19th January), but others may disagree!



NAIVETY SERVES NO ONE

Dear Sir,
I welcome Great Aycliffe Independents as a group of 9 Independents on the Town Council forming and registering themselves with the Electoral Commission as a Minor Political Party. It is what I would do if I wasn't Labour and if used wisely, can give substance and purpose to their aims and objectives and serve the public interest. I have been in local politics since 1975 with a distinguished record of service on the Town Council from 1983 to 1996. I have always put public interest before party or self, and as such will not blindly obey or follow Labour nor slavishly attack the opposition. No Party or group of people have a monopoly of wisdom and it is always in the public interest that a diversity of views and opinions are heard and expressed. Speaking as "just an ordinary member of the public" and one who regularly attends meetings of the Town Council, more than most councillors, except I am unpaid, I would make the following observations: The Labour controlled Town Council has run on the committee system since it was formed in 1894 as Great Aycliffe Parish Council. Then

in 1974 it changed to a Town Council and continues in that vein. This system enables any councillor whether or not they were elected at the Annual General Meeting to serve on any committee, to attend, and speak fully, and ask questions and make comment or observations. No councillor is deprived of being able to speak on any issue before the Council. The County Council and the former Sedgefield Borough Councils opted for the Cabinet system, which I totally oppose as being undemocratic and less accountable. In essence it can lead to a small cabal or clique running a council, and indeed that clique being dominated by the Officers of a Council, and the ruling Groups simply used as rubber stamps whereas the Committee system enabled direct Councillor access to all issues and the Councillors can be held to account personally for their decisions and their attendance. Something that can now only happen on the Town Council. The Town Council allows the public to ask questions on matters coming before it for consideration at every committee and full Council meeting - something Labour introduced. I have asked

more questions at Council meetings than most opposition/independent councillors. I am Labour, but it was I not the opposition who by asking questions at council meetings and using Newton News raised the issue of the Double Taxation Grant to be used to offset increases in Council Tax. It was I who raised the issue of Agendas and Minutes and Reports being available to the Public prior to meetings. It was I who forced the issue of public access to meetings of the council. It was I who pointed out at Council meetings that Councillors did not have to claim their £1,059 a year allowance and would not lose benefits or be taxed, yet the opposition all said they didn't know and thought they have no choice but to receive this money. Not one has opted out of receiving their allowance since! when they could at any time. It was I with the help of Newton News who proved that Town Councillors who served on Planning Committees at Borough or County level did not have to leave meetings. On all these issues the Independents have been silent. The Independents now have two former Labour councillors who defected after falling out with Labour. They are now part of the group of nine so they are no different than Labour accepting some Independents into its ranks, if we are talking about pots and kettles. Labour hasn't stitched up control of anything, it has the majority by public consent. Labour provides the stability and leadership for Council Officials to administer a multi million pound public authority. We are not perfect and make mistakes, but on the whole, the Town Council get it right. Labour froze Council Tax this year and next year, and the opposition/independents proposed nothing! When I served on the Council, we were fortunate to have good opposition councillors like Jill Frise, Eric White and Dave Elliott Independents, Peter and Andrea Bergg, Don Fraser and Len Cockfield Lib Dems, and others who studied their Agendas, Minutes and Reports, studied the Councils Standing Orders, understood the rules of debate, used strategy and tactics, asked the right questions, putting Labour and Officials on the spot, holding them to account. They put reasoned arguments forward, sometimes they agreed or disagreed, and sometimes they persuaded us to their view by reason and argument. Opposition is not there to oppose everything blindly, it is there to ask questions, raise issues, support that which is good for the public interest, oppose that which is bad and hold the governing Party to account. Perhaps if more Independents, read their Council Standing Orders, actually understood the rules of debate, actually read their Reports Agendas and Minutes they may have an impact, instead of leaving it to me, an ordinary member of the public, to raise pertinent issues.

Church Car Park Off Limits to School

Dear Sir,
As a parent of 2 children (1 being disabled) currently attending St. Mary's I am aware of Father Campion restricting access to the car park for parents. I'm sure other parents would like a reason for this as well! We understand the Church owns this car park and that they have let the school use the car park for many years. Some parents have abused this facility by parking out of bays and restricting access around the car park for other users. So far the school are unable to tell us what is going on, cars are being ushered away from the car park each morning. As I hold disabled badges for my

son I can't understand why they will not let us use any of the 4 designated disabled spaces in the car park. And what about taxi firms who have contracts with Out of School Clubs? We have been told by the school to use Tesco's car park, which is going to cause more mayhem in their very busy car park. I understand it is safe for children to use the crossing but a lot of drivers are inconsiderate and rev their engines impatiently as you cross which is very intimidating. I have had 4 near misses in Tesco's car park as people "don't see you" as they are backing out! Mrs. S. Radford

REPLY FROM THE PARISH PRIEST

A recent Safety Audit of the car park at St Mary's, carried out by a Health and Safety manager from a transport company, revealed that there is a significant safety risk when parents are using the car park for dropping off and collecting children from St Mary's School.

We installed speed ramps - at our own, Church, expense - to slow down parents' cars entering and exiting the car park. Nevertheless, some parents have continued to drive at speed, ignoring the ramps altogether. However, of even more concern is that parents have been parking their cars irresponsibly and, in some instances, quite dangerously, with little consideration for other drivers and children. This has resulted in a potentially lethal combination of cars and children, especially at the end of the school day; and it is all the more alarming on rainy days when visibility is restricted.

When we asked Durham County Council Highways and Education Departments for assistance, they said they could not help. So what is the Church to do? Clearly, we cannot ignore the problem and doing nothing in response to the Safety Audit is not an option.

I have consulted widely about this long-standing problem (which parishioners tell me has gone on for years). Everyone I have discussed it with so far, including members of the Church's Finance and Buildings & Grounds Committees, the Governors of St Mary's School, parents and some local Councillors, point out that it is a church, not a school, car park.

The responsibility for taking their children to school by car belongs to parents and not the Church.

Given the danger to children,




