TOWN COUNCIL MEETING REPORT

Wednesday 15th December

The Full Council meeting of Great Aycliffe Town Council (GATC) is slightly different to the various Committee meetings. Firstly, it is open to all Councillors and, secondly, its main role is to ratify the decisions of the different committees of the Council (which it did unanimously, without comment)

However, there were also a number of important other matters, in which you might be interested:

1. DRAFT SERVICE DELEGATION SCHEME

At its inception, Durham County Council (DCC) promised to support Town and Parish Councils who wished to deliver services on behalf of the County Council, and now a working party has issued a report which outlines the different types of delivery, the criteria for delegation, and the process by which a delegation of service might be sought and operated. This is an important issue, because it is part of the government's push for 'localism'.

GATC has always made it clear that it would be interested in taking over certain services, and CIIr Fleming, speaking as Leader, welcomed the document, but pointed out that there had been as yet no actual delegations. He was sceptical of a scheme which gave to DCC Service Managers the power to delegate their own services (since they would be supervising the dismantling of their own jobs – 'like turkeys voting for Christmas').

Most of all he noted that the report failed to resolve the key problems of WHO WOULD PAY for the delegated services (how funding would follow the services), or of DOUBLE TAXATION (where Aycliffe taxpayers are paying for Town Council services which elsewhere in the

County are provided by the County Council). In short, the scheme was still inadequate, and if GATC were to take on any major service (and suggestions have included planning, libraries and snow-clearing) it would only be after full consultation with the people of Aycliffe. 2. HITACHI **INVESTMENT**

3. GAI PARTY

A letter from the Audit Commission recorded its 'unqualified' (i.e. without reservation) opinion on both the Town Council's financial statements and its value for money, noting that 'its financial position and governance arrangements mean that it is relatively well-placed to meet future challenges'. This is the best report you can get from the Auditor, and was welcomed by all Councillors.

Is the Global Warming Joke Over?

Dear Sir

If, last week, frozen behind a snowdrift, you heard a faint hysterical squeaking, it might well have been the sound of those 20,000 delegates holed up behind a wall of armed security guards in the sundrenched Mexican holiday resort of Cancun, telling each other that the world is more threatened by runaway global warming than ever. Between their tequilas and

Between their tequilas and lavish meals, paid for by the world's taxpayers, they heard how, by 2060, global temperatures will have risen by 4 degrees Celsius; how the Maldives and Tuvalu are sinking below the waves faster than ever; how the survival of salmon is threatened by CO2-induced acidification of the oceans; how the UN must ban incandescent light bulbs throughout the world.

"Scientists", we were told, are calling for everyone to be issued with a "carbon ration card", to halt all Western economic growth for 20 years. It is only those same old computer models that predict that Tuvalu and the Maldives are about to drown, when real measurements show the sea around them not to be rising at all. Far from the oceans acidifying, their pH currently ranges between 7.9 and 8.3, putting them very firmly on the alkaline side of the threshold, at 7.0. The prediction that global temperatures will rise by four degrees in 50 years comes from that same UK Met Office computer which five weeks ago was telling us we were about to enjoy a "milder than average" winter, after three years when it has consistently got every one of its winter and summer forecasts hopelessly wrong. (And the reason why our local authorities are already fast running out of salt is that they were silly enough to believe them.)

When Vicky Pope, the Met Office's Head of Climate Change Advice, wanted to fly out from Gatwick to Cancun to tell them that 2010 is the hottest year on record, she was trapped by inches of the same global warming that her £33 million computer had failed to predict.

As for all that "geoengineering" make-believe which has been peddled for years, about giant mirrors and covering the sea with iron filings, are as fanciful as the idea that we can save the planet by forcing everyone to use those miserable mercuryvapour "low-energy" light bulbs, or that we can pipe away all the carbon dioxide from power stations to store it in holes under the North

What we are seeing here is one of the greatest collective flights from reality in the history of the human race. As western Europe shivers to a halt and our energy bills soar through the roof, the time has come when we should all start to get seriously angry with our politicians for being carried away by all this claptrap.

Why, for instance, when our public debt is still rising by £3 billion a week, do we allow our Government to ring-fence £2.9 billion of our money to help the developing world to build useless wind turbines and solar panels? With all the cuts in public

spending going on one which has rightly drawn flak is the colossal 47 % jump in our spending on overseas aid, due to rise from £7.8 billion to £11.5 billion. This includes, for instance, a further rise in the £800 million a year we already donate to India, one of the world's fastest growing economies. This will be spent on promoting gender equality, and assisting the Indians with their space programme.

This includes, however, only a part of the £2.9 billion that will be spent, along with the Department for Energy and Climate Change (DECC), as part of an EU scheme "to help developing countries pursue low-carbon growth and adapt oclimate change", which is a hefty part of the 27 % rise in the DECC budget over the next four years. A good case could be made that almost all spending on overseas aid

and climate change is money chucked down the drain. (My favourite politically correct DFID project was building a Ferris Wheel for the female inhabitants of the Afghan town of Lashkar Gah.)

Another item –on the list of fast-rising items of public expenditure–isthe £16 billion a year we already contribute to "EU institutions". This will be boosted by the EU Parliament's decision, that the EU Budget should rise by a further 6%.

When England's students

When England's students face a rise in tuition fees from £3,000 to £9,000 (but not Scottish or Welsh students thanks to England subsidising them) why do we tolerate a Parliament which blithely commits us to spending £18.3 billion every year for 40 years under the Climate Change Act, without having the faintest idea how we are going to keep our lights on? The global warming scare may have been fun for the children while it lasted, but the time has come for the joke to be declared well and truly over.

MANAGING THE CUTS N COUNTY DURHAN

Durham County Council faces an unprecedented challenge to reduce spending by over £100m over the next four years, which is more than double what the authority had planned to save in its current financial plan and will involve reviewing all services over the next four

The council's four year Medium Term Financial Plan (MTFP) sets the context for the more detailed budgets the council develops each year. Since the General Election, the council has had to completely review its financial plans to respond to the unprecedented spending reductions imposed by the Government.

As well as coping with additional spending cuts of £18.6m earlier this year, the council, must plan for a 28 per cent reduction in the level of Government support it will receive over the next four years. Together these figures total more than £100m.

In addition, council tax accounts for about a quarter of our income. In line with Government directions this has been frozen for 2011/12 and significant increases will not be allowed in future years, so the authority has no other option but

to significantly reduce spending to respond to its reduction in budget

This will be very challenging and will involve many difficult decisions. The council now has the final settlement figure of £235.4m for 2011/12 and is able to assess in more depth

Durham's baseline grant from Government has been reduced in cash terms by £28m in 2011/2012 and a further £17m in 2012/13 plus £25 million in Area Based Grants

The published figure of a 6.7 per cent reduction for Durham arises from a calculation of grant reduction against our total spend, rather than against grant received and includes Council Tax plus our share of the Social Care allocation.

Over £11m of the council's grant entitlement has been withheld by Government to protect services in other local authority areas

Unlike many other councils, Durham is proposing to achieve more than half of the savings required from sources other than service rationalisation. This is possible because the council will make significant efficiencies as a result of its ongoing modernisation programme and as a larger council, has more scope to realise savings.

The council has also responded to widespread recent public consultation and, as a result, will find above average reductions from management and support This overall approach is key to protecting frontline services as much as possible.

Our approach will be to reduce spending across five categories

More than half of the savings which the council will have to make from its core budget will come from the first four categories above.

Durham County Council can

do this because its on-going modernisation programme following unitary reorganisation in 2009 includes a whole series of cost saving projects and efficiency improvements to modernise, improve and streamline the operation of the largest local authority in the region and one of the largest councils in the county. As a larger local authority, Durham County Council has more scope than smaller councils to achieve savings in management and

support costs.
In developing a revised MTFP which reflects the major reductions in spending, the authority has conducted two major consultation exercises with the public. During these people have been asked how they feel Durham County Council should make the required savings and which services they would most like

to see protected.
The council intends to build on its recent track record of making efficiency savings and proposes a further £13.6 m of similar savings during the course of the plan, through projects such as:

More cost effective waste, recycling and refuse collection

Centralising and rationalising council depots and stores Creating integrated teams with the Health service

Supporting people to live independently through moving to re-ablement services

Sharing management costs between leisure and cultural services

More effective use of the council's fleet of vehicles

More cost effective administration for the council's Area Action **Partnerships**

More cost effective procurement of services including social care contracts. waste disposal and technical services.

These projects should help to protect or improve service

provision by reducing costs. On fees and charges, the council expects to save £5.5m, should the proposals set out in the revised MTFP be accepted by Cabinet on December 22. The authority will aim to strike a balance between charging for services (where it is normal practice for councils to do so). and the need to ensure that fees are appropriate and affordable for the many low income households in County Durham

Historically, Durham has offered relatively high levels of service compared with other councils. For example, music in schools in Durham is subsidised by the council tax and kerbside green waste collections are free. whereas in other areas these are paid-for, self-financing services. This means that Durham has more scope to meet the spending reductions by varying the standard of service, before having to consider withdrawing services altogether.
The council will fundamentally

review services to identify efficiency savings and the potential for rationalising elements of service areas. Amongst 140 proposals for making savings and reviews (see attached appendix), and having listened to the public's views the council will review high profile services including:

INCLUDING PUBLICATIONS SUCH AS DURHAM COUNTY NEWS Given the size of the council and the large number of facilities it has, Durham is better placed to achieve reductions by rationalising services before having to consider withdrawing them altogether.

The scale of spending reductions will involve the loss of approximately 1,600 jobs. This figure is the number of actual full time equivalent posts likely to be lost, taking in to account the deletion of vacant posts.

In addition, to the core grant reductions outlined above. where the Government has reduced specific grants - for example managing child protection databases – Durham County Council has followed suit. The approach Durham County Council is taking will protect frontline services as much as possible, within the restricted funds available.



Education is also highly regarded with primary education, (91 per cent satisfied), nursery education (89 per cent) and secondary education (86 per cent).

A large majority of residents 93 per cent feel the council has staff that are friendly and polite. Close to nine in ten feel that the council is doing a good job, (88 per cent) and enhances and conserves the environment (87 per cent). It is also very positive that 80 per cent of respondents feel that the council is efficient and well run.

With questions around the image of Durham and satisfaction with their local area over four in five (85 per cent) residents agree that Durham is an attractive place to live with views as high as 97 per cent and 95 per cent among residents of Weardale and Teesdale. Aycliffe FC, currently four points clear at the top of the Northern League 2nd Div. need to finish in the top three to win promotion to the top flight at the end of the season.

But they'll not qualify for the first division due to strict ground grading rules set out by the national Football Association, unless they erect a second stand at Moore Lane Park to accommodate at least 100 standing spectators, alongside their 113-seater stand.

They need to raise around £10,000. However, the club are keen to speak to

local tradesmen and firms who can offer services and supplies at cost price.

Farley added: "We've been given a quote for a stand but there are other ways around this and by pooling the resources on the town we could get there with one big team effort, just like the Newton Press deal. "We'd love to hear from any firms or tradesmen out there who'd be willing to chip in and help out by either doing some work for us or offering cost-price materials."

More than £30,000 has been spent on ground developments in the last year, the majority of which was donated by Aycliffe Sports Club. That's on top of the original £320,000 spent to redevelop the ground in the first place, provided by grants from the LIP Fund and the Football Foundation.
