Your readers should be aware that the A6072 is to be closed from the 5th of May to the 22nd of May from the junction with Darlington Road to the Roundabout where it joins the

This is a very busy 'A' road and the only diversion route as far as I can ascertain would be a diversion through Heighington Village to the junction with the A68 at the Dog Inn, or down through Aycliffe Trading Estate and over the level crossing at Heighington Station.

I am sure that people will be trying all sorts of routes to avoid this traffic chaos, including diverting down School Aycliffe Lane and the bottom part of Newton Aycliffe. To make matters worse a lot of the Arriva buses are changing at the same time. Some are being taken over by Scarlet Band (one being the number 16) and other routes are implementing timetable changes from 5th May.

My wife has been trying to find out without success what is happenning to the 16 bus in particular. If you just get on a bus and pay there will not be any issues other then the timetable changes but if you have an Arriva pass, eg a post 16 student pass, then this will not be valid on Scarlet Band. My son asked an Arriva

bus through School Aycliffe which runs the 16 route but is actually the number 19 would be still run by Arriva, or would Scarlet Band also take over this service, but the driver could

not tell him. Both the No.16 and the No. run down the road that is to be closed. Nobody is volunteering any information on bus diversions or changes to services. This leaves a lot of people especially, people in School Aycliffe, with a dilemma.

If the 16 is to be run by Scarlet Band and the 19 is to be run by Arriva, holders of Arriva bus passes will be able to get to College in Darlington but not home without paying an extra

The only alternatave is to get a bus to Heighington or Aycliffe Train station and walk. This may be fine in the summer months but in the winter it is along a dark unlit stretch of road for about a mile whichever

way you go.
It would be worrying for a young girl walking the same route. Whatever happens come the 5th of May I predict travel chaos. Closing a very busy main road for over two weeks seems foolish when there is no obvious alternative for a lot of

# ON ITS SHOULDER

On Monday, Aycliffe Business Park was a flurry of activity when a 35 tonne crane from Ross Wright Ltd carried out a dramatic manoeuvre moving the HEAD section of artist Joseph Hillier's new public art landmark 'In Our Image'.

The head was lifted over 25metres into the air and craned only a few yards away from its current workshop base at Aycliffe Fabrications to a specially constructed 10-metre high scaffold tower that has been erected for the next stage of the sculpture's building process. This process will involve the four-metre high and 1.5 ton head being put onto the shoulders section, ready to be sandblasted and later painted.

This is the final stage of the process before the stunning sculpture is prepared for installation at its permanent home of the newly developed Heighington Lane section of Aycliffe Business Park; where it will act as an impressive gateway to the southern entrance of Business Park, an essential driver for the regional economy and the second largest industrial business park in the North East.

The original commissioners Sedgefield Borough were Council and due to local government reorganisation the project will now be delivered by Durham County Council. Joseph Hillier has been working alongside a nine-man team of highly skilled fabricators at Aycliffe Fabrications.

The fabrication process has also been an education programme enjoyed by young people from over 45 local schools and colleges visiting the workshop. It has provided a priceless opportunity for them to see first-hand the creative aspects of engineering which will hopefully encourage a high percentage of them to consider entering the industry.

The development agreement is an exempt item although I can reveal the clauses concerning the development of the Amenity

land are as follows "Amenity Land" means the open and amenity areas forming part of the Property as the same are shown coloured purple on the Plans Numbered 28,29,39-72,48-52, 63-66,6 7and 67.1, 68 and 69

Not during the period of eighty years from the date hereof to carry out the development of the Amenity Land without the prior written consent of the Transferor (such consent not to be unreasonably withheld or delayed) PROVIDED THAT any consent granted by the Transferor under this clause

3.6.1 shall be without prejudice to the rights of the Transferor under the Clawback Agreement; and

3.6.2 shall be granted by the Transferor as transferor of the Property hereunder without prejudice to the rights powers duties and obligations of the Transferor in exercise of any of its functions as a local authority nor shall any consent granted by the Transferor as a planning authority constitute consent hereunder

maintain and keep the Amenity Land (save to the extent that development thereof is permitted pursuant to clause 3.6) to the same standard as that to which similar spaces and land are maintained by the Transferor and to ensure that the grass thereon is cut on a regular basis to a reasonable standard and to keep all such land available for access and use as amenity land at all reasonable times by the Transferor its successors in title the Transferee's tenants and lessees and the general

When talking about the development agreement we are talking about two different things and I will try and explain this for you. The document that we call the development agreement is a financial document concerning the development of the SBH stock and does not cover the development of the open space

This is the document we are saying is commercially sensitive

What you seem to be asking for is the document that covers the development of the open spaces. The clauses that cover this are contained in the Land Registry transfer of portfolio of titles (TR5) and those are the ones I included in the email yesterday in full.

The TR5 document is registered with the land registry and becomes a public document normally after about 2 months. I hope this helps to clarify the situation for you Jeremy Miller,

## **PUBLIC TOILETS ARE** OF GREAT CONCERN

We seem to be able to provide

Whilst you can applaud work being provided to a local Company in these difficult times, I reserve judgment on this new "icon". I think that any firm considering a new start in our area would put good local facilities for workers as a greater priority, rather than interesting local sculptures. I hope I am proven wrong.

So Councillors follow the good example of Ferryhill, stop squabbling with each other in the press, stop wasting time writing to tell us negative news, and adopt a positive attitude for future of Newton Aycliffe.





# **COBBLERS HALL RECREATIONAL** DEVELOPMENT OWED TO THE TOWN

The article 'Cobbler's Hall Project Dependent on New Housing' in last week's Newton News was misleading. It is a lame excuse for the former cabinet of Sedgefield Borough not delivering on their liabilities and promises before the Council was dissolved.

The Cobbler's Hall Development Plan was part of the Northern Area Study Plan of the 1980s and of the subsequent Development Plans of Sedgefield Borough Council.

Under the Cobbler's Hall Development Plan, Sedgefield Borough Council received large areas of land between Meadowfield Way and Woodham Golf Course. This land had outline planning permission to build housing and, over the years, a large number of houses were built on the land. This land was a multi-million pound asset for Sedgefield Borough Council.

To give readers an idea of how valuable an asset the land was, between 2003 and 2007 when I was Leader of Sedgefield Borough Council, three plots of land were sold to developers. Plot 1 alone raised 12.3 million pounds and the other two sites raised almost six million pounds. These sites made up only a small percentage of the Cobbler's Hall Development site and the Council received very large sums of money for the land from developers. With the demise of the Borough Council, some large areas of undeveloped land with outline planning permission for housing were transferred to Durham County Council.

With the assets Sedgefield Borough Council received, with the Cobbler's Hall site, came a liability. That liability was 'to provide extensive recreational facilities in the northern area of the town'. It was envisaged that, as well as play areas for children, there would be football pitches (to Northern League standards) rugby pitches, tennis courts, cricket pitches and a bowling green. These recreational facilities were to be sited on the land which is known as the 'Moors'.

In 1996, together with the then Town Clerk, Mr John Farquhar, we met with Mr Norman Vaulks (Chief Executive Officer, Sedgefield Borough Council) and Mr John Litherland (Chief Development Officer, Sedgefield Borough Council). At that meeting, we were informed that the 'Moors' area could not be developed

as a recreational area owing to the land in that location being unstable. The Officers from Sedgefield Borough Council offered alternative sites adjacent to Burn Lane and Burnhill Way. which were accepted.

In 2003, I became Leader of Sedgefield Borough Council and I was determined to move on the provision of the recreational facilities at Cobbler's Hall. Consultants were employed by the Council to evaluate the current recreational needs of the town and to survey the sports providers and the public on what they required in the way of recreational provision.

The result of the survey was that the Borough Council agreed to provide an urban park, running from Burn Lane to Horndale Park. The football pitches between Meadowfield Way and Greenfield School would be drained to provide good playing surfaces for both junior and adult football teams. The present changing room would be demolished and replaced by new changing facilities. The urban park would have play areas for children, flower beds, seating and footpaths.

This plan was going to be expensive but the Council had large balances of money available and most of these balances came from the sale of land at Cobbler's Hall. When I met with the Leader, Deputy Leader and Chief Executive of Sedgefield Borough Council on 7 July 2008, I was informed that the project was going ahead, with some minor alterations. No mention was made of matched funding or the need to sell further land. Indeed, Sedgefield Borough were anticipating a large receipt of money from the sale of land on the Industrial Estate.

At the Town Council meeting held on 23 April 2009, the Cobbler's Hall Development Plan was discussed at length. It was resolved that as Sedgefield Borough Council had recently transferred a large number of assets to Durham County Council, including assets at Cobbler's Hall and Rope Moore, the Town Clerk was instructed to contact Durham County Council and point out that they had also received the liabilities associated with Cobbler's Hall. The Town Council will advise the residents of the town of future developments on this issue.
