

#### Concern Over Transfer of Town Land

The Town Council has called a special meeting to discuss the transfer of land to Sedgefield Borough Homes. The members have already won a victory over the greens and open spaces which were included in the transfer and now remain in public ownership, thanks to objections the Council made.

However when they received the amended plans Councillors could still identify vast areas of open space, mainly in the newer areas of the town, which were being given to the private landlord.

The meeting is called to discuss whether the council should pursue its fight to keep large areas of land in public ownership, fearful that sometime in the future it could be developed to benefit a private company.

This Extraordinary Meeting of the Town Council is to be held on Tuesday 12th May at 7.15pm and is open to the general public.



# **OVER 50's WARNED ABOUT ROBBERY ON HOLIDAY**

One of the UK's leading over-50s specialists, 50plus Insurance, is urging travellers to be extra vigilant as reports of crime increase in holiday areas. As unemployment rates rise across recession-hit tourist resorts, 50plus Insurance is warning that petty theft and robberies of elderly tourists are likely to increase.

Furthermore it advises travellers to check the small print of their insurance policies before travelling as many travel policies may not cover all eventualities: for example, some policies don't cover mobile phones, which are often easy targets for petty thieves **Take photos** of all valuable

personal possessions and keep a copy at home

Only travel with essentials - leave expensive jewellery, watches and items of sentimental value at home. If you have a digital camera. load a memory stick with

photos of possessions Include on the memory stick copies of important documents – passports etc Lock passports and valuables

away safely when you reach your destination Don't carry expensive items around in pockets or handbags, which can easily be stolen by opportunist street thieves.

Dress down - don't make yourself a target Duncan Hughes,

50plusInsurance said: "It really important that holidaymakers or people living abroad take proper precautions to protect themselves. We realise that no one likes reading through the small print on an insurance policy, but 10 minutes spent now could save much heartache later.'

I could not believe my eyes when I read Mike Haley's letter "New Landlord will keep their promises."

Mr Haley believes housing policy changes to be sufficient reason for housing bodies like Sedgefield Borough Homes to exist. This ignores the fact that more often than not, such policy changes are politically motivated, sometimes illogical and far from beneficial to the country.

Nothing could highlight this more than this idea of selling off council properties across the country to private organisations, particularly at a time when demand for affordable homes is so high and property builders have stopped building houses.

Being an experienced Trade Union branch secretary I am well used to the various techniques and spin used by large organisations and politicians to sell such great ideas.

Mr Haley finds it incredible that the Town Council are still talking about a judicial review when Sedgefield Borough Homes are offering money etc for the next 10 years. I take it he did not read a letter from Councillor Blenkinsopp on the other side of the page about pushing things through that the majority of people do not want and then crying about the cost of challenging such blatant disregard for the views of the people.

# **FIND YOUR VOICE IN REGISTER TO VOTE WEEK**

Do you care about how long you spend at work each day, what goes into the food you eat and how much your mobile calls cost when you're abroad? Political decisions are being made that affect our everyday lives, yet thousands of people in Britain are without a say about who represents them because they are not registered to vote.

This week (4 -10 May) is 'Register to Vote' week when the independent Electoral Commission is calling on everyone to take a few minutes to make sure that they are registered to vote by the 19 May deadline. A national TV, radio, online and print advertising campaign was launched last week, with the slogan: "If you want to vote, make sure nothing stops you ". "At each election some people turn up at the polling station to vote but find they can't because they didn't realise that they need to register before polling day," says Electoral Commission Chief Executive, Peter Wardle. "We want everyone who is eligible to be on the register and able to vote. and part of our job is to make sure they know what they need to do."

"There are elections to the European Parliament on 4 June, as well as local elections in parts of England. Some people, especially young people and others who may be voting for the first time, may not realise they need to be on the electoral register. Other people may think they're registered, but if they've moved house they need to re-register at their new address.

"We also find that many people who have every intention of voting are away from home on polling day, and miss their chance because they have not

applied for a postal or proxy

vote in advance

To register to vote or apply for a postal or proxy vote, go to www.aboutmyvote.co.uk, print off a form and make sure it reaches your local authority by 5pm on Tuesday 19 May. It just takes a few minutes to make sure your voice is heard. Remember, if you're not registered, you can't vote!

# **NEW SERVICE PUTS FAMILIES FIRST**

Families in County Durham who need extra support will benefit from a new service. The Family Pathfinder service is being piloted in the Sedgefield, Easington and Derwentside areas and is jointly funded by Durham County Council and County

Durham Primary Care Trust (PCT). It will mean a new system of partnership working between Durham County Council's children's and adults' services, the PCT and other organisations.

Durham County Council successfully applied to the government to be a Family Pathfinder area last year. Durham's bid, which brings an additional £780,000 worth of funding over three years, was among 15 successful bids chosen out of 90 across the country.

The Family Pathfinder will ensure that help is given to families where children are suffering as a result of issues such as parental substance misuse, domestic abuse, parental mental health problems or where the parent has a learning disability.

Family Pathfinder teams include workers from a wide range of backgrounds, such as housing, education, social work, nursing, early years and youth work, who bring a wealth of knowledge and

skills. Their role will be to provide help and support for those families who need it most and who agree to work with the Family Pathfinder team. The teams will establish new wavs of working with the whole family and with other workers from services including health, police and the voluntary sector to improve the lives of

children. Coun Claire Vasey, Cabinet Member for Children and Young People's Services at Durham County Council, said: "Where families are facing complex problems and these problems are having a negative impact on children, it is vital that they get the support they need.

"The Family Pathfinder scheme means we will look at the needs of the whole family and make sure they get the right help at the right time."

Morris Nichols, Coun Cabinet Member for Adult Services, added: "We expect this service to make a big difference to families who are facing the most difficult of circumstances.

"The help and support is there for them and this scheme will strengthen that network of support to ensure it is properly planned and coordinated."
