COMPETITION TO BRING DOWN BUS FARES

The Campaign for Better Transport has launched a competition to find the most expensive local bus journey in the country. By highlighting expensive routes Campaign for Better Transport hope to shame the Government into bringing down fares by investing more in buses. The person who submits the most expensive journey will win a £50 voucher.

Sarah Matthews, a campaigner in the group, said "More people in the North East would travel by bus if it were cheaper. Higher bus use would reduce traffic, making it easier for us to get around, and be better for the environment. Affordable buses are also a lifeline for many people, making it possible for them to get to work, the shops, the GP and other services. Through this competition we hope to shame the Government into investing more in buses, to bring down the price of bus fares. Funding could go directly to local councils to upgrade services, but could also go to bus priority

measures – like bus lanes – to bring down operating costs." Whilst I don't often get involved in other peoples' squabbles, this was clearly a case of a bully taking out his frustrations on a member of staff who was not in a position to defend herself and typical of a bully he was too afraid to

approach the Management directly. Perhaps he should start shopping after the 8.00am

slot if he wants to be pampered, or better still find somewhere else and leave the rest of us in peace. I would prefer to remain

Bringing Wildflowers to Byerley Reserve

A change in management practice will reap rewards for wildlife at a local Nature Reserve in Newton Aycliffe. The reserve at Byerley Park is a diverse mix of habitats including woodland, scrub, wetlands and wildflower grasslands, enjoyed and treasured by the local community.

An area of grassland that lies with in the boundary of the reserve and located to the rear of Jesmond Court was until recently, mown very short resulting in little or no wildlife value.

After discussions with the "Friends of Byerley Park" a local community group interested in the management of the reserve, it was decided to develop the grassland into a flower filled meadow, similar to what would have been in the area before the development of the town. The management has seen a

"wait and see" approach that requires the area to be left unmown and already cuckoo flowers are growing among a carpet of dandelion. The Cuckoo Flower is important as a larval food plant for the Orange Tip Butterfly now seen regularly flying over the meadow and egg laying on the flowers. Durham County Council

Countryside Officer, Ian Armstrong who manages the reserve said: ". It may take a few years for a species rich meadow to establish but with patience, we may gradually see a superb habitat that will further enhance the nature

St. Mary's Open School Garden



Following St. Mary's initial studies into the environment and climate change through the Climate Change Lead Schools Project, they have developed a thriving garden which was officially opened on Wednesday 3rd June. Parents and governors were invited to share in the celebrations with a blessing for both the new outdoor play area for Key Stage 1 children and their garden, from Fr. Campion.

Work started last autumn the very unsightly prefab removed from school grounds. The land left behind was an ideal size and plot to create a school garden. Mr. Foster, the school caretaker very kindly offered to take a lead in developing just that. Early on in the Spring term, Class 6 were invited to help Mr. Foster with this project. Those who were willing brought in their willies and split into 5 groups. Each morning about 5 children went out to help turn over the soil carry out all the hard labour in preparing the soil for planting. Local Councillor, Mr. Moran, helped out, providing topsoil, turf and sleepers to create some raised beds

Eventually the ground was ready for planting. The children helped to plant potatoes, cabbages, carrots, a variety of beans, lettuce, radish, onions, courgettes and strawberries. He even encourages the whole school to keep apple cores, banana skins etc. from 'fruit time' to collect for the compost bins. Mrs. Minns also helped out with planting new tree around the school grounds and wildlife areas.

Mrs. Moran helped the children in Reception to plant flowers in the raised beds and tyres in their new outdoor play area. This was sparked off by one of





the girls in Reception, named Poppy, bringing in some poppy seeds to plant. They have also planted sun flowers, nasturtiums and marigolds. Both our new outdoor play areas and garden were looking so good that we decided to hold an official opening ceremony. During the school's 3rd climate themed study days, which was actually spread over 3 days, involved creating and maintaining a school garden. Each class had a timetabled session, either morning or afternoon, where they could go and investigate the garden area. The first group from Class 6, who had carried out a great amount of work with Mr. Foster, had their work cut out as their session was the first

after the half term break. They were pleased to discover the addition of a greenhouse and inside tomatoes had been planted. Class 3 couldn't decided whether to use our produce in our kitchen for lunch to save on produce being driven to us, or to have a 'market stall' to sell our produce to raise money for school for future garden projects and equipment or give

the money to charity. Hopefully a decision will be made at our next school council meeting. In the meantime they have added radishes from the garden to their salad trolley. Key Stage 1 children also had a fabulous time learning about to plant seeds, and looking after them. Class 1 painted some wonderful pictures of what they thought the flowers they'd planted would look like.

During these 3 days, anticipation was high with the prospect of governors and parents arriving to see all of our lovely work, and to see how hard everyone had worked creating such wonderful outdoor areas. The whole school got together to practice songs for the occasion, and children practiced reading out loud so everyone would be able to hear them speaking

outside.

Key Stage 2 children had a quick last minute practice, out where and worked everyone was standing, whilst the children in Key Stage 1 and the choir congregated in the outdoor play area. The choir began the proceedings with hymn 'Think of a World Without Any Flowers', then the children shared their pictures and opinions with parents and governors, and finally Fr. Campion gave a blessing. Everyone then gathered together with Key Stage 2 in the garden to share their work, thoughts and ideas for the future before finishing with a blessing form our parish priest, Fr. Campion, and a final song, 'Cauliflowers Fluffy'. The children went on to enjoy a well deserved extended playtime as parents and governors were invited into the school hall for refreshments and strawberry The

particular are delighted with the work Mr. Foster and the children are doing in the garden and eagerly watch their developments. Mrs. Leech, a local resident and school governor said, "Thank you very much for removing the hut and making it into a garden. The local residents are delighted, and look forward to seeing the children working in the garden each day. They can't wait to see what they will be doing next. It has really improved



KEEP PARISH VOTING SIMPL

Dear Sir,

I was present at the meeting of Great Aycliffe Town Council on Wednesday 3rd June 2009 when they discussed the review of Electoral Wards for Great Aycliffe. Cllr Bob Fleming Leader of the Town Council and Town Clerk

Andrew Bailey had gone through the electorate figures and came up with a proposal for 3 Wards covering Great Aycliffe. With no other Councillor expressing any view the recommendation was accepted as the Council's proposal. Bob did suggest that others may wish to look at the figures and come up with their own suggestions, but there were no takers. We should thank Bob and Andrew for their efforts and hard work.

Whilst I agree Parish electoral wards should follow Unitary for convenience to all, the proposed 3 wards for the Town Council, one of 13 seats, one of 9 seats and one of 8 seats, seems to be anti democratic and favours those in a Party and capable of financing and contesting elections, to the exclusion of independents and others

Candidates wanting to leaflet or canvass will find it more difficult to walk the streets in a ward of 8,000 voters than the previous 4,000, especially if they work for a living. Less canvassing means less opportunity for those who vote, to meet those seeking public office.

In 2007 47 people contested 30 seats In the proposed ward for 13 seats, if each seat was contested by Labour and Independents, there would be 26 candidates on the ballot paper for Town Council and more if others contested. The electorate would be selecting 3 Unitary Councillors on one ballot paper, and 13 out of at least 26 for Town Council on another ballot paper.!

This argument also applies to the other two proposed wards for Town Council of 9 and 8 seats respectively; the electorate in each ward is reported as 8,601, 5,877 and 6,191. Aycliffe Ward 1: Unitary Councillors (UC) 3, Town Councillors

(TC) 13, Electorate 8,601; Aycliffe Ward 2: UC 2, TC 8, Elec. 5,877; Aycliffe Ward 3 UC 2, TC 9 Elec. 6191 giving 7 Unitary

Councillors, and 30 Town Councillors. Total electorate 20,669.

If we are to encourage multi party and "Independent" democracy at local level, we have to encourage multi skilled and diverse sections of the community to stand for election. Public office must remain easy to achieve and it should not be reserved for professional political parties who have the advantage of an organisation to give assistance to their chosen candidate.

Wards at Parish level, whilst running within Unitary Boundaries, should be small enough for this to be attained. Independents would face considerable costs and logistical obstacles fighting a ward of 8,601 rather than 4,000 or less. A small ward allows representation to be truly local and it would not interfere with the professional political parties.

We need to encourage more people from all backgrounds, skills and local knowledge into local politics not put obstacles in their way by making supersized wards, capable of being fought only by the professional political machines.

Many electors do not cast all their votes now because ballot papers can look complex, and daunting. What would a ballot of 26 or more names look like to vote 13 names out of, say 26 or more? A vote not cast is a wasted vote and a loss to democracy. We must keep Parish voting simple if we hope to attract the right quality of candidates
