Colstons, now Tallents were producing machines for the notorious John Bloom in the 60's prior to the company he owned, Rolls Razors, went bust owing the Aycliffe company £866,000.

Final Service at St. Joseph's | Married in Crete

On Saturday, 27th October, the last Parish Mass was celebrated in St. Joseph's and it was packed to capacity. The Mass was a joyful occasion and one of celebration in thanksgiving for the priests and people who have served in St. Joseph's over the last 44 years.

In his homily, Fr. Campion personally thanked all those (living and dead) who had given of their time and talents in the building up of the parish. The hymns had been carefully chosen to reflect this special celebration and the last hymn "Faith of Our Fathers" was sung with great gusto by all present.

Sunday Mass times in Newton Aycliffe are now on Saturday (Vigil) at 5.30pm in St. Mary's and Sunday morning at 10.00am in St. Mary's. Fr Campion also celebrates a Vigil Mass (Saturday) at 4.00pm in St. Thomas's, Shildon.

In 1948 when the "new town" of Newton Aycliffe was born, the nearest Catholic church was St. Thomas Aquinas, Darlington, and Sunday Mass was supplied from there. In 1954 Newton Aycliffe was formally made a parish and Fr. Martin McBrien was appointed parish priest and initially lived in a rented house in Shafto Way. He decided to build a church and presbytery first and St. Mary's Church was opened in 1960 followed by the opening of St. Mary's primary school in 1962. The town was expanding rapidly

and the Catholic population everything was chosen very was also increasing

In 1967, Fr. McBrien was replaced by Fr. Dennis Anderson. During his time in Newton Aycliffe, it had been decided to build another school to the west of the town centre to accommodate the ever growing town most of which was in that area. St. Joseph's school was opened in 1968 with lots of land to allow further building on the site, if needed. St. Joseph's school hall was used as a Mass centre and Fr. Joseph Devlin came here in 1968 to look after the parishioners in this area of the town.

In 1973, Fr. Harry Ryan was appointed parish priest of St. Joseph's and Mass continued to be celebrated in the school hall. In 1980, Fr. Ryan moved to St. Mary's on the town and was replaced at St. Joseph's by Fr. Patrick Kennedy.

By the early 1980s, it was clear that the town would settle at a population of just under 30,000 (much less than was originally envisaged) so the Bishop indicated that no new church would be built at St. Joseph's. Instead, a handsome granite chapel was added on to the school hall and was officially opened by Bishop Owen Swindlehurst on 13th July 1984. The architect was W.H.R. Pattisson of Newcastle and, indeed, he won an award for the design of St. Joseph's Chapel.

Fr. Kennedy oversaw the building of the chapel and carefully, he wanted to use materials from local sources as much as possible. Without doubt, the chapel was his 'pride and joy' and it was affectionately known as 'Paddy's Wigwam' because of the shape of the chapel and its conical roof.

In 1992, both priests moved and Fr. Ryan was replaced by Fr. Michael Weymes. In 1997 the parishes were united under Fr. Weymes. In 2000, Fr. Weymes left and was replaced by Fr. James Dunne. Bishop Ambrose asked Fr. Jim to complete the parish's progress into a single unit and to encourage the people in each area of the town to work together. This he did until he left in 2008.

Fr. Michael Campion replaced Fr Dunne in 2008 and since then has continued the work of uniting St. Mary's and St. Joseph's. He has given parishioners a vision for the church of the future in light of the reducing number of priests in the diocese.

This is now leading to the amalgamation of the parish in Aycliffe with St Thomas' in Shildon which Fr Campion has been serving for the past year. Although the closure of St. Joseph's Chapel is tinged with sadness, it takes place in this wider and challenging context and brings with it the opportunity for the Catholic community of Great Aycliffe to come together and worship as one in St. Mary's Church, the MotherChurch.



VAN DRIVER SOUGHT AFTER ROAD RAGE INCIDENT AT REDWORTH

Police are investigating a road rage incident in the area last Sunday, October 21.

At around 3.20pm a man was in his car, a black Vauxhall Insignia, on the A1 roundabout at Burtree when a small white van, possibly a Vauxhall, has cut him up The Insignia driver sounded his horn at which point the van gave chase towards Redworth. When the Insignia driver stopped at temporary traffic lights at Redworth, the van driver got out of his vehicle carrying a tyre iron and threatened the other driver. He had to drive through red lights to get away. The van followed through the red lights, chasing the car until the Watling Road roundabout at Bishop Auckland before turning off up Watling Road.

The van driver was described as being in his mid-20s around 5ft 9in tall, of medium build with short dark hair. He was wearing a black t-shirt and black carpenter style trousers and spoke with a local accent. The car driver's wife and young children were also in the vehicle. Police need to trace the van driver, so would welcome anyone coming forward who recognises with description.

There were several other cars stopped at the temporary traffic lights who may have information which can help the enquiries.

Mouth Cancer - If in Doubt Check it Out!

More than 6000 people will be diagnosed with Mouth Cancer in the UK this year alone. Without early detection half will die. Sadly, very few people are aware of this cancer which kills more people than cervical cancer and testicular cancer combined. Even more importantly four in five of us don't know symptoms of the disease.

November is Mouth Cancer Action Month and Sedgefield Dental Practice wish to let people know what the risks are and to help persuade everyone who has any doubts to get themselves checked out by a dentist.

Whilst people who both drink and use tobacco to excess are up to 30 times more likely to develop the condition, even if you are a non smoker you can still get the disease. If tobacco and alcohol are consumed together the risk is even greater.

Many recent reports have linked mouth cancer to the human papillomavirus (HPV). HPV is the major cause of cervical cancer and affects the skin that lines the moist areas of the body. HPV can spread through oral sex, and research now suggests that it could soon rival smoking and drinking as one of the main causes of mouth cancer.

The lifetime risk of developing oral cancer in the UK is estimated to be 1 in 93 for men and 1 in 186 for women.

So what should you be looking out for?

Mouth cancer can appear in different forms and can affect all parts of the mouth, tongue and lips. It can appear as a painless mouth ulcer that does not heal normally. A white or red patch can also develop into a cancer. It is important to visit your dentist if these areas do not heal within three weeks.

Mouth cancer can be detected in its early stages by your dentist. Remember your dentist can see parts of your mouth that you would ordinarily not be able to see.

If it is spotted early the chances of a complete cure are good, and the smaller area or ulcer the better the chance of cure.

WOODHAM STUDENTS CONTACT WAR HEROINE

Drama Students from Woodham Academy were thrilled to receive an email from Sally Becker in response to their comments about her during a drama lesson. As a British Charity Worker, Sally's heroic missions during the Bosnian war earned her the title 'The Angel of Mostar'.

Drama teacher, Mrs L Drew, designed a scheme of work based upon the extraordinary efforts of the people carrying the Olympic Flag.

During the 'Sally Becker' lesson, students used explorative strategies to mentally place themselves in her situation. Students used her as a stimulus to explore whether bravery was a feeling, or a response to a situation.

During the plenary of the lesson, the students were asked to write down anything they would like to say to Ms Becker or any questions they would like to ask her. Mrs Drew wrote to Sally explaining the lesson and forwarding on the students' comments and questions; within 24 hours, Ms Becker had replied.

Sally said she was "honoured" to be a part of the lesson and how much she appreciated the comments made by Woodham students. After taking time to respond to each comment directly Kiera, 15, said "I admire her bravery and dedication to a cause, it was such a shock to receive a reply from her and made us realise that she is a real person and not just someone you see in the news".



Rebecca, 14, explained "I was excited and overjoyed, I was proud and totally

understood why she chose to stay in the war zone, I wish I had her courage".

Greenfield Way, Williamfield Way, Stephenson Way and back round to Greenwell Road.

The service will start in January as they have to give 8 weeks notice. Initially the bus will opereate between 09.20am and 2.20pm with a view to expanding later. The bus will be able to accept bus passes and wheelchairs.

Alec told Newton News he decided to offer the service following the withdrawl of the bus connecting Heighington and School Aycliffe to Newton Avcliffe.

REPORT ON COUNCIL MEETING **WEDNESDAY 24th OCTOBER**

Great Aycliffe Council's Policy Resources Committee met on Wednesday 24 October.

The meeting started with a presentation by Mr Graham Wood from Regeneration and Economic Development at Durham County Council, and Mr Stewart Watkins from Business Durham. (Business Durham offers news, advice and guidance for businesses in County Durham, and you can subscribe to their daily email at http://bit.ly/ BDemail) The Town Council is anxious to keep informed of developments in the local economy; councillors heard a very useful account of the opportunities and challenges facing local firms but were told that – despite a small growth in the national economy – the local economy continues to struggle.

The next important issue considered was a request by Sedgefield and District Citizens Advice Bureau for funding of £18,000. The Council had looked into the matter carefully in July, when it had been agreed that as a parish council – this Council could not afford to support CAB to the kind of degree that they required on a year-on-year basis. Thus, the grant of £6,933 given in July had been given on a 'one-off' basis and, since then, the Council had been faced with a substantial cut to its own income. Regretfully, therefore, councillors agreed unanimously that they were unable to make another donation. Councillors appreciated that CAB carries out excellent work in the community, and that CAB's services are needed more than ever in the current economic climate, so when Counc. Crosby proposed that a working party be set up to investigate ways that the Council might support CAB other than financially, councillors agreed

unanimously to do so.

A number of further items on the agenda dealt with next year's Town Council budget. The Council has received a consultation from the County Council proposing that the adjustments to Council Tax benefits should not apply to town and parish councils; this is very welcome news

if they had applied, then the Council budget would have been seriously affected so the Council agreed

unanimously to support the proposal. However, the consultation also proposes the withdrawal of the current Double Taxation Grant as a quid pro quo. Councillors unanimously agreed to oppose this suggestion (which will reduce Council income by £38,475) since Double Taxation is not related in any way to Council Tax benefits, and is an issue of fairness and equitability. (You can reply yourself to this consultation, which has significant implications for individual Council Tax payers as well as the Town Council, at http://bit.ly/DCC-CouncilTax).

Councillor Clare, leading the meeting, stated that he was proud to propose a budget which though financially safe - froze the Town Council precept for the fourth year running and also, for 2013-2014, planned to freeze Council fees and prices at its facilities ... despite the significant reduction to Council income caused by the withdrawal of the Double Taxation grant. North's Insolvencies **Higher than South**

Firms in the north of England are still more likely to fail than their southern counterparts, according to a report from Euler Hermes, the world's largest trade credit insurer

No fewer than eight of the top 10 'hot spots' for insolvency are in the north of the country, with the top spot occupied by the Darlington area which has an insolvency rate of 1.68% - almost double the rate of its nearest competitor, Manchester (0.87%). The first southern town to feature in the top 20 is Southampton (in 12th place) with an insolvency rate of 0.57%

(in 12th place) with an insolvency rate of 0.57%. The findings show 11 new entrants to the Top 50 league table including Aberdeen, Norwich, Doncaster and Exeter; a sign, that the economic malaise remains a UK-wide concern and one not solely restricted to the North.

Sean Stone, Manager at Euler Hermes who compiled the league table, says that corporate insolvencies will continue to rise "With the Bank of England expecting zero growth this year and signs of an export led recovery still some way off, we believe there will be more corporate insolvencies in 2012 than 2011," he says.

Aycliffe Girl with Titanium Spine Zips from Bridge

Aycliffe Teenager who three years ago underwent major spinal reconstruction surgery with titanium rods inserted into her spine has zip wired from the top of the Middlesbrough Transporter Bridge in aid of a

local charity.

17 Year Old Sixth Form Student Emma-Jo Blundy of Woodham raised more than £240. A high speed descent from the Bridge would put the fear of God into most people, but not Emma-Jo who three years ago underwent serious spinal surgery to correct curvature of her spine caused by the debilitating condition Scoliosis.

The surgery initially left her without the use of her legs after a 14 hour operation went wrong. The operation at the James Cook Hospital had complications and required 2 further operations to correct the problem that caused temporary paralysis in her legs and to partially correct her spinal curvature.

Emma-Jo takes most things in her stride these days and says: "I just couldn't resist the opportunity to do something for charity." The 'Take A Day Out' charity Emma-Jo has been helping is based in Newton Aycliffe and provides needed time out

for full time carers. Emma-Jo said: "I work a few hours each week at the Cobblers Hall pub in Cobblers Hall, Newton Aycliffe and their strong bond with the charity inspired me to get involved. When they mentioned they were looking for volunteers to take part - I just jumped at the chance.

"I am passionate about helping others in anyway I can and I guess my own experience of being in hospital made me want to see what I could do to help carers that are so important in the aftercare of all kinds of people, without support from my family, I wouldn't have been able to cope with my own surgery and rehabilitation."

Peter Sheen, who runs the charity said: "We are a very small and new charity with low overheads. In order for us to make a difference to the people we support we need the kind and generous support of organisations like the 'Cobblers' and people like Emma-Jo. When I found out about Emma-Jo's own situation I couldn't believe it, it's just outstanding that she would help us out in this way, we are very grateful and very humbled.
