Shocking Case of Neglect by Social Services

Family With Disabled Mother Left Without Heat

Alan and Lisa Maddison with two children of Gilpin Road were left for 3 weeks with no heating and little food while Durham County Council Social Services did little to Council help!

Lisa is severely disabled with Huntington's Disease and she and her two children were left shivering under a blanket in awful cold weather. Alan was boiling a kettle to

get hot water for carers who attend to Lisa's hygiene and a fight is still ongoing with Social Services to provide a suitable shower in the home. Lisa's disease affects muscle coordination and she is in cognitive decline. Alan gave up work 8 years ago to look after his wife. He was told by Social Services to phone E-on for help, but they just fobbed him off

Counc Billy Blenkinsopp was called in by the family to help and he was appalled by the condition in which they were

living. He brought in two electric heaters to relieve the family's misery. "In my opinion their situation

should have been treated as an emergency and work carried out straight away to help the family who were in a desperate situation with no heat or food in the house. I cannot believe Social Services could leave a family to suffer like this - animals are treated better! This is worse than recent reports of how patients in Stafford Hospital were being treated' said Billy.

If Lisa was in a Nursing Home it would cost Social Services at least £1000 a week, but Alan wants to keep the family together. It is hard work for him as his wife needs 24 hour care. Keeping the garden and home tidy and caring for the children is a constant worry. Billy took control of the situation and at his own



High Rent-Few Shops! Low Rent-More Shops?

It is sad to hear of shops being financially squeezed at this moment in time when business is poor. Higher rents, rates and service charges can only lead to closures and staff redundancies, destroying the current sense of optimism in Aycliffe Town Centre's redevelopment.

It appears the landlords whilst agreeing to upgrade and modernise their property are at the same time planning to get that investment back as soon as possible. Looking back over the years high rents and overheads have been a constant threat in Aycliffe Town Centre and the exodus of many private shopkeepers is part of that history.

question is often asked why do landlords get so greedy The and why do they seem to prefer to see empty shops rather than reducing rents to allow shopkeepers to continue trading? The rent plays a large part in calculating property value. It makes financial sense for an owner to leave a property sit empty rather than take a reduced rent. If you have a big property portfolio there might also be tax benefits on the annual balance sheet.

Holding Council Tax | Town's PCSO's Give Good Service | CHIEF CONSTABLE FOR **DURHAM CONFIRMED** Harms Progress Dear Sir.

Dear Sir,

In response to Bob Fleming's letter in last week's Newton News, I, too, am very proud the Town Council has been able, yet again, to announce a freeze in Council Tax, despite a huge 'hit' of £95,000 on Council finances as a result of the government's changes to Council Tax Welfare Benefits.

There are, however, two things which I would like to make clear. The first is that – although the Town Council has managed to get by without raising council tax - this has not been achieved without significant damage to the Great Aycliffe community.

The Town Council has been forced to abandon two planned apprenticeships which means that two Aveliffe vourse two Aycliffe young people will stav out of work next year - young people whom we would have wished to put on the first step of a career.

Another big disappointment has been the decision not to appoint a Neighbourhood Planning officer; a Neighbourhood Plan is essential to encourage growth whilst protecting our green spaces from rogue developments



and - although we will still produce a Plan - it will now take longer and be limited in scope. The second thing people need to realise that this is the result, not just of government policy, but of government incompetence. Mr Pickles, Secretary of State for Communities and Local Government, purported to be giving us a grant to cover 90% of the shortfall on Council Tax Welfare Benefit. However -Welfare Benefit. However – because he did not take account of the mechanisms of parish finance (basic issues such as 'gearing' and the disproportionate impact of the unparished areas) – the grant to Great Aycliffe actually covered only 75% of the amount. Worst of all, the government has as yet given no indication of whether or not there will be any grant at all next year, which makes it impossible to construct a meaningful medium term plan. There are parishes in the County harder-hit than Great Aycliffe. Basically, the way it works is that, the poorer the parish, the worse the impact. If you are reading

this in Shildon, then your council is the 105th worst-hit out of the 108 parish councils in County Durham. If you live in Eldon, yours is the worst-hit of all 108 councils. Meanwhile, five of the wealthier parish councils in the County are actually better-off as a result of Mr Pickles's changes. It is just another example of the Tories targeting the poorest areas and punishing them for having poor people living there. It is another indication that we are not 'all in this together'! Mike Barton has been confirmed as new Chief Constable of Durham Constabulary.

The appointment, proposed by Durham Police and Crime Commissioner Ron Hogg, was confirmed today by the Durham Police and Crime Panel.

Mr Barton, who has been temporary chief constable since last October, has been with the force since moving here from Lancashire police in 2008, serving first as assistant chief constable then being appointed deputy in 2009

"It's both an honour and a delight to have been given job of leading this the constabulary and providing world class policing to the people of County Durham and Darlington," he said today.

"I'm proud to be leading a team of dedicated, professional police officers and staff who have maintained our excellent performance in crime and anti-social behaviour reduction, in the face of budget cuts and the challenges of a complete force restructure.

"We are all committed to the force vision to inspire excellent policing, inspiring confidence in victims and our communities by protecting



tackling neighbourhoods criminals and solving problems around the clock." Mr Barton, who holds the national intelligence portfolio with the Association of Chief Police Officers, has led the force in tackling organised crime in County Durham and Darlington. Operation Sledgehammer uses intelligence, analysis and effective enforcement action to break up criminal networks which often involve extended family members.

He is also committed to tackling lower level crime and disorder, including antisocial behaviour like litter, dog fouling and speeding vehicles which can have an adverse impact on communities. These issues regularly addressed are through neighbourhood Police and Communities Together (PACT) meetings.

Growth in Apprenticeships

GROWING interest in apprenticeships could help spur on the growth of the region's manufacturing sector, according to a North East training provider. Newton-Aycliffe based

manufacturing and engineering training company S.W. Durham Training (SWDT) says that a surge in interest in – and sign up to – apprenticeships could help grow the manufacturing and engineering sectors in the North East.

The 45 year old training company, which specialises company, in providing courses for the manufacturing and engineering sectors, believes that a growing awareness of the benefits of apprenticeships is helping to make it a more attractive career choice. something that new figures released from Semta support. 



Newton Aycliffe FC chairman Gary Farley has called on townsfolk to get behind their only semi-professional football team. The Royal Blues started their rise up the football pyramid in 2008, progressing from the Durham Alliance to the Wearside League.

Their only year at that level - a title-winning campaign - saw crowds of over 200 pack out Moore Lane park, but despite progressing to the Northern League first division and competing in the FA Cup and FA Vase, the club have seen their attendances dwindle.

From attracting 567 for a derby match with Darlington RA, they could only attract 238 for a game with much-closer rivals Shildon

Now 150 appears to be the standard, while a record-ever low crowd of 87 turned up on Saturday as the Newtonians chased a fourth consecutive victory.

The sparse crowd was just as much of a disappointment as the narrow victory against a very good Celtic Nation side, as the club heavily rely on matchday income to compete. matchday income to compete. Chairman Farley wants to see Moore Lane heaving on a matchday again. "It's been disappointing to see the crowds fall this season," said Farley. "We made a decision to freeze prices at £5 in the to freeze prices at $\pounds 5$ in the summer when many others were going up to £6, as we wanted to ensure fans were

getting value for money. "Without big gates we will struggle to compete at the level we're at. We've worked hard to reach this level and it would be a shame if we were unable to continue providing first division football for the town due to a lack of funds.

"We understand many from the town go and see the big three clubs in the region but for those who don't or can't afford to, we urge you to give Moore Lane Park a go on a Saturday. You won't regret it." Northern League chairman

Mike Amos has also expressed his bemusement at the situation. In August, after he had seen Aycliffe play Hebburn, he wrote on his Chairman's Blog: "Newton Aycliffe have done extraordinarily well. Five extraordinarily well. years ago they were in the




