The decision to protect council tax benefits to the most vulnerable households in the county for an initial one year period was approved by the authority's Full Council on January 9, 2013.

To date Durham County Council has already saved more than £90m of the required overall figure.

However, members will be advised that precise planning continues to be difficult in light of uncertainties surrounding some funding and complexities around the revised formula for public sector grants. The council's Medium Term Financial Plan balances the budget for 2013/14 and the authority is committed to further widespread consultation this autumn to identify where the remaining savings should be

Throughout the process of budget reductions the council has consulted with residents.

was sought so that the authority could understand how people had been affected by reductions or changes to services so far.

This was done via the council's 14 Area Action Partnerships, the Citizens' Panel and targeted questionnaires. 1,500 people responded and the results revealed there is a high level of public understanding of how the authority has managed a very difficult process. Included in the responses received was the fact that some 40 per cent of people felt that the introduction of Alternate Weekly Collections for refuse and recycling had had a positive impact on them, with only 12 per cent reporting a negative impact. The remainder reported no impact at all. This change alone is already saving the council over £2m a year.
Despite the financial pressures

the council has been able to maintain a significant capital investment programme of £159m in 2013/14 in line with the council's regeneration and job creation priorities.

The programme is fully funded from capital grants, capital receipts from the sale of council assets and some prudential borrowing.

Needles - size 6 for tight knitters 7 for loose knitters Cast on 44 stitches and work 18 rows in K2, P2 Rib Work 30 rows in stocking stitch - K 1 row, P 1 row.

Council Reply...

Jimmy Bennett, Durham
County Council's clean and green manager, said: "The council has a responsibility to ensure that trees near roads and pavements are not at risk of falling onto the highway. We never remove trees unless

it is absolutely necessary.
"The trees in Emerson Way were inspected by a fully qualified and experienced arboriculturist and felled due to concerns over their safety. Two of the trees had ash heart rot and another was almost dead, probably as a result of pholiota root disease. The fourth tree had a large cavity. However, all posed a risk to the safety of the public."

She joined her sister Brenda and her husband Cliff in work as missionaries in Eastern Europe, ministering in song, testimony and preaching. The trio helped renovate a property in Maletice to be used as a Christian Retreat.

At an outreach meeting in Penrith where Janet keyboard, she met playing Keith Furlong and was amazed to hear he did missionary work in Far Eastern Russia and Central Siberia. He played guitar and enjoyed painting as a hobby. They became friends and were married in 1999.

As a Christian, Keith learned at an early age the importance of God in his life. Over the years he was mocked and scorned because of his faith, yet never doubted God and the Lord Jesus Christ He worked for over twenty years as a Hill Shepherd and Farm Manager in the Lake District and fully appreciated the beauty of God's creation. In Newton Aycliffe, one day, Janet met, and was persuaded by Frank Ridley, Headteacher

of Sugar Hill School, to return to teaching. "Who could resist his charm? He always referred to me as the "smallest giant". I accepted a post at his school, where I was very happy. Frank, the staff and parents, encouraged and supported Keith and I in our work as missionaries". said Janet.

This took the couple to the Czech Republic, South Bohemia and Moravia, always taking their musical instruments with them. "We travelled by coach and twice drove there by car, taking toys and clothes for the orphaned children. We went to gypsy orphanages, disabled centre's, schools for the blind, where we were loved and appreciated so much." said Keith.

Janet had to retire from teaching due to ill health and could no longer fly, but after five years is now completely healed. The couple attend Harvest Christian Centre at Woodham where they are encouraged by Pastors, Jeff and June Malvin and the wonderful people that attend. "This church really cares for and attends to the needs of the

people" said Keith. Keith is now semi retired after working as a painter and decorator at Hardwick Hall Hotel. He now has time to write Christian poems and follow his love of art.

Janet and family are so proud of his success, as in the last year he had two books of Christian poems published, and two of his paintings accepted for an exhibition from 2nd March at Bowes Museum. He will also exhibit three Paintings at Greenfield Gallery Open Art Exhibition commencing Wednesday. 10th April 2013. He has a website for his poetry "Keith Fulong Poet" and his paintings can be viewed on

Urgent Care Centres/Accident & Emergency Access Explained

How do you access medical treatment within our NHS Trust area? This is something many people find confusing even worrying, especially when confronted by a perceived serious medical situation.

I hope in this updated article, to offer basic guidelines as to when and how to access either Accident and Emergency, or, the care and treatment delivered by Urgent Care Centres.

Let me put your mind at rest about which telephone number you should ring. It is 999 for Emergency and 111 for Urgent Care Centres, with their focus on non life-threatening medical conditions. Both of these are FREE numbers.

Do not worry if you get it wrong, experienced operators will assess your medical situation and channel you towards the most appropriate treatment pathway. Accident and Emergency began in the 1960 s. and was known as Casualty, later Accident and Emergency and now increasingly so to avoid confusion, The Emergency confusion, Department

When should you ring 999?

If a person is badly injured or showing signs of critical illness, such as poisoning or a stroke or heart attack. Other conditions would include severe blood loss, chest pains, shortness of breath, choking and blacking out, or other situations where speed is of the essence.

Within County Durham and Darlington NHS Foundation area, there are two and Emergency centres: Darlington Memorial Hospital and the University Hospital of North Durham, Durham City. A. and E. is staffed on a 24-hour basis, with a mix of different doctors, nurses. consultants and other senior staff on call throughout the night.

There are six Urgent Care Centres in our Trust area. I have visited them all and met with their dedicated staff. They offer outstanding medical facilities and provision - in no way inferior to that given by Accident and Emergency - for situations that would not be considered to be

life threatening.

They were set up to take the pressure off Accident and Emergency Departments, not

to replace them. The nearest Urgent Care Centres to us are at Bishop Auckland General Hospital, and Dr Piper House, King Street, Darlington (both open 24/7). Also, the University Hospital of North Durham open Monday to Thursday 6 pm to 8 am. Then Friday 6 pm, through until Monday at 8 am). You access these if it is not a medical emergency, but you still require treatment fairly quickly. You should ring 111. Remember calls to this number are FREE. Your situation will then be assessed and this is known as Triage. An agreed appointment time will be negotiated that is most suitable for you and your medical condition, at whichever UCC is the most convenient for you. Calls to 111 can also be useful in finding out information about late opening chemists, out

Ambulances are provided for 999 cases only. However, dependent on the age or infirmity of the patient, any necessary assistance required would be assessed during '111' Triage.

of hours doctors and emergency

dental care.

If you have a chest infection urinary infection, suspected eye infection, cuts, bruises, sprained ankle, toe, hand or wrist fracture, you probably need to phone 111 and then get yourself to an Urgent Care Centre. They are open 24/7 (except UHND and Seaham Medical Centre) and are manned by a doctor (usually a GP) as well as senior nursing and paramedic staff (primary

care practitioners).
Several have X-ray provision, though this usually closes during the late evening/night time hours. If you turn up at an Urgent Care Centre without an appointment, you will not be turned away. They try to triage you within twenty minutes and either treat you then and there, or ideally offer you an agreed appointment time. Urgent Care Centres are there

for the whole week, however, they often come into their own from Friday evening onwards. Especially so on a weekend and at other times when your surgery is closed or when the provision

Centre is more appropriate.

There are grey areas and potential overlaps between the services offered by A. and E. and the Urgent Care Centres.

However, be assured, whether you phone 111 or 999, you will receive the appropriate advice and help.

I hope that this information will be of some benefit to you and I will try to keep you informed

Kids Admitted Free to **Town Football Matches**

Newton Aycliffe FC has reacted to recent dwindling attendances by launching an exciting initiative for kids aged under 16, in the hope of

boosting upcoming gates.
For the remainder of the current Northern League campaign, any child under 16 who attends a game at Moore Lane Park - home of the first division outfit - will gain entry free, providing they are with a full paying adult.

With 10 home games between now and the season's climax, the Newtonians are hoping to inject fresh impetus into their crowds, in the hope of securing longer term support for the club, which has seen average attendances drop to just 130 this campaign, a fall of 70 from previous seasons.

Chairman Gary Farley, who launched a plea against the falling numbers just two weeks ago, said of the scheme: "It's a new idea which we're trying out, in the hope of further creating exposure of the football club, by reaching out to a generation of support which we probably lack.

"Kids on this town have longed for accessible football, and not many are aware of the great facility we have here at Moore Lane Park. We're hoping to bridge this gap, and win some new support along the way.'

The scheme will begin with next week's visit of Ashington (Sat March 9) and run until the end of the current season, with Aycliffe still embroiled in a relegation battle.

Though results have picked up of late, with the club currently fourth in the form table. Allan Oliver's side still have one eye fixed over their shoulder should any of the sides below them in the table hit similar form.
