He apologises for any inconvenience to traders and shoppers, thanking them for their patience. The new staircase to Upper Beveridge Way is now open and work on demolishing the ramp is planned to take place when the replacement ramp is erected.



Building Work at Aycliffe Leisure Centre

ADULT DAY CARE

Building works have begun in the Leisure Centre to provide Adult Day Care and take about 12 weeks. It will see the former Sedgefield Borough Homes offices which were located in the reception area and on the first floor; transformed into a fully functional day care centre. Part of the project will include the provision of a Changing Places changing room which will be accessible to users of the Leisure Centre as well as day care clients.

ENERGY EFFICIENCY

New energy efficient lighting has been installed throughout the building. Most of the public areas and offices are now managed by sensor controls.

The majority of the air handling units have been replaced with more efficient plant which will deliver heating throughout the centre in a more controlled manner. A building management system has been installed to operate the air handling units to ensure that all areas are heating to the recommended temperature for the activity taking place.

A new Combined Heat and Power Unit has also been installed in the plant room. This generates electricity and heat as a by product. The heat is then used throughout the Centre.

and the residents have been encouraged to write into Darlington Borough Council to object.

The UK Noise Association recommends that wind turbines not be sited within 1 mile (1.6 km) of houses as families have experienced serious problems with smaller turbines at a greater distance from their homes.

There is a potential risk of sleep disturbance and related health issues from this proposal.

Residents believe the proposal contravenes a key principle to "protect the countryside for the sake of its' intrinsic character and beauty, the diversity of its landscapes, heritage and wildlife."

If allowed the turbine would adversely affect walkers and horse riders using local paths and bridleways, potentially compromising safety. The destruction of local birds and bats is inevitable.



THE BUDGET IN LAYMAN'S TERMS

Dear Sir,
George Osborne announced the new budget was for an 'aspirational nation'. All we aspire to is an unbridled continuation of the rich getting richer, and the poor getting poorer.

By 2018, debt is set to double to over 1.3 trillion pounds; while workers bear the sting of real terms cuts in their wages for the next four years. The aspiration Osborne talks about, is home ownership. Where people can afford to put down a 5% deposit on a new build house, the government will pay 20% of the mortgage. This is an ideological budget aimed at the middle class. For Osborne, on the other side of the class divide, what he understands to mean poor, are people who have £10,000 in the bank to put down on a modest £200,000 home. Perhaps he thinks this is the answer to the council housing crises, in much the way Marie Antoinette is fabled to have thought that

cake was an option for those who had no bread.

The Office for Budget Responsibility predicts the current budget will produce no growth in the economy. Even the most optimistic forecasts have slashed their figures in half, predicting that it'll take until the end of 2016 to see the economy where it was on the eve of the Leeming Brothers collapse. Meanwhile, 48 000 young people have joined the dole queue to bring the youth unemployment register back up to a million. The 22 billion in benefits cut from poorly paid hard working families will plunge children back into poverty which will cost 25 billion to less adjust in other parts of the economy.

Then perhaps, we might find ourselves able to put down our five percent on a new build family home. Only, Osborne knows that, if the carrot he dangles ever became within the reach of the poor, he wouldn't have implemented the policy in the first place. The old principles of capitalism never change, free to those who can afford it, very expensive for those who can't.

In Support of 'Bedroom Tax'

Dear Sir,
Once again John D. Clare has decided to blame the Coalition Government for the farce that was the Benefits System inherited from New Labour. My father had a phrase which describes his politics, "Selective indignation".

Inadvertently, he has properly called the proposed benefit cut a tax. All taxpayers have paid throughout the new Labour era so that New Labour could buy votes from those on benefits by subsidising empty bedrooms and under occupancy of Social Housing. Unfortunately, New Labour's mismanagement of the economy and failure to regulate the banks has meant that tax payers and the country at large cannot afford to continue to finance what is a waste of the State's resources.

All politicians agree that a major factor in the recovery will be the speed of growth in the economy. To grow the economy we need jobs and to attract qualified workers. Clearly, when Hitachi starts up there will be an increased demand for bedrooms for workers who will pay tax and bring money into the local economy.

In an ideal world some of those on housing benefits should get one of the new jobs and therefore be able to pay the economic rent that Social Housing provides and still be in a position, via income tax, to assist in financing those that are unable to work and need subsidised accommodation.

It appears to me to be good for the town, the region and the whole country (and taxpayers) to encourage a single person on Housing Benefit, living in a three bedroom Social House, to down-size and make way for a family that needs and can afford the rent of the three bedroom house. Tax payers are in a win-win situation. They do not have to subsidise two spare bedrooms and there is an extra tax payer to share the load of paying benefits to those who really need them.

Of course there will be special cases and a lot of hardship, however, that is not the making of the Coalition Government. Instead of squandering tax monies on subsidising under occupancy of the Social Housing Stock (to ensure re-election by the beneficiaries) New Labour should have spent this tax money on single and two bedroom accommodation so as to free up family houses for families, many of whom are having to rent in the more expensive private sector while still subsidising under occupancy of our housing stock.

John D. Clare needs to get into the real world and stop wasting his time attending rallies. He is too late; he should have rallied against the minimum wage, tax credits and New Labour creating a reliance society and the misappropriation of tax money to buy votes to achieve re-election. Indeed, the movement he supports hit a new low when they had

a grieving mother, who had recently lost a child, appear on TV and say that she could not afford to keep her child's bedroom as a shrine as her housing benefit was being cut. That to me was sickening! I find it abhorrent that national television should use a grieving mother in such a fashion. Also, the implication was there that the Coalition Government's policy was to blame for the pre-mature death of a child! This was gutter politics at its lowest.

Again, we need to guard against knee-jerk reactions to policies that will allow us to continue to afford to give benefits to those who are reliant on them. New Labour wrecked the economy and harsh measures are needed to effect a recovery. Jobs which are

subsidised by tax benefits and housing benefits are not the answer. We need jobs that pay a living wage (not New Labour's minimum wage that has to be subsidised by Tax Credits and housing benefits). We need to properly and fully utilise our previous investment in Social Housing assets to revitalise our local economy, fairly and for the benefit of all in our society. If our economy goes the way of Greece and Cyprus all people on housing benefit will suffer whether they are in under occupancy or not!

This is the true legacy of New Labour and John D. Clair's selective indignation at the Coalition Government's necessary policies, and his intermittent ranting against them, will not change this fact.

Breakfast Time Help for Horndale School

Apprenticeships are 'Key to Recovery' says Aycliffe Director

The youngsters then gave presentations based on their experience during a special

event at Greenfield. Mr Finley, who went straight into a labouring job in a Bakery after leaving school, says there aren't enough skilled youngsters available these days as the majority of school pupils go into further education.

"We need more school-leavers to go into Apprenticeships," says Mr Finley. "It has been well documented that we face a skills shortage which is set to increase over the next 10 years, and with an ailing construction industry, I think it's imperative we look at the basics and start educating children that they can enjoy good, successful, well-paid careers through apprenticeships. Ultimately it will help the manufacturing, construction and engineering industries which will play a key role in this country's recovery."

David Priestley, head teacher at Greenfield, says his students have benefited hugely from the programme. "Companies from Aycliffe Business Park have enabled our students to go out there and learn about some of the world-leading businesses that exist right here where we live. "I thought all presentations were exceptional and it was impossible to single one out from another. They were all winners.

"The whole process has been extremely useful, and we're grateful to all the companies for letting our children go to them to explore the world of work. It has provided invaluable experiences, and I feel this is just the beginning of what could be a very worthwhile exercise in the long-term."

A Specialist Day for health and social care saw students taking on the role of different healthcare professionals in a workshop based on a multi agency team meeting and a case study.

The workshop, led by school nurse, Kate Devine, focussed on a young person needing support. The team had to identify a range of issues and suggest different types of help and guidance.

Playing the role of professionals not only gave students the opportunity to learn about local and regional support for adolescents but it also gave them an insight into different professions in healthcare.

The day ended with students trying out one of the support suggestions, which was a stress busting relaxation therapy session.

My point is that – whatever one's attitude to the government – this election is crucial to the future of the County, and to Aycliffe, through the most difficult of times. appearance with a vital three-points. It was Hinchley's third goal for the club and second against the Synners. He

headed a dramatic stoppage-time equaliser at Moore Lane Park back in October, but this strike came much earlier. Only six minutes had passed when he received the ball from right-back Stephen Gibson on the edge of the area and the midfielder - who replaced Fred Woodhouse in the starting line-up as Allan Oliver chose to utilise a three-man midfield - curled a brilliant effort into the top corner to give Aycliffe the lead.

The conditions were terrible - bitterly cold with a strong wind affecting both side's rhythm - but Martin Young used the conditions to his advantage as he let fly from 30 yards but his effort dipped narrowly over the crossbar. Aycliffe's strong start continued in the 10th minute as Danny Earl's knock down found Danny Lambert but the winger's half-volley was well saved by Tim Griffiths.

Earl had a glorious chance to extend the lead against his former club on the stroke of half-time. He robbed possession from Paul Johnson on the edge of the area but blazed his shot over the bar. Synners improved after the break and were denied a 52nd-minute equaliser by a terrific block from Josh Knox. Nathan Jameson found Nathan Porritt in the area and the former Middlesbrough man steered the ball towards goal only for Knox - deputising in defence for the suspended Darren Craddock - to prevent the equaliser with a last-gasp challenge.

Then former Newtonian Nathan Wilson was released through on goal but his attempted chip was well saved by Scott Pocklington.

Synners wanted a penalty after the hour-mark as Aidan Cattermole tangled with Gibson, but the referee waved away the appeals and Aycliffe avoided conceding a spot-kick for the fourth consecutive game.

Aycliffe were put under severe pressure but the defence - marshalled superbly by John Close and Knox - stood firm. The last chance fell to defender David Abel but his effort was blocked by Knox.

The victory was greeted by delight by the travelling Newtonians, and these celebrations grew louder when news reached the ground that Billingham Town had lost to South Shields, meaning the gap to the bottom three was extended back to five points.

£1.5m Soccer Factory Moves a Step Closer

Ambitious plans to build a state-of-the-art indoor soccer arena in Newton Aycliffe have moved a step closer to reality.

Plans for the £1.5m facility, to be housed on Aycliffe Business Park, were first revealed mid-way through last year, following the granting of planning consent. There has been a delay in the programme due to difficulties in sourcing private investment funding. But the project is now back on track and work is expected to start soon.

Dan Lewis, managing director of The Soccer Factory, explained "We had a couple of local individuals who had agreed to provide the funding we required to open the facility. Unfortunately that didn't materialise, and as such has set us back slightly. However, this delay has allowed us to build a stronger

structure to the business, and to refine the business model to ensure the company is more sustainable. "We now have funding agreed, and are working through the process of finalising the new private equity we require, which will hopefully mean we will be back on track to start the refurbishment of the property very soon."

The Soccer Factory will provide seven 3g five-a-side courts, as well as a brand new health and fitness suite, multipurpose studio, café/ bar and sports injury clinic.

It promises to bring at least 15 new jobs to the town, and along with other leisure facilities on the Business Park ensure Aycliffe becomes a popular destination for people from the whole of the South West Durham as well as further afield.

Dan, who is general manager of Ebac Northern League

first division club Newton Aycliffe, added: "We're really excited to be opening the first of our centres on Aycliffe Business Park.

"We think the combination of the second largest business park in the North-East, as well as the size of the town, coupled with the strong sports history in the area makes it an ideal location.

"We have worked very closely with some excellent companies on the Park all ready to provide some of the marketing materials, and look forward to welcoming the business and general community through the doors".
