

ARUN CHANDRAN

Arun Chandran has lived in Newton Aycliffe over 50 years (West Ward over 30 vears) active in local politics since 1974 age 16. He was elected at the age of 25 to the Town Council in 1983, and served for over 13 years holding the chairmanship on the Environment, Parks, Recreation and Finance committees and was elected unopposed as Mayor in 1991 at the Age of 32. He reformed the Council's

finances and procedures, initiated many ideas and has a proven record of experience achievement, preventing the Blue Bridge from being demolished in 1992 to having a Tree Presevation order made on the North Agnew Plantation. He also forced British Rail to rebuild Codling Bridge which was a public right of way and led many campaigns including Ambulance Station closure, and saving The Cubby. Arun was first in proposing OAP trips in 1984, got Woodham Community Association its freehold in 1987, proposed Safety surfaces in all our in 1988, persuaded the Town Council to take over the deed of transfer for the Aycliffe Nature Park (working with Syd Howarth of the Rotary Club). He set up the first Crime Prevention



Panel in Newton Avcliffe in 1988 to name but a few, and served as a school governor for 10 years at Woodham Burn School.

Arun is currently on the Newton Aycliffe Youth Centre Management Committee. and is Secretary of the Great Aycliffe Residents' Association which recently led a successful campaign in getting the new Police & Crime Commissioner to commit to rebuilding the new police station in the Town Centre. He attends Pact (Police and Community Together) meetings and Association Residents meetings. He believes that the quality of our Environment and combating anti social behaviour should be a high priority.

RAY BOWMAN

Ray Bowman first moved to Newton Aycliffe with his parents in the early fifties when he was 17yrs old. He worked for Tarslag when they were building the Blue Bridge.

On his return from National Service, he worked for Aycliffe Development Aycliffe contructing Corporation Shafto Way. He moved away from Newton Aycliffe to run his own haulage company returning to the West Ward area in 1998.

In 2002, Ray spent several years helping to run the Junior Neighbourhood Watch Disco at the Southerne Club, providing heated food in the kitchen and a tuck shop.

He was involved with



setting up playgroups for the young people in his local area and has been active in the community with the young people at Silverdale Community

House.
In 2007 Ray became a Town Councillor, a role he carries out by attending meetings and helping members of the public with their problems.

Election Candidates Defying Purdah

The Labour Party announced their Manifesto in the Newton News on 22nd March which was unsigned.

EDITOR: We asked a Labour Party member to respond to this letter and received the following reply:

The guidance in the Code of Recommended Practice on Local Authority Publicity in the pre-election period, says that "a local authority" must not at any time publish any material that in whole or in part appears to be designed to affect support for a political party or a candidate.

The restrictions apply six weeks before an election and up to and including the day of the election. Councillors can attend events but the same restrictions apply about quoting them in any council publicity. Councillors can create their own publicity, the restrictions only apply about quoting them in any council

publicity.
Individual councillors generate their own publicity during this period. The restrictions only apply to official council organised publicity including press releases or events. The rules in the councillor and officer protocols about use of council facilities must be observed.

The Elected Members Code of Conduct contains a general obligation upon councillors to have regard to the Code Recommended on Local Authority Publicity. Councillors involved in the election will not be quoted in proactive news releases issued by their Council.

The Code of Conduct covers areas of individual behaviour such as Councillors not abusing their position or not misusing their authority's resources, it does not apply to Candidates or Parties. This means that any current County or Town Councillor can be called Councillor and can have any publicity in a newspaper, as long as they do not purport to be speaking or acting on behalf of their Council

The only restrictions are that the County Council or Town


For three nights last week. Woodham Academy students entertained audiences with their production of "We Will Rock You". The musical, written by

And those who unemployed will find that work really will pay, but where are the jobs?

The coalition have permitted the banks to absorb 750bn an obscene sum which should be loaned to small businesses to create jobs throughout this country. The only direct investment in job creation the coalition have announced, is a meagre 3bn, and not until after the next election.

Mr Welsh accuses Mr Clare of 'selective indignation'. The only selective indignation I'm aware of is the coalition government who 'shirkers and scroungers' who do work for poverty wages whose benefits they've cut, and those who the government refuse to create jobs for who are desperate to find work.

Obituary: RIP NHS 1st April 2013, aged 64

The demise of the National Health Service this week will have taken many by surprise, since it was presented by the government merely as a reorganisation – the handing over of control to the GPs' Clinical Commissioning Groups (CCGs).

Hidden in the small print, however, and largely unreported by the media, 'Section 75' of the new rules includes a requirement to put out NHS services to competitive tender. Thus, when the new legislation came fully into force on 1st April, the NHS ceased to be a service provided by the state. and started instead the process of becoming a service paid for by the state, but provided by such private providers as have won the various contracts.

Already, £250million-worth of contracts have been given to private companies; it is estimated that, in the coming year, another £750million of contracts will be similarly outsourced. It has been a small scandal that some GPs have been caught awarding contracts to companies in which they have a financial interest.

From the user's point of view, our health services may seem little changed. We are certainly not suddenly going to have to start paying for treatment. The new providers all operate under the NHS logo, so we won't know whether it is a private company or the old NHS supplying our medical care. But, behind the scenes.

the provider of our medical services will likely have changed from the state (doing it for civic duty), to a business corporation (manipulating it for profit; they are going to make a fortune out of our ill-health in

the coming years). There is little that we, as ordinary people, can do about this. The Labour Party has promised to repeal the legislation but, by 2015, many of the profitable bits of the NHS will already have been sold off and lost.

There are just two positives.

Firstly, there is an organisation being set up in County Durham called 'Healthwatch Durham'. which will promote the needs and the views of users; it is based in Aycliffe Business Park and it is this organisation, after the election, with which I would wish the Town Council to get involved.

Secondly, Durham County Council has set up a 'Health and Wellbeing Board' which will work with the local CCG on the commissioning process. In our new 'marketised' NHS well-written contracts will be our first line of defence against cut-price care, and it is vital that the 'Health and Wellbeing Board' is an effective body.

This is just one more reason that the elections this May are of vital importance to us as a community. So when your candidates knock your door, ask them how they think the Council should engage with the NHS changes.

Town MP Wants National Memorial to WW2 Munition Workers

Phil Wilson made a passionate Westminster speech to support a campaign for a permanent memorial to the 'Aycliffe Angels'. MP's are planning a cross-party campaign to try to raise £100,000 for a tribute at the National Memorial Arboretum, in Staffordshire, to celebrate munitions workers during World War Two.

There are also calls for a badge to be awarded to the surviving munitions workers. At its peak in 1943, the Royal Ordnance Factory number 59 - situated where Aycliffe Business Park is today - employed 17,000 people, 90% of whom were women. That was out of about 65,000 people in the country who had the highly-dangerous job of filling shells and bullets.

During a Commons debate Phil Wilson, whose grandmother, Isabella Woods, was an 'Aycliffe Angel' made an impassioned eight-minute speech in thwe House.

"Their work was very important and the factory was visited by Winston Churchill, King George VI and even Gracie Fields, who I understand gave a beautiful rendition of the Lord's Prayer," said Phil.

"At Aycliffe they produced over 700 million bullets. Work was very dangerous, but there was high levels of companionship among the women, who risked their lives on a daily basis. They became known as the Aycliffe Angels, because Lord Haw-Haw (British traitor William Joyce) said in his broadcasts that the 'little Angels of Aycliffe won't get away with it.'

Phil applauded efforts by Great Aycliffe Town Council.who have done their bit over the years to remember the Aycliffe Angels. Our MP said: "They produced special certificates for survivors. My grandma was awarded one posthumously because she died 30 years ago, but that certificate still sits on my Mam's coffee table to this day.

"The council erected a memorial in the town centre for the men and the women who worked at the Ordnance Factory

at the Ordnance Factory.

Newton Aycliffe is now a thriving town, with the second biggest industrial estate where the Aycliffe Angels once worked, and this is a proud history of that town.

"The Aycliffe Angels should be recognised they weren't on the front, they weren't fighting in the desert or in the jungle or at Normandy, but they were helping to keep the war effort going, and some lost their lives. I think a permanent national memorial is something that would suit their endeavours."

Mr Wilson quoted Dorothy Addison. "Our job was to weigh cordite, put it into linen bags and sew gunpowder on top. This was put into '25-pounder shells' and the next block had to put the detonator on top! I remember one girl in the next block getting her hair in a machine and later died.

"German bombers often came over and all the lights had to be out. The siren went and we all had to go into the shelters. The sky was lit up with hundreds of 'chandeliers' - our name for bombs."

Heart-felt speeches were made by other MPs during the debate, and in reply the business minister Matthew Hancock said he would "consider the points that have been made in the debate", while Michael Fallon, a fellow Conservative minister in the same department, will meet with the all-party group on 23rd April to discuss its campaign.

But Mr Hancock warned: "The lack of records and the difficulties in verifying entitlement raise practical questions about how to recognise formally the contribution of individual civilian workers."



Disabled Receive Help for House Adaptations

Housing Minister Mark Prisk today confirmed £180m to help councils adaptations the fund disabled people need to live independently in their own home - £10,405,604 of it in the North East.

Councils across England will receive a share of the million Disabled Facilities Grant, which provides financial help to install a wide range of adaptations housing modifications such as wider doorways, stair lifts and level access showers.

Mr Prisk said that the grant was essential to help thousands of people in their homes if stay their circumstances change, providing the support that disabled or vulnerable people need to live independently and comfortably, whether they are homeowners, social tenants or living in rented accommodation.

Ministers have protected the Disabled Facilities Grant programme for the last 3 years, with a further £185 million expected in next year's funding.

Housing Minister Mark Prisk said:

"For many people, the security of being able to stay in your own home in difficult times can have a real impact on their health and wellbeing.

'That's why protected the Disabled Facilities Grant. The £180 million I've allocated today will help to support people across the country through disability and provide some of our most vulnerable with the help they need to live independently for as long as
