



New Head of **Woodham Learning**



Academy has Woodham appointed a new head Woodham Learning, Dr. Christine Warburton. Woodham Learning is a unique programme designed to help Year 7 students settle into their new school and develop the skills they need to succeed at secondary level.

During their first term, students spend the equivalent of one day per week with the same teacher. This gives them continuity and the security they need when getting used to a new environment.

Woodham Learning is based on the educational research of Professor Guy Claxton and helps students to become resourceful, reflective and resilient learners who are able to work effectively and co-operatively with others.

The programme has proved very popular with students, who say that it helped them to settle in easily and that the learning opened their minds to lots of new ideas.

After obtaining a first class honours degree in Geography at Edinburgh University, Warburton travelled extensively. She spent four years in the Himalayas conducting research for her doctorate in Himalayan

Geomorphology.
She has taught Geography at Woodham for a number of years and brings a wealth of experience to the role. Dr. Warburton says, "I want our young people to know that there is a wide world out there, of wonder and opportunity. The world is such an interesting place and I want to help open their eyes

Will These be Last Local Government **Elections?**

I suspect few people reading this will be fully aware of the extent of the crisis facing local government in the next few years.

Recently, a body called the 'New Local Government held a 'war-Network' budget-setting gaming' exercise in-volving 50 senior council officials from all over the country.

It imagined an average council ('Any Borough'), estimated the scenario facing it (government cuts, rising numbers of old people, inflation etc.) and invited the officers to work out budgets through to 2018.

In the game, the officers maintained the quality of provision for adults with learning disabilities – but that was all they protected. They cut all spending on 'culture' (theatre, museums, libraries etc.) and 'leisure' (recreation centres, swimming pools).

They forced all their schools to become academies and thus cut all local expenditure They education. introduced radical new 'total place' plans (where services are merged to end any duplication), for example merging NHS and Care budgets to meet rising care costs. They raised Council Tax and laid off council workers.

All these measures together were not enough to fill the budget gap.

The exercise was imaginary, but it gives an idea of the pressures facing the County Council and the Town Council in the coming years. The task facing councillors – to preserve what they can of council provision, and to minimise the damage to local communities - will be herculean.

If ever you considered the candidates carefully, and voted in a local election, now is surely the time to do so.

Famous Artist Praises Student's Artwork

There's a buzz about the art department at Academy.During the spring term. Year 9 students have undertaken a project on portraiture looking at a number of contemporary artists and non-traditional methods of drawing the face. They have made portrait work in a variety of unusual ways using ink, ripped newspapers, sticks, candy corn, beans, spaghetti, thread and photography.
Artists studied are Ben Tour,

Maurizio Anzeri, Vik Muniz, Justin Sears, Sarah Beetson and Loui Jover. But even more exciting is that they have been complimented in their efforts by artist Loui Jover via Twitter.

Jover is an Australian artist represented by the famous Saatchi

contemporary art gallery in London. His work is distinctly recognisable by hand drawn stark black lines, scratches and drips against adhered together sheets of vintage book paper. Year 9 students are thoroughly enjoying the project and in particular Jover's work.



Durham Tigers Beat INDEPENDENT CANDIDATE ACCUSED OF DECEPTION

can voters Independent candidates when they deceive to get elected? I read with disgust at the false statements made by Mrs Dorothy Bowman in her election address last week.

Mrs Bowman has misled the voters of West Ward for personal gain; therefore I would like to state the facts:

Mrs Bowman could not have been deselected by the West Ward as she does not represent our area in the first instance. In fact she is the current County Councillor for Shildon East, elected in 2008 and is the current Town Councillor for Byerley Park and Horndale, elected in 2007.

Mrs Bowman did not mention that she was nominated as the Labour Party County Council Candidate for Evenwood, and she chose to stand down and become an Independent Candidate. Therefore, she was not deselected by the socalled Labour party 'family/ friend' block vote.

She also states that the candidates chosen 'virtually unknowns', this is untrue. Eddy Adam has a proven 10 year record as a town councillor and is an active Labour party member

for over 39 years. Kate Hopper is the current West Ward Town Councillor and is also an active Labour party member.

Eddy Adam's selection had no impact on Mrs Bowman inability to get selected. He was selected in January this year due to another candidate withdrawing; he then went through democratic process, and Eddy was then selected as a Labour party candidate for the County Council.

I was greatly offended by the suggestion of being part of a 'family/friend block vote'. Mrs Bowman had to win the right to stand by convincing 28 members of the Labour party; she received 4 votes and therefore failed in that goal. All members work hard to promote and support genuine honest and trustworthy councillors and candidates, like our existing councillors Mike Dixon and Kate Hopper. As far as I am concerned the best candidates were chosen and not because they were already an existing councillor or by a block vote but on ability.

Although a minor point but important from a factual point of view. Mrs Bowman did not top the polls as a Labour candidate at the County elections in 2008 or Town elections in 2007. Even so, it does not give her an automatic right to be nominated or selected to stand as a Labour candidate.

So, it's your choice at the ballot box, do vou cast your vote for self-interested Independents or do you vote for integrity and ability of candidates who can work honestly with the community to deliver real change.

NO NEED TO MISLEAD OR **DECIEVE SAYS CANDIDATE**

I have no need or wish to deceive, mislead or self gain from my Election address - every word is the truth.

This is election time so I can understand Julie Adams, wife of a Labour candidate, getting jittery and worried about her

She failed to state that it was many years ago that he was a Town Councillor from 1983 until 1994 when he left to take up a position as a lecturer at Darlington College. Is he going to give this up if elected, as being a County Councillor involves many day time meetings and to be involved in the Community is a full time job.

I stand by what I said, and was co-opted onto the Town Council 5th December 2001 and remained there through two elections to the present day. I was elected to the County Council in 2005 for Shildon East which covers Aycliffe, Middridge and part of Shildon.

In 2007 I was elected to Sedgefield Borough Council until the Unitary Council Elections in 2008. I won the seat for Shildon East with a Labour Councillor serving with me to the present day.

I am one of seven sitting councillors representing Newton Aycliffe on Durham County Council, the 8th Councillor represents Shildon and the boundary changes now reflect the fact that it is no longer included with Aycliffe.

I was de-selected by Julie Adams' family block vote and I think that is quite obvious. There had to be three separate meetings to decide the candidates for Labour West Ward. Kate Hopper and Mark Catmul were only kept by using the block vote.

I was asked to stand at Evenwood on recommendation and by my previous work record in the Community

The Labour Party would not allow me to stand down from the Evenwood seat in January to contest the vacancy in West caused by Mr Catmull's resignation after moving out of Town, yet Eddy Adam was allowed to be added to the panel at that late stage to be considered for selection! He was selected by his family/friends to represent West Ward. I stood down from Evenwood and now stand as an Independent as I realised that I could not continue the work I was doing in Aycliffe and give 100% effort to Evenwood. At the selection meeting Mrs Adams refers to, only 23 people were voting including 9 members of the CLP executive. I was beaten by 14 votes to 9, her family block vote of 5 votes says it all.

If in her opinion the best candidates were selected on ability why did her family need to cast 5 family votes to prevent me being selected?

As for topping the polls, I got more votes than any other Labour Candidate in Newton Aycliffe in 2005 when I received 827 votes. In 2008 Brian Stephens got more votes from the Shildon part of the ward, but Shildon no longer figures in our Ward boundaries.



SUPPORT FOR GREEN DOG WALKERS' SCHEME

dog owners to act responsibly has resulted in hundreds of people pledging to pick up after their pets.

Durham County Council backed by town and parish councils – carried out a monthlong campaign to promote responsible dog ownership.

During the campaign, which ran from February 6 to March 6, neighbourhood wardens across the county investigated 412 reports of dog fouling and issued 26 fixed penalty notices and 19 warning letters.

They also handed out 460 'golden tickets' to dog owners who were seen acting responsibly and picking up after their pets, putting them in with a chance of winning a prize draw.

The council's green dog walkers' scheme – in which members agree to always pick up after their pet and carry extra waste bags to offer to other dog walkers who don't have one - was also promoted during the campaign with 361 people signing up and a further 86 people taking the scheme's pledge cards away with them to fill in later.

Ian Hoult, neighbourhood protection manager the Council, said: "The vast majority of dog owners in the County are responsible and do pick up after their pets. "However, due to the actions of a minority of people, dog fouling remains a major concern. "I am delighted that we have been able to get the message across to so many people that we will respond to

complaints about dog fouling through this campaign.

"We will continue to act upon any information we receive and would urge people who have details of incidents to get in touch so that we can respond."

As well as targeting the problem of dog fouling, Durham County Council's Civic Pride Team has also organised a number of free microchipping events, which led to 706 dogs being microchipped so that they can be easily returned to their owners if they become lost or

The Civic Pride Team also organised education sessions responsible about ownership in 22 schools.

Durham County Council's Neighbourhood Wardens also issued 89 fixed penalty notices for littering and 13 fixed penalty notices for failure to comply with a litter clearing notice during February.


