Dogs Trust's Happy Ending | Another Dog Killed for Puppy Auctioned for £2 by Loose Bull Terrier

A ten-week old puppy has found her happy ending after being sold at auction along with her siblings for just £1.88 each. The Collie cross pup was rescued by a local dog lover after being sold at a livestock auction in the "last chance section" at just six weeks old. The pup was brought to Dogs Trust Darlington where she was affectionately named Lottie by staff that nursed her back to health and found her the loving home she deserves.

Hazel Richards from Teeside came across the pups, sold as the last lot of the day, at an auction in Somerset and took the litter of four straight to the vets. Sadly the starving pups were far too young to be separated from their mother and one of the pups passed away. Fortunately Hazel was able to find loving homes for two puppies and handed Lottie, the remaining pup, who needed some extra TLC, to Dogs Trust for

rehoming. Hazel Richards explains "I was working in the area and saw the signs for the auction and thought I would see if I could pick up a chest of drawers. I soon discovered it was a livestock auction but was horrified when the last lot was unveiled as a cardboard box containing four filthy, severely malnourished, six- week old puppies. I couldn't just leave them so immediately bid on them and bought the box for

condition the puppies were in, they had been sold as a box of three but tucked at the bottom of the box was the smallest pup, clearly starving with a deformed jaw. I with a deformed jaw. believe that if I hadn't bid on the lot, the pups would have been put to sleep or worse returned to the owner who has neglected them in the first place. Luckily Dogs Trust were able to take her in and find her a home."

Sue Embleton Dogs Trust Darlington Rehoming Centre Manager explains" We were shocked to hear of the circumstances in which Hazel acquired Lottie, it sounds like something which would occur centuries

ago. It just highlights how easily puppies are also sold so flippantly in such circumstances and through pet shops and websites. We advise people to buy a dog from a reputable breeder or get a rescue dog so as not to encourage unscrupulous puppy traders who show little regard for welfare."

My wife was so badly shaken by this she says she will never have another dog as she feels she let our's down by not being able to protect him.

I hope the so called man who walked away and left her in that situation is ashamed of himself.

OSTEOPOROSIS -THE SILENT DISEASE

Today, women are living longer and as we get older our bones get weaker. Osteoporosis affects around 1 in 3 post-menopausal women and fracture following trauma is often the only indication of an underlying problem. This is why it is often called 'the silent disease'. Victims may suffer from deformity, pain, loss of independence and premature death. 3 in 10 women who suffer an osteoporotic hip fracture die within 12 months as a result.

Risk factors include; being post menopausal, early menopause or hysterectomy, family history, use of steroid based medications, dietary factors such as coeliac disease and colitis, low calcium diet, alcohol consumption, rheumatoid arthritis and other medical conditions, low body mass and lack of exercise.

Fortunately, there are steps you can take to prevent the development of the disease, as well as treatment for those who already have it.

Following the 'STAIRs' approach as in the following is a good guide:

STOP smoking

TAKE exercise, especially weight bearing activity such as dancing, jogging, brisk walking, skipping, aerobics, badminton, pilates or training with weights.

ALLOW exposure to some sunshine (before 11.00am and after 3.00pm) between May and September to stimulate Vitamin D production.

IMPROVE diet by increasing those foods high in vitamins and minerals together with moderate amounts of protein. Avoid processed or sugary foods and drinks

RESTRICT caffeine and salt and limit alcohol to two units per day.

For those diagnosed with osteoporosis, several prescriptions and supplements now on the market have been shown to be effective in slowing down the bone-loss process and in strengthening the bone that

A few months ago, several residents living in Stanfield Road asked for my assistance in resolving a number of problems including offroad parking (chewing up the grassed areas in the never-ending inclement weather) and the continued deterioration of the road surface.in

COUNTY RESIDENTS ASSOCIATION HOLD PUBLIC CONFERENCE

County Durham Residents Association has organised a conference at Haswell Community Centre on Thursday 16th May. The topics include recent changes to legal services and policing provision.

Speakers include a solicitor who will show how this impacts on civil cases such as divorce, planning disputes etc. Inspector Dave Coxon will speak on how the police and community can interact through web pages, Facebook and PACT meetings. Information will be available on how to set up a Neighbourhood Watch scheme.

Police Commissioner Ron Hogg will be present detailing his plans for community protection. He will answer any questions and concerns so this is an opportunity to take an active part in policing decisions.

(ROAD B6444 HEIGHINGTON LANE AYCLIFFE) (TEMPORARY ROAD CLOSURE) ORDER 2013

The Council, on 3 May 2013, made an Order under Section 14 (1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1984, as amended, its effect being to close to vehicular traffic a 30m length of B6444 Heighington Lane equidistant from the centre of Heighington Station Level Crossing, Aycliffe to enable level crossing maintenance works to be undertaken.

The maximum duration of the temporary closure under the Order is 18 months and is required from 10 May 2013 and for the duration of the works anticipated to be until 31 May 2013 commencing on selected nights at 9.00pm until 7.00am the following morning including 10 May 2013. However, on rare occasions, alternative dates for closures may be necessary and these will be signed accordingly.

An alternative route will be available to vehicular traffic from the eastern side of the closure from B6444 junction with A167 at Aycliffe Village, southerly via A167 to Coatham Mundeville Interchange (J59), south westerly along A1(M) to Burtree Interchange (J58) then northerly along A68 and A6072 to the western side of the closure, and vice versa. A local (non-HGV) diversion will be signed from the eastern side of the closure, northerly via Whinbank Road, left onto Horndale Avenue then south westerly along School Aycliffe Lane to the A6072 Roundabout junction with B6444 to the western side of the closure and vice versa.

Family motor dealer celebrate twenty years service in Newton Aycliffe



A familiar name on the town prove there's still the need for a local motor dealer in 2013.

ew retail sectors have endured the same rigorous changes faced by the motor industry over the past decade. However, one such Newton Aycliffe business not only survived, but grew in the face of adversity.

During sweeping changes and a double dip recession witnessing many retailers either seeing their doors close or becoming swallowed up by larger PLC's, Ramseys Garage in Newton Aycliffe were adapting to a new way of doing business.

Ian continued, "Back in 1993 we didn't have the luxury of the internet for shopping, all of Ramseys' advertising went through the local press (which we still use today), although many of our sales now come through the website. Who would have ever imagined you could shop from your mobile phone- did we even have mobile phones in 1993?...I can't remember! I do remember finance terms were restricted to the age of the vehicle you purchased. Today 5 years finance is the norm."

The company went full circle recognising to survive they would need to make their own sweeping changes to safeguard the future. Looking back, both lan and Gillian acknowledge changes made proved the difference in preventing them from going the same way as so many other dealers.

"We could see how things were changing so we set up a series of objectives as part of a plan to steer us through uncertain times. We invested in new equipment and additional staff with new VAG factory-trained technicians. This meant we could now compete with main dealers and more importantly offer discounted prices for Volkswagen, Audi, Skoda and SEAT servicing. The investment in state-of-the art Bosch diagnostic equipment (determining fault codes), has resulted in new jobs for local people." added Ian.

Other changes introduced include a loyalty scheme for companies and staff on Aycliffe Business Park offering a collection and delivery service minimising disruption to their working day. Ramseys are also an accredited Fleet Assist agent which means companies such as Pendragon, Hitachi, Arval and Alphabet all now recommend Ramseys for service and repair.

"Instead of selling up, we decided to remain faithful to our customers and the surrounding area," says Gillian. "We still hold the same principles we had when setting out out twenty years ago.

Remember when?... Ramseys' first press adverts in the Newton News in 1993

Jeff was passionate about customer care and relationships. He believed in looking after the small details as well as the large. When customers become friends you know you must be doing something right."

Ramseys loyal customer base extends far and wide with many of the same customers returning as parents and even grandparents.

"Family values are what make all the difference," continued Ian. "With so many local shops and stores now being replaced with high street chains, people value the real "local' retailer even more than even ever before. Here's to another twenty years. We still have much to do, but one thing we've learnt over the years is never to stand still."

Seminar on Hate Crime

Ron Hogg, Police and Crime Commissioner for Durham held his first seminar yesterday, attended partners from across County Durham and Darlington Reducing the impact of Hate Crime is one of Mr Hogg's personal priorities which he recently announced in his Police and Crime Plan 2013-

said: "The Mr Hogg purpose of hosting this seminar was to identify gaps in service delivery and create a mechanism where organisations can work better together in the future. The ultimate goal is to improve outcomes for the public and to increase confidence for individuals to report these appalling crimes, instead of suffering in silence.

Approximately 80 representatives from a broad of range organisations including, public voluntary sectors, victim services and community groups contributed by giving individual feedback action points about how they would like Hate Crime services to be improved. The 6 areas covered included Sexual Orientation, Gender Identity, Race Belief and Faith, Disability, Gypsy Travellers Learning Disability.

Mr Hogg continued: "The

public also needs to be awar that Durham Constabulary will be the next police force to begin recording offences motivated by hatred for members of alternative cultures, such as goths, emos and punks. I believe that correctly recording such incidents as hate crime will be an important forward County Durham and Darlington.

Barton, Chief Mike Constable said: personal stories we heard from Sylvia Lancaster and another guest speaker were extremely moving and frankly those sort of stories is why I joined policing: to protect the vulnerable, to challenge bullies and to make a difference. This conference has further inspired me to put more effort into these three ambitions. We have got to call time on bullies that pick on vulnerable people just because they are different". Volunteers from across the organisations were asked to work together over the coming year in small groups to take the actions forward, to ensure that partners continue to work together to achieve the same goals and to improve confidence for the public. Mr Hogg announced that a follow-up seminar will take place again next year to review how actions have progressed.

Private Landlords Only Interested in Rent Income

It is a sad fact that in these dire financial times, people with a few bob to spare are snapping up properties in our town for "buy to let".

Whether as a retirement plan

or a 'get rich quick' scheme it is my belief that these rented properties should at the very least be maintained to a reasonable standard and tenants vetted so that they are not a nuisance to others living around them.

As you are aware my residents group is very active in the community and we try to help where we can for the benefit of not only our community but also our town.

Sadly, it is sometimes the case that, unable to secure a reasonable tenant, landlords are desperate to rent and just don't care who they accommodate.

All over the country, homes and neighbourhoods are being terrorised and destroyed thanks to absent landlords only interested in the rent.

Under the terms of the data protection act details of landlords are kept secret from the public so that they cannot be pestered by those persons being annoyed by their tenants. I for one would like to make a complaint to the landlord of a party who are having a shouting match in the street at 1.30 am but I would like to make that

call when it is happening!

In my role as chairman of a local residents association I often attend conferences about law and order etc where the

social niceties are observed.

A police inspector, social worker or health professional will give a rambling oratory about how poor junkies about how poor and criminals she oor junkies should be

rehabilitated treated compassion and housed in a nice area where there are low crime rates. There they can be magically reformed when they see how law abiding people spend their lives. Total balderdash!

Reality checks show that neighbourhoods deteriorate, property prices go down, residents are afraid of reaction if they report incidents to the olice. Police make the area lower priority as its now ecome a "disadvantaged" become area". Groups of people on probation, who need support, and others hiding from their abusers are also parachuted in. Is it me, or is it a bit of NIMBYISM that police NIMBYISM that police inspectors and social workers live in posh areas which never seem to suffer from these irritations?

If you want to get out you find nobody wants to buy your home because of your neighbours or if they do it's at a reduced price, and guess who buys it then? Following is just some of the complaints I have received

over the last couple of weeks: 1. A tree in a private landlord's garden is causing problems for neighbours – the landlord wants neighbours to pay for remedial action.

2. Tenants of a private absent landlord seen climbing on a

local persons car.

3. Rubbish left in the garden to blow about the area 4. Broken glass left on the road outside the house.

5 General poorly mantained exteriors, broken windows, etc. I am impressed with the reduced anti social behaviour figures lauded by local police forces, but I am beginning to think these are "lies, damn lies



Elderly Rushed into Care **Homes**

Budget pressures on the NHS mean thousands of elderly people are being rushed into care homes from hospitals without a review meeting to discuss funding arrangements for their care, say experts.

This means thousands of vulnerable elderly people are wrongly paying for their care when they are entitled to funding from their local NHS

are 376.250 older There people living in 10,331 care homes in England. Care home residents who transfer directly from hospital are entitled to a review meeting to discuss their care needs and funding arrangements.

'care home refunds The scandal has arisen as the NHS has admitted thousands of relatives were mistakenly forced to pay for fees when they were entitled to government funding. 56,000 elderly people – nearly a third of those entitled to have their care home fees paid in full last vear - were forced to turn to relatives for help with topping up care home bills – a four per cent jump on the previous year. If your relative has been rejected for care home funding because of financial eligibility alone or because of a recent health assessment. they should challenge the decision immediately. They're entitled to a review meeting to determine if they are owed money by the NHS but many people don't understand the complexity of the process staffing Budget cuts and shortages mean this review is often overlooked or not conducted fairly.

Most people find the review process daunting and fail to leave with the funding they actually deserve. It is felt the NHS makes it deliberately complex for people to understand. It's shocking and many people will lose their home over this issue because they need to sell it off to pay for nursing home fees which can be as much as £1,000 per week.

The average cost of a care home is £750 per week and many victims of the funding scandal were forced to sell their home or use their inheritance to pay the cost. Alarmingly even family members who kept appealing the initial decision and were rejected again and again - have now been told they were entitled to funding after all. Some families have recovered more than £100,000 in fees wrongly paid by elderly

RESIDENTS SAFER AS CRIME DROPS BY 15%

Ron Hogg, Durham's Police and Crime Commissioner, welcomes the end of year policing figures, which shows a 15 per cent reduction in reported crime.

Over 4,000 fewer people County Durham and Darlington have fallen victim of crime following the significant drop in recorded offences in the last year.

Between April 1, 2012 and March 31 this year, 30,090 crimes were reported to police compared to

35,260 the previous year. Victim-based crimes violence against the person, sexual offences, stealing and criminal damage - reduced by 14 per cent, meaning there were 4,506 fewer victims.

Mr Hogg met with Chief Constable Mike Barton at a force Executive Board meeting on Wednesday to discuss the results.

Commenting on the crime figures, Mr Hogg said:
