Hopefully they will represent the younger generation in Aycliffe in a positive manner. # Dogs Trust's Happy Ending for Puppy Auctioned for £2

A ten-week old puppy has found her happy ending after being sold at auction along with her siblings for just £1.88 each. The Collie cross pup was rescued by a local dog lover after being sold at a livestock auction in the "last chance section" at just six weeks old. The pup was brought to Dogs Trust Darlington where she was affectionately named Lottie by staff that nursed her back to health and found her the loving home she deserves. Hazel Richards from Teeside came across the pups, sold as the last lot of the day, at an auction in Somerset and took the litter of four straight to the vets. Sadly the starving pups were far too young to be separated from their mother and one of the pups passed away. Fortunately Hazel was able to find loving homes for two puppies and handed Lottie, the remaining pup, who needed some extra TLC, to Dogs Trust for rehoming. Hazel Richards explains "I was working in the area and saw the signs for the auction and thought I would see if I could pick up a chest of drawers. I soon discovered it was a livestock auction but was horrified when the last lot was unveiled as a cardboard box containing four filthy, severely malnourished, six-week old puppies. I couldn't just leave them so immediately bid on them and bought the box for a meagre £7.50." Hazel adds "When I collected the box after the auction I could see the terrible



condition the puppies were in, they had been sold as a box of three but tucked at the bottom of the box was the smallest pup, clearly starving with a deformed jaw. I believe that if I hadn't bid on the lot, the pups would have been put to sleep or worse - returned to the owner who has neglected them in the first place. Luckily Dogs Trust were able to take her in and find her a home." Sue Embleton Dogs Trust Darlington Rehoming Centre Manager explains "We were shocked to hear of the circumstances in which Hazel acquired Lottie, it sounds like something which would occur centuries

ago. It just highlights how easily puppies are also sold so flippantly in such circumstances and through pet shops and websites. We advise people to buy a dog from a reputable breeder or get a rescue dog so as not to encourage unscrupulous puppy traders who show little regard for welfare." Dogs Trust Darlington cares for around 120 abandoned and unwanted dogs at any one time. the field but could not lift him and had to flag down a motorist to help her carry the dog.  
He put the dog into his Land Rover and took my wife and the dog to the Vets but our pet was too badly hurt and had to be put to sleep.  
My wife was so badly shaken by this she says she will never have another dog as she feels she let our's down by not being able to protect him.  
I hope the so called man who walked away and left her in that situation is ashamed of himself.

# OSTEOPOROSIS - THE SILENT DISEASE

Today, women are living longer and as we get older our bones get weaker. Osteoporosis affects around 1 in 3 post-menopausal women and fracture following trauma is often the only indication of an underlying problem. This is why it is often called 'the silent disease'. Victims may suffer from deformity, pain, loss of independence and premature death. 3 in 10 women who suffer an osteoporotic hip fracture die within 12 months as a result.

Risk factors include; being post menopausal, early menopause or hysterectomy, family history, use of steroid based medications, dietary factors such as coeliac disease and colitis, low calcium diet, alcohol consumption, rheumatoid arthritis and other medical conditions, low body mass and lack of exercise.

Fortunately, there are steps you can take to prevent the development of the disease, as well as treatment for those who already have it.

Following the 'STAIRs' approach as in the following is a good guide:

**STOP** smoking

**TAKE** exercise, especially weight bearing activity such as dancing, jogging, brisk walking, skipping, aerobics, badminton, pilates or training with weights.

**ALLOW** exposure to some sunshine (before 11.00am and after 3.00pm) between May and September to stimulate Vitamin D production.

**IMPROVE** diet by increasing those foods high in vitamins and minerals together with moderate amounts of protein. Avoid processed or sugary foods and drinks.

**RESTRICT** caffeine and salt and limit alcohol to two units per day.

For those diagnosed with osteoporosis, several prescriptions and supplements now on the market have been shown to be effective in slowing down the bone-loss process and in strengthening the bone that still remains.

Dear Sir,

A few months ago, several residents living in Stanfield Road asked for my assistance in resolving a number of problems including off-road parking (chewing up the grassed areas in the never-ending inclement weather) and the continued deterioration of the road surface.

As a Great Aycliffe Residents' Association committee member, I liaised with the committee, then organised a fact finding survey involving many residents, asking for feedback.

I contacted DCC about the road surface and had been told that the road had been inspected annually and was on schedule for repairs (one, five or ten years).

Whilst GARA can do little about the off road parking situation, I am pleased to note that Durham County Council

has listened to GARA and the concerns of those residents of Stanfield Road who contacted me.

The DCC have resurfaced the entire road which has made a real difference to the general environment. I wish to thank Durham County Council for carrying out this work, especially so at a time when all County budgets are under such pressure.

Finally, remember that GARA aims to ensure that all residents within the Parish of Great Aycliffe have a voice within their community and that their aspirations are fairly represented and acted upon.

Several of us, elected onto GARA, are also councillors, but we are non-political and seek to work with all other organisations and bodies.

### (ROAD B6444 HEIGHTINGTON LANE AYCLIFFE) (TEMPORARY ROAD CLOSURE) ORDER 2013

The Council, on 3 May 2013, made an Order under Section 14 (1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1984, as amended, its effect being to close to vehicular traffic a 30m length of B6444 Heighington Lane equidistant from the centre of Heighington Station Level Crossing, Aycliffe to enable level crossing maintenance works to be undertaken.

The maximum duration of the temporary closure under the Order is 18 months and is required from 10 May 2013 and for the duration of the works anticipated to be until 31 May 2013 commencing on selected nights at 9.00pm until 7.00am the following morning including 10 May 2013. However, on rare occasions, alternative dates for closures may be necessary and these will be signed accordingly.

An alternative route will be available to vehicular traffic from the eastern side of the closure from B6444 junction with A167 at Aycliffe Village, southerly via A167 to Coatham Mundeville Interchange (J59), south westerly along A1(M) to Burtree Interchange (J58) then northerly along A68 and A6072 to the western side of the closure, and vice versa. A local (non-HGV) diversion will be signed from the eastern side of the closure, northerly via Whinbank Road, left onto Horndale Avenue then south westerly along School Aycliffe Lane to the A6072 Roundabout junction with B6444 to the western side of the closure and vice versa.

However, the first part was not finished so why the powers that be, decided to close more of it rather than finishing the first bit, is beyond me.

Again, a third part was sectioned (bottom of the ramp) and yet the first part is still not finished. Now the shops that we still have - for the moment - have limited access, and poor paving outside.

I witnessed two children falling as a result of the uneven surfaces and just

# Family motor dealer celebrate twenty years service in Newton Aycliffe



A familiar name on the town prove there's still the need for a local motor dealer in 2013.

**F**ew retail sectors have endured the same rigorous changes faced by the motor industry over the past decade. However, one such Newton Aycliffe business not only survived, but grew in the face of adversity.

During sweeping changes and a double dip recession witnessing many retailers either seeing their doors close or becoming swallowed up by larger PLC's, Ramseys Garage in Newton Aycliffe were adapting to a new way of doing business.

Ian continued, "Back in 1993 we didn't have the luxury of the internet for shopping, all of Ramseys' advertising went through the local press (which we still use today), although many of our sales now come through the website. Who would have ever imagined you could shop from your mobile phone- did we even have mobile phones in 1993?...I can't remember! I do remember finance terms were restricted to the age of the vehicle you purchased. Today 5 years finance is the norm."

I really enjoy the Newton News, especially the banter and arguments from local people plus the usual slagging off from one councillor to another and the way you publish all views.

I am getting tired of John Clare's Labour party broadcast under the guise of information. In last week's issue he raised points of legal aid cuts and reform to the system as if they were secret. In Jan 2012 it was announced there would be a review of legal aid and consultation went out across the legal framework as, as usual the costs have rocketed

and needed adjusting. The reports came back and legislation came into effect on 1/4/13. As regards who deals with Legal Aid, the comment regarding G4S is spurious and frankly a lie. G4S do NOT carry out legal services in courts so the comment is rubbish. What was decided through 2012 was that the legal aid pot would be given out to larger firms with the experience and hopefully the expertise for people. In this area that would mean Hewitts or Meikles, local firms with court experience. It was designed to get the best for the available money and I assume quite sound economics. John commented on the Human Rights Act - the one Tony Blair signed us up to that wants to give prisoners the vote despite our MPs saying no (including some Labour) and bits we were opting out of. Parliament sets the law for this country, or used to until we signed it away.

Did Mr Clare notice Tony Blair signed the bill in 2007 which resulted in the lady being jailed without trial in secret a couple of months ago for trying to get her dad out of a home? Did he warn everyone that between 1997 and 2010 Labour built NO storage tanks for gas, no new generators, no nuclear power despite being warned we were running out of energy? Did he warn everyone when Ed Milliband signed his energy bill in 2010 to close all the coal fired generators in the country despite having no alternative?

# Good News on Fall in Crime

Police and Crime Commissioner Ron Hogg is hailing a 15 per cent reduction in reported crime as good news for victims. Over 4,000 fewer people across County Durham and Darlington have fallen victim of crime following the significant drop in recorded offences in the last year. Between April 1, 2012 and March 31 this year, 30,090 crimes were reported to police compared to 35,260 the previous year. Victim-based crimes - violence against the person, sexual offences, stealing and criminal damage - reduced by 14 per cent, meaning there were 4,506 fewer victims. Chief Constable Mike Barton said: "Protecting the people in our neighbourhoods and tackling criminality in all its forms is at the heart of our business and what we strive to do every day. The

work we do with our partner organisations and agencies is paying off and making our communities even safer. The fall in reported crime is good news all around, especially for victims, but we are never complacent and our communities can be confident our efforts to reduce crime even further will continue unabated." All major crime categories have seen significant falls: violent crime fell by 11 per cent in the last financial year from 4,955 to 4,390; sexual offences by 14 per cent from 426 to 368; house burglaries by 14 per cent from 1,651 to 1,417; criminal damage by 12 per cent from 7,762 to 6,811; drug offences by 13 per cent from 1,432 to 1,240. Anti-social behaviour has reduced by 27 per cent from 41,985 reported incidents last year to 30,569. There have been 290 hate crime incidents reported in the last year, 67 fewer than the previous year, a decrease of 19 per cent. The force remains one of

the best-performing in the country with low overall crime and a detection rate of 38 per cent. Mr Hogg said: "This is great news and these performance figures are extremely impressive. I hope that the residents of County Durham and Darlington are reassured to know that we are doing everything we can to keep them safe. We are committed to keeping crime low and these figures show that Durham Constabulary is continuously improving and addressing the needs of our communities. We will continue to protect vulnerable people within our communities and seek to reduce the number of victims even further. It is for this reason that we protect the neighbourhood policing teams and will continue to do so despite future budget cuts. I would like to thank all officers and staff for their hard work in achieving these results never forgetting the massive part played by our communities and partners"

## Police Commissioner's Seminar on Hate Crime

Ron Hogg, Police and Crime Commissioner for Durham held his first seminar yesterday, attended by partners from across County Durham and Darlington. Reducing the impact of Hate Crime is one of Mr Hogg's personal priorities which he recently announced in his Police and Crime Plan 2013-17.

Mr Hogg said: "The purpose of hosting this seminar was to identify gaps in service delivery and create a mechanism where organisations can work better together in the future. The ultimate goal is to improve outcomes for the public and to increase confidence for individuals to report these appalling crimes, instead of suffering in silence."

Approximately 80 representatives from a broad range of organisations including, public and voluntary sectors, victim services and community groups contributed by giving individual feedback and action points about how they would like Hate Crime services to be improved. The 6 areas covered included Sexual Orientation, Gender Identity, Race Belief and Faith, Disability, Gypsy Roma Travellers and Learning Disability. Mr Hogg continued: "The

public also needs to be aware that Durham Constabulary will be the next police force to begin recording offences motivated by hatred for members of alternative cultures, such as goths, emos and punks. I believe that correctly recording such incidents as hate crime will be an important forward for County Durham and Darlington."

Mike Barton, Chief Constable said: "The personal stories we heard from Sylvia Lancaster and another guest speaker were extremely moving and frankly those sort of stories is why I joined policing: to protect the vulnerable, to challenge bullies and to make a difference. This conference has further inspired me to put more effort into these three ambitions. We have got to call time on bullies that pick on vulnerable people just because they are different". Volunteers from across the organisations were asked to work together over the coming year in small groups to take the actions forward, to ensure that partners continue to work together to achieve the same goals and to improve confidence for the public. Mr Hogg announced that a follow-up seminar will take place again next year to review how actions have progressed.

2. Tenants of a private absent landlord seen climbing on a local persons car.
3. Rubbish left in the garden to blow about the area.
4. Broken glass left on the road outside the house.
5. General poorly maintained exteriors, broken windows, etc.

I am impressed with the reduced anti social behaviour figures lauded by local police forces, but I am beginning to think these are "lies, damn lies

and statistics".

# RESIDENTS SAFER AS CRIME DROPS BY 15%

Ron Hogg, Durham's Police and Crime Commissioner, welcomes the end of year policing figures, which shows a 15 per cent reduction in reported crime. Over 4,000 fewer people across County Durham and Darlington have fallen victim of crime following the significant drop in recorded offences in the last year. Between April 1, 2012 and March 31 this year, 30,090 crimes were reported to police compared to 35,260 the previous year. Victim-based crimes - violence against the person, sexual offences, stealing and criminal damage - reduced by 14 per cent, meaning there were 4,506 fewer victims. Mr Hogg met with Chief Constable Mike Barton at a force Executive Board meeting on Wednesday to discuss the results. Commenting on the crime figures, Mr Hogg said: "This is great news and these performance figures are extremely impressive. I hope that the residents of County Durham and Darlington are reassured to know that we are doing everything we can to keep them safe. We are



committed to keeping crime low and these figures show that Durham Constabulary is continuously improving and addressing the needs of our

communities. Chief Constable Mike Barton said: "Protecting the people in our neighbourhoods and tackling criminality in all

its forms is at the heart of our business and what we strive to do every day. The work we do with our partner organisations and agencies is paying off and making our communities even safer. The fall in reported crime is good news all around, especially for victims, but we are never complacent and our communities can be confident our efforts to reduce crime even further will continue unabated." Anti-social behaviour has reduced by 27 per cent and there have been 67 fewer hate crime incidents than the previous year, a decrease of 19 per cent. As a result, County Durham and Darlington remain among the safest places to live.

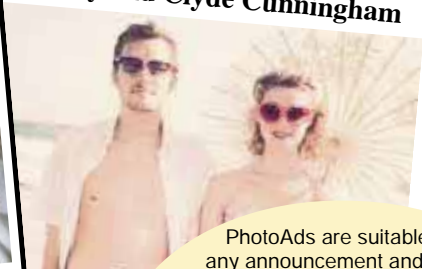
