

Terry Collins, chair of County Durham Environment Partnership, said: "There are many people and organisations in County Durham who put a great deal of effort into protecting and improving the local environment.

These awards are about acknowledging their hard work and their success and we are calling for people to nominate those who are worthy of recognition.

Quality of School Swimming Raised

working currently alongside local primary schools in an effort to raise the quality of swimming opportunities for primary children. school The national curriculum for schools in England says children should be able to swim at least 25m unaided by the end of primary

However a recent report by the Amateur Swimming Association (ASA) has warned that half of seven to eleven year olds in England, some 1.1 million children, cannot swim the length of a standard pool. Only 2% of schools surveyed delivered the government's recommended 22 hours per year of swimming lessons. As Woodham Academy has such a fantastic swimming pool, local primary children from Byerley Park and St. Francis schools have been attending Woodham Academy on a weekly basis to use the swimming pool as part of their swimming lessons and will continue to do so up until the end of the summer term.

Students have progressed from swimming widths to lengths and all students continue to make progress relative to their ability, regardless of whether they are a beginner, improver or advanced swimmer. Swimming lessons are led and run by Heather Brewster, a fully qualified ASA swimming teacher. alongside Woodham Sports Academy staff.

NEvolution Makes Case for North East Growth

Newton News is joining newspapers across the region to spearhead a campaign, backed by local authorities and business leaders, to call for support to grow the North East economy.


NEvolution, a campaign created by newspaper editors, is designed to make the case for the North East ahead of the Spending Review later this month, sending out a clear message to Chancellor George Osborne that – with the right support – North East England is geared up to grow.

The campaign, which calls for greater devolution of powers

The campaign, which calls for greater devolution of powers and the redirection of funding into the North East, is described by the Association of North East Councils (ANEC) as a positive and proactive initiative that makes a strong case for the economies of this area of the country.

Launched last week in newspapers across the North East, NEvolution appeals to George Osborne to back this area, devolving budgets and powers to local authorities and Local Enterprise Partnerships. NEvolution presents a united voice that makes the case for economic investment in the North East. It is hoped that the campaign will help shape announcements made in the Chancellor's Spending Review, on June 26th.

Paul Watson, chair of ANEC, said that the decision by North East councils to get behind the NEvolution campaign was testament to the importance they attach to the opportunity presented by the Spending Review to devolve greater powers, freedoms, flexibilities and funding to local areas to help grow

He said: "The NEvolution campaign is a unique and groundbreaking approach that celebrates the great things we have achieved across the whole of the North East, and makes the case for this area of the country to the Government. We are a capable, constructive collection of people in this part of the world. We know our strengths, we know the areas in which we need extra support, and, with the help of Government, we believe that we can make things even better, and grow our economies and the UK economy.

"We believe that, if we are given the power and financial wherewithal, we can make this area of the country even more prosperous. And this is the spirit of NEvolution – a collaborative, positive and progressive campaign that calls for support to allow us to realise the huge potential that exists here"

NEvolution seeks to showcase to Westminster the benefits of acting on the Heseltine Report. No Stone Unturned, published in October 2012, looked at Government policy affecting economic growth and made a series of recommendations challenging politicians, civil servants, business leaders and individuals to make changes that would generate economic growth.

A key part of Heseltine's report was a recommendation to direct power to local areas and leaders, as those best placed to understand and to address the opportunities and obstacles to growth in their own communities. The report called for the decentralisation of economic power, as well as packages of investment that allow local economic areas to really demonstrate a track record of delivery.

As well as power and funding, NEvolution calls for support from the Government to drive the development of the skills, improvements to transport and connectivity and improved access to funding for growth, including European funds. The campaign targets the Spending Review as an opportunity for George Osborne to give the area the right tools for creating the change we need to deliver conditions for economic growth.

In a report recently published by ANEC, councils in the region highlight the role that they and the Local Economic Partnerships can play in growing their economies. The report states, 'North East councils are committed to creating the right conditions for business growth and investment in their areas, in developing skills and employment opportunities, in infrastructure developments, promoting investment opportunities, capital expenditure and developing strategic relationships with partners in the private sector.

Local government has enormous potential to help Government re-balance the economy, to foster growth, promote inward investment, increase overseas exports and help reduce the deficit. We are fundamentally part of the solution.

'The two Local Enterprise Partnerships for the North East are making great strides forward and are implementing strategies that build on the positive strengths and assets of their respective geographies and for the whole of the North East. But building strong economies is a long term game and our economies are fragile. We welcome the Government taking forward an approach to decentralisation that will give LEP geographies more powers to make the choices that are right for their local economies, to generate and accelerate growth. There is ample evidence to demonstrate that, to date, with both LEPs for the North East maximising the opportunities available for funding to create an investment fund and developing capacity to deliver for their areas.'

Colin Tapping, chairman of the Society of Editors Northern Region, said: "Newspapers across the region have put aside their rivalries to support a compelling case to the Chancellor on behalf of their communities.

WORST ALCOHOL ABUSE IN THE NORTH EAST

Most Hospital Admissions

Colin Shevills, Director of Balance, said: "The statistics issued today continue to paint a bleak picture for the North East. "Once again we have the highest rate of alcohol related hospital admissions in England, at 3,156 per 100,000 head of population. It's no surprise, given that alcohol is 61% more affordable today than it was in 1980. The same cannot be said for other household goods.

"There is a direct correlation between alcohol misuse and its price. The Government has a clear opportunity to deal with this by introducing a minimum price per unit of alcohol. This will make the cheapest and strongest alcohol less affordable to vulnerable younger and heavier drinkers who are more likely to drink it and suffer the consequences.

"In short, a minimum unit price is needed, it's wanted and it works. The North East needs it because we've the highest alcohol related hospital admissions. Not only that, alcohol is also linked to nearly half of all violent crime and 39% of domestic violence. It's wanted by a majority of North Easterners and importantly, the evidence shows that it works. In British Columbia a 10% increase in price resulted in a 32% fall in deaths.

Research carried out by the University of Sheffield indicates that after ten years, every year in England a minimum 50p per unit will: • save 3,393 lives

She disbelieved my two girls were 10 and 11 then finished by reminding me that I was to 'make sure the children behaved at the

poolside'. Things went from bad to worse when the girls entered the pool - They are confident swimmers having completed swimming lessons to high levels in the main pool.

From the spectators' area I saw a lifeguard approach them and in an aggressive manner told them to swim up and down to determine whether they could go in the deep end or not. Fair enough I thought, and good safe practice, however, he lent over the side of the pool in such an intimidating manner that both girls immediately panicked and put their feet down, as they thought they That was that, two very

sensible and able swimmers were consigned to the shallow end, as the lifeguards chose to ignore a very small child in the deep end, jumping in without any flotation aid and no adult in sight.

The rest of the swim consisted of the girls being told not to jump in as they have done many times in their swimming lessons, The staff ignored me when I asked if there was any problem with the girls' behaviour as the staff were being generally unpleasant. After the session the girls got out of the pool to find a disgusting, dirty toilet and changing area.

I appreciate the Lesuire Centre staff will be met with all kinds of behaviour but my girls were sensible throughout and they were accompanied by an adult who would have taken them home had it been a concern

The attitude of the staff was unecessary and belittling and after this terrible experience we won't be returning to our Lesiure Centre. We will use the Dolphin Centre where the staff are pleasant and the

building is clean!

It was a great honour for me to represent the Town Council of Great Aycliffe in my role as Mayor during The Queen's Diamond Jubilee and the Olympic Games. I attended many community events to celebrate these remarkable occasions. I also had the wonderful opportunity to unveil the stone commemorating the Queen's Diamond Jubilee in the commemorative woodland the Town Council planted along a section of The Burn. As well as the formal civic duties I attended a further 166 engagements.



I would like to thank everyone who helped me raise £6511.00 for my nominated charities this included the generous donation from Barclays Bank. This amount was shared as follows the Butterwick Hospice received £4,761, Combat Stress for Veterans returning from war received £1,550 and the two food banks on the Town received £100 each.

The Town Council endeavours to rise to all challenges whilst focusing on the community's needs and continuing to improve our services this is becoming increasingly difficult during these current economic times.

This annual report provides a brief summary of some key achievements from the past year, an overview of financial information and a snapshot of the year to come.

- ✓ A major achievement last year in this current economic climate was once again not raising the Town Council portion of the Council Tax.
- ✓ Achieved £264,000 savings across all service areas which have been added to council balances, this will enable us to continue to deliver all of our services to you without the need to make cuts.
- ✓ Achieved a clean bill of health with our finances and received an unqualified audit.
- ✓ Installed an upgraded BMX track at Woodham Park.
- ✓ Expanded the skateboard area within the Town Park.
- ✓ Installed outside gym at West Park.
- ✓ Worked with a range of partners to deliver a variety of events and services.
- Finalised the licence agreement with Durham County Council which will enabled the Town Council to manage and improve a number of areas of land.
- ✓ Entered into an agreement to undertake a limited snow clearing and gritting service on behalf of Durham County Council.
- ✓ Held 38 public environmental events even with the bad weather we had.
- ✓ Held another successful Town Pride Environment Week working with the Youth Council, local schools and volunteers.

A message from the new Mayor, Councillor Mrs Barbara Clare

It was an honour to be appointed as Mayor for the Town Council of Great Aycliffe at the Annual General Meeting held in May. I am looking forward to a full year of civic events and public engagements. The Town Council has been working very hard to find cost savings, yet still deliver the high level of services the residents of Great Aycliffe have become accustomed to. However, changes in legislation to the way that Council Tax is calculated resulted in an unexpected shortfall in the Town Council finances of over £352,800. Whilst this was partly offset by a Government Grant of £296,150, it still left the Council facing a net shortfall of £56,650 in the 2013/14 Revenue Budget. Due to careful management of the Town Council finances we achieved this saving without the need to make cuts to front line services or staffing levels, although, vacant staffing posts did need to be deleted.

We encourage the residents of Great Aycliffe to engage with the Town Council and make their views known. We have a customer panel where residents can be actively involved in Town Council business and we are always looking for new members. 

Annual Report on the Council's Finances 2012/13

1. Introduction

Welcome to the annual report on the Council's finances which we hope you will find informative and of interest.

This report sets out a summary of the Council's spending plans for 2013/14 and explains how this will be funded by you, the council tax payers of the Parish. The report also provides a summary of the Council's financial performance in 2012/13 and details of the outcome of the annual audit inspection by the Audit Commission.

2. The Council Budget

The Council Budget is an estimate of the resources that the Council will require to be raised from council tax to fund all of the services it provides for a period of one year.

The Budget covers the financial year which runs from 1st April to 31st March.

The Council needs to set a Revenue Budget and a Capital Budget each year.

The Revenue Budget funds the day to day running costs of the Council's services such as salaries, supplies and services and the net cost after deducting any income receivable from fees and charges and grants is met from the Town Council proportion of the Council Tax bill.

The Capital Budget funds major one off investment in the Council's fixed assets such as its buildings, vehicles and play areas and is funded from the Council's Balances and Reserves and any external grants that may be available.

3. Localisation of Support for Council Tax

The Council has been subject to a fundamental change to the way in which it is funded following the localisation of support for council tax by the government.

These statutory changes to the way in which council tax benefits are funded and accounted for in the council tax system, left the Council facing a reduction in its tax raising capacity of over £350,000 with effect from 2013/14.

While the government has put in place Localising Council Tax Support Scheme (LCTSS) funding totalling £300,000 per year to offset the impact of these changes, the Council was still left facing a £50,000 shortfall which needed to be met from savings in the setting of Council's 2013/14 Revenue Budget.

In addition, the Council has found itself in a position moving forward whereby it is now reliant on an external funding stream which accounts for nearly 20% of its Budget. This has created much uncertainty and concern for subsequent years as the future receipt of the LCTSS funding is by no means guaranteed

4. 2013/14 Revenue Budget

the need for any job losses, whilst striving to freeze the Town Council Tax for what would be a fourth year in a row.

The setting of the Revenue Budget needed to take into account the likely changes in costs and income between the two years. This included making additional budget provision for pay awards, inflation, falls in leisure income and the withdrawal of double taxation grant by Durham County Council, and offsetting these through efficiency savings and budget reductions including the 2012/13 officer pay freeze, the new insurance and brewery contracts, a restructure of sports complex staffing.

The Council also needed to fund the £56,650 shortfall created by the localisation of support for council tax. This was met through the deletion of vacant staffing posts.

In overall terms, the Council's 2013/14 Precept reduced by £352,800 from £1,624,400 to £1,271,600, reflecting the loss in tax raising capacity following the localisation of support for council tax, the inclusion of the new LCTSS Grant which partly offsets this loss, and the budget reductions made to balance the budget.

5. 2013/14 Council Tax


The Town Council Tax is calculated using the Tax Base for the Parish which is a calculation of the total number of chargeable properties in the area.

The Council Tax Base reduced by over 20% from 7,959 properties to 6,230 properties following the localisation of support for council tax, reflecting the inclusion of council tax benefits payments in the calculation.

However, by reducing the Council Precept to £1,271,600, the impact of this reduction has been offset and the Council is pleased to report that a freeze in the level of Town Council Tax has been achieved for 2013/14.

This is the fourth year now that the council tax has not been increased and the Council hopes that this will make a small contribution at least towards easing the burden on local tax payers during these difficult economic times.

The 2013/14 Council Tax at Valuation Band A, which is the band at which the majority of properties in Great Aycliffe are valued, will therefore remain at £136.07 per year or £2.62 per week.



A breakdown of the 2013/14 Council Tax is shown above demonstrating that only 12p in every £1 of the total Council Tax comes to the Town Council:-

6. 2013/14 Capital Programme Budget

Following the change in the Council's financial situation following the localisation of support for council tax, a decision was taken to undertake only essential capital investment this year.

The 2013/14 Capital Programme Budget was therefore set at a lower level than in recent years at £187,250 and includes provision for various building works, replacement machinery and equipment, footpath and play area safety surface repairs, and refurbishment of bus shelters.

The Capital Programme Budget will be funded in full from the Council's Earmarked Capital Reserves,

as there is not currently expected to be any external capital grants and contributions available to support the Council's spending plans, and the Council does not need to undertake further borrowing at the present time.

7. Council Balances and Earmarked Reserves

The Council's Balances and Earmarked Reserves stood at just under £950,000 at the end of March 2013. After accounting for the funding of the 2013/14 Capital Programme Budget and a number of on-going revenue and capital budget commitments from 2012/13, as well as the cost of the 2013 Elections, it is likely that the Council will have just over £750,000 in Balances and Reserves at the end of the 2013/14 financial year.

This is considered to be an adequate level of reserves to support future capital spending commitments and to provide some protection against future spending commitments and possible cuts to LCTSS funding.

The financial position and spending of the Council is continuously monitored and controlled in order to help achieve the most efficient use of public resources and, as can be seen above, this has resulted in significant savings being achieved in both 2011/12 and 2012/13. Spending in 2012/13 was £315,000 or nearly 20% under the level of Precept. This is made up of the inclusion in the Revenue Budget of a £50,000 contribution to Earmarked Capital Reserves as well as substantial efficiency savings and under spending on the Revenue Budget of over £250,000. All savings achieved on the Revenue Budget have been set aside in the Council's Earmarked Reserves to support future spending commitments

and to provide for further investment in Council and community assets for the benefit of the tax payers of Great Aycliffe over the coming years.

Capital investment in Council and community assets has totalled nearly £2 million over the six year term of the Council since 2007. This investment has included the installation of numerous new play and multi-use games areas across the town, the opening of the Environment Centre at Moore Lane, disabled access works, planned maintenance works to public buildings and

replacement vehicles, machinery and equipment.

This is all investment that would not otherwise have been possible if the Council did not include a contribution to capital reserves in the Revenue Budget each year and achieve efficiency savings against the Revenue Budget year on year. The Council has also actively sought external grant funding, securing over £500,000 from various sources to support capital investment in the town in recent years.

10. Annual Audit Repor

The Council is subject to an external inspection by the Audit Commission each year and the overall opinion on the financial standing of the Council is set out in an Annual Audit Letter. The Audit Commission looked at three main areas in 2012/13:-

1. Statement of Accounts 2. Annual Governance Statement 3. Value for Money (Use of Resources Assessment)

The Council is pleased to report that it has again received a clean bill of health on all aspects of the audit inspection.

This means that the Audit Commission considers that:-

- the Council's Accounts present fairly its financial position;
- it is well managed and governed with sound strategies, policies, procedures, systems and internal controls;its finances are in good order;
- it delivers value for money to the local community.

This was a very positive Audit Report for the Council and the Audit Commission commended the Council for the progress it has made over the last few years. This is an excellent achievement and has been achieved as a result of the hard work and commitment of all councilors, management and staff.

It has also been agreed by the Council that it will continue to seek a greater level of external audit in 2013/14 despite a change in legislation which would allow the Council to move to a limited assurance audit regime. As one of the largest Town Councils in the country and which spends nearly £3 million of local tax payers' money each year, it felt it needed to continue to manage its finances to a higher standard and to seek a greater level of assurance from external auditors in order to demonstrate efficient use of public money.

The 2012/13 Audit Letter is due to be received later in the year, following the completion of the 2012/13 Audit



John Elliott, founder of Ebac Ltd, has told academics and industry experts that he would "suspend innovation for a year". Delivering a keynote speech at the Manufacturing National Debate 2013 at Cranfield University, Mr Elliott said the move would drive UK manufacturing forward by placing the focus upon goods people in the country consume.
