

COUNTY COUNCIL CABINET MEETING Wednesday 5th June

Regular Report Submitted by County Councillor John D. Clare

At Durham County Council, Cabinet of senior the councillors is empowered to make key decisions (which are then monitored by 'Scrutiny' committees). Thus the meeting of 5 June dealt with some huge issues. The Empty Homes Cluster

Programme is a £4.4m scheme bring 120 uninhabited houses back into use. Helped by government funding, the Council will purchase empty properties and do them up, so they can be rented out. It is a **bold** initiative to address the housing crisis; the areas which will benefit in southwest Durham are Chilton, Coundon and Ferryhill. The Cabinet also approved an

exciting scheme to investigate

forming a 'Combined Authority' to coordinate the 'Combined economic policies of the 'magnificent seven' northeast local authorities. The focus will be to deliver Lord Adonis's Economic Review recommendations for the area, especially with regard to transport and infrastructure.

Also approved was an interim Procedure for the Adoption of Public Open Space on new housing estates – those odd plots of land which belong to the developer, but are often poorly maintained. Among a list of target plots was land in Ranulf Court and Cobblers Hall in Newton Aycliffe.

The Cabinet agreed to 'refresh' its Safe Durham Partnership Plan, in order to incorporate its 'Think Family' strategy, which is designed to make sure that families facing multiple challenges receive multi-agency support. The Cabinet also considered a number of very detailed reports: The Performance Management Report measures the Council's performance over the last year against the various performance indicators. In a desperate financial situation, whilst having to deliver £93m

savings, the County Council still managed to attain many of its targets ... and many of those where it fell short (e.g. unemployment) are arguably due to the recession and/or the cuts.

The Update on the Medium Term Financial Plan reported that the Council has met its savings targets. Sadly, in the past year, 428 jobs had been lost – 190 by early or voluntary retirement, 125 vacant posts had not been filled, and unfortunately there were 113 compulsory redundancies. The Council had consulted widely with the public about where the cuts might fall – consultations showed that the which Council had so far managed the process well, given the tough decisions necessary.

Finally, a very full report outlined Government Legislation affecting Durham County Council and reflected on its implications for the Council; it is well worth a read if you want to know in detail about what this government is doing to the County.

UK data show there 229,318 young adult carers aged 18-24 in the UK; 5.3% of all people in that age group. One quarter of these are providing care for more than 20 hours per week and almost 12% are providing care for more than 50 hours

each week. Our team of project workers have supported young people recently with accessing learning and training learning and opportunities (including Steps 4 Success and the Prince's Trust), accessing Carers Breaks, registering with housing associations, applying for benefits and CV preparation, in order that they achieve their own aspirations

and ambitions. The team also supports young people in training to become peer mentors, so that they can use their own experiences to help others and expand their own skills within Horizon and beyond.

Young Adult Carers Rebecca and Siobhan have recently returned from a residential Media Training weekend in Derbyshire, supported by Horizon staff. The weekend was a great success with carers from around the country

attending. The media training included learning how to interview, questions to ask etc, conducting the interview and capturing the necessary They also learned footage. how to edit their interview report using the latest hi-tech

equipment. The films they created featured their caring role and challenges they face, as well as any positive factors and outcomes. They also took part in photography training capturing the different emotions that carers face in their daily lives, ranging from tired and anxious to happy and empowered.

Rebecca and Siobhan worked really hard throughout the weekend and Horizon won a specialist award for their quality of work inputted onto the 'Makewaves' website. The website is designed specifically for education, primarily used by schools, as well as organisations and projects that work with young people.

Commissioner Welcomes New Police Powers

Durham's Police and Commissioner Crime approves of new measures being introduced to tackle

dangerous drivers. Ron Hogg consulted with the public when he developed his Police and Crime Plan and one of the top policing priorities voted for by County Durham and Darlington residents was road safety related issues.

From July, motorists could be issued with £100 fines and three points for careless driving offences that would currently have to go to court. Current fixed penalties for

using a mobile phone while driving or not wearing a seatbelt will also rise by £40 to £100. Other fixed penalties could be issued for persistently driving in the middle lane on motorways and tail-gating other drivers. Mr Hogg said: "I fully welcome these changes to improve road safety, particularly to deter those who still insist on using a mobile phone while driving. Giving the police more discretion to act is good news as the new process will target offenders without the need for lengthy court procedures

M.P. TRIES TO FORCE **AYCLIFFE WIND FARM DECISION**

Recent Government announcements indicate that local people will have more say on whether wind farms are to be located in their area.

In a Parliamentary debate Phil Wilson tried to raise the situation at Aycliffe, but as can be seen with the dilaogue below the Minister sidestepped the issue,

PHIL WILSON QUESTION: E.ON wants to build a wind farm consisting of 25 wind turbines in the middle of my constituency, generating 64 MW of electricity, which is therefore over the 50 MW threshold.

The final decision will be made by the Secretary of State. Does this announcement today mean that if the local planning authority is opposed and the local community is opposed, the Secretary of State will say no to it?

MARK PRISK ANSWER: It is cute of the Hon. Gentleman to try to tempt me into that area. He knows that these are quasi-legal decisions, and I am not going to comment on any individual application.

What we have done today is make sure that the balance in discussions is correct at the local level and at the appeal level, so that there is an appropriate level of decision making. I am not going to be drawn into individual applications, as he will understand.




