Caring for Carers

A new survey via Carers Week found that six out of ten carers have suffered from depression because of the unrelenting stress of their caring role.

I work for a disability charity called Vitalise and unfortunately this fact comes as no surprise to us. We know that carers are not taking enough respite to help them cope - and we know why. One of our own studies

found that six out of ten carers suffer huge feelings of worry and guilt at the prospect of sending their disabled, frail or elderly loved ones into residential care even for just a few days' respite, and that the issue of quality of care is the cause of their fears. They are simply terrified of letting go.

Sadly, their lack of trust in the care system is quite justified. In many cases respite care amounts to little more than 'warehousing' disabled or older for people in totally unsuitable surroundings. So it's really not surprising that many family carers would rather struggle on at home, risking complete breakdown in the process, than entrust the care of their loved ones to strangers.

Vitalise provides desperately-needed respite breaks for people with disabilities and carers at our accessible UK centres. We are 50 years old this year and we know from experience that carers' worries can be eased if they are confident that their loved ones will receive good quality combined with care, dignity and respect, in an

appropriate and stimulating environment. Is this too much to ask? There are already 6.5

million carers in the UK and this number is increasing a rate of 6,000 each day. If we are to avert a full-scale crisis in social care, the issue of quality in respite care needs to be addressed now. For more info about our

Community groups and organisations voluntary providing health initiatives and help for adults can now apply for grants from £500 to £10,000.

Magnates competition. Great Aycliffe then got a third mention when Mr Henig introduced the motion to agree to join the north-east 'Combined Authority' which, he said, will stretch "from Great Aycliffe to Berwick-

on-Tweed". The LibDems suggested that Council reserves are too high - and were told by an officer that they are necessary to guard against the current "massive financial risks" of Council Tax Welfare benefit changes and the business rate. They also drew attention to an internal auditor report that the Council's internal controls were 'moderate': the Council is of course not satisfied with 'moderate' but, given the government cuts, redundancies, amalgamations etc., the sustaining of a 'moderate' opinion is a positive outcome.

There was cross-party agreement to move reporting of complaints and suggestions to the Corporate Issues Scrutiny Committee, which will mean that complaints are monitored and acted upon much more thoroughly. Finally, after a bit of horsetrading, there was agreement to set up a working group to look into the broadcasting of Council meetings. This is something that Eric Pickles, Secretary of State for Communities and Local Government, wants, but will be very expensive, and is not quite as easy to do legally as Mr Pickles thinks.

ABANDONED TURTLES LEFT TO DIE AND **KILL POND LIFE**

Dear Sir

Most of us are used to the occasional seeing wild hedgehog or rabbit killed on our roads around Aycliffe but on the 1st July I discovered a slightly more unusual animal on Burnhill Way - a Turtle. This animal, about the size of an adult's hand had become the latest victim of what is becoming an unwelcome trend in the town.

Over the last 18 months at least five turtles have been recovered from local ponds and water courses in the town. These animals are veracious predators that can decimate many populations of pond animals including the occasional protected species such as the Great Crested Newt. They can also introduce unwanted diseases and bacteria into the water. People are buying these animals as babies unaware

of or unwilling to consider the considerable time, cost and effort it takes to look after them throughout their lifetime. To keep a turtle healthy they should have a

heater, UV lighting, a good water filter and an aquarium big enough to give a mature turtle a fair standard of life. Thay can grow as large as a dinner plate so should have a tank about 2 feet by 5 feet minimum.

general turtles In can survive summer outside in the British climate but will often die as a result of cold By winter temperatures. releasing these animals into the waterways the owners are consigning their pets to a slow painful death.

Anyone wishing to purchase one of these fascinating animals should first seriously consider what they are taking on, read about them, question the seller about what exactly they are buying, speak to local animal sanctuary's who often have a few needing homes. Please learn about what you

want to take on as releasing them into the wild you are not only harming the turtle, but also the wider local environment.

There has been some public concern about the algal bloom on West Park Boating Lake over recent weeks following the recent hot weather. This is a national problem on many shallow manmade inland ponds, particularly on sites which have high populations of waterfowl. Whilst the bloom does make

the lakes appear unattractive, it does not cause a hazard to health for humans and if managed should not cause a problem to wildlife. The water quality has been tested and monitored over the last few years by an independent

water analyst and on every occasion the water tests have proved the water is safe. The bloom is a temporary annual problem on the lakes and the Council applies a soluble formulation of bacteria and enzymes called

Symbio Blue Water, which competes with the algae to help reduce its rapid reproduction in the water.

The lakes are litter picked on a regular basis to ensure that debris is not allowed to build up in the algal bloom, which would make the lakes look an

Emerald Biogas Call for Action on Food Waste enable the company to reduce

As Emerald Biogas - the region's first commercial food waste anaerobic digestion (AD) plant - approaches the end of its commissioning phase at Aycliffe it is calling on food producers to address the amount of food sent to landfill

Romano-British farmsteads at the site. Our investigations should allow us to document life at Aycliffe as it was over a 3000 year period, and make sure that archaeological finds are professionally identified and recorded."

There is also some early evidence of earlier Bronze Age activity at the site. The team have already found a series of pits and stone tools, including a flint arrow head. Archaeological remains dating to the early Bronze Age are quite rare so this is a potentially significant find. Prior to construction of the factory the archaeological within remains the development site require complete excavation and recording.






