BID TO ESTABLISH UNIVERSITY TECHNICAL **COLLEGE IN AYCLIFFE**

Town Senior Schools Unware of Proposal

The Avcliffe Business **Park Community meeting** last week heard of a bid by the University of Sunderland to bring a UTC to Aycliffe Business Park based at South West **Durham Training.**

University Colleges are a new concept in education. Offering 14-18 year olds the opportunity to take a highly regarded, full time, technically-oriented course of study.

They are equipped to the highest standard, sponsored by a university and offer clear progression routes into higher education or further learning in work.

The meeting heard that a £9 million grant would be made to establish the UTC at Avcliffe and the bid was being prepared to meet a closing date next month.

A fundamental principle of UTCs is that they do not

judge students on their past competition for places but performance. Students are given new opportunities and new ways of learning which allow them to achieve to a higher level than they may have done before.

Newton News editor was present and asked question how the UTC would fit in with existing Secondary School education particularly as the school leaving age was being extended.

establishments would already be seeking to use that extended period to equip students to move into higher education or technical training.

The reply was that it seemed acceptable to have

it seemed loaded against the secondary schools who might feel a bit aggrieved if the bid was successful. In fact our two senior schools were not aware of the proposal bid until this week! The UTC say they will take students from a wide geographical area and this would reduce the negative impact for local schools in terms of the student roll. However it is quite obvious there will be a greater demand from Aycliffe as they are nearer and won't have the same transport problems as others

West Park Lakes for Recreation or Wildlife Haven?

Wednesday debated the condition of West Park Lakes following complaints from users of the facility. Former Councillor Maud Gray spoke on behalf of the residents and said she understood why there were large amounts of algae due to weather etc, but could not understand why the Town Council did not clean the lake regularly to maintain its attractiveness.

During the debate Counc Dan Summers agreed and asked the Council to return the lakes to what was once the pride of the West Ward. and suggesting aeration could solve the problem.

In a lengthy report Steve Cooper Environment Officer explained the situation, stating why the algae and other pond life existed in the shallow 18" deep lakes. He believed this was an important asset to the town as a natural habitat. Some of the blame was aimed at visitors who feed bread to the ducks not realising that rotting bread can affect the water. Neighbours might also be guilty of disposing their motor oil down the drains which is against the law and pollutes the water.

The officer insisted the lakes were cleaned on a daily basis but Coun Gray doubted this as he is a frequent dog walker in the park and has never seen any cleaning activity taking place. He had visited lakes in other towns who did not have this problem, but this was explained away by the officer who said they were much deeper in comparison. Large

Lake the issue seemed to revolve around whether it was a public amenity or a haven for wildlife. The latter was apparently easier and cheaper to operate, but when did this change take place and were the public consulted?

But then the issue of Health & Safety comes into play with the council liable for any accidents. Perhaps the Council could consider having a separate small area of the lakes for this use, with a fountain? This would be safer and easily managed by part time summer staff.

Councillors Chandran and Summers volunteered to help clean away the algae and thought residents would also offer their time to see improvement. Other an councillors had researched the problem and suggested embracing the lakes' natural state by introducing more plants to help aeration was

No Free Garden Waste Collection

An 'opt in' annual fee is the only way Durham County Council can continue kerbside garden waste recycling scheme.

reductions budget Facing of more than £200m (2011-2017) due to large reductions in Government grants, members will be told that the initiative has to be funded by charging an annual fee of £20 to anyone wishing to use it.

The garden waste collection service currently provides 16 free fortnightly collections more than 150,000 households across the county between April and November. Introducing a yearly charge would mean that the service would be substantially funded only by those who use it and would deliver the necessary saving of £933,000.

Cabinet member neighbourhoods and local partnerships, Cllr Brian Stephens, said: "I don't take sort of service change lightly but this is one of many tough decisions we will have to make given the £200m in savings we are required to

position whereby we just don't have the money to deliver some of the services we would like to for free anymore. However, we will also need to understand how people wanting to continue to use the scheme or who will now qualify for it, would prefer to pay and how they would like to have the service delivered. A consultation will help us to understand that.'

While local authorities are not obliged to provide garden waste collections, of those which do, more than 30 per cent already charge separately for the service. The £20 annual fee, which is the same as that already charged by Newcastle City Council and a little less than that in Northumberland, would be payable from next spring.

The revised scheme would use fewer vehicles however, there will not be any job losses associated with the changes as the service has a number of vacant posts currently filled by agency workers.

£4M SAVING FROM **WASTE & RECYCLING**

A complete overhaul of services and a reduction in Durham County Council's management arrangements will mean a cleaner, greener service - and potential savings of more than £4m per year.

The results of a three-year programme to completely review the council's waste collection and disposal arrangements will presented to the authority's Cabinet when it meets on Wednesday, 18 September.

As well as the change to alternate weekly collections of waste and recycling, the council has renewed its waste disposal contracts and the operation of its household waste recycling centres.

By increasing recycling and avoiding the disposal of waste to landfill, the changes will mean more environmentally-friendly

landfill tax of another £1m

Cllr Brian Stephens, said: "The council's waste management strategy was agreed in March 2010 and sets out our targets managing waste more sustainably until 2020.

"During the past three years, we have carried out a great deal of work to re-shape our services in order to make them more cost-effective and environmentally sustainable and have already achieved many of our goals."

A survey of 1,500 members of the public revealed a high level of understanding among residents of how the authority had managed a very difficult process in implementing the change, with 40 per cent saying it had made a positive difference.

Aycliffe FC Vase Dreams Dashed

Aycliffe kissed goodbye to their hopes of a long FA Vase run as they were dumped out at the first hurdle with a 3-1 defeat to Guisborough.

Allan Oliver's squad was down to its bare bones with Stephen Salvin, Fred Woodhouse, Danny Lambert, Paul Broom and James Oliver all missing, meaning Danny Mellanby was the only one aged over 18 on the three-man substitute's bench.

The full-strength visitors took advantage, scoring three times within 7 minutes either side of half-time before a spirited late fightback from Aycliffe could only yield one goal.

Jamie Owens headed wide in a first half that was low on goalmouth action until two minutes before the break when the visitors took the lead in controversial circumstances.

A goalmouth scramble was ended when Adam Gell bundled the ball in from close range from a seemingly offside position, but the appeals from the home side fell on deaf ears. Guisborough immediately added a second through Daniel Johnson's left-footed finish.

Things got worse in the second half as Johnson rounded Dan Molyneux to slot in a third five minutes after the break.

The Royal Blues were heading for elimination and threw on striker Dan Mellanby for John Close in the 55th minute.

Within 10 minutes, Aycliffe had a goal back as Owens headed in Stuart Owen's cross.

The hosts laid siege to the Guisborough's goal for the remaining 25 minutes of the contest but the closest the Newtonians came to another was when Owens struck the crossbar from an acute angle.

Danny Earl sent a late chance narrowly wide of the post as Avcliffe exited the competition at the first hurdle for the third time in four years.

That defeat meant rearrangement of the club's upcoming fixtures.

Allan Oliver's men will now travel to Newcastle Benfield on Saturday August 14th and will make the long trip to Carlisle to face Celtic Nation on Saturday September 21st.

The Royal Blues' quest for Durham Challenge Cup glory will begin on Tuesday September 19th with a trip to Tow Law Town.

Aycliffe's next home game is Wednesday September 25th, when Sunderland RCA visit in Division One action. Kick-off is 7:30pm.
