

Town Centre Shopkeepers Fight 85% Increase **MORE SHOP CLOSURES IMMINENT**

A large group of disgruntled town centre shopkeepers met this week to discuss the difficulties they are facing with increased service charges - nearly twice the amount they are paying at the moment. It was agreed the new charges are unreasonable, unjustifiable and unfair at a time when

Aycliffe shopkeepers have biggest suffered their downturn in business due to the current refurbishments and the general recession. One shopkeeper reported a loss of £100,000 in turnover since the redevelopment began.

Three shops have closed already and it is feared more will follow unless the Landlords realise the seriousness of the problem and hold service charge increases until they can be afforded. Jim Parkin from Homeplan

is heading the campaign for a review of the service charges as they appear to be different for each leaseholder. One shopkeeper admitted to paying no service charge while next door is expected to pay an 85% increase.

Dr. Parkin himself has just been told he should pay no service charge as his premises are not in the town centre. Presumably this now applies to all businesses operating in Greenwell Road? Jim is obviously happy with his result, but still believes his town centre colleagues are getting a raw deal and will help them fight the increase. The shopkeepers complained

the new charges were

announced without any justification and there was a distinct lack of communication from the Landlords.

Service charges should be based on the size of each shop. Detailed information on these charges, and what each shop is paying, would be a useful starting point so that all lease deals were open and transparent.

Further meetings will be held and it was agreed to send the minutes of the meeting to the Head Office of all the large national stores who have premises in Newton Aycliffe calling for their support.



Jim Rodwell came north from Fulham in 1973 to Newton Aycliffe and was a well-liked and popular figure, particularly in the Simpasture area where he lived. For more than 20 years he worked as a Clerical Assistant with the Department of Education and Science at what was in those days their regional headquarters in Darlington. He served as a Councillor on Great Aycliffe Town Council for 18 years, and was Mayor in 1995/6

Jim's listed hobbies when he became Mayor were gardening, theatre, and the local Operatic and Choral Society. Most of his time, however, was spent helping and serving on, a wide range of voluntary and community groups. At various times, Jim served on the Newton Aycliffe Youth Committee, the Centre Crime Prevention Panel, the Local Health Advisory Committee, the Alzheimer's Committee and Newton Aycliffe MIND. He was a Friend of Darlington Memorial Hospital and a volunteer for the Coronary

Care Unit. at some time He was Vice Chairman of the County Durham Residents' Association, Chairman of the Agnew Community Centre Association, a trustee of the Woodham Village Community Association and of the Greenfield Centre Community Association, a Committee member of the Great Aycliffe Residents' Association and, even after he retired as a Councillor, a member of the Great Aycliffe Council Customer Town Panel.

Many people who remember Jim will have known him as a Governor of their school: Vane Road, Sugar Hill, Aycliffe Village and Greenfield Schools. For nearly 30 years he was Chairman of Governors at Infants School, Horndale where his involvement and love for the school was exemplary.

It is almost certain that the above list misses many organisations that Jim supported. His was an unassuming service to the community, but, wherever he found people trying to make Newton Aycliffe a better place he was eager to give them his loyal and caring support.

It is estimated that helping these families remain in their homes could have saved at least $\pounds 85m$ in costs to the council and government departments such as the Department for Work and Pensions and Department of Health.

The figures are included in a report to Durham County Council's Cabinet, which will be asked to approve a new Homelessness Strategy for 2013-18 when it meets next week.

The strategy explains the challenges facing the council and other organisations and sets out how they can work together over the next five years to tackle the problem of homelessness. It also outlines what the council

has done since 2008 to prevent homelessness and how social and economic factors have affected its work.

Cllr Eddie Tomlinson, Durham County Council's Cabinet member for housing and rural issues, said: "The county council's first Homelessness Strategy covered a period of transition as we became a unitary authority.

"But despite the challenges of setting up a new, countywide homelessness service and a rise in the number of people applying to the council for help to prevent losing their home, we have achieved some significant results. "Between 2008 and 2013, we

saw an increase of 281 per cent in the number of families who we helped avoid the misery and distress of being made homeless. The report also reveals that during the five-year period of the first strategy, no 16 or 17-year-olds were officially declared as homeless. And while domestic abuse remains the main reason for homelessness in the county, homelessness there was a 28 per cent drop in in the number of homelessness applications due to domestic abuse between 2011/12 and

2012/13. The installation of additional security measures in the homes of domestic abuse victims has

led to an increase of 92 per cent in the number who have been able to remain in their homes The council has introduced a range of measures to help tackle homelessness, including a dedicated welfare rights worker within its housing service, a 12-month pilot offering support to people sleeping rough in Durham City and a regional initiative targeting repeat offenders leaving prison.



Britain's voung-people may have come near the bottom of a global league table of literacy skills recently, but an Aycliffe school has hit on a solution which, it is hoped, will see its own students come out tops.

Academy Woodham has recently introduced a number of major improvements to its reading policy. Year 7 learners (plus selected individuals from Ŷ8 and Y9) have been enrolled on an Accelerated Reading programme which provides an accurate assessment of their reading and comprehension skills, matches them with appropriate books, and then tests them on how much they have learned.

Those who score well on these on-line quizzes are then able to move up a level and the number of words they have read triggers rewards. Reading takes place in the newly refurbished Reading Area and students are free to find a quiet corner or crash on a cushion to make the most of this leisurely opportunity.

In addition to what the school termed 'free reading' has students are also provided with a complimentary Guided Reading programme, where learners discuss matters relating

to themes, current issues and deeper meanings, and where they can get to grips with the author's actual intentions; all of which forms part of the English curriculum.

The intention behind these new initiatives is, says programme leader Josie Marsh, to make reading enjoyable and relevant. To further encourage students to read Woodham has also launched a reading facility on Moodle, the school's Virtual Learning Environment (VLE). The Prize Read scheme offers opportunities for learners to read social and historical articles and win prizes for their thoughts and observations. This, says, Mrs Marsh forms part of the school's 'holistic approach to reading and writing - this being, she says 'vital' for future achievement and success:

"If learners read a lot and read well they will develop a better understanding of the world around them and of the issues they face when they are adults." The scheme should also have a positive impact on other school subjects right across the curriculum, and, perhaps, help learners' future promotion chances.
