# **OVER 900 AT GAMP PROJECTS VOTING DAY** An Education Centre for Children with Downs

Syndrome and an appeal for funding to build a Multi Use Games Area were amongst 12 projects that captured the public's imagination at a community funding event, organised by Great Aycliffe and Middridge Partnership (GAMP), and held on Saturday (November 23rd) at Newton Aycliffe Youth Centre.

More than 900 people attended the Your Money, Your Area, Your Views Forum Event to vote for the community projects they believed most deserved a share of a £27,000 funding pot

This year, 31 groups applied for grants of up to £2,500 for various community projects.

Representatives from each organisation exhibited at the forum to give residents and those who work, study or volunteer in the area an insight into what they do before casting their three votes.

In the end, 12 projects proved successful, including Hordale Residents Association, which applied for £2,500 to build a Multi Use Games Area. The total cost of the project is  $\pounds40,000$ with the £2,500 secured at the event, means that the project can now come to fruition

Philip Clarke, Chair of Hordale Residents Association, said; "The dream and promise I made to the youngsters of our neighbourhood became a reality. This would not have been



possible without the help of all those who voted for us.' During the event 241 members of the local

community also took part in an exercise to look at how the Council saves the predicted £100m from its budget. Brian Riley, GAMP Co-ordinator, said: "It's

been a fantastic event and we have been overwhelmed with how many residents made the effort to vote for their favourite projects. As part of the event the community also got the chance to vote for the GAMP priorities for 2014-15 and I am grateful that 825 residents have given the GAMP Board direction on what they consider to be the main issues in the area.

# **Biggest Danger**

Dear Sir, A recent letter from 'a concerned resident' argues that, because of speeding on Central Avenue at times outside of school opening and closing times, and because a student was hit by a car somewhere unspecified in the last two years, and because a child and his sister were almost hit by a car crossing Central Avenue, there should be a 20mph speed limit outside schools. Concerned resident asks whether I still think it would be a waste of time and money to reduce the limit to 20mph. In a word, yes. Concerned resident implies they favour a 20mph limit on Central Avenue, because Vane Road and Woodham pupils cross it on the way home. This is one of the main roads through town. It's just not feasible to say average speeds reach 40mph on this road - I drive it regularly, and they don't, especially not at busy times. My own experience is that nearly all drivers drive safely, slowing right down when the road is busy, and it's at a crawl when the school pupils are crossing.

You can't redesignate every road as 20mph just because there is an accident or near miss on it - that's a knee-jerk reaction. Instead you need to look at all the circumstances and properly assess the risks. Concerned resident would have the whole town redesignated as 20mph, or would have cars banned altogether! Kids could cross

Probably the best way to mitigate the risks is to educate children on how to safely cross a road, and if they're not old enough to do this, they should be accompanied by a parent or older sibling. By far the biggest risk is



# £20,000 BOOST FOR TOWN'S FOOTBALL CLUB

Newton Aycliffe, who play in the Ebac Northern League first division, have received £20,000 from the Great Aycliffe and Middridge Partnership (GAMP) thanks to local councillors.

The money has gone into a number of ground developments, mainly the creation of a new 'Supporters Bar' as well as new steel terracing. The cash was allocated from

budgets of former local County Councillor John Moran and current Councillor Sarah Iveson, each giving £10,000 each from their Neighbourhood Budget Funding earlier this vear

The money was met with cash donated by two local firms – Allan Oliver Reinforcing and Finley Structures – to help fund other areas of ground improvement, including the foundations and drainage for the new bar and a viewing area above.

The new improvements came on the back of a number of investments made at Moore Lane Park, which was first opened in 2008 after a £300,000 grant from Sedgefield Council's Local Improvement Programme and a further £20,000 from the Football Foundation.

Since then, more cash has been pumped into ground improvements. Landowners Aycliffe Sports Club and the Football Foundation went halves on a new  $\pounds 20,000$  all-seater stand, while the William Finley Stand, built by sponsors Finley Structures followed. These latest developments take the total investment in the

ground to almost £400,000 in five years. The club's general

Dan Lewis said: nanager "We've been making steady improvements to the ground year on year, in a bid to provide the best spectator experience possible, while also providing

possible, while also providing playing conditions that are appropriate for the standard. "These latest developments are hoped to make a big particularly improvement, for our loyal fans, because previously we were one of very few Northern League clubs without a bar within our ground. "Thanks to a partnership approach between us and our landlords, Aycliffe Sports Club, supporters are able to enjoy hospitality on site." Supporters won't be allowed to drink pitchside, in accordance with FA rules, but the availability of a nearby bar is expected to be a new attraction to both home and

away fans. Mr Moran, a Sunderland season ticket holder, wanted to make the donation as one of his last actions as a Durham County Councillor. "I just love football and I love to see our hometown being represented the in Northern League," he said.

Cllrs Moran and Iveson donated £4,000 from their budgets to various improvements last year. GAMP Coordinator Brian Riley said: "This is a fantastic project that helps the town's football club. Funding will provide a number of benefits not only for the club but also the hundreds of supporters who enjoy following their local team. We wish Newton Aycliffe FC future success and to establish themselves in the Northern League. "We're Lewis added: Mr

We feel the latest developments will add considerably to the supporter experience we can offer at Newton Avcliffe, and we hope will lead to increased numbers coming through the turnstiles. auoted planning language chief using indicating he regards as a fair accompli the 'big development' at High Copelaw. In fact this is still subject to ongoing

consultation. The draft County Durham Plan seems to be based on a lot of demographic and socioeconomic statistics, a computer model and a key underlying Government steer that the area has to have economic growth. However, cynics might say some of the key assumptions underlying the model amount to little more than guesswork designed to support politically desired

The model concludes that, to achieve the economic growth required, the area needs to import skilled people from other parts of the country (because there aren't enough here already!). This, combined with the fact that people are living longer, means we will have population growth, so County Durham will need more housing, including more top end housing for all the skilled people coming from elsewhere. Newton Aycliffe is identified as one of the key places earmarked

for economic and population growth. Copelaw seems aimed mainly at providing more top end housing.

At the time of writing there have only been 5 written responses to the consultation on the proposed Copelaw development (which opened on 14 October), including my own, none of which support it. Despite this, the Council states 'evidence based work and consultation undertaken to date continues to support the release of the Low Copelaw site for housing to deliver the growth required in the South Durham

This is a large proposed development of 1,400 dwellings (circa 4,000 people, I guess) or 10-15% of the existing town population, which would stretch from just north of the Young People's Centre to just south of the Gretna, and east from the A167 to beyond High Copelaw farm - you can see the plans and comment on them online (Google County Durham Plan, click on County Durham Plan Consultation Pages, then Low Copelaw). Note that the area to


