

Residents in County Durham are reminded that some bin collection dates will change during the festive period. The changes will affect rubbish and recycling collections which normally take place on a Wednesday, Thursday or

Friday. Collections which usually take place on a Tuesday will not be affected and will be done as normal on Christmas Eve and New Year's Eve.

The Christmas and New Year collection arrangements are as follows:

All collections will be back to normal from Tuesday 7 January. Keith Parkinson, refuse and recycling manager at Durham County Council, said: "Bin collections will still take place during the festive period but the date of the actual collection will change for some people.

"It is important that residents check their collection dates and ensure they put the right bin out on the correct day.

Residents can arrange for their real Christmas tree to be collected free of charge. To make arrangements people should contact the county council on 03000 26 1000 before Monday 6 January.

Alternatively people can take real Christmas trees to any household waste recycling centre in the county. They can check the opening hours of their nearest site at www.durham. gov.uk/hwrc

All sites will be closed on Christmas Day and New Year's Day. There will be no bulky waste collections between Monday 23 December and Friday 3 January. Further information about refuse and recycling collections can

(FOOTPATH NO. 36 AYCLIFFE) (TEMPORARY FOOTPATH/FOOTBRIDGE CLOSURE) ORDER 2013

The Council on 16.12.13 made an Order under the provisions of Section 14 (1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1984, as amended, the effect of which will be to temporarily close to all pedestrian traffic a 75m length of Footpath No. 36 Aycliffe Parish eastwards from the north-south section towards Codling Railway Bridge then northwards along the western side of the railway line, then westwards, northwards and eastwards crossing the Millennium Bridge to the adopted highway of Long Tens Way and Millennium Way, Aycliffe.

The maximum duration of the temporary footpath closure order is 6 months and is required from 18.12.13 and for the duration of the earth works and developments works proposed to be executed on or adjacent to the said footpath, anticipated to be for 6 months or until the works are complete whichever is sooner. 

Police Appeal for Witnesses

Police are appealing for witnesses after an elderly pedestrian was left in hospital following a road accident in Newton Aycliffe recently.

The accident happened at midday on Saturday, 7th December on Greenwell Road when the victim, a local man aged 83 was struck by a blue Vauxhall Corsa. He suffered a head injury but at first there was no immediate cause for concern as the collision happened at a relatively low speed and the pensioner was fully conscious in the

ambulance which took him to Darlington Memorial Hospital.

However, over the weekend his condition worsened and this morning he was classed as being in a 'critical' condition. The car driver, a 26-year-old man was unhurt.

All witnesses who were spoken to at the scene are being re-traced in view of the accident now being classed as serious, anyone else who saw the incident should ring the police on 101 and ask for the road policing unit.

flying triangle. The fight went to the ground and Jordan rolled for a leg lock only to be caught by David's fast heel hook


