



With the weather remaining unpredictable, people in County Durham are being reminded to think of others.

Durham County Council is asking people to be a good neighbour during bad weather, by: • Calling on those living nearby to check if they need anything. · Looking after the vulnerable by getting in touch with people who are ill, older or who live on their own and may need a helping hand.

· Keeping drives and footpaths clear by shovelling snow for friends and neighbours if they struggle to do it themselves.

The cold weather can significantly increase the risk to those who are already vulnerable. Spare a thought - and perhaps a little time - for friends, relatives and neighbours who may struggle in the worst of the winter.

Check they are warm, especially at night, and have food and medicines so they don't need to leave the house. Remember, a small act can make a big difference.

SIGHT LOSS CAN BE AVOIDED BY REGULAR TESTS

Almost two million people in the UK are living with sight loss, yet over half of sight loss can be avoided say experts. Sight is the sense that lots of

people fear losing the most, yet many of us don't know the best way to look after our eyes. It is important for sight tests to be part of everyone's healthcare routine, just like going to the dentist.

It is important to get your eyes tested every two years, even if you think your vision is fine, as some eye conditions may not show symptoms. A sight test isn't just about checking whether your vision needs correcting with glasses or contact lenses.

Sight tests can detect conditions which, if many found early, can be treated successfully avoiding potential sight loss.

Other serious health conditions, such as high blood pressure or diabetes, can be detected through regular sight tests. Awareness of the link between diet and good eye health is low - a recent survey found sixty per cent of people living in the UK had no idea that what they eat can affect the health of their

eves Vitamins minerals and carotenoids found in many fruits, vegetables and other wholesome foods can help protect sight and keep eyes healthy.

Excessive alcohol consumption and smoking can lead to serious health conditions which can have a detrimental effect on eye health. After ageing, smoking is the biggest risk factor for developing macular degeneration. Smoking also increases the risk of developing cataracts.

Aycliffe Woodlands IDEA LEADS THE WAY

Dear Sir.

Over recent years there has been an alarming rise in the number of reports of people removing fallen timber from our woodlands around the town

This can be linked to the trend for people to purchase traditional wood burning appliances such as wood burning stoves and garden braziers to burn timber.

While the use of these types of appliances can be seen as a sustainable source of fuel it is important to note that timber taken from our nature reserves can have a significant detrimental effect on the local wildlife. Fallen and dead timber

habitat for many types of wildlife including food for insects, fungi and birds. It also provides cover for many other species such birds, amphibians and as mammals. The removal of this resource will therefore have a significant impact on the wildlife which will make our woodlands their home. For this reason Great Aycliffe

Town Council will leave fallen and dead timber on site in the form of habitat piles and anyone proven to be taking the timber for their own benefit is liable for prosecution.

Great Aycliffe Town Council would therefore encourage members of the public to remain vigilant of people removing timber from removing timber from Council owned land and report any concerns to the police on 0345 6060 365 in the first instance. Any further information can be passed onto Great Aycliffe Town Council on 01325 300700. Again, anyone who has invested in this type heating is encouraged to buy their timber from a reputable dealer and would encourage everyone to enquire where their timber is sourced from. The Amp SelectaTM is a simple to use guide, which shows the levels of electrical current used by common household appliances. The design of the guide, in the form of a wheel, provides a quick and easy way to check if you are at risk of overloading the sockets in your home. It shows the your home. It shows the power used by everyday electrical appliances so you can work out if you may be putting yourself at risk. Andrew Allison, community safety manager for Durham and Darlington Fire and Rescue Service said: "Fires caused by faulty or misused

electrical appliances account for around 40 to 50 per cent of all house fires. We will be handing out the Amp SelectaTM during all of our free home fire safety checks to help people understand when they are at risk of overloading their sockets. "Many people are unaware that each socket can only

People from the North East are being asked to make 2014 the year that they start saving lives by giving blood. With the festive season coming to an end, NHS Blood and Transplant (NHSBT) is hoping people will pledge to become regular blood donors for their New Year's resolution.

The New Year period is often a particularly challenging time for blood stocks due to the wintry weather and dark nights keeping people indoors. And as hospitals need 7,000 units of blood each day to treat patients with chronic conditions like cancer and anaemia, along with people needing treatment for often life-threatening illnesses and injuries, NHSBT is encouraging new or returning donors to book an appointment in the first weeks of 2014.

Donna Batty, NHSBT's lead donor relations manager for the North East area, said: "People often set themselves very difficult and drastic challenges for their New Year's resolutions which they struggle to complete.

"However, we are asking people here to do something very simple which should only take around an hour of their time, a few times a year. Making and keeping a New Year's resolution to give blood will give you the satisfaction of knowing you are saving lives.

"We can also guarantee you a warm welcome, a nice drink and a biscuit to stave off the cold January weather." Anyone aged between 17-65, weighing more than 50 kg (7

stone 12lbs) and in general good health could potentially start saving lives by becoming a blood donor. There is no upper age limit for donors who have donated in

Tackling Enviro-Crime in Co. Durham

More than a hundred fixed penalty notices were issued to people in County Durham for offences such as littering and dog fouling. Durham County Council's neighbourhood protection team operates throughout neighbourhood the county to tackle enviro-crime and during November the team issued a total of 107 fixed penalty notices.

Of those, 79 were issued for littering, 26 were issued to people who had failed to comply with a litter clearing notice and two were issued to people who failed to pick up after their pets. offenders Two were

subsequently prosecuted at magistrates' court for non-payment of their littering fixed penalty notices.

In addition to the fixed penalty notices the neighbourhood protection team investigated 171 incidents of flytipping and issued 118 advisory letters and 32 litter clearing notices in relation to properties with untidy gardens and yards. Ian Hoult, neighbourhood

protection manager at Durham County Council, said: "County Durham is a beautiful place and we, along with the majority of people who live here, want to keep it that way.

"Environmental crimes. like littering, dog fouling and flytipping, blight our communities and are a real concern to residents. "We urge with anyone information about such those and incidents responsible to report it to us so that we can investigate and

take action." Anyone with information about enviro-crimes fouling, including dog fouling, littering and flytipping, or about incidents of anti-social behaviour is asked to contact Durham County Council's neighbourhood protection protection team on 03000 26 1000.



Care Connect provides a roundthe-clock alarm monitoring and response service for older and vulnerable people living in their own homes.

As part of its Medium Term Financial Plan, the council needs to reduce the cost of providing the service by £1m from 2014.

Cabinet was being asked to agree to a number of proposals which would enable the service to make the required savings. These include changes to the way in which customers are assessed as well as improvements and efficiencies



Warm up North is available to everyone, seeking to maximise whatever offers are available to residents.

Latest figures also show that more 2,000 people have called the special Hotspots advice and referral service to get expert advice on everything from heating and fuel debt support to fire safety checks. It can also be used when there are problems with a lack of hot water or heating. All referrals need to heating. All referrals need to be made by frontline health and social care staff.

Funding from Hotspots comes from Public Health Durham

County Council and key partners include Durham and Darlington Fire and Rescue. Stuart Timmiss added: "The council beliaves that the council believes that the best way of tackling energy bills is by making our homes more efficient but we also want to promote the Warm Homes Discount Scheme which provides qualifying householders with a $\pounds 135$ discount off their electricity bills. Everyone who qualifies will get a letter from their utility provider before the end of January. But why wait? Contact them now to find out how they

can help. "An exciting year ahead offers more opportunities for schools to start reducing their bills whilst at the same time improve the environment in which our children learn. We hope to launch the schools offer in the spring with many options available to suit every school: we hope this will quickly convert into a much wider opportunity, building on what

the council has already learnt from making its own buildings more energy efficient.

"By investing now the council has shown how it will manage the significant energy rises we are currently experiencing. Over the last 18 months we have opened two new primary schools, both of which are the most energy efficient in the country, reduced energy consumption in four of the highest energy consuming buildings by 40per cent, installed Photovoltaic panels on 36 buildings and implemented a range of energy reducing projects, some of which have

cost little or no money across all of its buildings. " County Durham has already

40per cent carbon reduction target (on 1990 levels) and is now aiming to achieve a 55% reduction by 2031. The council's streetlighting project is yet another example of how in partnership we will reach this target with 40,000 street lights to be replaced with LED's reducing consumption by up to 70 per cent.

The Council also provides crisis help through the Welfare Assistance Scheme which includes immediate financial

help to top up gas and electricity meters or help with paying energy bills.

y bills. Neil Foster, Cabinet Cllr member said: "We are committed to helping people make their homes warmer and cheaper to heat and are delighted to be at the forefront of a range of schemes to make this possible. As a council we really take our responsibilities seriously by leading by example. What we have found is that we have reduced energy consumption, our staff have become fully on board and the environment in which we work has improved.'
