Central Coaches ceased running this service, due to lack of support, but JSB have taken it on, with a subsidy from Durham County Council. The time table will be exactly the same which will be appreciated by passengers especially from School Aycliffe and Heighington who were cut off completely from Aycliffe. One lady in Heighington with an appointment in Newton Aycliffe had to take the bus to Darlington and then a bus to Newton Aycliffe - a 2 hour round trip for a 5 minute journey down the road.

Work Starts on TED Space at Greenfield College

Building work has now started on a fantastic new creative space at Greenfield Arts. The work, which will see the layout of the centre change dramatically to create two new spaces for research and creativity in the centre, has been funded by Professor Sugata Mitra of Newcastle University as part of the TED award he won earlier this year.



Greenfield Community College is one of two schools in the UK, alongside a number of areas in India who have been awarded funding to continue Professor Mitra's "School in the Cloud" research.

The new spaces will include "Room 13," Greenfield's own "School in the Cloud" with IT and technology facilities in an indoor/outdoor themed space, providing a social atmosphere for students and the community to learn independently through an enquiry based approach.

The space will be used by students and staff at Greenfield Community College for this research, as well being accessible to local primary schools, community partners and members of the community. A number of projects and activities have already been planned for the space, including a reading enquiry with Chilton Primary School, "Skype Granny" research with Newcastle

University and more. In addition we have received funding from GAMP AAP to create "The Shed" as part of the "Equipped for Life" project, which will include a range of specialist design and print equipment to be used by young people and the community to develop enterprise and employability skills. We would like to thank GAMP AAP for their support and contribution to these exciting changes.

Katy Milne, Director of Arts and Creativity at Greenfield said: "This is a fantastic opportunity for Greenfield to continue this global research and development into enquiry based approaches to learning here at Greenfield Arts. We are confident that the new spaces will offer a range of new opportunities for creativity and learning for students at Greenfield, local primary schools, the community and more and look forward to the

grand opening in February!" The building work is being undertaken by Burnip Property Solutions following discussions with Design by Kiosk, and is expected to continue through January 2014. Greenfield Arts will remain open as normal throughout the building work, we hope you will bear with us through the dust!

READER SUGGESTS NEW BUS ROUTE TO INCREASE USAGE

Dear Editor
Following the letters in Newton News about the re-routing of No 7 bus to include Tesco, Aldi and Argos, etc, I contacted Arriva to add my support for the suggestion. A few days later, I got a phone call from a very pleasant young man at Arriva. He said discussions were ongoing, and they were noting people's concerns etc. One concern was that re-routing alternate buses via Tesco, etc, would mean that some people would then have only a half hourly service instead of quarter hourly. I then had another think, and suggested a new idea, which he said he would put forward:- Run all No 7 buses on the current route

from Woodham to the Town Centre, then detour down Central Avenue to the Tesco stop, round St Mary's Church roundabout and back up Central Avenue to St Clare's Church roundabout and continue the present route to Darlington. On the return journey, take the same detour before the Town Centre stop. It would add less than 5 minutes to the journey, would be a big help to people in the Woodham areas, and would also attract passengers from the Burn Lane/Shafto Way/ Central Avenue areas, travelling to Darlington or Chilton/Ferryhill/ Durham. I await developments, but wonder What other bus users think of this idea?

Please note that the County Durham Bus Maps website (Pinder) after stating the 116 service being withdrawn have without any announcement put up a new timetable for the 116 service starting on the 6th of January 2014. Although it looks unchanged as to the times it is now being run by JSB. The timetable is available online and I found it on 7th January 2014. It only stated it was being withdrawn and did not mention a new service was taking its place.

Dear Sir,
Many years ago most people in rural villages had a dog. In those days pedestrians walking the pavement had to have a good eye and be nimble of foot to skip round the dog mess which decorated the pavements. Fortunately since those days most local dog owners take responsibility for their animals by cleaning up after them, and I am pleased to say that in Heighington and Redworth there are more good dog owners than bad ones.

Yes, there are times when dog fouling is more prevalent than at others, particularly at the bottom of Twinsburn Road, Station Road and the Batts Lane end of Highside when the mornings and evenings are cold and dark and owners stay close to their own front door. (This is not an excuse for them only an explanation) but generally the problem of dog fouling is not as bad as in other towns and villages – but there is room for improvement.

This afternoon I went for a breath of fresh air along Twinsburn Lane, around the back of the farm and onto Highside Road and beyond. The sun had just set and it was chilly but ideal to enjoy the scenery using public footpaths which would take me across fields away from the sound of cars, telephones and 'e' mails.

Unfortunately, as I entered Twinsburn Lane, the first off road part of the walk, I was surprised, and dismayed to have to pass a Dog Bin on the right hand side of the lane. The Dog Bin was so full of carefully knotted polythene bags all containing dog excrement that they had spewed over covering the ground beneath the bin. The sight was revolting. Which will even look worse if rats or birds tear the bags. I don't doubt some of the dog owners will blame the Council for not emptying the bin and they have a point but there is still no excuse for anyone to leave their dog mess in or around a bin that is full – please take it home and dispose of it responsibly. It is grossly unfair on the owner whose house stands behind the dog bin. They have to pass this mess every time they leave their home. It is unfair on parents who walk their children along the lane for exercise, it is unfair to the Parish Council who spend a lot of money and time improving the environment throughout the Parish, and it is certainly unacceptable to the community of Heighington who take so much pride in their village.

It will be interesting to see if Street Scene clean up the area around this dog bin. I can understand it if they refuse. They are after all working people with the same reactions to filth as the rest of us.

I would not ask anyone to do something that I would not do and I certainly would not be happy having to

reach down to pick up this disgusting pile of filth and perhaps this is the question all dog owners should ask themselves would you pick up piles of dog mess left by others and if the answer is 'No' then why should anyone expect Street Scene operatives to do so?

Dog owners, having picked up your dog mess in the first place, the worst of the job is done. If a Dog Bin, or a litter bin for that matter is full, take your waste home.

As always, I am available should anyone wish to discuss this matter further?



ART EXHIBITION




