

Aycliffe Steel Company Finleys Win Hitachi Contract

" Proud and Delighted" says Managing Director


Family-run steel company Finley Structures has been awarded a multi-million pound deal to construct Hitachi Rail Europe's trainbuilding factory in Newton Avcliffe

Shepherd Construction the main contractor for the project, has given Finley's the task of constructing the steel frame of the main factory on the 42,700sqm site at Aycliffe Business Park.

Finley's, based within a mile of Merchant Park, where Hitachi's new £82m facility will be built, has also been handed a secondary steelwork package in a huge contract involving a total of 2,000 tonnes of steel.

The factory, which will include a research and development centre, expected to take about 20 months to complete, and will support more than 200 jobs in its construction.

It will then employ 730 people once open by the end of summer 2015, and it's estimated thousands more in the supply chain.
Neil Matthias, Shepherd's

manager for the Hitachi factory, says the deal is another example of how the firm is committed to using local companies after appointing Rushyford-based Hall Construction to carry out the groundworks.

Mr Matthias said: "This is great news for the project and for the scheme, and particularly John Finley who has been close to the project for a number of years and has worked alongside Shepherd for a number of years in the industry."

Finley Structures, started by managing director John Finley in 2000, has completed a string of high-profile contracts in recent years.

Mr Finley said: "It goes

without saying we're proud and absolutely delighted to be given this contract. We have a long-standing relationship with Shepherd Construction and we've worked with them on a number of major contracts over the last few

Merchant and Developments have said from the very beginning that they will use local suppliers and contractors as much as possible, and clearly this deal means they're sticking to their word.

"I would especially like to thank Geoff Hunton from Merchant. Geoff can be credited largely for helping to bring Hitachi to Newton Aycliffe.

In May last year (2013), Hitachi Rail Europe signed a deal with Newcastle-based developers Merchant Place Developments to construct and fit out the train-building factory, and then in November Shepherd Construction was revealed as the main contractor for the 20-month project during a high-profile attended ceremony Secretary Vince Business Cable.

Cumner, Darren facturing Plant Manager at Hitachi Rail Europe, said: "The appointment of Finley Structures for the steelworks contract is excellent news for the region. For Hitachi, it is most important that our vehicle manufacturing facility is built to the highest quality standards and we are delighted that with Finely Structures, a local company, has been able to answer to these requirements and to secure the contract.

Mr Hunton added: "Merchant Place Developments fully endorse the statement made by Hitachi and are delighted with the appointment of a local North East based company for the steelworks contract which has fully



GREENFIELD TAKES A STEP FOR HOLOCAUST MEMORIAL DAY



Greenfield Community College students have been remembering the Holocaust and subsequent in Cambodia, genocides Rwanda, Bosnia, Darfur. The students commemorated Holocaust Memorial Day through a series of assemblies and were encouraged to take their own steps, using social media, reading books, writing poems and more to ensure genocide is never forgotten and to help prevent it in the future. In addition each house group at Greenfield took a collective step by lighting a candle for each house shade in the assemblies.

Last week a group of year 8 students went to Durham Cathedral to study journeys of the Holocaust accompanied by their teachers Miss Newton and Mr Johnson where they participated in workshops about prejudice and discrimination and listened to Holocaust survivor. Ruth Barnett.

During the morning, students took part in activities which highlighted the dangers of prejudice and discrimination as well as considering the lessons we can learn from the Holocaust. In the afternoon, Ruth spoke about her experience of the Holocaust and the impact it has had on

The students commented on the experience that they were very saddened to learn the true extent of the horrors of the Holocaust. One student reflected 'how the genocide affected different people in different ways' and were 'extremely shocked to find out extremety snocked to find out Roma Gypsies were brutally murdered as well.' Students asked very pertinent questions and gained a huge amount from a very thought provoking and moving day and moving day.

Newton News would beg to differ on that point as we believe THAT is exactly what **Newton Aycliffe needs** and we are sure our readers would agree.

Do we want residents to continue to travel out of town to get the facilities offered at other Retail Parks outside our area? Is it not a fact that Aycliffe Town Centre is restricted in size and cannot accommodate large retail outlets such as B&Q or Currys?

Surely a mulitplex Cinema cum Concert Hall could also be viable. Already we see the success of Planet and Leisure other and Fitness service Centres on the Park proving they attract support.

As more houses are built and we attract more families to live here, along with new industry, the retail industry, the retail demand will increase and it will become more evident that we need a full blown Retail Park at Aycliffe.

Durham City has one so why not at this end of the County? Our County Council is forcing us to use Retail Parks in other authority areas Teesside. Darlington and Wear Valley. when we should be supporting our own local economy.

Extra land has been acquired so let's use it, not only for industry but also for essential services to bring added benefit and convenience to the population of Aycliffe as a whole.

Robotics at Woodham Academy

During the last week of the term, Academy hosted first Royal Academy of Engineering (RAEng) County Durham VEX Robotic Challenge. This event was by the funded Academy's Connecting STEM teachers programme Michael Nelson, Head of

Engineering and Design & Technology, who is also a RAEng STEM Teacher Coordinator for the North East of England, gained funding to buy VEX Robotics Clawbot kits. During the summer term Woodham Academy ran a workshop to introduce and train the teachers involved from other Durham schools, to understand the process and to feel confident in working with a group of their own students. secondary schools ed were Park View involved School, Tanfield School, School Ferryhill and Woodham Academy. almost a term each school built, tested and modified their robot, working towards the



RAEng final at Woodham on 19th December.

event packed. The special guests were Dr Mike Leddre, from STEMNET at the Regional Technology Centre (RTC North), and Tony Swanick, STEM Engineering Ambassador. Both guests were fantastic judges and attention to detail was needed to judge the build quality.

During the event each team competed in four events. Then all went head to head in Robot Wars style carnage, to collect as many bean bags as possible. The result was tight, but there could be only one winner and this year it was Ferryhill.

The next stage, with very kind sponsorship from Autodesk software, has enabled all four teams to compete in the regional VEX Robotic finals. This is when twelve teams compete for places for the National Finals, at the Big Bang event in Birmingham in March, and hopefully qualify for the World Finals in the United States of America. To realise this dream teams will

He said, 'It is so good to see STEM skills being developed within our local schools, especially robotics. These are the type of young people that we need to go on to be our future engineers. We will begin to solve the skills shortages that local companies like Gestamp Tallent and Hitachi will want" The future of robotics at Woodham Academy? Nelson is currently waiting for funding from RAEng to recruit four more Durham schools to be involved in the 2014 competition. Woodham has also looked at funding to allow working with local primary schools and with Durham Local Authority, creating a programme to further develop STEM skills with younger students, using the VEX IQ platform.

Two free Healthy Lifestyle courses are taking place at the Pioneering Care Centre for people living in Newton Aycliffe or Middridge who have a learning disability, dvslexia or dyspraxia. Participants will learn how to make positive lifestyle changes and how to maintain them.

The courses will run for 4 weeks on Mondays or Fridays. The first will start Monday 24 February from 2.30 – 3.30pm and the next one starts on Friday 28 February from 1-2pm.

Angela Quinn, PCP Health said "Learning disabilities can make it more difficult to understand new information, learn new skills and communicate. This means some people with learning disabilities need help to live independently. For example, they may find maintaining a healthy weight difficult, and need help understanding information and advice about diet and nutrition, cooking and regular physical activity.

PCP are also looking to recruit volunteers to help with this project. Volunteers will receive full support and training to become Health Trainer Champions so they can work with the clients to help them become healthier. 



A Senior Citizen is calling for more consideration people who effected badly by a sudden electricity cut.

Peter Hull of Clanny Road a retired construction worker retuned home at 4pm on Saturday 11th and found his electricity supply off and talking to neighbours found it had been lost since 11.30am that morning with no

reason or explanation. The other side of the road was unaffected and Peter was struggling to find his way in the dark and could not cook a meal or boil a kettle for a cup of tea.

In the end he dedecided to go to bed early, but due to illness had to get up around midnight. The electric was still off and as he moved into the kitchen he fell headlong over the doorway threshold, banging his head against the kitchen unit and it could have been a serious injury. Peter is not wanting any compensation for his injury but he does feel the electicity suppliers N-Power have a duty to contact their customers to let them know why the supply is off and when it will be restored.

They do have an 0800 number, but it is difficult to get through to get the answers to your query.

an apology and told there underground an fault. NPower were very sympathetic and apologetic and took Peter's mobile phone number promising to notify him if there was a similar occurrence. Peter was surprised to learn there was an emergency number for vulnerable clients who could be kept informed about any cuts to their electicity supply.
