



Review: "Elenbak: What a bunch of fighters these guys are! Back again after previously strong showings in past BOTBs, Elenbak return with yet more melody driven and insanely catchy soft rock. More new material in their excellently delivered set, but still it's the wonderful 'Samantha' that gets under your skin and refuses to be ignored - a summertime hit single if ever I heard one. Partnered to familiar favourite 'In This World' these are two great songs that really show the quality running through this band. Closing with a triumphant 'Someday' you have to believe that there is a cracking AOR album in this band just begging to be unleashed."

Saturday 8th March - "Sticky Fingers"

1st set blasted off with Judas Priest's 'Metal Gods'; UFO classic 'Lights Out' followed and by now the Stickies are going full steam, rocking out good and hard. There is only one word for Phil's guitar playing on this track - awesome! Drop in Van Halen's 'Lets Talk About Love' followed by a huge guitar solo spot that led into Satriani's 'Surfing With The Alien' and 'Breaking The Law' for a bit more Priest and you have the makings of a great first set.

Second set opened with a Zeppelin medley of 'Communication Breakdown', 'Rock n Roll' and 'Whole Lotta Love' and it was here that the sheer volume and thump of Keith Moore's bass drum really made it's impact. Blending nicely with Phil Finley's bass, this is a good rhythm section for Phil Martin to build upon. Fronting a band like Sticky Fingers is no easy job, especially considering the length of time they have been around and the following they have built up but Mark Evans looks so relaxed on stage, moving bassman Phil to take centre stage to sing 'Teenage Kicks' really worked and when Mark returned to close out the set with 'Enter Sandman' and a bouncy 'Anarchy In The UK' the audience took their voices through the roof.

Stiller Builds £700,000 **Multi-use Factory**

Part of Company's Expansion Plan

is investing £700,000 in a new multi-use building on its huge site as part of the group's long-term growth plans to create employment. Stiller Warehousing and Distribution has plans to develop a two-and-a-half acre piece of land which adjoins its main premises on Ridgeway, Aycliffe Business Park.

The first phase of the development includes a includes a ft multi-use 20,000 sq ft multi-use building, with the steel frame already in place, with plans to develop the rest of the land.

Contractors will now begin building and fitting out the facility, which will be fully insulated. Stiller, which employs 115 people, say the property would be ideally suited for a small to medium sized manufacturing or distribution company.

Paul Managing Director Paul Stiller said: "At this stage, as we're about to construct it, the facility could be built bespoke for end-users. The building is right in the heart of Aycliffe Business Parkand could be divided into two 10,000 square feet units". There is also planning

There is also planning permission for other buildings on the site which are earmarked for further phases of the development.

Stiller, which reported an increase in turnover to £10.5m at the end of 2013, is working

The group offers a "just in time" service to Gestamn time" service to Gestamp Tallent and 3M - storing materials and feeding them into their factories and has recently started working with growing engineering firm

The rapid success of national network Palletline - a national group of 70 companies across Britain of which Stiller is a member and major shareholder - is increasing business, resulting in two new members of staff being recruited.

Stiller's premises includes a 15,000-pallet store of 160,000 square feet, storing for 15 customers from varying industries.

"Palletline is a very successful national network which is experiencing growth. The system itself, of which we're an integral part, is growing at more than 20 per cent a year.
"The numbers of pallets being transported around the country are going up all the time" said Paul Stiller.

Because the number of pallets is going up by 20% a year, Stillers have to meet that demand. As they gear up to that - to trunk them up from the Palletline hub in the Midlands and back to the North-East -

with an increasing number they've got to generate more of companies on Aycliffe business in this area in order to keep the vehicles efficient.
Otherwise the vehicles will be going down empty to the hubs to bring back lots of pallets, which isn't cost-effective.

"We're already very active in the sales market place but we're investing in our sales team accordingly, with two new members of staff coming in, to build on the success of Palletline.

"It's the market-leader in the transport of pallets and we recently invested more than £1m in a fleet of new vehicles, including four which were part of the Government's trial of longer semi-trailers (LSTs). which nationally are expected to save over 3,000 tonnes of CO2 over 10 years." said Paul.

New Homes Still Have No Telephones

Despite all the bad publicity for BT the residents of Greenwood Court are still waiting to get their new homes connected to the telephone system.

They are still getting wrong incorrect information from their Telephone and Broadband suppliers. The residents are having to find out the correct information themselves and it is unbelievable that neighbours are talking to each other all with different dates for the connection to be made.

On Monday 10th Febuary an Open Reach engineer attended the site and informed some residents that there is a collapsed duct under the road and blamed the contractors who laid the new sewers which is disputed by the builders. This would take 5 weeks to rectify, but at the same time a resident received a text telling her she would be connected that Friday.

Philip Clark contacted the local County Councillor to find out if the planned works had been requested from Durham County, the request was put into the Council the following Monday (so much for the hurry) and it was

confirmed the works would start Friday 21st February. Another resident contacted

Phil Wilson MP, on the Friday the contractors arrived on site and put in new ducting which was completed on Monday 25th. The residents are wondering is it a coincidence that things seem to be happening after other high profile people are getting involved including the MP, County Councillors and representatives from

Open Reach informed Livin before Christmas that they were aware of the collapsed duct and said it would be done before Christmas. Did they mean Easter?

The biggest complaint is that no one from Open Reach is prepared to tell the truth and explain what is happening and the residents would feel better if they felt that they weren't being lied to. They can only hope that this matter is resolved soon and can join the 21st Century. Come on Open Reach stand up and treat us like adults and give us the respect we deserve!

The Oddest Items of I

suspender belt charity reveals the ten weirdest items found littering our streets

Every day, Keep Britain Tidy's survey team is walking the streets, looking at the litter that we, as a nation, drop – a staggering 30million

tonnes of it every year.
The environmental charity does this surveying for an annual report for Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs (Defra) on how clean our country is, the Local Environmental Quality Survey of England (LEQSE). As you would expect, the charity's surveyors find millions of cigarette butts, thousands of plastic bottles and crisp packets but, alongside the everyday stuff, the surveyors occasionally find something that stops them in their tracks.

We have pulled together the most unusual and downright odd items that our surveyors have found on their finds around the country.

Top 10

1. A colostomy bag. 2. An artificial limb.

Whilst these items are certainly odd, litter and fly-tipping is a serious issue for England, which blights our nation's landscape, impacts on our local communities and causes harm to wildlife.

Annually, 30 million tonnes of litter are cleaned from our streets across the country with a cost to local authorities of £1 billion per year.

Chief Executive of Keep Britain Tidy, Phil Barton, said, "The LEQSE survey helps us to assess the environmental cleanliness of the country. It is critical to ensure that government, local authorities, land managers, business and Keep Britain Tidy have the information we need in order to act.





Falcons Unlucky to Compare Wonga with the **Aycliffe Credit Union**

Dear Sir

Your readers may have heard about the problems of the people struggling make ends meet and resorting to Pay Day Loans.

These often entail exorbitant rates of interest and borrowers can end up in serious financial Arising from this there has been a great deal of welcome publicity for Credit Unions: indeed the Archbishop of Canterbury, Justin Welby, has spoken out strongly on behalf of this organisation.

Having worked now as a volunteer for the Durham County Council Credit Union, for two years, I would like to tell you of the advantages of joining the credit union in Aycliffe.

First of all I need to point out that we have had a change of name. We in Newton Aycliffe now operate under the banner of N.E. First Credit Union and there are over 20 branches running throughout the county. We are now housed in the Town Library and are open on Thursdays between 11am & 12noon. I realise this may not be convenient for all and I would love to be able to offer more opening hours. This may happen in the future, but is dependent on having sufficient members and sufficient volunteers. There are, however, other means of operating to which I will

return later. The Credit Union operates mainly on two separate fronts: (a) savings (b) loans. Members can save as little or as much as they wish. Individuals with small amounts to save may often encounter resistance from High Street Banks. They will receive no such resistance from the Credit Unions - save whatever you can afford. Once the habit of regular saving is established it is amazing how the savings grow. Then when extra money is required. e.g. for holidays, birthdays Christmas or unexpected 'rainy days' there is something to turn to. I cannot emphasize

Once a member has joined he/ she will be issued with a Pay Point Card which can be used at the Post Office and other Pay Point outlets at any time. ce a year a small committee, at H.O. in Durham, meets to decide on Dividend (interest) to be paid on savings. This is at present small but at High Street Banks it is almost nonexistent.

Loans: Once a member has

saved for a few weeks it may be possible to take out a loan, should there be a need. This again is judged by a small committee and each application is treated on its own merits and on the apparent reliability of the borrower. The huge advantage in taking loans from us is the rate of interest repayable. This is variable but normally around 1% per month – compare that Wonga!!!

This is briefly what the Credit Union is all about. I hope I have aroused your interest. Should you decide to visit us you will receive a warm welcome from our volunteers in very pleasant surroundings.

Undoubtedly there will be many of you who will say "well its not for me I cant get" the answer is simple ring me on 315645 and I will make arrangements to meet with you and hopefully enrol you. Please show this article to anyone you feel would benefit
