GARA OPPOSE WINDFARM



The Great Aycliffe Residents Association at its recent AGM, unanimously re-affirmed its opposition to the proposal by Eon to build a huge windfarm on the Isles. County Durham has done more than its fair share of provision for windfarms, in the UK. GARA believe the 24 Turbines proposed are a massive and unwelcome intrusion into the countryside of County Durham, a landscape protected under the Sedgefield Borough Council local plan. This development cannot be justified and GARA pledge full support to Durham County Council (Planning

Officers and Councillors) as well as Great Aycliffe Town Council in their opposition. There is no objection to renewable energy in itself, but only to this proposed industrialisation of our local landscape. The Government recently acknowledged the massive profits made by Utilities like Eon from subsidies paid for out of everyone's Gas and electricity bills including the lowest paid, cannot be justified. The fact that over 90% of Wind capacity (not wind power actually generated) also has to be backed up by Gas fired power stations on "spinning reserve" means that the amount of CO2 emissions saved by wind farms is negligible. GARA say no to despoiling one of the loveliest corners of rural England with a noisy, ugly, taxpayer-subsidised, bat-chomping, bird-slicing wind farm turbines.

Aycliffe Artist John Palliser is painting a picture in secret ready for unveiling at a charity event celebrating Armed Forces Day in

Sunderland. It will then be exhibited in Bede's World before starting a four year UK tour to include several war museum galleries.

The extra large oil painting commemorates the 100th year since the start of World War 1. It respectfully portrays acts of extreme bravery, and the obscene consequences of the Great War.

Said John: "A generation of innocent young men, their heads full of honour, glory and England, went off to war to make the world safe for democracy."

"They were slaughtered in often ill-conceived battles

planned by incompetent and misguided generals. Those who survived were shocked, disillusioned and embittered by their war experiences, and saw their real enemies were not the Germans, but the old men at home who had lied to them."

"They rejected the values of the society that sent them to war, and in doing so separated their own generation from the past and from their cultural inheritance. The painting had to be historically accurate, symbolic in its approach and most of all bringing justice to the millions of lost souls on all sides."

PCP Send Waste to Aycliffe's New Biogas Plant

The Pioneering Care Partnership (PCP) found a local waste collection thanks to the power of social media. Emerald Biogas, which operates the north east's first commercial food waste anaerobic digestion (AD) plant, promoted its food waste service through the social media micro community 'AycliffeHour' on Twitter, which is how PCP first found the waste disposal services on offer. After meeting with the renewable energy company to discuss its requirements, which includes disposal of food waste from the Centre coffee shop, staff kitchen and nursery, Emerald Biogas is now working with the charity and collecting all of its food waste to process at its AD plant on the Business Park. The PCP is delighted their food isn't being sent to landfill. Carol Gaskarth, Chief Executive, PCP, said: "After hearing what Emerald Biogas could do with our food waste



and the processes involved we were immediately interested. The idea of turning our food waste into energy was extremely useful, as we are always looking for ways to reduce waste going to landfill. In line with this we want to reduce our impact on the environment, as well as helping any local economy through the energy produced from the waste generated.

"We are currently accredited with the environmental quality standard ISO 14001 and through this system; we have set ourselves ambitious objectives and targets to meet, with reducing waste to landfill being one of those objectives. Adam Warren, Director, said:

"We regularly engage with online business communities such as 'CoDurhamHour', 'AycliffeHour' and 'North East Hour', as they are a great way of making new contacts and potential customers while raising general awareness of the business. In this instance, being able to help a local community organisation to dispose of its food waste in a greener way is meaningful to both PCP and to Emerald Biogas and we were more than happy to help." Emerald Biogas currently employs seven staff at its £8m state-of-the-art AD facility based at Newton Aycliffe Industrial Estate, generating enough energy to power 2,000 homes through its food waste processing.

Aycliffe Schools Learn the Waste Food Recycling Lesson

Waste Warriors at Woodham Burn School



A commercial food waste facility has visited more schools in County Durham as part of its Waste Warriors campaign to talk about food waste and help pupils understand the growing impact of disposing of unwanted food. Emerald Biogas, based at Aycliffe recently launched the campaign to schools across the north east in response to the national food waste problem. Woodham Burn Community Primary School was delighted to take up the offer and was joined by pupils from Woodham Academy. Esther Brown, Commercial Manager at Emerald Biogas talked with 112 Years 2, 3, 4 and 6 pupils about how big a problem food waste is, both locally and nationally, where the food waste comes from and why it should be recycled

and not sent to landfill. The young recyclers learned about the process of anaerobic digestion, with the benefits of green energy and fertiliser produced at the other end, as well as what they can do to help by becoming a Waste Warrior. Kiera Edwards, aged 7, said: "It is amazing that you can make energy out of horrible waste food. I definitely want to help with this." Max Turner, aged 11, said: "It fits in really well with our school resolutions. We are really trying to be greener this year." Pupils were given workbooks with activities such as designing a team logo, filling in the gaps for the anaerobic digestion process and recording food miles for school's lunch, to develop their creative design, problem solving and mathematics skills.

Launch of Aycliffe Welfare Project

A local project aimed at supporting people hit by benefit cuts under the Government's Welfare Reform agenda will officially launch in Newton Aycliffe next week.

The 'Welfare Champions' project has recruited a small army of local volunteers who will provide advice and guidance to people in their own neighbourhoods to anyone who has been affected by the Welfare Reforms.

Six local champions have received initial training in potential courses of action for residents who have been affected by issues such as 'Bedroom Tax' and the suspension of Benefits.

As well as providing initial guidance the volunteers will also signpost individuals to supportive services such as advice agencies, local housing providers and welfare rights teams.

The project is run by Charity East Durham Trust and funded by the Greater Aycliffe and Middridge Area Action Partnership (GAMP) and local housing provider livin, and is based on a belief that local people will often turn to people they know rather than the established routes, as Chief Executive of East Durham Trust Malcolm Fallow explained "A significant number of people would rather seek the advice of a friendly, known local face rather than the often complicated and faceless public sector mechanisms such as 'helplines' or websites."

The project will replicate a highly successful version which has operated in the Easington area for over a year and has assisted 1500 people in that time.
