

Development at Cobblers Hall

I have been contacted by a number of people concerned about the work going on at the Moor, Cobblers Hall.

As you are aware, houses are being built on the area labelled O on the plan – but the Moor is being developed as a Sustainable Urban Drainage System (SUDS) scheme and a local nature reserve.

Due to recent problems with flooding throughout the country, legislation is in the pipeline for this year which will significantly change the rules about drainage for new build developments. Developers will no longer be able automatically to connect to the main drainage system. And they will have to ensure that, in cloudburst conditions, the run-off from their houses will not overwhelm the drains and cause flooding to other properties. For most developments, that will mean including some form of SUDS scheme.

That is what is being developed at the Moor, which is a development ahead-of-its-time. Instead of discharging directly into the main drains, surface water from the new housing at Site O will run down drains at points B into





the pond that is currently being dug out on the site. Normally, the water will then run out down drain C into the drainage system. In flood conditions, however - because drain C is of a small diameter - the rainwater will build up in the main pond and discharge at a steady rate down drain C.

At the same time, the County Council has

taken the opportunity to turn this functional feature into a local nature reserve. It will be surrounded by a 1.2m paling fence (D), encompassed by an upgraded carboniferous stone footpath (E) and with viewing platforms at points F. The permanent pond (G) will be planted with common water-crowfoot and broadleaf pondweed, with 'marginal' and 'emergent wildflowers' (BFS5) planted at the water's edge, and a mix of wildflowers and grasses (BFW4) in the rest of the catchment basin.

I have done many different courses since getting sober and enjoyed each and every one. To be nominated for this Life-Changing Learners Award means so much to me it really is more than I could

ever have imagined."

Marie says: "Sharon was a willing and enthusiastic learner who supported her peers in the group by sharing her experiences and offering help and advice.

Her life has changed through her learning to give her a positive attitude, better mental and physical health as well as increased confidence and self-esteem. All of which are now contributing to the help and support she gives to others.

She has overcome so many barriers with her health and addiction. Her relationship with her family is mending and she has achieved learning success with no prior qualifications or adult learning experience. She is an inspiration to many, well done Sharon!'

Aycliffe Walkers Falling in South Eastern Fells

Aycliffe Fell Walkers had a stark reminder recently that winter hadn't quite released its grip on the countryside, not just yet! Those travelling across the Pennines on the coach were given a clear indication of what was to come when skies darkened and heavy snow fell as they passed through Kirby Stephen, on route to the Lake District.

The south eastern fells, north of Kendal and Windermere, were covered in a heavy blanket of snow and this made for difficult, sometimes treacherous conditions underfoot! Whilst stronger walkers continued onto the high ridges, the majority elected to lose height and look for easier routes below the snow line.

The weather did eventually improve however and in late afternoon the sun shone on gleaming white snow-covered hills. Walkers were rewarded with views of Morecambe Bay in the far distance; whilst the Coniston Fells stood out in grand style in the near distance. Many lingered for some time, looking down towards Lake Windermere, before heading down to Troutbeck and the walk's end! It had been a challenging but rewarding day! So many had slipped or fallen during the walk however that when all had reached the warmth of the hostelry in Troutbeck, it was quickly established that only 5 out of the total of 47 members had managed to stay upright all day. One cheeky chap asked "Is that why they call these hills, Fells?" Of course, we all fell about - laughing!



Breaking down on a motorway is a nightmare most of us dread If you're vehicle has a puncture or mechanical problem and you're unable to pull into a service area and forced onto the hard shoulder, we have a few tips to help keep you and your family safe. Stop on the hard shoulder as far to the left as possible, with your wheels turned left, stopping near an emergency telephone if possible. These are usually placed at one-mile intervals You and your passengers should always exit the vehicle by the left. Ensure everyone is stood away from the carriageway and

hard shoulder, and that children and pets are kept under control With caution, emergency telephone on your side of the carriageway following arrows on the posts at the back of the hard shoulder. The call is free of charge connecting direct to the Highways Agency or the police. Remember, this is the quickest way for assistance to reach you.

Give your details to the Highways Agency or the police and inform them if you are a vulnerable motorist such as disabled, older or travelling alone. Walk back and wait near your vehicle, away from the carriageway and hard shoulder. If you feel at risk from another person, return to your vehicle by a left-hand door and lock all doors.
