

CALL NHS 111 WHEN YOUR GP SURGERY IS CLOSED

'Keep calm and call NHS when your GP surgery is closed and you need urgent health care this Easter.

That's the message from the NHS in the North East as health care services prepare for the busy bank holiday weekend.

People can play their part in ensuring services are used appropriately by 'Keeping Calm' and thinking about the right service for them this Easter.

Dr James Gossow, Regional Clinical Lead for NHS 111 said: "By 'Keeping Calm and calling NHS 111' North Easterners can ensure that our busy A&E departments are able to focus their resources on those people who are most seriously ill.

"The North East is one of the highest performing areas in the country for the NHS 111 service and was one of the first pilot areas when the was introduced in service

"When you call NHS 111, you will speak to the same highly trained call handlers who deal with 999 emergencies and be directed to the most appropriate service to meet our needs, first time."

NHS 111 is the new number to call when you need medical help fast, but it's not a 999 emergency. Using the NHS 111 service

will free up valuable resources in the North East's A&E departments for those people who are most seriously ill.

The NHS 111 service has successfully been running in the North East since August 2010, when it was piloted in the County Durham and Darlington area. It went live across the North East in April 2013 and is now available across the country.

The service is run by the North East Ambulance Service and is staffed by the same highly trained call handlers who deal with 999

NHS 111 will signpost you to the most appropriate service, first time and is available

24/7, 365 days a year and is free to call from landlines and mobile phones.

Woodham student Eva Efstathiou knows all about books: she should she wants to write and illustrate them she leaves school. Should the ambitious Aycliffe girl achieve her dream, she could join the illustrious ranks of Pat Barker, Terry Deary, David Almond, Ann Fine and many others who live and work in the North East whilst exporting their titles around the world.

Like any budding author, Eva knows that a good writer has to be a good reader first, so it is not surprising that she and her friends Rebecca Donkin, **Tessica** McKenzie Smallwood-Foster Aalivah have been busy signing their schoolmates up to a marathon

reading event that seeks to improve young lives through sponsored reading.

Readathon is an annual event reading encourages youngsters to read for pleasure, while raising money for seriously ill children. Isles Wind Farm

In response to the Great Aycliffe Residents Association letter about the proposed Isles wind farm. The first point they make is "County Durham has done more than its fair share of provision for wind farms, in the UK". I would like to ask. Is there a limit on doing good work? Is there a problem with doing more than your fair share?

Their second point is that "wind farms are a massive and unwelcome intrusion the countryside of County Durham, a landscape under protected Sedgefield Borough Council local plan". If the SBC was doing its job, this area would be forest. Agriculture already radically changed this landscape. Wind energy is just another crop like wheat or beef.

The next point they make is "This development cannot be justified". Well, how about the possible sinking of Bangladesh. Not to mention the recent flooding of Somerset and the coastal erosion of East Yorkshire.

The GARA's next point is "There is no objection to renewable energy in itself. but only to this proposed industrialisation of our local landscape." I would like to ask, what is agriculture other than industrial scale food production?

They then go on to say "The Government recently acknowledged the massive profits made by Utilities like Eon from subsidies paid for out of everyone's Gas and electricity bills including the lowest paid, cannot be justified".

What is wrong with profit? Profit is essential in order to improve infra-structure etc. We all benefit from profit in the form of wages, benefits

Since the second world war, farming has been heavily subsidised, resulting in profit for farmers and cheap food for the rest of us. All we need to do is tignten up on company's tax avoidance. to do is tighten up on large

Their next point is "The fact that over 90% of Wind capacity (not wind power actually generated) also has to be backed up by Gas fired power stations on spinning reserve means that the amount of CO2 emissions saved by

wind farms is negligible". This is misleading because spinning reserve is not producing nothing while spinning, it's just on part load and thus on reduced fuel consumption, also there are at least three kinds of gas fired power stations, steam turbine. gas turbine and piston engine, the steam turbines take a long time to stop and start but the gas turbines and piston engines will do so in minutes. I recently visited a hydro power station which could be turned on or off as required. Large scale renewable energy is relatively new, and our infra-structure is not designed to accommodate it but it will

England with, noisy, ugly, taxpayer-subsidised, chomping, bird-slicing, wind farm turbines.

I, as a vegan can't argue against "bat-chomping, bird-slicing" but agriculture also kills wildlife and as far as "loveliest" is concerned, that's a matter of opinion, like I said before "It used to be forest". And agriculture is also tax payer subsidised. As for noise, get double glazing, it will also reduce your need for wind farms.





WIND FARM OPERATORS RECEIVE **MILLIONS TO TURN OFF TURBINES**

You the Consumer, Foot The Bill!

paying millions of pounds a year to wind farm operators to turn their machines off unless the UK urgently invests in developing energy storage, according to a new report just released.

Public concerns are raised again about the millions of pounds that are being spent in constraint payments from National Grid to wind farm operators - effectively paying them to turn off their generators as the electricity is deemed to be 'wrong time'

Recent figures from the Renewable Energy payments were made to wind farms in March, part of the £13,749,814 already paid out this year. In 2013, wind farms received £32,707,351.

Under existing market arrangements, if an energy generating company electricity is unable to supply its power to the grid because it is not required it is entitled to constraint payments.

Dr Tim Fox, Head of Energy and Environment at the Institution of Mechanical Engineers, said:

"We know that energy bills Foundation (REF) claim are going to rise in future,

Energy customers will keep that £8.7m in constraint but unless we invest in energy storage technology these constraint payments are set to become an unnecessary additional cost for the consumer.

Virtually any form energy storage could help alleviate this problem, by allowing surplus generation from intermittent renewable sources to be stored by power providers until needed for use at a different time when demand exists.

"The intermittency challenge of renewable sources arises from the fact that the wind does not always blow, the sun does not always shine and the waves are not always in motion at times when consumers demand electricity. Equally, the converse is also true, in that consumer demand for power can be low when renewable energy sources are highly active

On just one day in August 2013, £1.84m was paid to operators of 28 wind-farms in Scotland to turn off their turbines and not generate electricity.

Between 2011 and 2012, constraint payments from National Grid to wind farm operators totalled more than £34 million. This represented just over 10% of the total paid to all electricity generators in UK, despite wind power accounting for less than 5%

of our energy production. In the same period, more than £340 million was paid in constraint payments to all UK electricity generators
– approximately £13 for every household.

We attended an open day at PCP and never looked back. First my wife and I started as participants, we joined the walking group, met some great people and it grew from there. I wanted to take things easier and live a quieter life but it wasn't long before I was taking courses in first aid and walk leader training. I also have a plot in PCP's community garden. Volunteering for PCP gives me a purpose, if I hadn't been involved for the past 10 years my health problems would have gotten worse; I would have become bored. depressed and unfit. I now



feel like a young lad, my health has improved through being physically, socially and mentally active."

Molly started attending walking group to the meet new people from the local area. Moving from Northumberland she didn't know anyone in Newton Aycliffe. Also retired, she wanted to become more socially active.

was overwhelmed Molly by the recognition of her volunteering for PCP, she said "I'm just giving back what PCP has given me, I wanted to meet new people and now I have made some lovely friends. The walking group is full of people of all ages and walks of life, some are widowed, some have health problems and others

just like the chatter! Plus the

fresh air and exercise makes people feel better.

Through volunteering we get to keep the group going. helping more people. I would recommend volunteering to everyone, it's one of the best ways to meet new people and help out in your community; which also makes you feel good."

Chief Executive Carol Gaskarth presented them with a gift and said "A huge thank you to Molly and John for all their support over the last 10 years. PCP volunteers are invaluable in supporting the organisation to achieve its mission to improve health, wellbeing and learning for all. I wish to acknowledge the hard work and commitment of all of PCP's volunteers, without whom we could not achieve so much."


