Finance Secured for Hitachi Rail Production at Aycliffe

Hitachi, Ltd. have announced that the British Department for Transport and Agility Trains (with its main shareholders Hitachi and John Laing) have reached financial close for the fleet of Class 800 series trains set to run on the East Coast Main Line as part of the Intercity Express Programme (IEP).

Commercial close of contract for the initial fleet of 92 trains (596 carriages) for the East Coast Main Line and the Great Western Main Line was announced in July 2012, at the same time as financial close was reached for the Great Western Main Line route.

In July 2013, the Department for Transport announced the decision to place an additional order of 30 trains (270 carriages) for the East Coast route with Agility Trains. Toshiaki Higashihara, President & COO of Hitachi, Ltd. said: "I am extremely pleased that a total of 866 Hitachi train cars will be running in the UK, which is the birthplace of railways. I would like to express my very sincere gratitude to all those involved, and particularly to the members of the Japanese and British governments who offered their strong support and invested great efforts in bringing this project to fruition.

Hitachi will continue to provide highly reliable, comfortable passenger services with low environmental impact, by establishing a new manufacturing base equipped with the world's most advanced production facilities."

Alistair Dormer, Hitachi Rail Global CEO of Hitachi, Ltd. said: "I am delighted by today's news of financial close for the last tranche of trains for the Intercity Express Programme. Agility Trains has successfully raised the finance for this important infrastructure investment in the UK, bringing all contractual and financial agreements to a close.

"For Hitachi Rail, the announcement signals a new phase in the Intercity Express Programme. With all finance raised, our teams across the

UK and in Japan, jointly with Agility Trains, can now fully focus on delivering all aspects of this programme, which will bring major improvements for passengers across two of the busiest train routes in Britain. The construction of our train factory in Newton Aycliffe is underway and we are looking forward to seeing all Class 800 series trains for the East Coast Main Line being manufactured by our 730 staff in north east England."

In addition to the factory construction, work on the Intercity Express Programme is progressing in various areas. The interior design of the

trains is at an advanced stage with final sign-off expected

shortly. Three pre-series trains will be manufactured this year in Hitachi's factory in Japan, with arrival of the trains in the UK expected in the first half of 2015. Suppliers for the main bought-in systems on the trains have been selected, and a large number of British-based companies are directly bringing their products and expertise to the programme.

In Newton Aycliffe, construction of Hitachi Rail train factory is progressing. The £82 million manufacturing facility will be operational in mid-2015, with series production of the Class 800 series trains scheduled to start in 2016. Recruitment of the senior team for the facility has started, and large-scale recruitment of what will eventually be 730 staff is planned for 2015.

In order to fulfill the demanding requirements for dependability and availability of the trains, Hitachi Rail has started constructing a new, state-of-the-art maintenance depot in Bristol (Stoke Gifford), is refurbishing the North Pole depot in west London and upgrading the maintenance facility in Swansea. Construction of a new depot in Doncaster will start shortly. All work is on schedule and the trains are expected to enter passenger service in 2017 on the Great Western Main Line and in 2018 on the East Coast Main Line.

Town Council Considers Threat to Early Learning Centres

The Town Council's Policy and Resources Committee met on 16 April. The Committee agreed to cooperate with the Aycliffe Village History Society to commemorate the First World War, by assisting the Society as it seeks to put on exhibitions and refurbish the War Memorial in Aycliffe Village Churchyard. The Committee also signed off a successful Parish Plan performance report, which showed that all the council's targets were either complete or on-going. A major decision was to commit £20,000 from the Capital Programme budget to replace the bar roof at the Oak Leaf Sports Complex. The most important business of the Committee, however, was to consider a significant threat to its Pre-School Learning Centres.

Provision of Pre-School education is not a statutory duty of the Town Council – the Town Council's Pre-Schools originally started as playgroups in the 1970s, but were registered with Ofsted in 1998 to provide early years education. The two Pre-Schools are located in St. Oswald's Park and Woodham Burn Community Primary School, and are open during school term time to all children from their 3rd birthday. Places are part-funded by the government, with the first 15 hours free for eligible children, and £3.50 per hour thereafter. The Centres are open for the full school day, but provide flexible hours to meet users' individual needs.

Last Wednesday, Councillors heard that the government has changed the funding formula to pre-schools, awarding more funding to those which are judged 'outstanding' by Ofsted (where the Town Council's Pre-Schools are judged 'good'). The result is a 5% (£10,633) reduction of funding (to add to the £135,000 of cuts already made to the Town Council's income).

In addition, the Town Council had received an invoice for £4,000 from Woodham Burn Community Primary School. The Town Council owns its St Oswald's Park site, but rents a room from Woodham Burn School; the demand, received without prior warning, is a 90% increase in the rent the Council is being asked to pay (£1900).

These costs represent a threat to the Town Council's ability to provide Pre-School education. Councillors asked officers to negotiate with Woodham Burn School in regard to the increase in rental, and to report back to Council on the impact of the changes to funding.

YEAR 9 VISIT TO EMERALD BIOGAS

Three Year 9 students, Jaydene Chappell, Shannon Clay and Hana Stephen from Woodham Academy recently visited the Emerald Biogas Plant on Aycliffe Business Park. The purpose of their visit was to gather information on food waste and the Waste Warriors campaign for a project at school.

The plant, which was completed in July 2013, has a small work force of six employees. There are plans to expand the plant and increase the number of employees. On arrival, the students were given safety jackets and helmets to wear and were taken on a tour of the site. They learnt about the process of food waste, what Emerald Biogas do to help the environment and the company's plans for the future.

The students commented: "After we'd put our safety equipment on, we headed over to a building where there were trucks filled with food waste being emptied into a huge pile of rubbish. Outside the building there were several green bins that had been collected from homes. Before we even went inside the building there was a really unpleasant smell. As the smell was so strong we stood with our hands over our mouths, listening to information about how much food waste there was and where the company collects the food waste. When we finally caught our breath again we were taken to all the tanks around the plant and were told the processes of each tank. We were also taken into a boiler room, which was nice and warm, that contained energy that was used for powering and heating our homes and other buildings."

Although the smell was unpleasant a staff member stated that you soon get used to it. Visiting Emerald Biogas was an excellent experience and really helped the students understand how food waste is converted into energy.




Woodham Academy Digital Leaders Teach Hungarian Students

Woodham Academy has just embarked upon an innovative Digital Leaders initiative. Several students applied for a position and only the best were accepted. Mr Smith, Director of ICT, said "The standard of applications were really high. It was a difficult choice but it is an important position which requires a good level of expertise".

The first two Digital Leaders selected, Tamsin and Erica, are already keen computer users in school demonstrating excellent technical knowledge in lessons and regular attendees to Woodham Academy's CC4G (computer club for girls) and Code Academy lunchtime clubs.

As part of the Digital Leaders venture the two girls 'Skyped' the Hatvani Kossuth Lajos school in Hatvan, Hungary and shared their expertise. The students created an extensive teaching resource which supported the lesson and then used Microsoft's Skype video conference software to make



a video call to the Hungarian school. Tamsin and Erica then expertly took the Hungarian schoolchildren through the process of creating a computer game using the Scratch programming language. Tamsin said "I was really nervous about doing this but it was fine when I got started. It was excellent fun". Erica said "I loved doing this. I can't wait to do something like this again."

Feedback from Hungary has been amazing. Lionel Basa, the Hungarian teacher involved in the project said "It was really great. Our children loved it. They were very excited after the lesson and your students did a great job."

Woodham Code Academy club teaches students how to create games and apps and is available to year 7 and year 8 students on Tuesday lunchtimes in room 111.

NOT AN AREA OF SCIENTIFIC INTEREST

Dear Editor
 As you know, I am always pleased when people take an interest in developments, so I was delighted to read the letter in last week's Newton News about the development at the Moor. However, may I address some misconceptions about the development.
 To the best of my knowledge, the site has never been an 'Area of Scientific Interest', nor has it ever had Natterjack toads - the ecological report compiled for the planning application mentioned only common frog, common toad and smooth newt (and I am fairly confident that most of these will have decamped to the flooded medieval roadway

to the south of the site as soon as work started).
 In fact, the ecological poverty of the area was what initially attracted me to the site, because - we said - it resembled the boggy rough grassland that covered the whole of Newton Aycliffe at the end of the last ice age.
 Also, residents were consulted about the development. The Town Council has been considering developing the area since the late 1990s. Sedgefield Borough consulted formally with residents on a plan very similar to the current development in 2005, and the application this year for planning permission was not only properly advertised, but was discussed by myself and other correspondents in the Newton News. It is hoped that a 'Friends of The Moor' group might be established, if local residents wish.



WILDCATS INTO THE PLAY-OFFS Aycliffe Finish Season With Cup Triumph

Newton Aycliffe's premier league basketball team powered into the play-offs last weekend with consecutive victories – on Saturday they ran out 113-81 winners at bottom-of-the-table Birmingham Knights, whilst at home on Sunday against Cheshire Phoenix they raced out to a 20-point lead in the first ten minutes, to be gradually pegged back, before securing a 104-96 victory in a thrilling final quarter.

Wildcats star Danny Huffor top-scored in both games and on Sunday point guard Devin Ginty pipped team captain Ralph Bucci to the MVP (most valuable player) of the season award. Excitingly, the outcome is that, for the first time in their history, the Wildcats are in the quarter-finals. Having qualified in eighth place, they play league leaders Newcastle Eagles over two legs this week – on **Friday 25th April** at Newcastle and on **Sunday 27th April** at 4pm at Newton Aycliffe Leisure Centre. Durham have pushed Newcastle close over the last two games, so – with the Wildcats riding on a high – the result is by no means a foregone conclusion.

Newton Aycliffe Rugby Club finished their season with a fine win in the Durham County Challenge Plate final played under lights at Durham City. With a squad of 22 able to be used in the game, Aycliffe were in the position of having 25 players available.

Aycliffe aimed to play the game the way they had finished the league season and took the lead with a team try, the ball passing through forwards and backs before Adam Gascoigne's pace finished off the move. Luke Tinkler added the conversion. Aycliffe now seemed to let the occasion get on top of them and they lost their shape in the face of some spirited play by Washington, belying their lowly league position. Washington brought the score within two points with a try and continued to play well for most of the half. With less than 10 minutes of the first half remaining, Aycliffe used their pace to take command of the game with three tries in quick succession. First a move by Luke Crossen and Tinkler made the space for Craig Holmes to cross the whitewash. Holmes then turned provider for Gascoigne to score his second and Darrell McLaren provided an assist for David Judge's score. A full house of kicks by Tinkler saw the teams turn round with Aycliffe 28 – 5 ahead.

Early in the second half a chip by Tinkler led to another Judge try. Washington again showed their spirit and another period of pressure was rewarded with a second try. Drew Gibson came on as a replacement and was soon on the scoreboard with a darting run. Another Washington try showed that they were still a factor in the game. Aycliffe put on their remaining

replacements, but their attacking edge was not blunted. A series of attacking rucks put Aycliffe in a strong position and scrum-half, Chris Richards, saw a gap to dart through for another try. To finish off the scoring in a fitting manner, captain Warren Parsonage showed a burst of speed to power through the defence. Tinkler's conversion was his 7th out of 8 to leave the score 54 – 17 to Aycliffe as they lifted the trophy for the second time.

This was a satisfactory end to a good season for Aycliffe under the new regime of coach Peter Ryans and his assistants, with a 3rd place finish in the league. The following day, representatives from the club met World Cup winning legend Phil Vickery and were photographed with him and the trophy.
